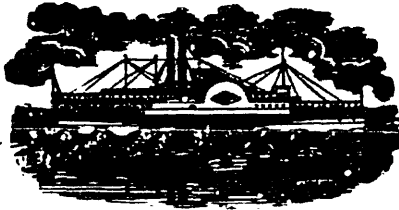
As usual the book will be found divided into three parts, viz. : (1) The Street Directory ; (2) The Alphabetical Directory ; (3) Miscellaneous Information.
