What a fabulous time that was for me and my sister Andrea who shared in the winnings. Although we had each been to various performances at Stratford over the years, it proved to be extra special to have an entire weekend to slow down and savor not just the theatre, but also a delightful small Ontario town, not unlike the nearby town of Fergus where we had grown up.

Let me recap and recall the warm welcome that awaited us at the Swan Motel nestled in a woody setting at the edge of town that had a Townships feeling to it. Thanks to the fine

instructions provided by the motel owner, Colleen Pola, we had no trouble finding our way to the Keystone Alley Café where a complimentary gourmet dinner was our next treat. The manager provided expert advice on which of the many house specialties we might enjoy, along with lots of local lore.

Saturday morning found us at 10 o'clock sharp at a very dingy warehouse in an industrial area of town for the next item on our agenda — a guided tour of the festival's props and costumes. Once inside, however, what followed was anything but dull as we wove our way through a maze of magical sets and costumes, literally everything under the sun. I enjoyed sampling the feel, if not the taste, of a very appetizing looking breakfast plate which turned out to be latex eggs, foam toast and fibre bacon.

Trying on costumes proved to be a real highlight of the tour with most of us fantasizing for at least a few moments that we were Martha Henry or Stephen Ouimet. There were several groans of disappointment when we learned that we had just missed their giant garage sale where many of the costumes, which may have cost \$2,000 to \$3,000 to make, were offered at garage sale prices. Apparently most of the small theatre groups in Ontario had dispatched shoppers there bright and early.

After a pre-theatre lunch at a restaurant called The Church, which lived up to its reputation of offering the most special food and ambiance in town, we made our way to the awesome Festival Theatre and were thrilled to discover that

we were to experience *Amadeus* from seats that were front and centre. The two-and-a-half hours that followed was theatre at its best. I would gladly have skipped the intermission so as not to break the spell, but Stephen Ouimet, who played Salieri and was on stage for every single scene, must have wished it was twice as long.

It was delightful not to be heading for the 401 and home but rather to a little café to review our favorite moments of the play and our subtly diffe-

rent interpretations of the dramatic ending. After sampling some of the appealing shops we decided on Bentley's Pub for a simple supper, then headed back to the Swan after a great day.

Another tour had been booked to get us going on Sunday morning — backstage at the Festival Theatre. Once again, we were awed by getting behind the scenes to see the complex network of lights, cameras and props that come together for each production.

Our guide, another from a highly trained corps of volunteers, shared highlights of the Stratford Festival's history, recalling its early days in the tent of the '50s when ticket prices had ranged between \$1.50 and \$6, a far cry from the current regular price in the \$50 range for a matinée, although Stratford does offer half-price tickets for some shows on Tuesdays and Thursdays. However, after the tours we were able to appreciate the high cost of producing first-class theatre.

Down The Street, touted as another fine place to dine and a favorite hangout for actors and locals, was a fine choice for brunch. Then we were off on foot to the old fashioned, beautifully restored Avon Theatre, just around the corner, to see *The Gondoliers*. This was my first encounter with Gilbert and Sullivan since Fergus High School days and I relished it as though I was a teenager once again. I also marvelled at the sets and choreography with increased awareness and appreciation gained from our tours.

After another café stop to review our favorite scenes, it was time to hit the road but not before rejoicing once again in my good fortune at having won the weekend that we had enjoyed so fully.

Right up there with my highest priority resolutions for 1996 I'm posting a return visit to Stratford to see at least two more first-rate performances, or perhaps to relive *Amadeus* which is to be repeated. I know where I'm going to stay and to dine and that I won't want to miss the a.m. tours either. Thanks for the memories *Record!*

Music to move Townshippers this chilly month

Music In Motion

1996 has barely just begun and already there is a tremendous amount of activity on the arts front. The music scene in the Townships is vibrant with a slew of shows presented over the next couple of weeks.

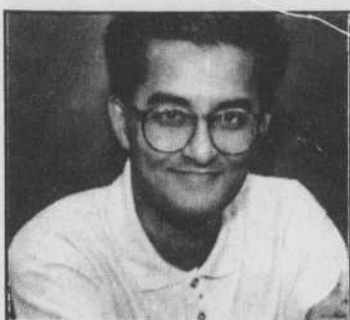
Bishop's University's music department offers three concerts to herald in the New Year, from contemporary classical to jazz.

"The Eastern Townships is a cradle of musical activity and the pearls are here, not elsewhere," enthused Jane Hospes of the music department.

The first show of the New Year takes place this Friday, January 12. *The Poetry of Chamber Music* couples the talents of Townships musicians Etienne de Médicis playing the oboe, Jean René on viola and Tom Gordon tickling the ivories, all members of Ensemble Musica Nova.

If you've never heard music played by this trio of instruments, you can get caught up with this one concert alone. There have only been nine pieces written for this particular grouping of instruments, and the trio will play seven of them. How often do you get this close to hearing an entire repertoire in one evening?

The combination of oboe, viola and piano is also rather lyrical. Each of the musicians who wrote music for it was inspired by a different poem. These are 19th and 20th century composers such as Klughardt, Hindemith and Loeffler.



Art Bites

The show takes place at Bandeem Hall at Bishop's University on Friday, January 12, at 8 p.m.

Next Friday, January 19, Renée Gilbert is joined by some of his friends to present a show featuring works by Claude Bollings that fuse classical and jazz with Latin and southern spices thrown in for good measure.

This was originally scheduled as a noontime recital in September, but was cancelled due to the tragic death of 31-year-old guitarist François Quintin of a heart attack.

At next week's concert, François' brother Jacques will play the guitar in his place, joined by a number of Townships musicians on the piano, drums and flute.

"It's dynamic, peppy music," said Hospes. "The concert will be a celebration of life."

As we head toward the end of the millennium, the music department celebrates the end of two centuries with a concert on January 26.

Soprano Michèle Gagné and pianist Brigitte Poulin, accompanied by string musicians Geneviève Beaudry and Céline Arcand on violins, Jean René on viola and Vincent Bernard on cello, will perform works written at the end of the 18th and 19th centuries by Mahler, Schumann, Schnittke and Schoenberg.

Radio-Canada continues its longtime relationship with the music department by co-producing this recital for later broadcast.

That should keep you busy at Bandeem this month. Upcoming highlights include the jazz beats of the Janis Steprans Quartet on February 2, nine musicians from the Sherbrooke Symphony performing rare nonets by Brahms and Spohr on February 16 and a tribute to Broadway by The University Singers and Bishop's Pop Ensemble on April 12.

"The Eastern Townships is so rich, people have to re-learn going to concerts," said Hospes. "It's very different listening to music at home on CD than going out to a show. At home, you start doing dishes, working around the house, you can profit totally from the music at a concert. In the old days before CDs and cassettes, concert halls were full and there was this energy when people walked out the doors."

Hospes pointed out the low

ticket prices for the shows make it affordable for everyone — \$8 regular, \$6 seniors and free for students.

"Remember the cost is so low not because the concerts are cheap, but because we're an educational institution," said Hospes. "It's the university extending its educational vocation to the public."

Let hot blues jams warm up your January with the fourth edition of the *Bordée de blues* music festival at Bar Ailleurs in Coaticook.

Every Thursday this month, guitarist Mike Goudreau of the Boppin' Blues performs solo, although he is often accompanied by friends.

Boppin' Blues players join a series of performers on Saturdays. Upcoming shows include saxophonist Marvin Rudisel on January 13, Montreal singer and harmonica player Rick Weston on the 20th and a five-member band led by guitarist Larry Niles plays on the 27th.

All shows begin at 9:30 and there is no cover charge.

The Magog Tavern in Sherbrooke continues its series of Friday night jazz and blues concerts on January 12 with a show featuring guitarist Mike Gauthier, drummer Kevin O'Sullivan and David Gelfand on bass.

Next Friday, a special guest from Perpignan, France, Bruno Fournié on flute joins the

Townships musicians at the tavern.

Student theatre educational, enlightening

SHERBROOKE — Many people expect university drama departments to offer exciting and enlightening theatrical productions. But elementary and high schools in the Townships — as well as Champlain College — are exercising mandates to educate as well as entertain those on-stage and in the seats with surprising results.

With productions that go beyond the obvious, anglophone educational centers across the Townships are doing their part to enrich the cultural life of all its residents.

Ken Tomlin, Champlain College's drama professor, places a priority on choosing non-commercial works that challenge both the actors performing them and the audiences that watch his shows.

Through classical and modern plays — such as Brian Friel's *Communication Cord*, Tennessee Williams' *Orpheus Descending* and *Close Ties* — his students have been able to examine the gamut of human relations.

"The plays introduce them to the adult world, the kind of concerns that are at the back of institutions like the Supreme Court, and the disintegration of the North American family," said Tomlin. "Plays that deal with important social issues of the decade."

Even plays that deal with important social issues of previous centuries have a bearing on life in the 90s, as in the department's next production, the Restoration comedy *The Country Wife*, presented in April.

"It deals with male chauvinism being upset by feminine wiles, the battle of the sexes," said Tomlin, adding that battle is tougher than ever with today's high divorce rate.

"I've decided, especially in the last eight years, I want to give the actors really challenging texts because if they think of going into the profession or continuing acting at Bishop's, I

want them to realize the kind of challenges they're going to need to meet."

He said local student theatre is promising.

"If I can judge by what happens on campus, there seems to be an increasing vigor. The Champlain drama club is very active, Bishops' frequency of productions is increasing and undertaking considerably interesting plays."

Champlain's extra-curricular drama club was resurrected last year by a four students who galvanized many more and mounted a successful festival of short plays.

One of the organizers, Kareem Fahmy, said this year about 40 students are involved, many of whom have written their own plays dealing with a variety of issues such as adolescence and insanity. Most of the students involved are not taking drama courses.

"It's neat because we're not doing it for any reason other than a bunch of students getting together enjoying ourselves, it's not for credits," said Fahmy, a science student.

Now that it's back in full swing, Fahmy is confident the torch will be carried on.

"Even though I'm moving on and people who were originally involved are moving on, I hope it's left a lasting impression and hopefully carry on," said Fahmy, adding one student has already informed him she's writing a play for next year's show.

CHALLENGING

Tomlin said the work both Champlain and Bishop's University are doing in terms of theatre is challenging for audiences.

"We're not doing musicals, and musicals tend to be lighter, the dialogue and acting tends to be less challenging. It's normal for academic institutions to give a greater challenge to actors and people going into university or college theatres are probably expecting a more challenging content."

Tomlin said future theatre-goers will probably expect to see more serious works.

"Maybe Generation Xers in their efforts to understand society, maybe seeking in their theatre more serious content in an attempt to find a mirror on society than neither movies or TV tends to do for them."

Lewis Evans, head of the theatre department at Bishop's College School, also bemoaned the existence of popular entertainment such as television.

"My dad used to direct the Lennoxville Players (amateur theatre group)," Evans said. "They used to meet three times a week for rehearsals. No one watched TV in the 50s, who could afford it?, so they put on a play, for relaxation, for fun, it was a real community thing. People just don't have the time they used to have today, part of that is their evenings are quietly and nicely entertained by the boob tube."

"Amateur theatre in high school and universities is where it's act because adult amateur theatre is gone belly up," he added.

At least in this part of the Townships. In Knowlton, it seems to be thriving with amateur theatre groups such as the Knowlton Players, Mandragore Productions and the Echo Art theatre company, which mounts community musicals on a yearly basis.

INNOVATIVE

Bishop's College School's drama professors are using innovative methods to train as well as educate their young actors through two plays a year.

Last year, a highly charged bilingual production of Agatha Christie's *Ten Little Indians* utilized two casts who each better learned the other's language in the process.

While *Ten Little Indians* featured a French first act and an English second act, for this year's production of *Romeo & Juliet*, Evans and Maryse Forest, head of the French option at BCS, have concocted a new challenge for its actors and audiences.

"Romeo and his family are English-speaking, Juliet and her family are French-speaking, the Prince is bilingual, the townspeople are varying degrees of bilingual," explained Evans.

Both William Shakespeare's text and a translation by François Victor Hugo are being used.

"Bilingualism is a major thrust of this school, and theatre is a wonderful way to do this," said Evans, adding that it helps students learn another language.

Evans said he also tries not to choose overly commercial works, although they do present the "silly", as with last semester's British comedy *Daisy Pulls It Off*, set in a girl's boarding school in the 1920s.

"We have a freedom in the choice of plays because we're small, because our parents don't all live in the area," said Evans, adding that at some schools, a child's swearing on stage in character results in complaints from irate parents.

The public high school in Lennoxville, Alexander Galt, has a reputation for presenting ambitious works with a large section of the student body.

With its 25th anniversary production of *The Sound Of Music* two years ago, the drama department got the broader community involved on stage in a show that received raves from those who saw it.

TAKING CHANCES

Although last year's non-traditional, comic version of *Robin Hood* received flak for its raunchier elements, at least director Nelson Gonyer was taking chances, trying to push student theatre to new heights.

Danny Lapointe, of Heroes' Memorial elementary school in Cowansville, is also trying to take theatre to new heights. He said each play there is approached with a professional attitude that the kids respond to, an attitude initiated by Tony Whittall, who resigned last year.

He also said Heroes' Memorial is the only elementary school in the Brome Lake area to make a concentrated effort to attract audiences from other schools to their plays.

"Close to 2000 people saw *The Tinder Box*," he said. The comedy by Nicholas Stuart Gray based on a folk tale by the Brothers Grimm was a non-traditional choice. So is the drama club's upcoming March production *Nicholas Nickleby*, by Charles Dickens.

Lapointe said what the students get out of the plays is invaluable.

"They learn about themselves, their abilities, confidence," he said. "Drama is a great character builder."

Also, Cowansville's high school, Massey-Vanier, is known for its excellent Shakespearean productions. The next one, *12th Night*, will hit the stage in early May.

Be it through plays that tackle social issues or bilingual productions that keep the actors and audiences on their toes, student theatre in the Townships is holding firm on a mandate to educate as well as enthrall.

As Ken Tomlin summed up: "Education is more important than the pleasure factor, whereas in commercial theatre, the pleasure factor tends to be greater."

Bishop's drama entertaining and enriching

LENNOXVILLE — Professional theatres in the Townships must rely heavily on attendance figures to survive, a reality often reflected in the programming, so much of the real experimentation occurs in educational institutions.

As an important cultural center in the Townships, Bishop's University is committed to offering an enriching lineup of productions for both its students and the greater community.

The drama department is at the forefront of this cultural revolution by continually experimenting with its productions. Also, by bringing in experts to work with its 75 majors and fostering a relationship with surrounding professional theatres, it offers its students and audiences a connection to a world that extends beyond the Lennoxville community.

Ian Gaskell, drama professor and director of Centennial Theatre, said the annual student festival TheatreActiv is the best educational experience they offer students.

"We're not holding their hands," he said. "They're doing theatre. The faculty stand by and give advice when asked, but they get it up."

IN CHARGE

Students are in charge of everything — organizing the festival, directing the plays, starring in the shows, handling all its technical requirements and taking care of publicity.

The 11th annual edition of the festival will run from January 25 to 28 and feature eight short plays, one of which was written by student James Duncan.

Another festival, this one composed entirely of student-written works called New Plays, runs biannually. Last year, this fest got the greater community involved by holding

an open casting call.

The range of regular productions mounted by the drama department is also rather eclectic. Recent shows have included the British Renaissance classic *Dr. Faustus*, by Christopher Marlowe, about man who sells his soul to the devil; the bittersweet American play *What I Did Last Summer*, by A. R. Gurney, about a young boy's coming of age in the aftermath of World War II; the medieval piece *Passion*, an unconventional look at the life of Jesus Christ; and the Canadian musical comedy *Horseplay*, which combined a lightheartedness with a genuine concern for the environment and animal rights. *Horseplay* was also the first full-fledged musical the department has taken on.

Coming up this semester are the polar opposites *Dangerous Liaisons* by Christopher

Hampton and Thornton Wilder's *Our Town*, which replaces the previously announced Shakespeare play *Measure For Measure*.

"We try to provide a broad experience for students and audiences," said Gaskell, adding they often experiment with the productions. "It's imperative we try to stretch, to explore both in terms of playing with design and production concepts."

SEND IN THE PROS

Thanks to the university's Academic Enrichment Program, the department is able to bring in professionals to work with the students.

"They round out and develop our program and give students insight in the world of professional theatre," explained Gaskell.

Last semester, puppeteer Tim Gosley spent three weeks with students before works-

hopping a multi-media production, *Victoria Vikings*, a technically complex piece utilizing video projections, model figures and environmental musicians (playing on a log and an anvil). Gosley's story drew upon myths and legends as it dealt with personal identity and familial relationships.

At the end of January, experimental theatre group Primus of Winnipeg will arrive at Bishop's to conduct workshops and give public performances.

STRONG TIES

Bishop's drama students are also linked to the larger world with the department's strong ties to such institutions as The Piggery Theatre in North Hatley, which shares a technical director with Centennial and whose new artistic director is Bishop's prof Greg Tuck.

Drama students may also end up working at The Piggery, as Veronica Good did last sum-

mer in a small part on stage. She also provided a helping hand backstage.

"Students already do the Centennial Theatre road shows," added Gaskell. They work on the technical side of things, and serve as ushers.

There is also a connection to the National Theatre School of Canada in Montreal, where Bishop's drama prof JoJo Rideout teaches voice.

"So people who teach the professionals teach our students," said Gaskell.

"It's all interconnected. It goes from small things from students discovering their capacities at the festivals to what's going on at the Piggery."

The public benefits as well, since they wouldn't normally get a chance to see works like the kind offered at Bishop's at professional theatres.

"Theatre is alive. You can see these things at Stratford and Shaw or you can see it here," he added. "Part of the work the university does is also training audiences, having an audience respond to creative work. I think that's really the most important thing, to experience the enrichment that comes from art."

Rideout also extended her knowledge to the community with her Stage Door Workshops for teens last summer.

Perhaps one of the most satisfying developments is the return of former students, who impart what they've learned in the outside world to Bishop's students. This school year, Bishop's graduate Rebecca Harries is replacing drama professor Jonathan Rittenhouse while he's on sabbatical.

"Students teaching the next generation of students, that's what it's about," Gaskell said. "That's what we're in business for. It's education in its broadest and most important sense."

As Garth Brooks is gearing up for a three-year, world wide tour scheduled to begin in March, he is also preparing for his third child's arrival. His wife Sandy is pregnant and their baby is due August 10.

The 1996 tour had to be planned as a family affair since his wife and his two daughters are going on the road with him.

"We've had long talks for a year and a half, and Sandy realizes we're in this thing together," said Brooks in a recent interview.

"It's good for our marriage. She knows what we do, and she says she needs to be doing it with us. And I agree."

The mother and two daughters — along with their unborn sibling — will tour aboard their own vehicle. For now it's called The Girl's Bus.

Garth Brooks is already riding the success of his latest album *Fresh Horses* released in November. Here's the review:

From beginning to end, Brooks offers a wild ride you are bound to enjoy. He remains faithful to his tradition and serves up a diverse selection of excellent songs, most of them co-written by Brooks himself.

This is his sixth album of original material, excluding *Beyond The Season* and *The Hits*. The latter sold eight million copies in barely six months, becoming the fastest selling greatest hits album of all time.

"She's Every Woman", the first single from the new album, is a tribute sung in a very loving and tender way. It was very successful with radio programmers as well as with fans.

"The Fever" is Garth's version of an Aerosmith's tune, lyrically reworked to fit the rodeo rider's lifestyle. Brooks' own screaming at the end of the number shows the kind of excitement he generates at live performances. I must say that this is a dramatic turnaround on this album.

For those who like their music more on the traditional side, "Cowboys And Angels" will sweep you away with its wailing pedal steel and sweet fiddle while "That Ol' Wind" and "The Beaches Of Cheyenne" addresses the romantic

side of us all and will bring tears to your eyes.

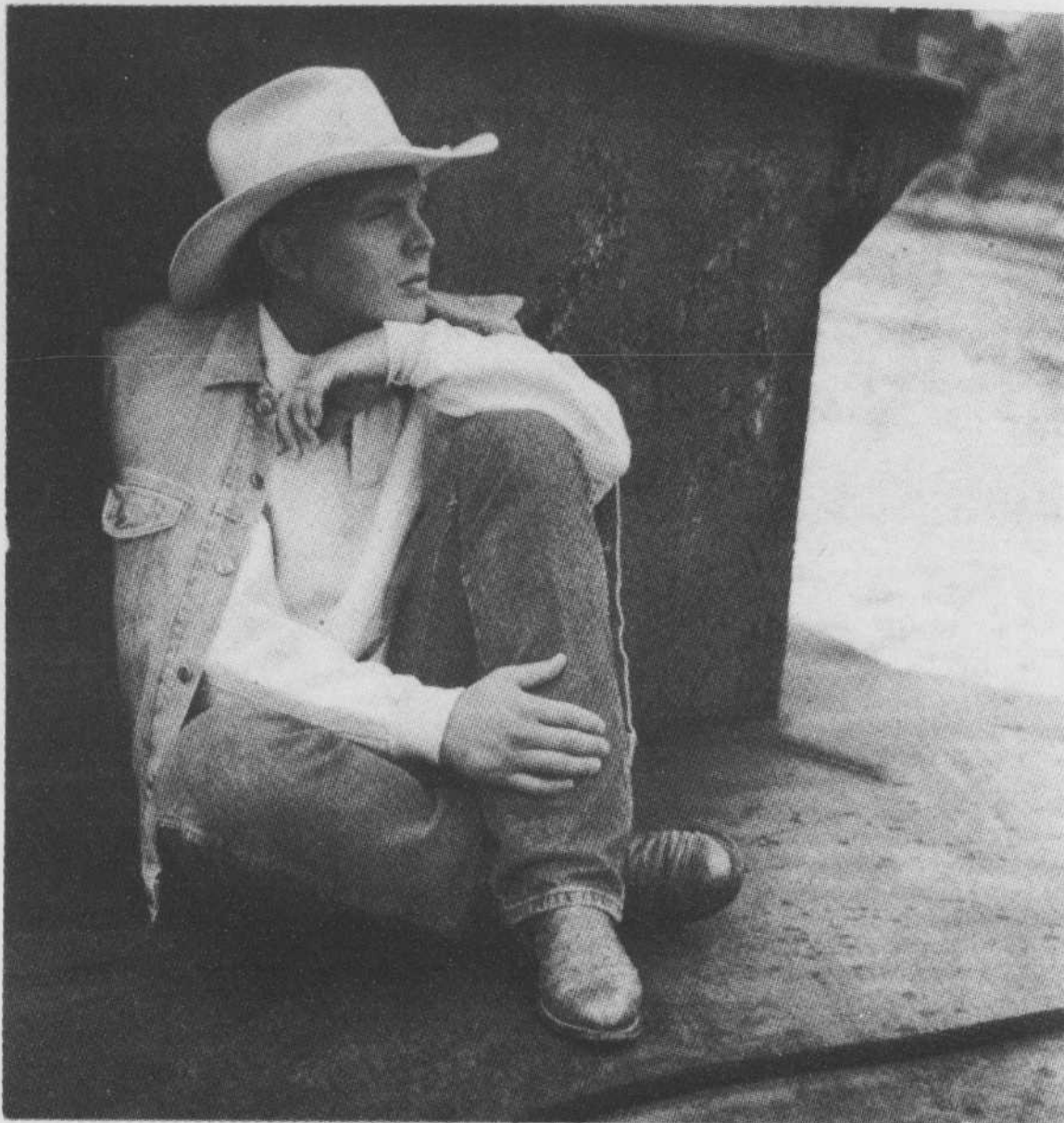
"The Old Stuff", with its tales of life on the road and lyrics such as "I asked the good Lord up in heaven/let me treat the music right/then I prayed that Detroit goes wild tonight", is sure to be a crowd-pleaser.

"Rollin'" is a rollicking train of passion featuring background vocals by Trisha Yearwood.

On "It's Midnight Cinderella", he rewrites the familiar fairy tale: "I guess your prince charming/ wasn't after all/ 'cause he sure seemed different/ right after the bal/ I guess more than horses/ are turning into rats/ and by the way he's walkin'/ I can guess where your slipper's at". There's a lusty edge added to the tale as Brooks will "Bip boppity boo" his way in Cinderella's heart — never mind the fairy godmother.

The emotions evoked by "The Change" can be compared to another one of his classics, "The Dance". Here Brooks offers a deep, magnificent vocal performance as he sings about holding true to your principles. The song definitely bares a Billy Joel influence. While he uses piano as a musical crutch, Brooks pours his heart out in this grandiose rendition.

"Ireland" is a majestic song, a victory cry for innocent victims, a veiled salute to the people of his native Oklahoma shattered last year by a terrorist bomb who still managed to hold their heads high and face the disaster and its aftermath. The grand finale on the album,

it may be the vocal challenge of Brooks' career. It is an outstanding work of art, but country radio will never classify this song as being country music.

But with this new team of *Fresh Horses* and Brooks firmly holding the reins, the race is on and you can bet he'll be the winner.

For Clint Black, there won't be any touring in 1996 and he's got a good reason. According to him, there's so many acts on the road now and so many new ones just waiting for their chance. He said it would be better if a lot of major acts would tour in cycles.

But that doesn't mean he won't be working since he's planning the release of a greatest hits album this year and plans to play a rodeo star next year in a TV-movie based on a

true story.

For the past eight years, Reba McEntire has been visiting with fans backstage following her shows, allowing them to take pictures, ask questions and make comments.

But this will no longer be the case. She said the lack of accommodations at most performance venues don't permit it. It is too bad for fan club members but that's the way it is.

Country fans can expect many new arrivals in music shops, so keep your eyes open. "He's A Good Ol' Boy" singer Chely Wright released her sophomore album *Right In The*

Middle Of It on January 9, legend Merle Haggard is releasing *1996* on January 23, and Patty Loveless' *Trouble With The Truth* will hit the stores January 23.

Tracy Lawrence will release *Time Marches On* January 23, hot on the heels of his *Live* album, but fans are not complaining.

John Anderson follows, on January 30, with a new album titled *Paradise*.

Wishing you a good country week. Keep in mind that listening to country music is very soothing for the mind and soul — and may be the cure for the common cold.

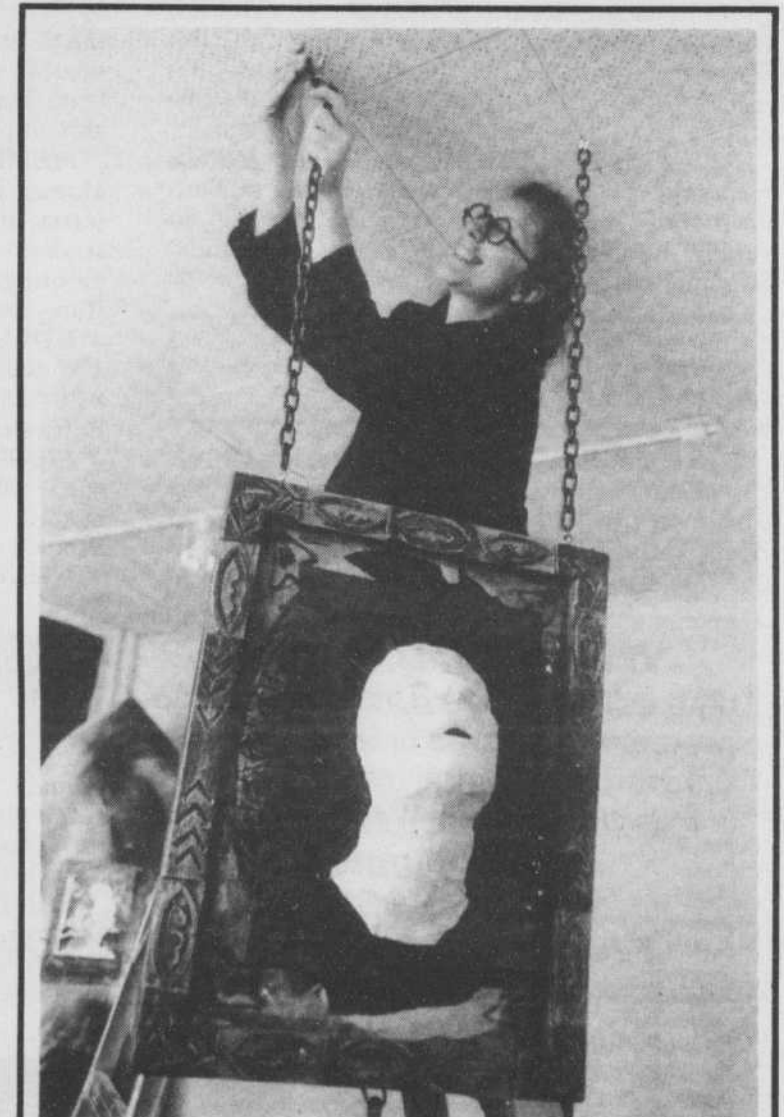

All-horse network: Phone betting on races

TORONTO (CP) — All horses, all the time. That's the premise of THN — The Horse Network, a new cable specialty channel and one of dozens of new applications that went before the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission Thursday.

The network would provide equine-related programming 24 hours a day, seven days a week — and allow couch potatoes to bet on live races.

There would be shows about horse-care and training, riding, breeding, stable management, rodeos and other western events, and even re-runs of old TV series like *Black Beauty*, *My Friend Flicka*, and, yes, *Mr. Ed*.

"All that will be missing will be the fragrance of the stables," say the proponents in submitting their application to the federal regulator for cable positions, primarily on a new low-penetration digital tier of channels expected to be available by 1997. Special set-top analog converter boxes would be required.

The most compelling aspect of the network, backed by the Ontario horseracing industry, including The Jockey Club, plus joint-venture partners in cable and banking, would be the live races from tracks in Canada, the U.S. and even Hong Kong. There would also be programming swaps with a similar emerging American network and with ESPN.

Plans call for about 80 per cent of THN's projected costs to be covered by a share of telephone account betting, with the rest coming from sponsors and advertisers.

With wagering licensed and operated by the tracks, bettors would establish special accounts, then place wagers by phone. There would be a fixed limit, with a 48-hour cooling-off period before the limit could be changed.

Off-track pari-mutuel wagering has been legal in Canada since 1982, but so far has been practised only in several western cities.

Andrew Gaughan, a Jockey Club project partner, says The Horse Network would make a nationwide extension of such betting viable by adding the excitement of a live video feed of the races.
