His Britannic Majesty having requested the King to be pleased to confer in his name the order of the Bath on his Excellency Lord Crumville, his ambassador extraordinary at Paris, the investiture of the said order was performed today (5th June), after Mass, by the King, with the usual ceremonies. Major General Sir John Malcolm, Knight, Grand Cross of the Order of the Bath, and Sir George Naylor, the Chief Officer of the same order, were present as witnesses at this ceremony.

The full wing of the speech addressed to the King, by the Duke of Northumberland, on delivering to his Majesty the Charter. —With the pleasure of your Majesty, I have the honour to have been entrusted by your Majesty, to be placed at the foot of the altar, and to read to you the Charter of the said Order of the Bath, which was signed by your Majesty, and which is now deposited in the Treasury. The wish of the King, your Majesty, is that by the insertion of your Majesty's name on the Charter, it should be drawn up, as if it were the work of your Majesty, and that the Charter should be signed by the mutual obligation of your Majesty and the King.
