If we ignore it, maybe it will just go away.

Variations within series can be intriguing

It has been said so many times; a single stamp does not necessarily mean the completion of the set or issue. Nothing illustrates this better than the United States definitives first issued in 1908 and in particular the first three denominations of the issue.

There were 12 denominations to the original series. Imperfs and coils were added. Then along came a printing on bluish paper and another on watermarked paper along with variations of coil stamps. It just never seems to end.

Eventually the design of the three cent purple was settled on for the domestic rate post-

ge. So what you had basically was one cent green, two cent carmine and three cent violet all of the same design. There were other denominations but these three are the ones that will require the most work to identify.

The easiest way to sort out these stamps is to first identify the perforations. Once complete the type must be determined. For instance, the two cent denomination of the original is

perforated 12 as is the 1910 issue and the 1912 stamps. The difference is the 1908 stamps are water marked with a double lined USPS whereas the 1910 and 1912 issues are watermarked with a single line USPS. The difference between the 1910 issue and that of 1912 is the type. The catalogue illustrates the types and the differences are minute. It comes down to shading lines and dots.

This particular series of definitive stamps ran from 1908 to 1920 and the United States never printed anything in small quantity. While catalogue prices might indicate the whole to be an exercise in futility, one may on the other hand receive a great deal of satisfaction in putting together a somewhat inexpensive yet rewarding study of the series.

If your patience allows you to pursue the study of these stamps, you may then want to go back to the earlier issues of U.S. stamps that have grills pressed into the paper and paper variations. These stamps are more expensive and a great deal harder on the eyes.

Interest in U.S. stamps requires a few tools the most important of which is a specialized catalogue of American stamps. It's not necessary to own a new copy. The early issues are what you are interested in so a five or six year old copy can be purchased for a few dollars. You'll also need a watermark detector, a good magnifying glass and perfora-

tion gauge.

The same rule of one stamp does not a series make also applies to Canadian stamps but in a slightly different way. The Small Queen issue for example is very complicated for it has two printings — Montreal and Ottawa. Each denomination also has several color differences. Perforations and papers play a large part in the study of the series.

One of the more interesting and inexpensive series of Canadian stamps to collect is the King George V Admiral issue of 1911. There are just enough color, perforation and size variations to make it worthwhile spending time on. Bundles of the lower denominations can be picked up for a minimum amount of money. The finds are interesting.

A watermark detector is not required for these stamps but a perforation gauge, metric ruler and a good magnifying glass are a must. This is standard

equipment for all stamps though. What is suggested for the Admiral issue is the acquisition of literature over and above that found in standard Canadian postage stamp catalogues. Some of the best material was written by Hans Reiche. A study group within the framework of the British North America Philatelic Society has just recently formed. This definitely would be a good place to start.

This type of stamp collecting will certainly encourage you to continue long after you may otherwise think you have a completed collection. I do agree that matching a stamp to a picture on an album can become boring. Finding differences in stamps of the same denomination within the same issue becomes intriguing.

A chapel and a church host upcoming concerts

LENNOXVILLE — Organist Jean Le Buis plays an afternoon recital at Bishop's University's St. Mark's Chapel on Sunday.

The Montreal musician will perform original works as well as pieces by Dietrich Buxtehude and John Stanley on the recently installed Karl Wilhelm organ.

Le Buis, who teaches at the Conservatoire de musique du Québec à Montréal, has frequently recorded his original works and interpretations of early music for CBC radio.

He is also substitute organist at the parish of St-Léon de Westmount and at the Cistercian Abby in Oka, and is a member of the executive committee of Les Amis de l'orgue in Montréal.

Sunday's recital begins at 3 p.m. Tickets are available by calling (819) 822-9692, 822-9660 and at the door.

Admission is \$10 regular, \$7 seniors, free for students. All proceeds from the concert will go to the organ fund.

SHERBROOKE — The Orchestre de chambre presents Concertos and Divertissements at St-Andrew's Presbyterian Church on February 10.

The group's first concert of the new year will be conducted by Quebec City native Claude Lapalme.

The highlight of the program is the famous "Brandenburg Concerto no. 5" by J.S. Bach, with featured Townships soloists Marie Bergeron on flute, Marc Bélanger on violin and Mary O'Keeffe on harpsichord.

Electric youths light up Townships stages

Like Father,
Like Son

Marc Bernier is well-known in the Townships as the dedicated conductor of the Sherbrooke Symphony Choir. Now his son François is following his father's footsteps as conductor of a new music ensemble, Prestissimo.

Formed by the younger Bernier, it groups 35 students from universities, CEGEPs and conservatories in Sherbrooke and Montreal — with one from Three Rivers. Most of them are present or former residents of the Townships.

The name Prestissimo, the fastest musical movement, was chosen to symbolize the youthful energy of its members.

The debut concert of this new orchestra takes place on Sunday, February 4, at 2:30 p.m. at the Granada Theatre in Sherbrooke.

François plans to continually change the configuration of the ensemble according to the repertoire to be played. At its first concert, Prestissimo will, at times, resemble a chamber orchestra, highlighting the strings, and at other times, a classical orchestra with the stringed, woodwind and brass instruments all getting their share of the spotlight.

On the program for Sunday's show is Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's "Magic Flute", Joseph Haydn's "Symphony no. 104", Arcangelo Corelli's "Concerto grosso no. 8" and "Fantasy on the theme of Greensleeves" by Vaughan Williams.

As well, Prestissimo will be joined on stage by 60 of the 130 members of the Sherbrooke Symphony Choir to interpret Antonio Vivaldi's "Gloria", featuring guest soloist Dominique Chamberland, a young Sherbrooke soprano.

François, a student at McGill University, said although these musicians get a great deal of pleasure out of playing together, they are not in the group just for fun. These are musicians well on their way to careers in the field and Prestissimo is part of their professional development.

For a Sunday afternoon treat, catch these 100 musicians on stage, all led by budding young conductor François Bernier. See what these electric youths have to offer.

The 11th annual Theatre Activ festival of one-act plays presented by Bishop's University's drama students at Studio Theatre last week had a few surprises up its sleeve.

One of the very best shows in the fest was Harold Pinter's *One For The Road*, an uncomfortable play about an intelligent, off-balanced interrogator putting the screws on a couple and their son in separate sessions. It works thanks in large part to the assured acting of its four-member cast, particularly Malcolm Bisiker, who shines in the difficult role of the interrogator. Adrian Greenlaw didn't have much to say, but proved to have tremendous presence. The two were ably supported by Alicia Dart and Isabelle Lussier. All the elements were masterfully directed by Vanessa C. White into a cohesive whole.

Two pleasant surprises were plays written by Bishop's drama students — *The Same...*

Only Family by James Duncan and *Kidstuff* by Alison Porter.

Duncan's dramatic reunion of two adult brothers and their senile father was filled with comedy and tenderness. John Reid gave a standout performance as the father, who's happy to have his two sons under the same roof even if they can't stop fighting. Reid displayed a good sense of comic timing and was a dear to watch. The characterizations of the sons, played by Drew Aaslepp and Richard Long, still needs some work. Between the dialogue and the performances, they simply didn't ring true.

Porter's *Kidstuff* was a laugh riot thanks to its comic performances, particularly by Sarah Lynn Macdonald and Art Maughan as psychotic pro-

fessors at a private school. Macdonald, in particular, left an indelible mark as an unbalanced teacher who steals a student's lunch box and blackmails him with it. A serious subtext illuminating man's indecency to man bubbles under Porter's broad comedy.

The media's indecency to people is the subject of *Tone Clusters* by Joyce Carol Oates, a biting satire on TV media with a pretentious interviewer (heard in voice only) asking philosophical questions to a man and woman whose 20-year-old son has murdered a 14-year-old girl. The funny thing about this play is it mocked the parents and their prejudices as much as the media. Blair Varden, Jennifer Khouri and Gavin Fearon as the interviewer did standout jobs.

Another play featuring a character in voice only was

English Made Simple, a hilarious piece by David Ives illustrating how men and women communicate. It was well-acted by Brad Cowan, Heather Coutts and Philip Sword as the voice of the communications professor.

Tell Me Another Story... Sing Me A Song, by Jean Lennox Toddie, was a touching look at a mother-daughter relationship throughout the years, played well by Julie Miller and Monika Franssen.

Trifles, by Susan Glaspell, moved at a snail's pace. Unfortunately since this is a fascinating play dealing with how women are underestimated by the men in society, all the more remarkable since it was written in the early 1900s. The cast seemed fine but failed to breathe any life into the work.

Also presented at the festival was Colleen Curran's *Amelia Earhart Was Not A Spy*, directed by Stacey Fownes.

Paulette Carlson and Highway 101 debut, again

When Paulette Carlson and her former group Highway 101 went their separate ways in 1991, they left fans very disappointed.

Together they recorded several number one hits, including "Cry, Cry, Cry", "The Bed You Made For Me" and "Who's Lonely Now", took home CMA Awards and were almost ready to hit superstar status.

At that point Carlson decided to go for a solo career but there were also other things on her mind.

"I like men a whole lot, but I just couldn't be one of the guys so I got lonesome and I started wanting to have a family," said the blond singer in a recent interview.

Of course Highway 101 found a replacement with Nicki Nelson and kept on recording and touring but with far less success. Carlson began her solo career but did not get the success she expected. On the other hand, her wish for a family came true — she and husband Randy Smith are raising their daughter Cali Gabriel, 4.

Some good news for fans is that Highway 101, which won two consecutive Country Music Association Awards as Vocal Group of the Year, has reunited with its former singer, calling themselves Paulette Carlson and Highway 101.

NEW YEAR'S DEBUT

Carlson and two other original members, Jack Daniels (guitar) and Curtis Stone (bass), made their re-debut in Music City, Nashville, at a sold-out New Year Eve's Party. Nice hook here, a brand new year for the re-birth of a great band.

Although Carlson and the band had discussed getting

back together for over a year, it took them a good part of 1995 to patch things up. Then, around mid-summer, drummer Scott "Cactus" Moser announced his intention not to re-join the band.

The trio hit the recording studio in September, recorded an album titled *Reunited*, and a music video has already been filmed. The new album is scheduled to be released in March, and then they'll definitely hit the road.

Their plans for touring are still in the formative stages, but will begin with a few performances in Nashville and the mid-West, followed by a European tour this summer.

Female singers dominate Juno nominations

TORONTO (CP) — The blockbuster international success of Canada's female singers was recognized on home turf Wednesday as the country's music industry rolled out the names of the 1996 Juno nominees.

Shania Twain, midriff-baring country-rock crooner, led the pack with seven nods while rock sensation Alanis Morissette was right behind her with six nominations. Inuk singer Susan Aglukark earned five.

International superstar Celine Dion snared four, including female singer of the year, an honor she's already won four times.

Last year's big Juno winner Jann Arden added another three nominations.

More than 1,000 nominations in 37 categories were

announced by the Canadian Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences. The 25th annual Juno ceremony is being hosted by multiple-Juno winner Anne Murray on March 10 in Hamilton, where it will be open to the public for the second year in a row.

This year's picks reflect the phenomenal success of home-grown talent in the past year, particularly of female performers, academy president Lee Silversides said.

"Canada's musical future has never looked so promising," he told an audience filled with music industry representatives who watched video clips of past Juno highlights.

Only a handful of nominees attended Wednesday's ceremony at the CBC Broadcast Centre, but Twain, Morissette, Arden, k.d. lang, Tom Cochrane, Our Lady Peace, The Ran-

kin Family and Gordon Lightfoot are scheduled to perform for the live broadcast on CBC television.

Twain's second album, *The Woman in Me*, produced by her husband Mutt Lange, has sold 700,000 copies in Canada and more than 2.5 million in the United States, where it's topped country music charts and had crossover success on rock music charts.

It's already earned her numerous accolades, including five Canadian Country Music Awards. On Monday, she was named best new country artist at the American Music Awards and she's a quadruple nominee at next month's Grammy Awards.

Born in Windsor, Ont., and raised in the Northern Ontario town of Timmins, Twain, who now lives in Lake Placid, N.Y., squares off against Morissette

in the entertainer, album, single, singer and songwriter categories.

Twain is also nominated for best country singer and best-selling album, which includes foreign releases.

Vying with Twain and Morissette for top vocalist are Aglukark, Dion and Rita MacNeil.

The Ottawa-born Morissette's multi-million selling *Jagged Little Pill* is also nominated for best rock album.

Morissette, who also lives stateside, has a half-dozen Grammy nominations, including best new artist, a category she won at the Juno podium four years ago while she was still a teen dance pop diva.

Morissette, on tour in the U.S., gave a three-word response to the Juno news: "I love Canada," a spokesman for Warner Music said. She's

expected to play a gig in Ottawa around Juno time, he said.

While female performers stacked up the majority of high-profile nods, perennial Juno favorite Bryan Adams added four more notches to his guitar.

Tom Cochrane, Ashley MacIsaac, Neil Young, Charlie Major, Colin James, Mario Pelchat and opera superstar Ben Heppner each grabbed two nominations.

"I'm totally amazed. These were my first solo outings and they were both nominated. I would have been thrilled if one had been nominated let alone two," said Heppner.

The Rankin Family, Headstones, The Tea Party, Blue Rodeo and Odds are up for best group.

The Tea Party and Odds are nominated in two other categories.

Richmond photographer subject of major retrospective exhibit

Richard Foss captures slices of country life

RICHMOND — When Richard Foss looks back at a career that has spanned more than 25 years, all he can see are negatives.

Thousands of them.

The photographer distilled a quarter-century of collected work for his first major retrospective exhibit, *Ombre, Lumière, Vie*, which begins at the Richmond Arts Centre Saturday.

"I've been printing pictures I've never printed before," said the Montreal native at his home in Richmond, where he's resided the better part of his life.

Foss' photos are slices of country living. He aims for a simplicity in composition and softness of focus. Though on first viewing, his work seems to feature an unlimited array of subjects, a universal theme does emerge: Foss captures animals — human and otherwise — in their natural environments. Be it exuberant children at play, a proud baker displaying his daily loaves, curious pigs peering at the lens, obedient ducks waiting for their leader's next move or a quaint shot of a woman and her bulldog sporting the same facial expression, his prints exude warmth as they celebrate life.

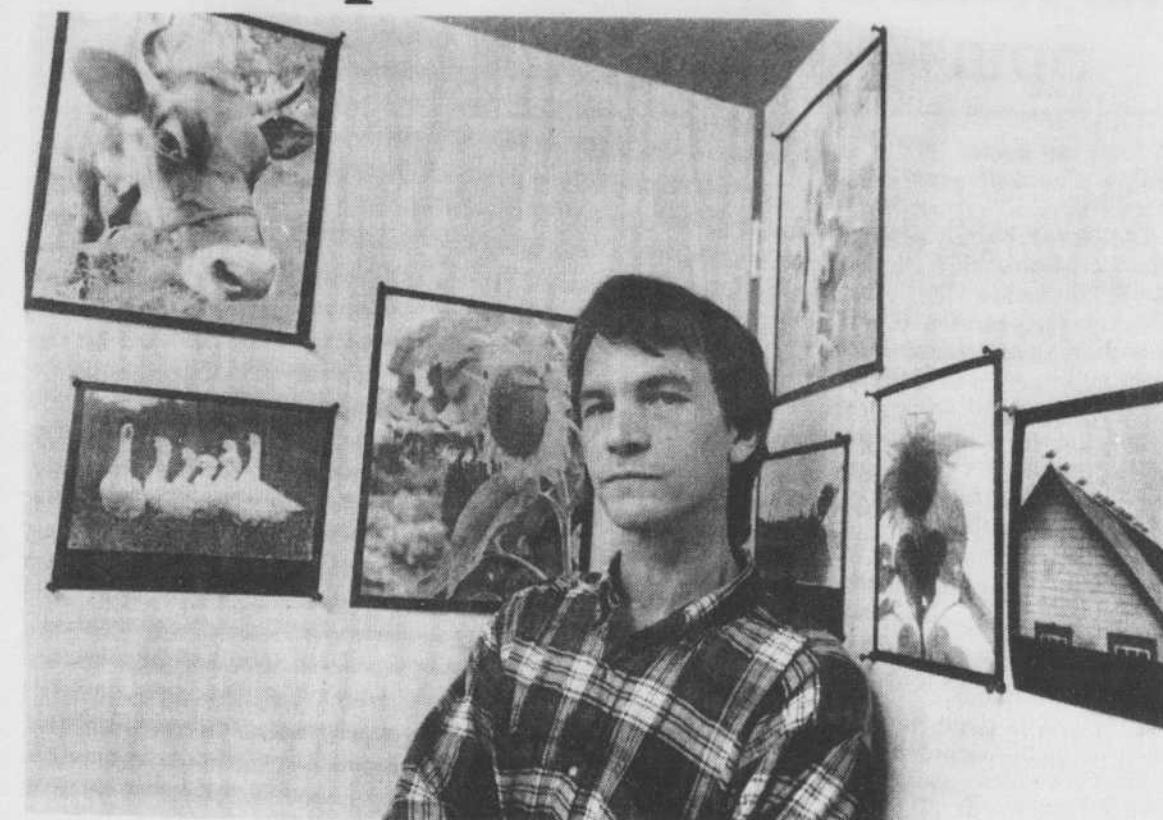
"I like to take pictures that I think someone else is going to like, that will do something for them psychologically," said Foss. "I'm not trying to make powerful social statements about negative things. I want them to have a picture to put on the wall that would be interesting to look at even after a long period of time."

Though on first viewing, his work seems to feature an unlimited array of subjects, a universal theme does emerge: Foss captures animals — human and otherwise — in their natural environments.

STRIKING

Perhaps Foss' most striking work in the exhibit is a three-dimensional piece featuring a gathering of horses. He took the shot on a whim while out driving one day, enlarged it, sliced it into nine squares, affixed them on blocks of varying thicknesses and then mounted the whole onto a frame. The effect is stunning.

"What I try to get is something that is visually interesting and if I can have living creatures in it," Foss said is what he looks for. "I just try to combine whatever I see and put them in an interesting pat-

tern of black and white."

What makes Foss' exhibit different is that all the photos are shrink-wrapped rather than framed or laminated. This means he can charge the relatively low price of \$20 a shot, allowing the buyer to decide how to mount it. The 3-D pic sells for \$100.

NUMEROUS HONORS

Foss has garnered numerous awards for his work over the years, including first prize in a contest organized by the Montreal Gazette newspaper in 1993. His winning print featured a gathering of goats admiring a proud duck in Bonsecours. Foss' life seemed to have come full circle with this win; he delivered the Gazette for

endeavors is taking pictures of kids at the nursery school his children attended. The single father helps take care of his 14-year-old boy, and two girls, 12 and 8.

CHILDHOOD INFLUENCES

Foss' own childhood influences have unconsciously found their way into his work.

His father, an Alcan director, moved the family around the world, first to India when Foss was nine months old and then to Japan when he was four. They lived there until he was 11 and the longer stay has informed his art to this day.

Foss fell in love with Japanese sumi paintings, watercolors brushed onto highly absorbant

paper giving the work a soft, hazy effect.

"That has influenced how I print. I saw so much of it and it's evident in all my prints," said Foss, adding he doesn't purposely try to achieve that effect. "It's just there."

Foss is constantly striving to achieve perfection in his art and he often rehearses his technique at home.

"I have the camera empty and I go through the act of taking pictures from start to finish, practicing focussing quickly, taking picture without shaking camera."

A new area Foss has gotten into is tinting some of his pictures.

"That's great," he said. "It makes you feel like an artist."

If Foss is uncertain of the label of "artist", it's partially due to the public's perception of photography.

"I think people have a certain attitude towards photographs. They think they'd like to buy something that's one of a kind, so why buy a photo, even though they do that with every other item. People would say, 'That's nice but I could do that.'"

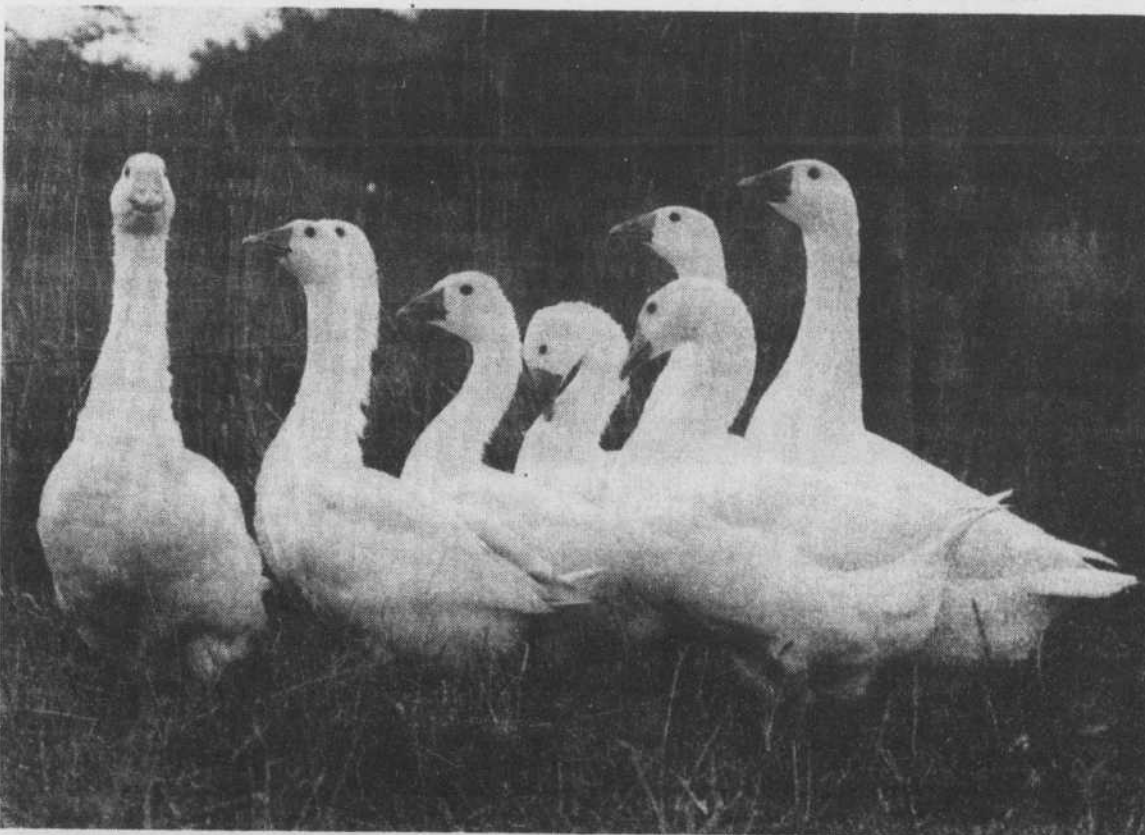
Foss said this attitude makes it tough to earn a living, which is why he also works as a jeweler-maker.

"Jewelry is a dynamite market," said Foss, who transforms silver and semi-precious stones into elegant adornments.

He sells his baubles to wholesalers who then distribute it to shops, such as the Musée de la civilisation boutique in Quebec City. Foss also sets up booths at community events such as Lennoxville's Friendship Day.

"It's tedious," he said of jewelry-making, "but it's great because it gives me freedom."

Ombre, Lumière, Vie, the Richard Foss photography exhibit, is on display in the Galerie Courant d'Art at the Richmond Arts Centre, 1010 Main St. N., Richmond. Vernissage: Saturday, Feb. 3, from 5-7. The gallery is open during concerts at the centre. Upcoming shows include the Ensemble Anonymus medieval music group on Feb. 11 and the Drummondville Symphony Orchestra on Feb. 13. five years as a teenager.

Two new releases celebrate Canadian music

Canadian Press writers review recent CD releases.

OH WHAT A FEELING — A VITAL COLLECTION OF CANADIAN MUSIC (MCA and HERE AND NOW — A CELEBRATION OF CANADIAN MUSIC (Sony)

Canadian music. At one time it was almost an eye-rolling phrase that prompted people to reach for their radio dials.

No longer.

The proof lies in these two CD box sets showcasing the diversity of performers ranging from stadium draws to little-known independent artists.

The just-released *Oh What a Feeling* includes 77 songs spanning 25 years of recording by a Who's Who in Canadian pop music.

Despite the corny title, the four-disc set is crammed with enough Canadiana to keep even the most die-hard nationalist waving the flag for hours, though not because the lyrics offer much clue as to the country of origin.

The first disc starts with a curious choice for a Canadiana collection, "American Woman" by The Guess Who, and moves

on to tunes better left in the vault, including Trooper's "Raise a Little Hell".

The Poppy Family's "Which Way You Going Bill" or Andy Kim's "Rock Me Gently" are other reminders of a time in Canadian music some would rather forget, particularly when contrasted with more recent material on disc four from Jann Arden, Sarah McLachlan, Moist or Alanis Morissette's "You Oughta Know".

The grand sweep of the box set deftly illustrates Canada's rich pop music heritage, though it opts solely for the big names and ignores the vast array of indie talent.

Here and Now, on the other hand, a compilation dedicated to the 50th anniversary of the United Nations, devotes three full CDs to Canadian artists with independent releases.

The fourth disc is devoted to "great Canadian artists who

have influenced contemporary music," featuring the likes of legendary pianist Glenn Gould and jazzman Moe Koffman.

The Canada Council held a contest that saw some 370 applications from contemporary Canadian musicians covering a wide range of genres, including folk, jazz, world music, classical and aboriginal music.

While there are some recognizable names — the First Nations duo Kashtin, for example — most are not.

Yet there are veteran session musicians with international reputations who are certainly no less important Canadian voices than those artists with household names.

The superb quality of the recordings illustrates further there is a flourishing and vital music scene in this country most Canadians will never get to hear — unless they sample this collection.

DEAD MAN WALKING: Various Artists (Columbia)

Actor-director Tim Robbins has lined up an impressive roster of musical talent for his latest movie, *Dead Man Walking*, though it's a stretch to call this album of 12 original songs a soundtrack.

Only four of the tracks by the likes of Bruce Springsteen, Tom Waits, Patti Smith, Johnny Cash and Pearl Jam's Eddie Vedder are actually heard in the film.

Nonetheless, the package captures the mood of a story about a death-row inmate played by Sean Penn.

"I help drag them when they cannot stand," Steve Earle sings in the acoustic "Ellis Unit One", told from the point of view of a death-row prison guard brought to life with Earle's vivid details. (Earle does have his own first-hand

experience of life behind bars after his arrest in Nashville two years ago for crack possession.)

Two of the most intriguing cuts belong to Vedder paired with Nusrat Fateh Ali Khan, South Asia's most popular singer. The mosh pit superstar alternates anguished wails with the Pakistani singer in the spiritual "Face of Love", a song that proves Vedder is a lot more than just a grunge God.

ACE OF BASE: The Bridge (Arista/BMG)

Close your eyes. Real tight. Now listen.

Do visions of platinum hair and white polyester suits spring to mind?

Yes, the Swedish popmeisters who could be Abba are back with another 15 sugary tunes sure to delight fans and baffle critics in equal measures of wonderment.

"Beautiful Life", with its pulsating rhythms and uptempo-reggae beat, is already loved by Dancing Queens everywhere.

Some may mock the syrupy, feel-good refrain: "It's a beautiful life, ooh, It's a beautiful life, ooh." But selling 19 million copies of a debut album (*Happy Nation*) may cause a certain *joie-de-vivre*.

"Never Gonna Say I'm Sorry" and "My Deja Vu", with its teaser "All That She Wants" (is another baby) opening, are popular requests at dance clubs across the country.

Ace of Base, closing in on a \$100-million-a-year industry in Sweden, need never ask anyone to Take a Chance on them.

TORI AMOS: Boys For Pele (Warner)

Amos faced her stormy past on two previous albums, *Little*

Earthquakes and *Under the Pink*, and here again presents herself as a latter-day Mary Magdalene who shoulders the pain of all women.

But if Amos wants to take up the mantle of universal mother, she should at least try to make her message intelligible.

If this album made any sense it might be called pretentious — as it is it's about as profound as the mythic doughnut hole Amos sings about.

Amos claims this album is a "jump off a cliff" musically, but it's no different from her familiar barrage of harpsichord, piano and susurrations of vocal fairy dust. Hiccups might work for Bjork, but Amos comes off sounding like a low-rent Kate Bush.

Although this album is supposedly a paean to the strength of Pele, a volcano goddess, Amos spends most of the time reverentially whispering arcane lyrics like: "I need some voodoo on these prunes." Almost all the songs are sung in a grating cobweb falsetto.

It's unfortunate, because Amos has a beautiful and powerful voice when she uses it. Only the poignant love song "Hey Jupiter" is happily devoid of vocal hijinks and showcases her true talents.

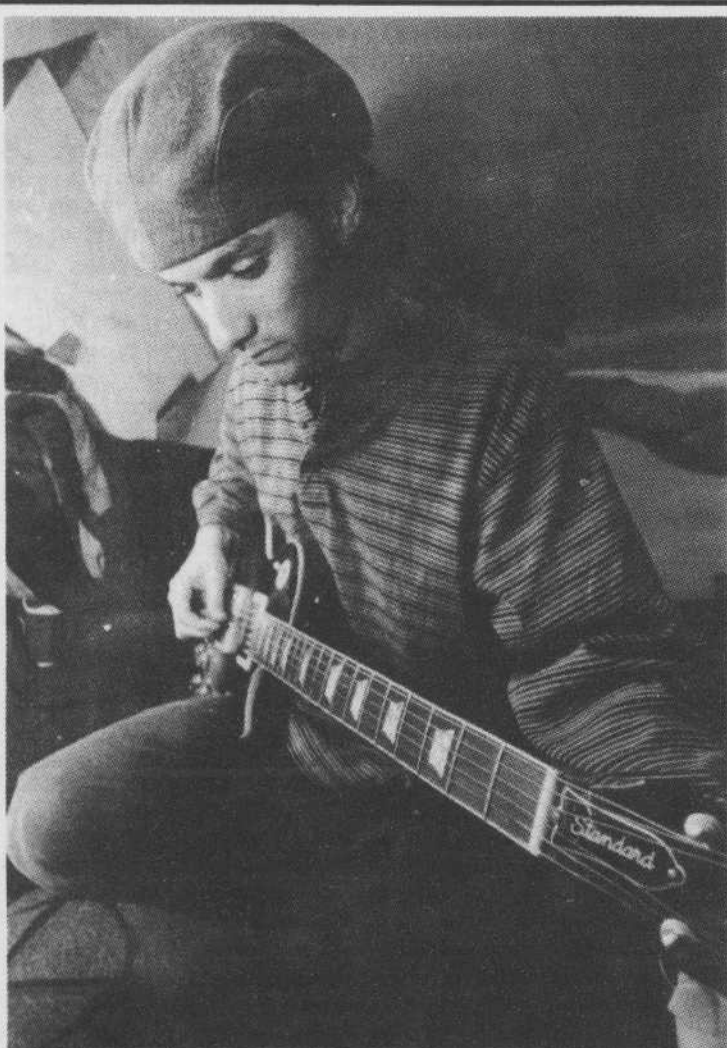
The result isn't the in-joke vanity project you'd expect, although the boys do have their tongues planted firmly in cheek for many rich tunes.

Canadian books in demand across the globe

TORONTO (CP) — Back in 1969, Farley and Claire Mowat found themselves stuck behind a stalled truck in the middle of a storm in a remote part of Siberia. Author and wife got out to investigate.

"You're not going to believe this but there, on the seat, he had a copy of *Never Cry Wolf*," Mowat recalls (in Russian it's called *Wolves, Please Don't Cry*).

Mowat was one of the first of contemporary Canadian writers to be widely read abroad, being translated into Russian, German and Japanese as early as the 1960s and '70s.

These days everyone from Carol Shields to Margaret Atwood to Robert Munsch has a worldwide audience of devoted readers.

Foreign rights sales make up only part of Canada's literary exports. Export sales of books published and printed in Cana-

da reached \$116 million in 1994, a threefold increase over four years, with most of the sales in the United States.

That's about the same as exports of Canadian footwear (\$118 million) and more than handtools (\$55 million) or pulp wood (\$18.9 million) in the same year.

But the most exportable of books actually published in Canada are those that are least Canadian in style and subject, says Anna Porter, who heads Key Porter Books:

"We sell a lot of outdoorsy books, books on hockey, on canoeing, wolves, bears, birds — 'critter' books, we call them

"Unfortunately, the books that are of Canadian social cultural significance — that's what we are going to be doing less of.

"There are very few things that will kill a book more quickly in the U.S. than the mention of Canada. We've sold

translation rights to our Chretien biography in Japan and Korea and we have sold copies of our English-language edition in the U.K., but zip in the U.S."

Foreign rights sales of Canadian authors took off in the 1980s. Today, all of Canada's major authors — and many who aren't household names here — are read abroad.

Pauline Gedge has a devoted following in France and Germany with sales much in excess of what she has sold in Canada for her historical romances set in ancient Egypt.

Novelists Michael Ondaatje, Carol Shields and Jane Urquhart have won literary prizes in England and France.

Robertson Davies has appeared in 19 languages, says the late author's secretary, Moira Whelan.

The quality of the translation is often the key to foreign popularity.

Mordecai Richler's Joshua

Then and Now is one of Hungary's most popular books, thanks in large part to the slangy Budapest street argot his Hungarian translator, Elga Srkzi, has employed.

John Ralston Saul's *Voltair's Bastards* became a bestseller in Italy after being translated into a clear, precise Italian by a University of Pisa mathematician.

Laura Forconi, a translator and literature teacher in Siena, says Nino Ricci is another favorite in Italy, in part because he has found a very competent translator from Abruzzi, the region where his Governor General's Award-winning *Lives of the Saints* is set.

Canadian children's books more adventurous

TORONTO (CP) — Lionel Koffler, the publisher of Toronto-based Firefly, says the success of Canadian children's books abroad is easy to explain.

"Our publishers and authors

are much more adventurous and willing to try fresh subjects."

Many subjects are considered taboo by U.S. librarians and publishers, Koffler says.

"We have found ways of doing it — Groundwood, Annick, KidsCan, Tundra have all had great success in the States."

Koffler offers an example of what he calls the immaturity of some U.S. publishers:

"Maurice Sendak wrote a book called *One Swell Pup* about a brother and sister who get a new puppy, which shows in one illustration that the puppy had urinated on the floor.

"Well, there was such an outcry the book was withdrawn and hasn't been in print since. It showed a little yellow puddle, that's all.

"That gives you an idea of what U.S. publishers, booksellers and librarians find unacceptable."

For movie hits, look for two under "U"

Steven Seagal is back as Casey Ryback, the world's most dangerous cook in *Under Siege 2: Dark Territory*, new on video from Warner.

The former Navy SEAL and now supposedly mild-mannered chef does for trains what he did on a warship last time around.

A mercenary-madman (Talk Radio's Eric Bogosian) hijacks a cross-country luxury train and converts it to a rolling com-

mand post. His plan is to commandeer a secret weapons satellite and hire out its death-ray capabilities to global terrorist groups. He'll blow up everything from airliners to the Pentagon for the right price.

Ah, but he didn't count on Ryback, the one-man SWAT team, to be on the passenger list and foil his evil doings. Sea-

gal is Seagal as usual, a one-note black-suited pony-tailed martial-arts hero.

But *Dark Territory* serves up some applause-worthy stunts and special effects, including a smashing finale as two high-speed trains collide head-on on an elevated trestle.

The Usual Suspects (PolyGram) — The phrase stylish thriller gets overworked these days. But the expression seems coined for this sly suspense

film that asks one of the year's most frequently heard movie questions: who is Keyser Soze?

Well, he's the shadowy nasty behind a complex plot involving drug-dealing, duplicity and assassination.

And he's just one of an impressive cast that includes Stephen Baldwin, Kevin Pollak, Kevin Spacey, Chazz Palminteri and Gabriel Byrne.

The Usual Suspects boasts the biggest movie guessing game since the surprise twist of *The Crying Game*. The film sneaked through the theatres with little notice, but its cleverness has spread by word of mouth and it should be a major video-rental hit.

Star Trek Memories (Paramount) — To celebrate the 30th anniversary of the TV premiere of Gene Roddenberry's *Star Trek*, Paramount has a year of release events planned. This includes William Shatner's *Star Trek Memories*, a behind-the-scenes tape based on his book of the same name.

The studio is dropping the retail price of the widescreen versions of the first six theatrical films and is bringing out *Star Trek Generations* in a letterboxed format and at a sell-through price.

Patrick Stewart will host a space documentary called *From Here to Infinity: The Ultimate Voyage*, while Jonathan Frakes will take viewers behind the scenes in *Journey's End: The Saga of Star Trek, the Next Generation*.

A new video gift set will contain the pilot and the last episodes of the *Next Genera-*

tion sequel series, while episodes 79 through 106 will be available, priced to sell.

And finally later in the year, true Trekkers can look for two batches of *Deep Space 9* programs.

Also new on video:

Desperado (Columbia TriStar) — Novice director Robert Rodriguez did such a bang-up job on his cheap "home movie" *El Mariachi*, he was bankrolled to do a big-budget version. Antonio Banderas stars as the no-name tight-lipped gunman who hunts down drug dealers. Mostly style over substance, but what style! Some great cameos from Quentin Tarantino and Steve Buscemi too.

Martha and Ethel (Malo-film) — A touching documentary about two elderly former nannies, one German, the other a southern black. After a lifetime of service to well-off families, both women are taken care of in their old age. But the contrast in their treatment is notable, as were the differences in their caregiver styles. One is still considered the help, the other has been practically adopted as a family elder.

Jonathan Swift's satire still pertinent

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Amid much hoopla, the 280-year-old *Gulliver's Travels* reaches TV screens with most of its story and much of Jonathan Swift's vigorous satire intact.

Previous depictions have focused on Lemuel Gulliver's adventures among the tiny people of Lilliput and the giants of Brobdingnag. The NBC version — on CTV Sunday and Monday, Feb. 4 and 5, at 9 p.m. — carries him all the way to the noble, horsey Houyhnhnms and the subhuman Yahoos, then back to England, where he is put on trial for derangement because of his incredible tales.

Although the \$30-million production exploits the adventure, Swift's blistering attack on 18th-century England underscores the events, and those views remain pertinent almost 300 years later.

Ted Danson stars as the long-suffering Gulliver, and Mary Steenburgen as his loyal wife Mary. The supporting cast is replete with famous performers: Peter O'Toole, Omar Sharif, John Gielgud, Geraldine Chaplin, Alfre Woodard, Ned Beatty, Edward Woodward, James Fox.

If the stately castles and sweeping plains of *Gulliver's Travels* seem fresh to movies, that's because they were filmed in Portugal.

"There are some incredible castles there that have not been seen in films," Steenburgen explained. Although her scenes were shot in London, she spent time in Portugal with

her husband, Danson.

"Also, the castles could be copied in miniature," she added. "A lot of the location choices on the film had to do with the necessity of shooting things from the perspective of a giant and the perspective of a tiny person."

Steenburgen was spared the ordeal of long hours before a blue screen, which is later filled with special effects. That was her husband's task.

For Danson, *Gulliver's Travels* was a far cry from standing behind the bar at *Cheers*. Because he spent much of the time talking to Lilliputians or Brobdingnagians, he couldn't do "eye-lines" — looking eye-to-eye with other actors.

"If he did a scene with Peter O'Toole (a Lilliputian)," said Steenburgen, "O'Toole was on the ground. Ted was on a scaffolding 80 feet tall, shouting through a megaphone down at him. It was incredibly complicated and challenging."

As Mary Gulliver, Steenburgen spends much of the movie yearning for her husband's return and fending off the advances of the evil Dr. Bates (James Fox), who is eager to declare her husband insane so he can marry her. Only in the late moments, when she defends her husband, is she allowed some drama.

"It was never going to be the greatest role of my career, and I knew that going in," she said. "What I did was to inject something more romantic between the two of us that wasn't in the script originally — without going so far that it made it untrue."

Jonathan Swift was no help in the romance department. The author, she observed, was

"almost misogynistic in the way he wrote the wife. . . . It's almost disturbingly dismissive

of women."

Gulliver's Travels airs on CTV on February 4 and 5 at 9 p.m.

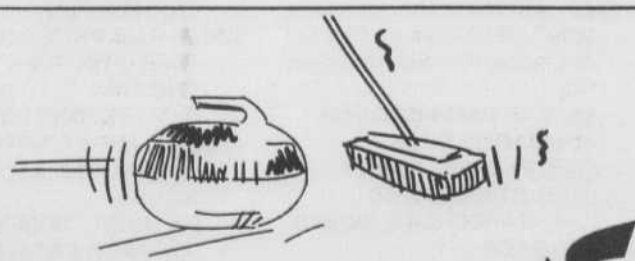
