# Lennon rebuttal documented in feature-length film

NEW YORK (AP)—*The Lives of John Lennon*, Albert Goldman's account of an angry, drug-crazed Lennon from Liverpool to his death on a New York City street, has produced fierce rebuttals from Yoko Ono and Paul McCartney.

Next month, Lennon adds his voice — posthumously — in *Imagine: John Lennon*, a feature-

length film in which the subject emerges as narrator.

The film, to be released Oct. 7, grew out of Yoko Ono's offer to producer David Wolper of what he describes as "two boxcars" of material from Lennon's archives: writings, film and photographs, many never released, many taken by John or Yoko.

Lennon, according to the producer and to Goldman, led "one of the best-documented lives of our

time."

Although Goldman relied on multiple sources, Wolper's choice was to let Lennon speak for himself and guide the viewer through the film.

"We're not saying Goldman was right or wrong about this or that. See the movie and tell me you believe he was a liar and a junkie," said Andrew Solt, director of *Imagine*.

## MAKES CLAIMS

In *The Lives of John Lennon*, the author asserts:

—Lennon and Yoko Ono were on the verge of divorce when he was killed by Mark David Chapman on Dec. 8, 1980.

—His public image as "house-husband" from 1975-80 was entirely contrived; he was instead an anorexic and drug user who spurned contact with his son, Sean.

—Ono had two affairs in the final years of their marriage, a time during which she was hiding a heroin addiction from John. She has since admitted having a drug problem during this time.

—Ono arranged Paul McCartney's 1980 marijuana bust in Japan.

—And, Lennon was bisexual, and

had his first homosexual experience with Beatles' manager Brian Epstein.

"John will be hurt by this book. These people in this book are not us. It's not John and me," said Ono in a nationally broadcast rebuttal of the book — a program Goldman dismissed as "a predictable performance."

McCartney, who urged a boycott of the book, said on NBC's *Today* show: "Obviously, he's not here to defend himself. And I think that's a big problem with a book like that. It's too cheap a shot, I think."

The strongest rebuttal comes in the film from Lennon himself, according to those involved in *Imagine*.

"He's the only one who can say what the truth was," said Solt. "He tells his own story. It's up there on the screen. You can judge for yourself."

It's ironic that a life so well-documented — Lennon and Yoko recorded almost everything they did — could be the subject of such violently diverse interpretations.

## WRITES EXPOSE

And it's amazing Goldman could have written an expose about a man who spent his life exposing himself, literally on the cover of

Two Virgins and figuratively in such songs as *Jealous Guy*, *Cold Turkey*, *Mother and Help!*

In the film, built around footage shot in 1971 when *Imagine* was being recorded at Lennon's estate in England, Lennon freely admits to having lived an often unhappy, debauched, violent life. He's also candid about the Beatles.

At a 1963 news conference, the Beatles are asked if they planned to adapt their act for their upcoming American tour. "We haven't really got an act," Lennon answered. "We just do what we do."

But by the time of their 1964 Shea Stadium concert, Lennon says they were unable to hear themselves playing. Lennon, who earlier pronounced the Beatles the best rock 'n' roll band in the world, admits: "We couldn't do it anymore."

Whatever the state of John Lennon's soul when he died, both the film and the book raise questions about the costs of pop stardom.

"Unfortunately, there seems to be very little correlation between artistic talent and the ability to lead your life," said Goldman. "Look at Beethoven. Look at so many of them."

"Many artists' private lives are a mess."

# Simon wrote song for new husband

NEW YORK (AP) — Newly wed and busy in her career as singer and composer, Carly Simon dreams of having a little house in the suburbs.

"How I picture it is a little stone house, with maybe two or three bedrooms, tiny, though," she said. "I'll do all the housework myself. With a nice living room with fireplace and a cozy kitchen."

"It doesn't need to have a lot of ground but it needs to have trailing vines, wisteria or honeysuckle, and definitely a magnolia tree if possible. That's what I want

to escape to on weekends from the city."

This is not, however, a woman looking forward to retirement. She had a new album out in August, which was taped during her first concert performance in eight years.

She's also scoring a movie for Mike Nichols that'll include a love theme she wrote for her new husband, Jim Hart. She has also done two private concerts which were her contribution to a benefit auction on Martha's Vineyard.

The Arista Records album, Carly Simon's *Greatest Hits Live*,

was taped — and so was a Home Box Office special — at one of two concerts on a Martha's Vineyard beach.

## PROMOTES ALBUM

"I was promoting the *Coming Around Again* album, which came out in April 1987; consequently there are many songs on the live album that also are on that album," she said.

"I also did *You're So Vain*, *Loving You Is the Right Thing To Do* and *Nobody Does It Better*. I didn't do *Jesse*, *That's the Way It Should Be* and *Haven't Got Time for the Pain*."

About the live album, she said: "My favorites are songs that never really got exposure and I wanted to give a second life, like *Never Been Gone*, which is my favorite song on the album, and *It Happens Every Day*."

"It's funny how certain songs that I've written I always thought were terrific songs but they were never picked up from albums as singles or they were on albums that were flops or they were never recorded properly."

"I think *It Happens Every Day* is such a neat song, compact, concise, emotional. It was on *Hello Big Man*, an album I did for Warner Brothers, which was never particularly popular."

"I think it's one of my best albums. It was at a time Warner Brothers was thinking of sending me to Siberia. I don't think they invested a whole lot in promoting that album. They wanted me to do more things that were contemporary."

The curse of the recording industry, she said, is radio's top 40 playlists.

# Stamp celebrates the 150th anniversary of baseball

Canada Post released a stamp on September 14, commemorating baseball's 150th anniversary. Canada Post claims the first baseball game to be recorded was played in Beachville, Upper Canada (now Ontario), on June 4, 1838.

The United States issued a stamp in 1939 commemorating the 100th anniversary of the game that was supposedly invented by Abner Doubleday. Historians are still debating where and when the first game was played.

Canada has had a rather illustrious baseball history. Some very famous players spent part of their careers with the once popular Montreal Royals and the Toronto Maple Leafs, both of the triple A International League. Closer to home, the city of Sherbrooke was once home to a triple A franchise of the Pittsburgh Pirates.

The launching of this stamp took place in the Salle Rouge at Olympic Stadium, where a reception was held for invited guests. Mr. Sylvain Cloutier, representing Canada Post, presented a special replica of the stamp and a stamp display to both Buck Rodgers of the Montreal Expos and Mr. Allan Lewis, a Governor of the Canadian Baseball Hall of Fame. It will be on permanent display at the Hall of Fame at Ontario Place, in Toronto.

A similar launching of this newest of commemorative stamps was to take place at the baseball game in Toronto which saw the Detroit Tigers play against the Blue Jays.

The baseball game. Yes. Well, the expos lost to the Pirates in extra innings.

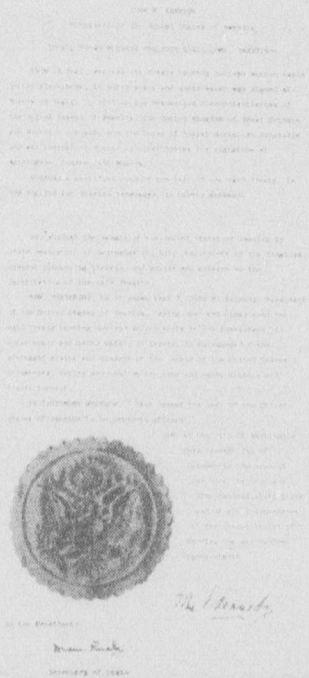

# First ever native ballet to have premiere in Ottawa

**SHERBROOKE** — The first native ballet has been created and will be in Montreal next fall. Written by musical conductor and Kanawake Indian John Kimball, the ballet is the first to be written by a native for native performers.

Kimball, well-known for his fundraising work for post-secondary education for native youth, co-wrote the ballet with Hungarian composer Miklos Massey. The choreography for the piece was created by Jacques Lemay, who, accor-

ding to Kimball, had to learn traditional native dance before taking on the task.

Kimball, who was the first North American Indian conductor, worked on 30 different Broadway musicals as well as having conducted the first U.S. tour of a Soviet ballet troupe and the Toronto Symphony Orchestra.

He spoke about his creation at a meeting of the Women's Canadian Club Eastern Townships chapter this week. He said he first thought of a native ballet four years ago

and began working on it in 1986. The ballet will be performed at the National Arts Center in Ottawa, sponsored by the federal government and Northern Telecom, on Nov. 16 and 17.

The piece, which uses traditional native melodies, also includes classical music styles and will feature professional North American native ballet dancers. "We hope to encourage native kids to consider

the arts," Kimball said.

## RAISED FUNDS

"We have to focus on the development of an interest in the arts and encourage established talents so they will consider getting jobs in the arts."

Kimball managed to raise \$67,000 for the ballet with the help of well-known singer and actress Bernadette Peters during a fundraising concert. The ballet uses native mythology to deal with the

problem of alcoholism among natives living in reserves.

According to Kimball, the opening night performance will be a fundraiser and plans are underway to take the ballet across Canada, the U.S. and Europe. "There is a fascination with Native people in Europe," he said. "We're trying to make it an event."

Kimball also plans to bring a group of native kids to see one of the Ottawa performances for free.

## Artist's nudes censored before show

**MONTREAL (CP)** — Artist Frank Mulvey says he was amazed when an exhibition of 11 of his drawings — including male and female nudes — was stripped from the walls of an art gallery two days before it was to open.

"I was shocked when I heard the news," said Mulvey, who has retaliated by arranging a showing of the works in his own private studio.

"I guess it's an indication of the rise in conservatism, and I'm concerned about the freedom of expression of all artists," he said.

The drawings, which show Mulvey working in his studio from nudes and other models, were removed from Galerie Alliance, a non-profit gallery on Sherbrooke Street sponsored by l'Industrie-Alliance insurance firm.

Mulvey said Jacques Lorange, the company's vice-president, expressed concern that the exhibit, which included seven large realistic drawings of nudes, might have an effect on high-school students walking past the gallery.

But Mulvey said nothing more was said to him until gallery director Claude Brault called to inform him the drawings had been taken down.

## BACKS ARTIST

Brault said in an interview he is amazed at the decision to drop the display and agreed that the drawings were not sexually suggestive.

"If anything, I thought they were a bit academic," Brault said. "I found the exhibition was very interesting on the academic form of

what is a nude model. I didn't know that nude was not contemporary any more."

Mulvey, who said he will keep the doors of his studio open to the public until Thursday night, said, "I personally intend no sexual implications in these images. I am simply dealing with nudes as artists have been doing for thousands of years."

Meanwhile, artist Jeannie Kamins has put together a show at another Montreal gallery as a protest against Bill C-54, the proposed federal anti-pornography legislation that has been criticized by artists, writers, librarians and civil rights advocates.

The current display includes a series of pictures by Canadian photographer Peter Tittenberger showing naked children frolicking around a lawn sprinkler. The photos were to have been part of a project to put art on buses in Winnipeg, Edmonton and Vancouver.

## CITES CONCERN

Kamins's notes for the exhibition say the photos were turned down by Winnipeg transit officials who worried that "viewers less sophisticated than themselves might be morally damaged."

Kamins adds the photos of the kids at play ended up riding the buses only in Vancouver but were removed after one driver complained "he didn't want any perverts on his bus."


Mulvey rejects any idea that his works — largely autobiographical — contain anything obscene, titillating or vaguely erotic. "Any artist with integrity is not producing images for the sake of sensationalism. They're producing them as serious matter for serious consideration."

Mulvey said he plans to seek compensation from the insurance company for the abrupt way his show was ended. "In no way do I feel weird or dirty," he said. "I believed in my art and I still do."

Sandra Paikowsky, curator of the art gallery at Concordia University in Montreal, said she deplores the removal of Mulvey's works, which were to have run as a joint show with works by French artist Claude Montoya.

"I would have hoped that we would have outgrown this sort of thinking," Paikowsky said. "The nude is one of the oldest subject matters in the history of art."

# Trio Taki-Wasi, South American music local style

SHERBROOKE — With the kind of primitive music that is fast becoming very popular among Canadian audiences the South American trio Taki-Wasi is about to hit Sherbrooke by storm.

With their *charango*, *sampona*, *okarina* and other instruments brought directly from their countries of origin, the members of the trio are playing the music they know best for people who know almost nothing about it.

The name of the trio, which means 'home of the song', is in the language of the Quechua nation the Incas once belonged to. The members of the trio chose the name because one of the members, Javier Melgarejo, is a descendent of the Quechuas.

But for all the trio's members, Cristina and Patricio Rivera as well as Melgarejo, their awareness of their roots is strong.

Melgarejo, who was a musician in Peru before coming to Canada two years ago as a political refugee, is still waiting for a visa from the Canadian government.

He says it's the spirit of the people who first composed the music they perform that Quebecers feel attracted to.

## COMMUNION WITH LAND

"The people of richer countries are touched by our music," he explained during an interview at the Rivera's Sherbrooke home. "The energy, because they never manage to reach it themselves, gives them a chance to have a kind of

communion with the land and nature."

Melgarejo said he has also gained something from his relationship with Quebecers through Taki-Wasi's performances around the province. "I'm also discovering my pride in being a descendent of the Quechuas," he said.

As for Patricio and Cristina, who were artists working mostly with copper, they are concerned about their own native land, Chile. According to Rivera, Chile is now troubled by the tyranny of its president and by the people's lack of knowledge about alternative agricultural methods.

The couple, who came to Sher-

brooke in 1978 as political refugees after escaping the dangers of the coup d'etat during that time, are now working for Rallye Tier Monde, a group working to educate the people in Third World nations and raise funds for international development projects.

## PROFESSIONAL SHOWS

Rivera is now making plans for the trio. "I have an agenda," he said. "We need to find financing for the trio to perform in more professional shows."

The Riveras were the first people Melgarejo met when he first arrived in Sherbrooke, and they soon began to get together and play the music they knew so well. Rivera played the guitar, Cristina sang and Melgarejo played the charango, an instrument much like a very small guitar made out of the carcass of an armadillo.

Soon the trio began playing throughout the province for Rallye Tier Monde, giving talks about the needs of Third World countries to school children and other groups, as well as singing at secondary schools CEGEPs and universities, including Bishop's.

"We also played at a rich wedding in Montreal," Cristina said.

"We were the quaint *petits réfugiés*," Melgarejo added with a smile.

The trio has also played at the Café Croissant in downtown Sherbrooke every Sunday brunch last winter until the restaurant closed. "Its only business was during Sunday brunch," Patricio said.

## WILL TAKE ACTION

But the present lack of work for the trio doesn't worry them at all. According to Rivera, up until now they never went looking for jobs, the jobs always came to them. So now they plan to take action in that department and feel they have nothing to worry about. They don't intend to go to the bigger city where they would find more gigs. They like Sherbrooke and the Townships too much for that.

"I think it was a lucky thing for us that we came to Sherbrooke," Rivera said. "Here we're able to live outside the ghetto and to have more contact with Quebecers." The tendency for immigrants in big cities is to socialize with people who come from their own country, Rivera said.

"But human beings are the same everywhere," he added. "You learn that people have different ideas about things but fundamentally we're similar."

Similar or not, at least here they can perform without the fear of persecution. "After the coup we had little chance to play in Chile," Rivera remembered. Some local musicians managed to open up a place where they could perform under the protection of the Catholic Church but soon the military closed that one down as well.

But now those worries are over. Taki-Wasi has found a home for its songs and the trio can look forward to performing to enthusiastic Quebec audiences. As for Patricio, Cristina and their 17-year-old daughter Gwendolyn, they plan to

return to Chile in two years — they haven't gone back since they left ten years ago. They will start work on the project they've been planning with Rallye Tier Monde. They hope to help the people cultivate their land and learn to feed themselves to become an independent nation.

So far, things look good for three people who escaped persecution in their own countries and found themselves a new home.

# Masterpiece, PBS standby, back for new TV season

NEW YORK (AP) — The Public Broadcasting Service, a steady customer of British programming in the past, is keeping most new programming on this side of the Atlantic in 1988-89.

Unfortunately, the result would seem to suggest we're not very entertaining over here.

All the new series are about Americans, Mexicans or Canadians, but none of it's going to bring floods of new viewers to public television — except perhaps for the one bald-faced attempt to lure commercial network audiences, a special on the making of NBC's hit comedy, *Family Ties*.

Of the new series, the most interesting would appear to be *American Experience*, a history anthology; *The Mind*, a sequel to *The Brain*, and *CE News Magazine*, a children's news show.

The good, old standbys, *Great Performances* and *Masterpiece Theatre*, are still coming up with promising if not ground-breaking fare.

*Great Performances* will have more episodes of those fine *Tales From the Hollywood Hills* in November, and *Masterpiece Theatre* kicks off Oct. 16 with a seven-part dramatization of John le Carre's *A Perfect Spy*.

Jeremy Brett returns as *Sherlock Holmes* on the *Mystery!* series, which premieres Oct. 13 with a production of the Terrence Rattigan stage play *Cause Celebre*.

#### TARGETS AUDIENCE

*Wonderworks*, the anthology series aimed at adolescents but much admired by adults, begins Nov. 5 with *Necessary Parties*, a story of a family breakup starring Alan Arkin and Barbara Dana.

Bill Moyers is back with more interesting interviews.

Here are the new series:

—*American Experience*, premiering Oct. 4, is a history anthology featuring observations and remembrances by notable citizens and filmmakers. The first episode is producer Tom Weidinger's *The Great San Francisco Earthquake*, including newly restored archival film and present-day interviews with witnesses of the disaster.

—*The Mind* is an ambitious sequel to the 1984 PBS series *The Brain*. This time, the series delves into the nature of consciousness through episodes on aging, addiction, pain, depression, thinking and violence, among others.

—*Bill Moyers' World of Ideas* is a nightly series of interviews with an interesting array of authors, scientists and philosophers. It premiered in September and runs through

Nov. 18.

—*CE News Magazine* is a children's news show, reported by kids recruited from the ranks of *Children's Express*, the children's newspaper that has occasionally scooped the adult news media. The kids, minus the cynicism of their adult counterparts, will tackle such tough subjects as, in the premiere Oct. 13, the ease with which parents can put unruly children in private mental institutions.

—*Canada: True North*, a four-part series that began Sept. 12 and ends Oct. 3, is a Canadian-made examination of the history of Canada, its present-day culture and its relationship with the United States. The host is Canadian-born Robert MacNeil of PBS' *The MacNeil-Lehrer NewsHour*.

—*"Global Rivals"* is a four-part series that premiered Sept. 20 and analyses conflicts between the So-

viet Union and the United States. The host is journalist and former Assistant Secretary of State Bernard Kalb.

This season's specials on PBS aren't terribly special, except perhaps for *All Night Strut*, a celebration of 1930s and 1940s swing music, with host Maxene Andrews of *The Andrews Sisters*; and Cary Grant: *The Leading Man*, a profile of the legendary screen star.

There's also a National Geographic special, *The Explorers: A Century of Discovery*.

Other specials include a salute to Australia's bicentennial; a no doubt riveting examination of the Munich Peace Pact on its 50th anniversary, and *Pyramid*, an inquiry into the mystery of the crypts that sounds more like a candidate for a Geraldo Rivera special than a PBS documentary, but could be interesting.

# Nelligan's talent unchallenged by play's cliched dialogue

*Spoils of War*, after mixed reviews in an off-Broadway run last spring, has been somewhat rewritten and spruced up for a Broadway opening planned for November.

It remains a wordy, often uninspired production.

The play, which opened a six-week run at the Royal Alexandra Theatre on Monday, stars Nelligan as Elise, an elegantly sluttish for-

mer political radical who retains remnants of caustic wit despite impoverishment and a slide into alcoholism.

Nelligan looks great — especially tarted up in a slinky party dress — and she's a commanding, free-wheeling presence in every scene.

The famous talent, which has won her accolades on Broadway and in London's West End since she left Canada 20 years ago, is never challenged in the cliché-ridden dialogue of playwright Michael Weller.

#### HELPS REUNION

Set in New York in the 1950s,

*Spoils of War* concerns the down-on-her-luck but faintly heroic Elise, and the efforts of her idealistic son to get her back together with his father, another one-time radical who now is the kind of dad who calls his son Champ.

Christopher Collet, a young New Yorker playing the teenaged son Martin, emerges as the star, bringing exuberance and pathos to his impossible goal of reuniting his ill-matched parents.

Nelligan, originally from London, Ont., appeared in student productions in Canada but this is her professional stage debut in her ho-

meland, though she has made some forgettable Canadian movies.

She first gained recognition in England, with the *National Theatre of Great Britain* and the *Royal Shakespeare Company*. She has lived since 1982 in New York, where she recently earned her third Tony nomination for *Serious Money*.

In *Spoils of War*, the spirited Elise must make down-to-earth decisions: she pays the phone bill instead of the electricity — she can't afford both — on the grounds that "nothing exciting ever entered my life through the icebox."

Martin, home from school, drinks warm milk and plots to take his mother as his surprise "date" at a party being thrown by his upscale father.

There are elements of class in the play and Weller has written some terrific one-liners which Nelligan makes the most of.

Its bright spots are overwhelmed by sometimes stilted conversation and overblown platitudes as the plot hopscotches from one theme to another — from the politics of McCarthyism, through marital fidelity, to the real meaning of life.

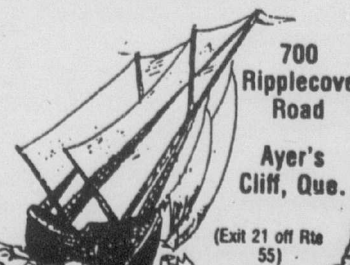

# Hillerman offers interesting backdrop for mystery

## A THIEF OF TIME

A NOVEL BY THE AUTHOR OF SKINWALKERS



A Thief Of Time by Tony Hillerman (FITZHENRY & WHITESIDE): \$22.50, 209 pp.

Mystery writers as diverse as Sir Arthur Conan Doyle and Raymond Chandler have captured readers' interest with the creation of fascinating, colourful worlds. Sherlock Holmes's London and Philip Marlowe's Los Angeles are as much a part of their creators' pantheon of interesting characters as any of the villains portrayed in their work. Tony Hillerman's series of novels involving Jim Chee of the Navajo Tribal Police, set in the heart of the Anasazi Indian country of Arizona, manage to convey the wonders of desert topography and tribal custom with equal efficiency.

Hillerman's seventh in the Jim Chee series concerns an anthropologist who is reported missing after her inquiries about a certain piece of Anasazi pottery puts her on the trail of artifacts of rare Navajo origin. Her disappearance brings Lieutenant Joe Leaphorn into the case, and his curiosity about the anthropologist's theft of protected artifacts on Navajo lands coincidentally overlaps with another seemingly unrelated investigation by Officer Chee.

Chee is anxious to find out who ripped off a very large back-hoe from an earth-moving company — he is extra embarrassed because the pilfering of the large machine occurred during his tour of duty, when he was distracted by a convenience store misunderstanding.

### INVESTIGATION

Chee and Leaphorn's cases are broken wide open when two men are discovered murdered at a site where graves have been desecrated and broken shards of pottery are scattered around. Into this circuitous investigation Hillerman introduces some distinctive and unexpected characters with the kind of peripheral connection with the two cases that keeps readers glued to the edge of their seats and rapidly turning the pages.

Enter one Harrison Houk, a pillar of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and a potent Republican, whose path crossed that of Leaphorn's many years previous to this story's setting, when his son Brigham killed his brother

and sister in a maniacal rage. Chee and Leaphorn interview the patriarchal figure of Houk, a cross between Lyndon Johnson and Jerry Falwell, in the pursuit of the baffling case of the missing anthropologist.

Hillerman's adept and interesting use of the lore of the Navajo Indians, of whose number Jim Chee is the shining example, presents a wonderful and fascinating world removed from the stunning landscape of the American Southwest. Chee is an example of the native acuity and his compassion for the people he moves among in solving these badlands crimes is evident in Hillerman's portrait.

The obviously well-researched data and trivia about the Anasazi folklore have led to Hillerman being named the "Carlos Castaneda of the mystery novel" by *Newsday*. The reader will perhaps find this material an interesting respite from the detective fiction that gets bogged down on the streets collapsing under urban squalor in most novels of the genre. Jim Chee's Arizona offers as distinctive a backdrop for Hillerman's admirable novels as Holmes' "London particular" fogs and Marlowe's seedy underside of the glamour of Hollywood.



### RECORD REVIEWS

Gary Wright *Who I Am* (ATTIC — A&M)

It's been a dozen years since former Spooky Tooth keyboardist Gary Wright struck gold with his lilting ballad "Dream Weaver". Before that he had worked with pal George Harrison on *All Things Must Pass*, while indulging in favourite session work with a host of rock folk.

The relationship with George

must have continued because the lead picker for the Beatles sits in on "(I Don't Wanna) Hold Back", which has an ambience, as do many of the tracks here, of the Harrison connection with eerie Indian music. The title track here uses an Indian violin, assorted percussion instruments, as well as a couple of things called a kangeera and a ghatam to flesh out a very good track.

### THROATY VOCALS

Wright's album is a long way from the wall of sound overkill of Spooky Tooth's main work; in fact, songs like "Voices" and "Love Is On The Line" are notable for their anguished, throaty vocals, with Wright able to shift from ballad to catchy rocker with ease. On "Sad Eyes", the Indian vocal by Lakshmi Shankar, with its soaring muezzin-like strains, is the perfect complement to Wright's lament for the loss of a pair of sad eyes.

Other tracks feature the very steady drumming of Alan White or Jim Keltner, and some outstanding lead guitar work from Michael Thompson, which rivals the work of Beate George on this album that quickly becomes like an old friend after only two or three playings. Although Gary Wright's album has not found much media attention yet, all that is needed is for a few people to hear it to send

the dream weaver into notoriety once again.

*Cocktail* Soundtrack (ELEKTRA — WEA)

The press on the flimsy film vehicle built around Tom Cruise's good looks has been uniformly bad, but that doesn't mean that the movie has a bad soundtrack. Far from it. In fact, *Cocktail* has some of the jumpingest music ever laid on celluloid, custom designed for the teen and young adult movie

market. Tunes by the Fabulous Thunderbirds ("Powerful Stuff"), Robbie Nevil ("Since When"), and the Georgia Satellites doing the old Swinging Blue Jeans/Beatles standby "Hippy Hippy Shake", ensure that this film will keep the feet tapping through the crush of popcorn cartons and plasticized drink cups.

A reprise of Little Richard's "Tutti Frutti" is proof that music supervisor Carole Childs wanted to ensure that *Cocktail* had some of the explosive musical impact that the inspired Mr. Penniman's "Great God Almighty" brought to *Down And Out In Beverly Hills*. Add in a raunchy treatment of Elvis's "All Shook Up", and you see why Ry Cooder's guitars are in such demand.

### TIMELY RESPONSE

Reggae gets an outing here too, with "Don't Worry, Be Happy" by Bobby McFerrin, and R&B is represented by Nevil and on "Oh, I Love You So", by Preston Smith, offering competition to the rocking music on these tracks. John Coogor Mellencamp's treatment of Buddy Holly & the Crickets' super tune "Rave On" won't cause anybody to forget Lubbock, Texas, but the song rocks. Even the Beach Boys kick in a song, on what surely must be an oldie, seeing as it's composed by Mike Love, Terry Melcher, John Phillips and Scott Mackenzie. A timely response to Brian Wilson's exciting solo album is this Beachies goody called "Kokomo".

All of the above seem to prove that perhaps the contemporary movie crowd is more attuned to rock videos on the big screen than making discerning judgements about the quality of modern films. When it comes to a choice between a good story & believable acting and some rocking tunes, the box office tallies imply that as a movie, *Cocktail* is a great soundtrack.

### VIDEO SCREENINGS

*Moonstruck* (MGM/UA VIDEO)

What Woody Allen and Neil Simon have done for the family life in New York City as it is lived by the large numbers of Jewish citizens of that metropolis, Canadian director Norman Jewison does for the Italian community, through the medium of screenwriter John Patrick Shanley's madcap script *Moonstruck*.

The wacky family that finds itself moonstruck includes Vincent Gardenia as the philandering father, Olympia Dukakis of America's next royal family as the long-suffering wife, with Cher as the sad-eyed daughter who has just accepted an engagement ring from the boring, straight Danny Aiello as the film opens.

Cher's commitment to marriage is rudely shaken when Aiello journeys to Italy to be at the side of his ailing mama and she calls on his estranged brother, Nicholas Cage, who is a cook at a local bakery. Cage's inspired lunacy as the wronged brother (he blames Aiello for the loss of his hand in a slicing machine, after which sad event the

brothers have not spoken for five years) charms the audience and Cher at the same time.

They indulge in a whirlwind romance, fed by the ecstatic passions of fiery Italian opera, with Jewison's focus moving in on the lovers and out to take in the affair of Cher's father and his paramour, who inadvertently bump into Cher and Cage at an evening at the opera.

Jewison's pacing in this movie is admirable, as he never allows it to get bogged down in the philosophical meanderings that sometimes hamper Woody Allen's filmmaking. Cher brings her role off with a doe-eyed sentimentality that has the audience raptly wondering what will happen when brother Johnny returns from Italy after the death of his mother.

The movie's ending is as unexpected as the award-winning acting — to Dukakis and Cher for best supporting and best actress — with Shanley's resolution of this family saga as satisfying as his script was deserving of the most original screenplay Oscar. ## Chinese travellers face overcrowding on local trains

LANZHOU, China (AP) — It's 3:30 a.m. on the Chengdu-Lanzhou local, and for the first time since the train began its journey 6½ hours ago, car No. 13 is quiet.

A noisy drinking game among some young workers ended abruptly and bloodily with a fight and the combatants have been led off to cool down.

Finally, most of the 150 people in the car are asleep.

They half-lie, half-sit on the hard seats, bodies propped against bodies. Some stretch out on the floor under the seats, feet extending into the aisles.

A dozen people sit or lie in the enclosed spaces between cars for most of the 24-hour, 1,300-kilometre journey from Chengdu in southwest China's Sichuan Province north to Lanzhou in Gansu Province.

By Chinese standards, the train isn't even crowded.

### NUMBERS RISE

Trains are the main form of long-distance travel in China, carrying 1.2 billion passengers per year, 30-per-cent more than the country's state-owned train system has seats to carry.

More than half the trains are steam-powered, old-fashioned choo-choo trains that chug across the searing Gobi Desert in the north or through semi-tropical mountain jungles in the south at the speed of a mini-motorcycle.

Travel this year is up more than five per cent, the Railway Ministry says, as China's market-style economic reforms create an army of travelling businessmen, making deals for factories that used to be bought and sold only through the state.

More and more Chinese also have the money to sightsee and visit relatives. Rail officials say tourists, foreign and Chinese, now comprise 40 per cent of summer passengers.

### TRAVEL BUDGET

Aboard car No. 13, five Lanzhou oil refinery workers with six children were returning from a week's vacation in Chengdu and Mount Emei, a famous scenic spot in Sichuan.

They went budget, the equivalent of about \$33 Cdn per adult for the whole trip. That's almost a month's salary, but like many urban Chinese they had much more than that in savings.

Planes are out of reach for most. A ticket in car No. 13, called hard seat because only the thinnest of padding covers the straight-backed benches, costs less than one-tenth the price of flying.

Foreigners travelling in China usually take soft seat, comparable to Western trains, at four times the hard-seat price.

### SHOVEL MESS

Car 13 soon was hazy with cigarette smoke and grimy with engine soot. The floors were slippery with

melon seeds, fruit peels, peanut shells, cigarette butts, food wrappers and spittle. Train attendants occasionally shovelled the mess out the window.

The crush of unwashed bodies in the hot cars reeked, but not as much as the squat toilets.

A steady stream of passengers edged around bodies to get drinking water from a boiler, and train attendants periodically wheeled through trolleys with beer, soda and boxes of boiled rice and noodles.

Loudspeakers blared travel instructions and Chinese pop music. They got competition in car 13 from a young Lanzhou worker showing off a boom box he bought in Chengdu for the equivalent of \$139 Cdn.

### REJECT MANY

But those on trains, even hard seat, are glad to be there. The Beijing train station turns away more

than 15,000 would-be ticket buyers every day and more than 10,000 people sleep on cots in the Chengdu station's guest-house each night because they can't get tickets to continue their journeys, according to official figures.

During the Lunar New Year holiday last February, when millions of Chinese were visiting relatives and trains were especially jammed, hundreds of desperate travellers stormed trains in Chengdu and Canton, broke the windows and crawled inside.

The railway sells standing-room-only tickets when seats are filled, but people getting on at the start of a run usually hold out for a seat. Those boarding at later stops often have no choice.

### NEED REFORM

Ticket-buying is a mob sport, with dozens or even hundreds of people shoving and elbowing to get

to the windows. Asked why they don't form lines, most Chinese laugh incredulously.

There's no such thing as a round-trip ticket or a ticket that covers connecting trains.

The government has called for reforms in rail administration following five train accidents that killed a total of 169 people this year. But there are no prospects for relieving the crowding, poor sanitation and ticket hassles.

Surprisingly, passengers don't complain, but make the best of it with a steady stream of conversation and food.

The small son of one Lanzhou refinery worker put away a whole chicken, dumplings, noodles, rice, apples, cookies, peanuts, dried melon seeds, a Popsicle and candy without appearing to get an upset stomach.

As his party got off the train in Lanzhou, they were debating where to go for dinner.

## Be careful when flying economy class

They call it "The Economy Class Syndrome."

Passengers on long-distance flights in cramped economy-class seats risk more than discomfort, says an article in the British medical journal *Lancet*.

In some cases they may suffer from blood clots in the legs (deep-vein thrombosis) which might travel to the lungs (pulmonary embolisms). Left untreated, the clots could lodge in the arteries of the lung, where they might interfere with breathing, damage the lung or even block circulation entirely.

This can lead to "a very dangerous situation," says Dr. Richard Gorlin, co-author of the article in the *Lancet*. And sometimes, it can be fatal.

But don't rush out and cancel that planned trip.

### DON'T BE ALARMED

"People should not be alarmed," Gorlin, who works at Mount Sinai Medical Centre in New York City, said in a telephone interview. "We don't know how often it occurs."

"But enough so that it's probably worth everybody taking precautions, like any other good health practice."

The precautions are the same as those that reduce jet lag — avoid alcohol, drink plenty of juices to prevent dehydration and get up and move around the plane frequently.

Blood clots in the legs are most common in people who are bedridden or have undergone surgery. On a plane, it's the cramped seating that poses the potential risk, says the article titled *Air Travel and Thrombotic Episodes — The Economy Class Syndrome*.

### CITE DEATHS

It cites a previous three-year study at London's Heathrow Airport which suggests 18 per cent of 61 sudden deaths among long-distance passengers were due to pulmonary embolisms.

Although the condition is usually a result of long flights, the authors note that trips as short as three to four hours can also cause harm.

People with a history of vein disease or heart failure are especially at risk. The victims in the Heathrow study tended to be women over 40 years old, with a history of deep-vein thrombosis. But men in their 40s with no predisposing medical history were also vulnerable.

Past studies have shown passengers tend to experience mild hypoxia — deficiency of oxygen in the bloodstream — and dehydration on long flights.

Both conditions tend to make blood a little thicker, and under some circumstances, more likely to form clots.

### BLOOD STAGNATES

But the central problem is sitting in a cramped space for long periods, which researchers say

causes the blood to stagnate.

Calf veins appear to be the most common site of thrombosis, probably due to pressure on the calves from the seat, the *Lancet* article says.

A clot usually forms over a day or two. Symptoms can be pain or swelling in the leg, pain in the chest, coughing up of blood or shortness of breath.

If left untreated, the clot can be dislodged from the leg, often by exercise or sudden movement, and travel through the bloodstream.

Reducing the risk is a reasonably simple matter:

— Go for regular strolls up and down the aisle; the *Lancet* article recommends sitting in an aisle seat for easy access.

— Avoid smoking, which causes oxygen deficiency and makes blood thicker.

— Don't drink alcohol, or strictly limit alcohol intake, since it causes dehydration.

— Drink plenty of non-alcoholic beverages to prevent dehydration.

— Keep carry-on luggage to a minimum to avoid having bags crowd leg room.

— The *Lancet* piece suggests high-risk passengers with a history of vein disease or heart failure should consider taking small doses of Aspirin on either a permanent or temporary basis.

Said Gorlin: "We can't say how often it's going to occur, but it's like any other good health practice: Why be the person it happens to?"

Just when you begin believing the **American Boobus** might be a rational and reasonable creature after all, the U.S. Congress does something to set you straight.

**Yuriy Smurov**, said he wanted to stay in Canada. He told CSIS all he knew and before you could say **Dmitri Shostakovich**, 17 (Count 'Em!) 17 Soviet officials were ejected for 'commercial and military espionage' and trying to join the **Canadian Silly Idiot Society**.

Then **Rekemchuk** flew back home to Moscow complaining CSIS debriefers had embraced him too forcefully and wanted him to spy on other Soviets in Montreal.

And reporters **Pierre Beauregard** (La Presse Canadienne) and **Normand Lester** (Radio-Canada) began turning in embarrassing stories about eight other defectors, a spy captured in Newfoundland, CSIS secret plans to squirrel **Smurov** to a safe house and its attempts to cover up recent suicides among its officers. To find out where **Beauregard** and **Lester** were getting their information — and to shut them up — two CSIS agents visited **Charlie Greenwell**, a reporter for Ottawa's CJOH TV, and asked him to spy on them in return for insider information on CSIS.

Being in the business of informing the public instead of deceiving it, **Greenwell** naturally turned them down, blew the whistle and CSIS got egg on its face once more.

\*\*\*

If Canadians were really something more than a northern subspecies of **Americanus Boobus**,

they'd hoot CSIS out of existence before it causes more trouble. Secret police have no place in open democratic societies; we are no good at keeping secrets and shouldn't even try because the temptation of extraordinary powers cloaked in secrecy is just too much for mortal man.

**Tadeusz Letarte's** First Law of Political Dynamics states; "Power that can be abused, will be abused." We have a prime example over in the Elephant with the American CIA — the **Company of Incompetent Assassins**.

That lot was born in 1947 to gather and analyse information on foreign powers so another surprise attack like Pearl Harbor could not happen. It has an abysmal record and few triumphs. It failed — among other things — to predict the 1967 Arab-Israeli war, the 1968 Tet Offensive, was unable to discriminate between popular uprisings and communist conspiracies to the nation's great cost (Vietnam, Cuba, Nicaragua), and even expanded its mandate to spy on its own citizens (**Martin Luther King**, **George McGovern**) and experimented with mind-altering and behaviour-modifying substances on unsuspecting civilians (at home as well as in Montreal). Operation 'Midnight Climax' even hired prostitutes and brothels to measure the effect of certain drugs on sexual performance.

But far worse are its attempts to subvert, overthrow, even assassinate the heads of governments it does not like. Much of the trouble in the world today can be directly traced to such efforts. In 1953, the Company paid Iranis to riot in the

streets of Tehran, bribed soldiers and police and succeeded in replacing **President Mossadegh** with the Shah. Then it helped organize and train SAVAK, the Shah's secret police, which terrorized, tortured and murdered so many people that they rose up and brought in **Khomeini**.

The Company tried at least eight times to assassinate **Fidel Castro** (Castro says 20 times but he's guessing, too), the popular leader of Cuba. It assassinated **General Rafael Trujillo** in the Dominican Republic in 1961, even hired the Mafia so that **President Johnson** exploded, "We had been operating a damned Murder Incorporated in the Caribbean!"

In 1954, the Company overthrew **President Arbenz** in Guatemala and replaced him with a repressive military dictatorship. In 1973, it had a leading role in the overthrow and murder of **Salvador Allende**, democratically elected president of Chile, and replaced him with **General Pinochet** — to everybody's cost.

It was responsible for supporting the **Samozas** in Nicaragua until the people could take no more. Two months after Reagan was inaugurated, **William Casey's** CIA organized the **Contras**, pretended it was a popular movement, mined harbors, blew up fuel depots and made war on women and children.

When Congress found out what was going on, it cut off funding but the Company raised money through Brunei and Saudi Arabia, smuggling arms to Khomeini and drugs to the U.S., and continued the war. **Admiral Poindexter** said he kept all this secret because he did not want "outside interference" — meaning control by the duly

elected representatives of the American people.

**President Nixon** meant the same thing when he excused his actions with, "When the president does it, that means it's not illegal."

That's not what the founding fathers had in mind when they put all power in the hands of the people. That's the road to tyranny.

The CIA, the military, even the executive branch of government, all have a vested interest in fostering the myth of a secret communist conspiracy to take over the world and enslave everybody in it. That sort of thing might do for **Fu Manchu**, **James Bond** or even **Ronald Reagan** fantasies but not for rational people in the real world.

The 'Evil Empire' is not Russia but the CIA.

## PM wants TV-5 to go cross-country

OTTAWA (CP) — Prime Minister Brian Mulroney said Wednesday he'd like to see the new international French-language television channel, TV-5, carried across Canada.

"I was greatly impressed with the quality, the value," Mulroney told reporters. "We're going to have to find the means to extend it across the country."

TV-5 is a specialty cable television channel which went into operation Sept. 1. Most Quebec cable companies are offering TV-5 as part of their basic cable service. Outside Quebec, it's up to cable companies to decide whether to offer it to their subscribers or not.

Cable companies operating in English-language markets can show TV-5 as long as it's part of the basic cable service. They may offer it as a pay television channel only if TV-5 gives permission.

TV-5 is run by a consortium of eight Canadian groups — including the CBC, the National Film Board and private French-language broadcasters — in association with five European television networks.

**Pierre Pontbriand**, spokesman for the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission which regulates the industry, said carrying TV-5 is

strictly up to individual cable companies since TV-5 was licenced as an optional service.

In Ottawa, some residents are annoyed that Ottawa Cablevision, the company serving the west half of the city, isn't carrying TV-5.

**Bill Kincaid**, vice-president of marketing, said Cablevision will soon begin a market survey to determine if its 100,000 subscribers want the service. But the compa-

ny's initial impression is there's not enough interest.

**Skyline Cablevision**, the other Ottawa cable company which serves more francophone subscribers, has an agreement with TV-5 to offer it along with the French-language family channel for \$6 a month. **Bill Holmes**, vice-president of marketing and public relations, said the only complaints have been from people who want TV-5 for free.

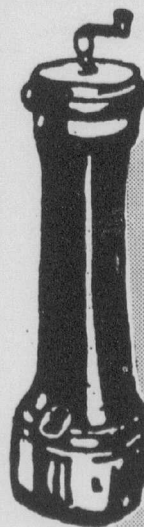

## Brooke Shields plays major suspect in jewel heist

Actress refuses to be just a prop on the set

Brooke Shields, Howard Hesseman and Ed Marinaro headline *The Diamond Trap*, based on the novel *The Great Diamond Robbery* by John Minahan, airing Sunday, Sept. 25, on CBS.

*The Diamond Trap* begins when New York City police detectives John Rawlings (Hesseman) and Brendan Thomas (Marinaro) stumble onto a lead about a pending major heist at a local gallery—the theft of \$12 million in jewels, including the renowned White Hall diamond.

Following their lead, Rawlings and Thomas meet an employee of the gallery named Tara Holden (Shields), and they solicit her help in catching the crooks red-handed. Unknown to the detectives, Holden is in on the heist, which goes off without a hitch. Rawlings becomes more determined than ever to catch the thieves when he realizes that the biggest bust of his career has disintegrated into a web of double-crosses and comic twists.

Rawlings follows the trail of the White Hall diamond to London, where he is assisted by an unorthodox Scotland Yard detective, played by Twiggy in her television film debut.

Shields, who has been in front of cameras since infancy, has certain criteria for her acting roles. "I don't want to do movies where the women are just props," she said. "My character really gets involved in the action."

Born Christa Brooke Camille Shields, her career began at age 11 months when she became the Ivory Soap baby. By the age of 3 she was modeling in fashion shows. She became the first child client of The Ford Model Agency and was in constant demand.

For a face that well-known, acting seemed the next logical step. Shields made her major screen debut as a child prostitute in *Pretty Baby* at age 12. Other feature films include *King of the Gypsies*, *Tilt*, *The Blue Lagoon*, *The*

*Muppets Take Manhattan* and *Endless Love*.

She was featured on television in the drama specials *The Prince of Central Park* and *After the Fall*.

Besides modeling and acting, Shields has come out with her own brand of jeanswear, which includes denims, corduroys, lighter-weight cottons, plenty of colors, plus coordinating jackets and vests.

Her book, titled *On Your Own*, tells how she dealt with her mother's alcoholism, how her father never fully accepted her career in show business, and other factors that have influenced her life.

A recent graduate of Princeton, Shields is described by her friends as a sweet Catholic girl who shuts herself off from the world in an effort to be "normal."

Hesseman's best-known television roles have been as Dr. Johnny Fever on *WKRP in Cincinnati*, as Bonnie Franklin's second husband on *One Day at a Time*, and now as Charlie Moore on *Head of the Class*. Marinaro starred for five years as Coffey on *Hill Street Blues* and was later featured on *Falcon Crest*.

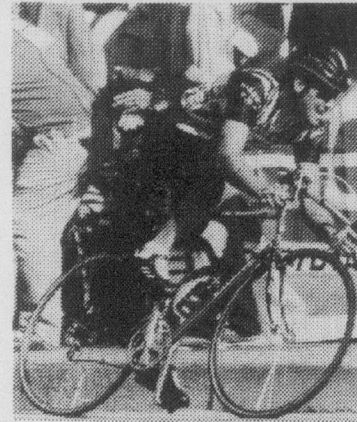

## Race to the finish line a family affair

Let's get this straight from the very beginning: Bob Kersee is husband and coach of Jackie Joyner-Kersey, world record-holder in the heptathlon. Jackie Joyner-Kersey is the sister of Al Joyner, a 1984 gold medalist. Al Joyner is married to Florence Griffith-Joyner, record-holder of the women's 100 meter, and Bob Kersee's star pupil.

Together they're one racy clan. Individually, they will each play an integral part in the 1988 Olympics.

But why does Florence stand out more than the others? The answer could lie in her incredible speed or her unusual success story. But more likely than not, it's her lightning-bright lycra and lace wardrobe, dragonlady fingernails and wild mane that has turned fans' heads, and made them decide to go with the Flo.

She brought 14 different outfits with her to wear in this year's quarterfinals, and admits that she rarely wears them more than once. Her trademark has become what she calls the "one legger," a full-length running suit that only covers—quite simply—one leg rather than both.

Although Florence's lycra flash has just recently been splashed on the covers of magazines and her name is fresh in sports headlines, she isn't a newcomer to the track. She's been a 100-meter runner in the past (but didn't break 11 seconds until last year), and won an Olympic silver medal in 1984 for 200 meters.

The track keeps sizzling when sister-in-law Jackie shifts into high gear. She holds the world record in the heptathlon, a seven-event competition. Although she jumped a mere 22 feet, 11 3/4 inches during the heptathlon trials, her 24-foot, 5 1/2-inch effort in the individual long jump was 9 1/4 inches better than Bruce Jenner's best leap in the 1976 Olympic decathlon. The competition for female athlete of the year keeps getting stiffer.

As for the men in the family, their times may be just as trying. Bob will be coaching them every step and stride of the way, while Al continues to help Florence with workouts and provides emotional strength to his sister, wife and brother-in-law.






