ECLIPSES.

There will this year be three Eclipses of the Sun and two of the moon.

— On the 9th January and 6th June.—Eclipses of the Sun, invisible at Quebec.

— On the 22d June—Eclipse of the Moon, total, and visible at Quebec.

Commencement at 1 h. 45 m. morning. The Moon totally obscured by the earth's shadow at 2 h. 50 m. Middle, 3 h. 35 m. The moon will set totally eclipsed at 4 h. 7 m. End of the Eclipse at 5 h. 19½ m. Duration, 3 h. 35 m. Digits eclipsed, 16° 42 m. beginning on the Moon's northern limb.

— On the 30th November—Eclipse of the Sun, visible at Quebec, total and central in many places on the continent of North America.

Commencement at 1 h. 15½ m. evening. Conjunction at 2 h. 2½ m. Middle, 2 h. 29 m. End, 3 h. 43½ m. Total duration, 2 h. 28 m. Digits eclipsed, 9° 21' on the southern limb of the Sun's disk. The line of the total Eclipse will begin on the Russian territory in about 65 degrees of North latitude, and thence extend along the range of the Rocky Mountains to the river Arkansas; from thence, diverging to the East, it will pass over the Mississippi and the Southern States, and strike the Atlantic near the meridian of Charleston, cross the Bermudas and end between the Azores and the gulf of St. Lawrence.

— On the 15th and 16th Dec.—Eclipse of the Moon, visible at Quebec.

Commencement on the 15th at 10 h. 38 m. evening. Middle on the 16th at 0 h. 7 m. morning. End on the 16th at 1 h. 36 m. Total duration, 2 h. 58 m. Digits eclipsed, 8° 6' on the Moon's southern limb.

ECLIPSES.

9 Janvier et 6 Juin—Eclipses de soleil, invisibles à Québec.

22 Juin—Eclipse de lune, totale, et visible à Québec :

Commencement, à 1h. 45m. matin. La lune totalement plongée dans l'ombre de la terre à 2h. 50m. Milieu à 3 h. 33 m. matin. La lune se couche totalement éclip­sée à 4h. 7m. Fin de l'éclipse à 5h. 19½ m. du matin. Durée, 3h. 33 m. Doigts éclip­sés, 16° 42', à commencer sur le limbe septentrional de la lune.

30 Novembre—Eclipse de soleil, visible à Québec, totale et centrale dans beaucoup d'endroits de l'Amérique septentrionale :

Commencement à 1h. 15½ m. soir. Conjonction à 2h. 2½ m. Milieu à 2h. 29 m. Fin à 3h. 43½ m.—Durée totale, 2h. 28 m. Doigts éclip­sés, 9° 21', sur le limbe méridional du disque solaire. L'éclipse totale commencera sur le territoire Russe, vers les 65° de latitude N. ; elle parcourra ensuite toute la chaîne des montagnes rocheuses jusqu'à la rivière Arkansas ; de là, se détournant à l'est, elle traversera le Mississipi et les États du sud ; enfin elle entrera sur l'Atlantique vers le méridien de Charleston (C. du S.), passera aux Bermudes, et se terminera entre les Açores et le golfe St. Laurent.

15 et 16 Décembre—Eclipse de lune, visible à Québec :

Commencement, le 15 à 10h. 38 m. du soir. Milieu, le 16 à 0 h. 7 m. matin. Fin, le 16 à 1 h. 36 m. matin. Durée totale, 2 h. 58 m. Doigts éclip­sés, 8° 6', sur le limbe méridional de la lune.

This Tide Table shews the time of high water on any day of the moon's age nearly, and the stream continues to run one hour and a half after high water, or, in the seaman's phrase, it flows "Tide and Quarter Tide," and this is to be observed in every part of the River.

RULE. Having found the age of the moon at the top of each month in the Calendar, look in the left column of the table for the day from new to the full moon then in the right column the day from the full to the new moon, and in the middle column you will find the time when it is high water ashore.

Reform bill read a second time in the English Commons, yeas 302, nays 301. Dissolution of the English Parliament, general election. Dissolution of the French Parliament and elections. Prince Saxe Cobourg accepts the Crown of Belgium with the consent of the powers. Dutch troops invade Belgium—50,000 French under Gérard, march to the assistance of the Belgians; Dutch retire. 1831

The allies ratify the treaty for the separation of Belgium from Holland—Don Pedro sails from Nantes and lands at Oporto with an expedition, to place the Crown of Portugal in the hands of his daughter Donna Maria. Reform bills for England, Ireland and Scotland, become law.—Resistance to tithes and disturbed state of Ireland. Otho, son of the King of Bavaria placed on the throne of Greece by the allies—new boundaries fixed.—Ibrahim of Egypt takes St. Jean d'Acre and Damaskus.—Unsettled state of Europe continues.—About 6 000 souls carried off by the Indian Cholera in Quebec and Montreal, from June to September; ravages in the country parts of the district of Montreal and some parishes in that of Quebec—spreads throughout the United States; great mortality at Charleston and New Orleans from cholera and fever.

1832

First reformed parliament of Great Britain ; Many changes in the laws ; Bank Charter modified ; China trade opened. Emancipation of Slaves in the West Indies. Martial Law passed for Ireland, enforced in Kilkenny. Cholera re-appeared in London and in Ireland, but not very fatal. Continued negotiations on the separation of Holland and Belgium.— Powers interfere to arrest the progress of the Pacha of Egypt. The large fleets evacuate the Bosphorus and the Pacha retires. Don Pedro takes Oporto and Lisbon—Donna Maria is recognised Queen of Portugal by England and France, leaves Paris and London and arrives at Lisbon. Don Miguel driven out of Portugal. Ferdinand of Spain dies : Queen regent ; Don Carlos fighting for the throne, and intestine war in the north of Spain. Cholera and yellow fever at New Orleans, Mexico, &c. Mr. Stanley succeeds Lord Goderich as Colonial Minister.
