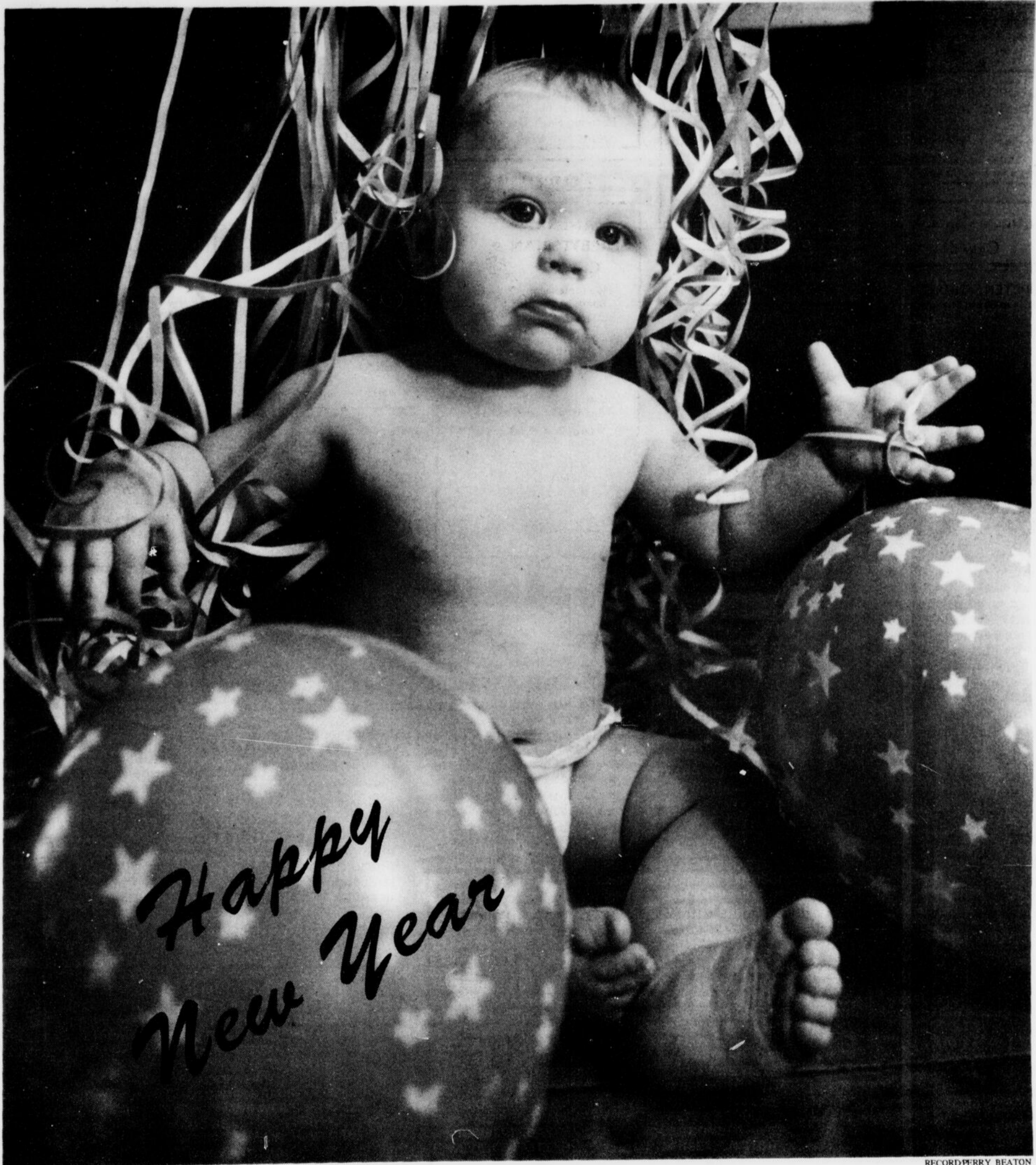

We're hip! According to a reliable source with close contacts in the fourth grade, 'cool' is back in style. 'Rad' is now passé. 'Narly' was a non-starter. 'Totally tubular' never made it out of California. 'Awe-

some' is old hat and 'neat' things are cool again just as they were when we followed Jack Kerouac on the road. We're hip again!

Being hopelessly, perhaps pathologically inarticulate, and wrestling daily with the inadequacies of language, I am not offended by bad words but I am offended by the bad use of

words that we hear every day from pundits, professors and politicians who sneer at slang and recoil from profanity but don't hesitate at 'irregardless' or 'at this point in time' or even 'hopefully'.

Hitting your thumb with a hammer requires the forceful expression of powerful words that should not have had their magic squandered on the weather or the referendum. Usage is all. Every generation comes up with its own meta-

phors for 'very' and 'excellent' as the old words become worn-out with use. During two world wars, things were 'ripping' or 'smashing' as in "I had a ripping time tonight, Basil." "You're a smashing girl, Edna."

Then things became "terrific" or "super" or even 'super-duper'. 'Gre-eat' had its day as did 'far-out' and 'ba-ad' or 'bit-chen'. My favorite (which had a brief but spectacular flowering was 'wicked') as in "It's wicked cold outside today," or "That

video is wicked good."

Carl Sandberg once called slang "language that takes off its jacket, spits on its hands and gets to work." That's more than can be said for the pundits, professors and politicians who use it to obscure absence of thought or as the drunk uses a streetlamp — for support instead of illumination. It is pleasant, therefore, to know that language is vigorous and flourishing in the schoolyards where it is refurbished by each new generation. That's cool.

Pam Tillis breaking new ground in country music

That fact was acknowledged



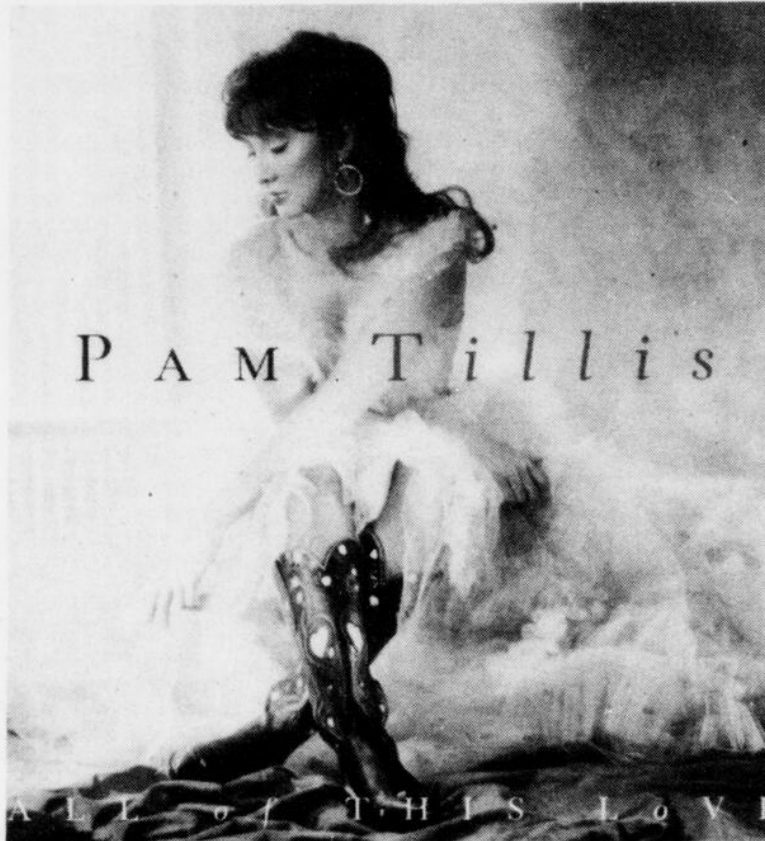
Country Connection

Being the sole producer of an album means the responsibilities of budgeting, choosing musicians, booking the studio and finalizing the mixes of every track. It also means many 12-to-16-hour days in the studio for a period of at least three months.

and Reba McEntire haven't produced solo yet. Many artists, male or female, have co-produced but the co-producer is always a professional with more experience to guide the project.

Tillis doesn't think of herself

as a groundbreaker. For her, it was a question of taking a step forward in her musical education.

"I learned so much from it that I think when I work with a co-producer again, I'll be able to work better. I really have a picture now of where my strengths and weaknesses lie in studio, and I wanted to see what it was like," she said recently.

She said the new album, her

fourth on Arista, doesn't resemble her original vision. She had an idea this record being was going to be so stripped-down.

"I think it was like a kid getting the big box of crayons for the first time," Tillis said of the finished production.

The first single, "Deep Down", was extremely well-received by radio and fans.

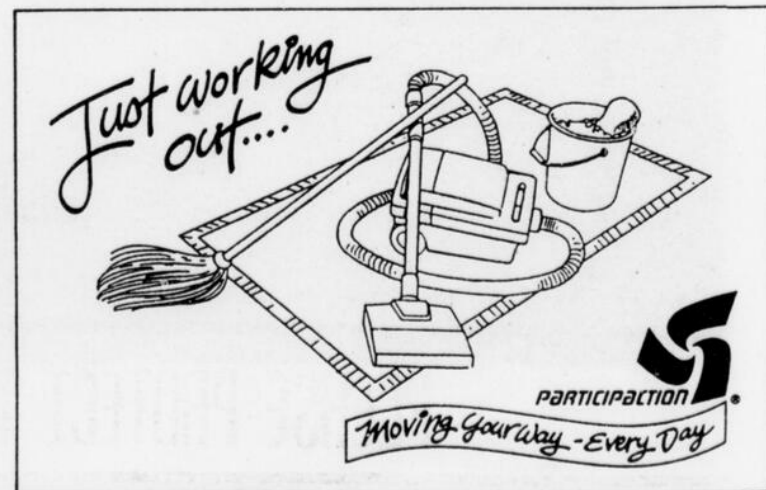
The whole album will be a huge success if judged by the way fans responded to her new material when she performed two months ago at The Burlington Memorial Auditorium in Vermont. Tillis gave a breathtaking performance. She poured her heart and soul in every song she sang. The interaction between her and the band members is stunning and her sense of humor is out of this world.

Tillis sings as if she was born to do nothing but. In concert, Tillis has no problem mesmerizing fans and from the first song on *All Of This Love*, there's this magic happening.

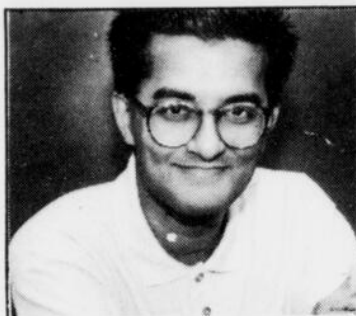
"He was about 10 days late," remembered mom Karen MacDonald. "He was born in the afternoon at 3:30 p.m."

A Class Act

For those wishing to celebrate the end of the year with the smooth sounds of classical guitar, Richard Bywaters is back in the Townships for four shows at Restaurant Frédéric Halin in North Hatley.

Bywaters was a regular player at many local restaurants during his eight years teaching music and performing in the province in the 80s. You may remember him from meals at La Rose des Sables in Sherbrooke, Moulin à Poivre in Magog or Les Muses and Frédéric Halin in North Hatley.

Back then, the Michigan native was known as Richard Przybylski. He changed his name to Bywaters after moving to London, Ontario, to accept a position teaching music to Grade 4 and 5 students at a French immersion school. While preparing his first compact disc of solo guitar works, *Cross Currents*, the musician felt his former name wasn't doing him any favors. Bywaters is his mother's maiden name.

Bywaters, who also performs regularly in Stratford, Ont., during the theatre festival there, says he plays a wide repertoire of "dinner music". It seems a shame to refer to his work as background music, though. As heard on *Cross Currents*, Bywaters' compositions are lyrical and melodious, one can almost hear a singer's voice in most of these pieces. They are devoid of the showy gymnastics some guitarists give into. The beautiful works stand on their own, and it almost seems a shame to drown them out with the rattling of utensils and cackling of conversation.

They are culled from Bywaters' folk, classical and religious musical experiences, all of which come to the fore at his

performances, which include medleys of folk songs from the British Isles and Quebec.

He said he fell in love with the French language when he hitchhiked to Quebec City at 17 years of age.

"I went to a restaurant, people were bilingual, and I said, 'One day, I'll do that. I won't be the odd man out,'" he said this week.

After his music studies in Detroit, Bywaters moved to Quebec to study French.

While here, he also helped edit a hymnal and was touched by the old melodies of the religious songs.

Bywaters has two other recordings on cassette — *Road Skipping* and *Rétrospection*.

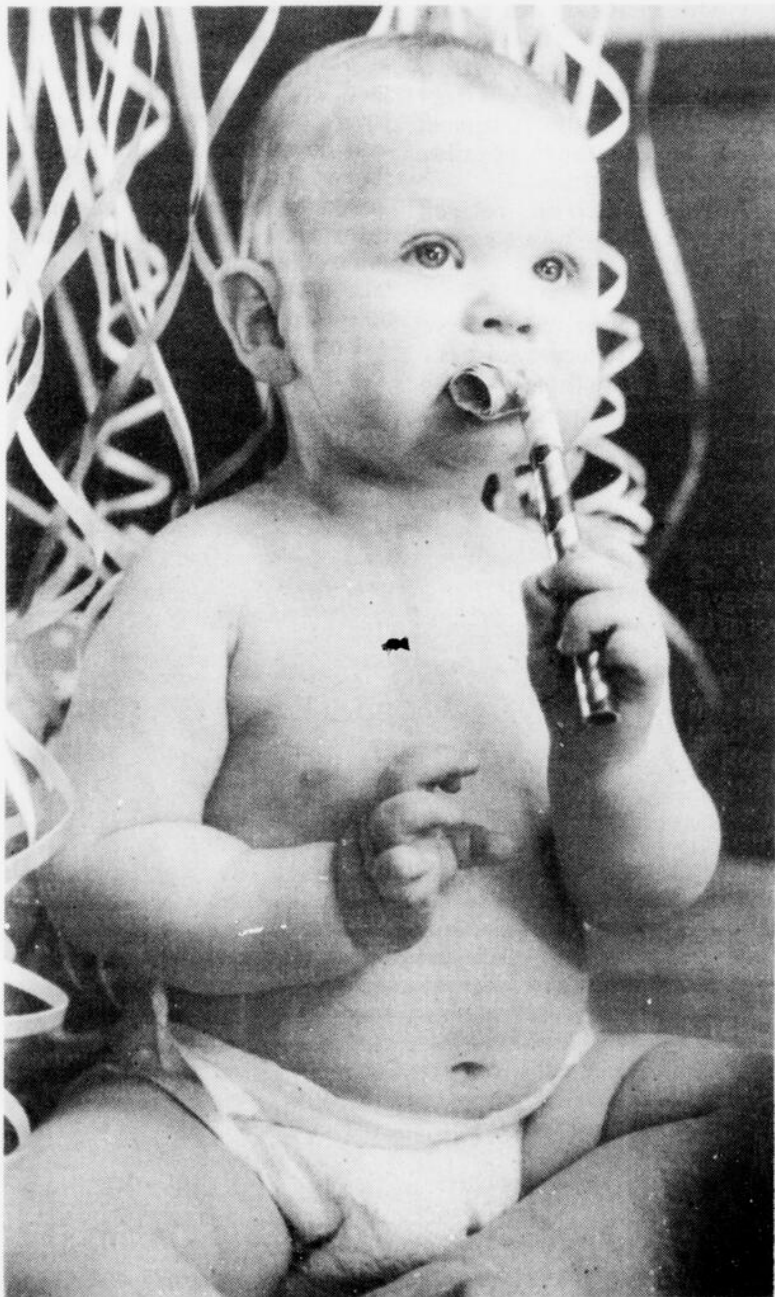

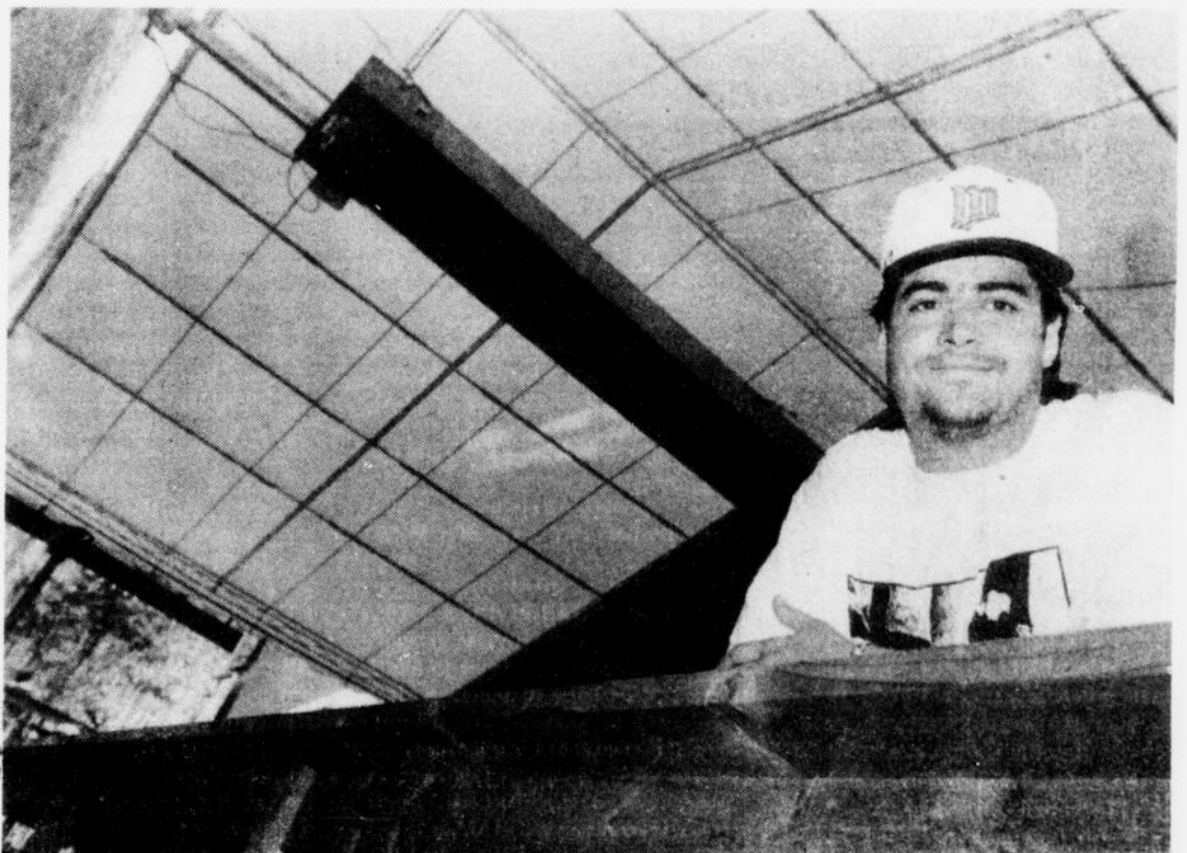

Slow year at the concert box office in 1995

TORONTO (CP) — A lack of stadium tours by big-name musical acts and increased competition for the entertainment buck drove down gate receipts in both the United States and Canada in 1995, concert industry analysts say.

"We didn't have the (Rolling) Stones, we didn't have (Pink) Floyd, the Grateful Dead (Jerry Garcia) died, that knocked a lot of money off the box office," Jim Monaco, communications director with Concert Productions International, said.

The Eagles, a 1970s rock band that reunited for a lucra-

tive comeback tour, were the exception, raking in about \$89.6 million (\$64 million US), to become North America's top grossing concert box-office act in 1995, two U.S. trade journals reported.

Their Hell Freezes Over tour was cut short in October 1994 due to guitarist Glenn Frey's illness, pushing dozens of dates into 1995, including five sold-out shows in Vancouver, Calgary and Edmonton in March.

More than 1.1 million people, about 73,000 in Canada, paid as much as \$93 a ticket for a nostalgic trip with the band that released Hotel California

19 years ago, Debbie Rix, of MCA Concerts.

The hip-hop harmony quartet Boyz II Men were the second-highest box office earners in North America, grossing \$60 million (\$43 million US), due to their prolific touring schedule of almost 140 dates, including stops in Toronto, Vancouver and Montreal.

But overall, gate receipts were down significantly, primarily because fewer stadium-sized bands hit the road.

"1995 was more indicative of the nature of our business than was 1994, which was almost a ridiculous anomaly as far as

big shows went," said Monaco.

Jane Cohen of *Performance Magazine*, which compiled year-end figures, said concert attendance across North America was down 21 per cent from 1994, but echoed Monaco's warning that 1994 was an exceptional year at the gate.

"That's because we had five stadium shows. You also had Barbra Streisand touring with a very inflated ticket price," she said from Fort Worth, Tex.

Monaco wouldn't say how steep the revenue drop was in Canada but acknowledged CPI, under investigation for alleged fraud, has had "a battle" with the upstart Molson

Ampitheatre in Toronto, which opened this year.

However, he agreed the figures underscore the reality that fewer acts today can command stadium crowds.

"New bands are all playing 1,200 to 4,000-seat halls, smaller places . . . they don't have the drawing power to fill big stadiums yet," he said.

That has something to do with the way new bands are marketed, with radio and MuchMusic playing only one or two singles, he said.

"If you have one or two hit records, it's very difficult to fill 30-40,000 seats."

Canadian musical acts go global

TORONTO (CP) — The cover of *Billboard's* year-end double issue, devoted to tracking the international music success stories of 1995, features matchbook-sized shots of six albums.

Two belong to Canadians, country music's new superstar Shania Twain of Timmins, Ont., and raunchy Ottawa-born rocker Alanis Morissette.

"It's been a helluva year," enthused Larry LeBlanc, Canadian correspondent for *Billboard*, a New York-based publication that's a must-read in the entertainment industry.

"Morissette and Twain not only were the most striking North American breakthroughs of 1995, but singing-in-two-languages epic Celine Dion became a global star as well," he said.

Indeed, Dion's 1994 album *Color of My Love* has sold 1.4 million copies in Canada and 10 million worldwide.

In France, she dominated

the charts with her French-language album *D'Eux*, an album that is even a hit in England, where Dion was recently greeted by fans Sarah "Fergie" Ferguson and golfing great Nick Faldo backstage at Wembley Arena.

"She is possessed of a voice that can stun a mugger at 40 paces," Britain's *Q Magazine* gushed in its most recent issue.

The trio lead an impressive roster of Canadians with international-selling albums this year, a list that also includes Loreena McKennit, whose *The Mask and Mirror* spent 56 weeks on *Billboard's* world music chart.

Calgarian singer-songwriter Jann Arden's bestselling album *Living Under June* produced a No. 1 hit single, "Insensitive", in Australia.

Toronto jazz crooner Holly Cole is popular in Japan while established acts like k.d. lang and Sarah McLachlan continued to elevate their profile abroad.

What's striking about Canadians' success abroad is that it covers such a broad spectrum, not just pop music, said LeBlanc, noting the popularity of children's favorites Raffi, Sharon, Lois and Bram, dance group Plastickman and opera tenor Ben Heppner.

Brian Robertson, president of the Canadian Recording Industry Association, said the country's music industry is maturing and developing the sophistication and know-how to reach into non-Canadian markets.

That's vital for the future of the country's music industry because Canadian acts cannot live on homegrown sales alone, he said.

Excluding independent releases, it costs on average a hefty \$300,000 to record and market an album.

Yet in a country the size of Canada, which has about 30 million people, the best most acts can do is to break even "even with very successful Canadian sales," he said.

"You'd like to think you

could isolate a career within Canada, and to some degree it has happened . . . but the bottom line is the real success is outside of this country."

Record companies, realizing this, are establishing full-fledged divisions to export domestic music, something that Britain, a country with 56 million people, has done with tremendous success.

Line between reel vs. real life was blurry in '95

TORONTO (CP) — Cops, docs and lawyers dominated North American television viewing in 1995.

There were real ones who paraded through the courtroom at the O. J. Simpson trial.

And imitation ones on the various police, medical and legal shows that dominated prime-time network schedules.

The line between reality and entertainment was never so blurry as in 1995, when news events were treated like entertainment extravaganzas and prime-time television became grittier.

Simpson spilled across the TV landscape. But the Canadian equivalent, the high-profile Paul Bernardo trial, did not — largely because of the absence of courtroom cameras.

The event that did hijack the airwaves in Canada was the Quebec referendum. The

roller-coaster, edge-of-your-seat referendum night was one of the most-watched news events in Canadian TV history.

The long-running Simpson epic reached its climax on Oct. 3 when millions of viewers from around the world tuned in to see the Juice acquitted of killing his ex-wife and her acquaintance.

Just hours later, there was a strange sort of closure to the

saga as airborne live-eye cameras tracked Simpson's journey from jailhouse to home in a white van, an ironic inversion of the infamous 1994 Bronco chase at the outset of the tale. It was a television moment for the archives.

So it came as no surprise that when the American networks' fall season began, a highly touted new series about a Los Angeles law firm was front and centre. Its continuing storyline? The firm's handling of a major celebrity murder case.

Because of his favorable track record, creator Steven Bochco was given a rare upfront endorsement in the form of a network green light for 26 episodes of *Murder One*.

The show began well enough, filling in for Bochco's other current success, *NYPD Blue*, on Tuesday nights. But it slumped badly when shifted to

Thursdays opposite the hugely popular *ER*.

Murder One is now on hiatus till January, when it will appear on Monday nights opposite that other hit hospital saga, *Chicago Hope*.

With audiences fragmented and so much at stake financially, network TV programming became an even riskier and

more ruthless game in 1995.

As a result, many in the new fall lineup, mostly sitcoms with recycled *Friends*-like ensemble formats, were cancelled after only a few weeks.

In Canada, stability was maintained through so-called packaged financing.

A handful of public- and private-sector investors are now responsible for an unprecedented number of quality Canadian series and TV films in production this year, shows that could never have made it to air on network money alone.

The success stories include *Due South* on CTV, *North of 60* and *The Rez* on CBC, and *Traders* and *Jake and the Kid* on Canwest Global.

All were financed from such varied sources as Telefilm Canada, similar provincial programs, the new Cable Production Fund, plus the network or production house involved.

Friends are everywhere; actors serve hams to homeless

"Sometimes I worry about overexposure," Courteney Cox, who plays Monica, told *Entertainment Weekly* in its Dec. 29-Jan. 5 issue.

discussing their favorite episodes on the Internet, and *Entertainment Weekly* just voted the cast Entertainers of the Year for 1995.

David Schwimmer, who plays Ross, quips that he's the only one in the cast "who doesn't have a personal assistant yet."

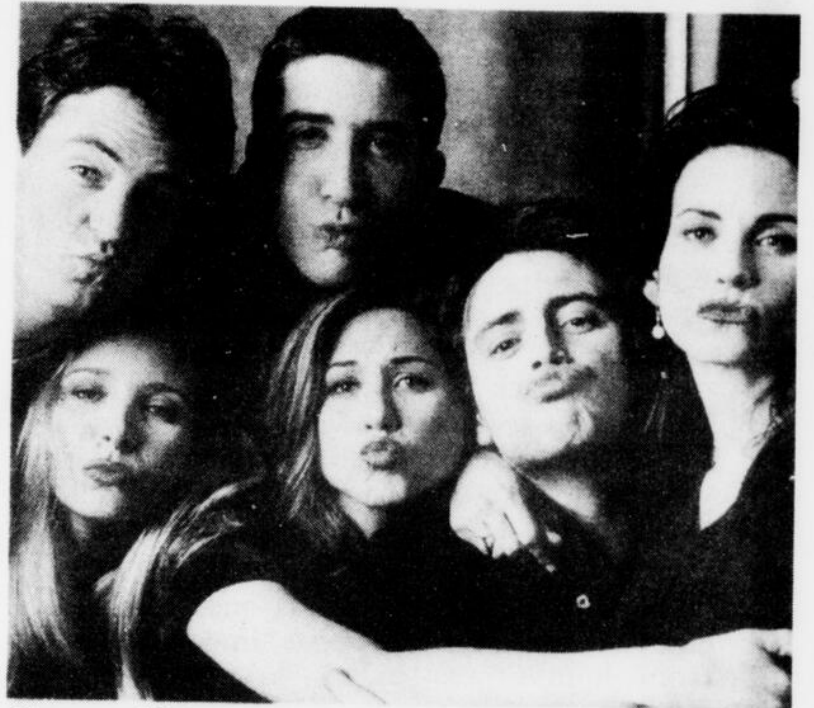
Actors team up to serve

1995 was a dreary year for movies

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The 1995 movie season may well set another box-office record —

but don't let the numbers fool you. It was a dreary year.

Creatively, the season was dominated by cardboard

cutouts and over-the-top violence. As for the comedies, can anyone remember the difference between *Billy Madison*,

Tommy Boy and *Major Payne*?

The box-office returns are deceiving, too. Ticket prices were higher and about two dozen more movies were put into wide release in 1995 than in 1994. Nevertheless, income is almost unchanged from a year ago, with \$4.96 billion US in North American tickets sold through mid-December, compared with \$4.92 billion at the same point in 1994.

Thanks in part to *Waterworld*, *Batman Forever* and *Judge Dredd*, the average studio movie cost 15 per cent more than a year ago, *Weekly Variety* estimates, and marketing costs climbed another 20 per cent. Foreign and video revenues are up, but not enough to make the theatrical slide irrelevant.

Here's the year-end scorecard:

Columbia: Sony's movie unit (Columbia and TriStar) accounted for 12.3 per cent of all tickets sold. The relatively good share came without any single blockbuster — the top performer was *Bad Boys*, with \$65.7 million. Columbia will have several Academy Award nominations, though, and *Sense and Sensibility* should be a minor success. Grade: C.

Disney: With an 18.2 per cent share of the box office, Disney again will edge out Warner Bros. as the town's top studio. Contributing to the strong year were *The Santa Clause*, *Pocahontas*, *Crimson Tide*, *While You Were Sleeping* and *Dangerous Minds* (which quietly grossed more than \$80 million by itself). Disney wasn't sure *Toy Story* would work, but it has, and may surpass \$150 million. *Powder* will earn \$30 million. Grade: A minus.

MGM: Even though MGM claimed only 6.3 per cent of ticket sales, the studio finally showed it has regained its roar. In the last quarter, both *Get Shorty* and *Goldeneye* performed well. But *Showgirls* was a naked failure and other films came and went in the blink of an eye — *Tank Girl*, *Fluke* and *Wild Bill*. Grade: C plus.

New Line: *Seven* and *Mortal Kombat* propelled New Line to 7.1 per cent of box-office sales. Not even counting those two films, New Line released several particularly gruesome movies — *The Mangler* and *In the Mouth of Madness*. The company took on the more artistically daring works *The Basketball Diaries*, *Don Juan*

DeMarco and *My Family* with spotty results. Grade: B minus.

Paramount: Paramount claimed only 10.3 per cent of the box office, with the studio failing to place one film in the year's Top 10, with *Congo* the best-performing at 13th. *Braveheart* was surprisingly popular, as was *Clueless*. Washouts included *Losing Isaiah*, *Stuart Smalley* and *Jade*. But studio accountants get special creative mention for claiming that despite a \$329 million gross, that hugely successful *Forrest Gump* has lost money. Grade: C minus.

Tristar: Like sister studio Columbia, TriStar had a bad year. The underachievers were numerous: *The Quick and the Dead*, *Hideaway*, *Johnny Mnemonic*, *Devil in a Blue Dress* and *Never Talk To Strangers*. Grade: C.

Twentieth Century Fox: The studio's slate took few dramatic risks it reaped a mere eight per cent of the box office. *Die Hard With A Vengeance* played even better overseas than it did in the United States, and Hugh Grant's *Sunset Boulevard* blunder didn't hurt *Nine Months*. Fox released only 17 films, and the mistakes included *Bye, Bye Love*, David Caruso in *Kiss of Death* and *Strange Days*. Fox's new specialty film division scored with *The Brothers McMullen*. Grade: D.

Universal: Universal has been criticized for relying too heavily on just two producers, Steven Spielberg and Brian Grazer. But Spielberg's production company made *Casper* (\$271 million worldwide) and Grazer's turned out *Apollo 13* (\$327 million worldwide). *Waterworld* will lose money, but its loss was offset by the surprise *Babe*. With only 18 titles, Universal claimed 13.2 per cent of the movie gate. Grade: B.

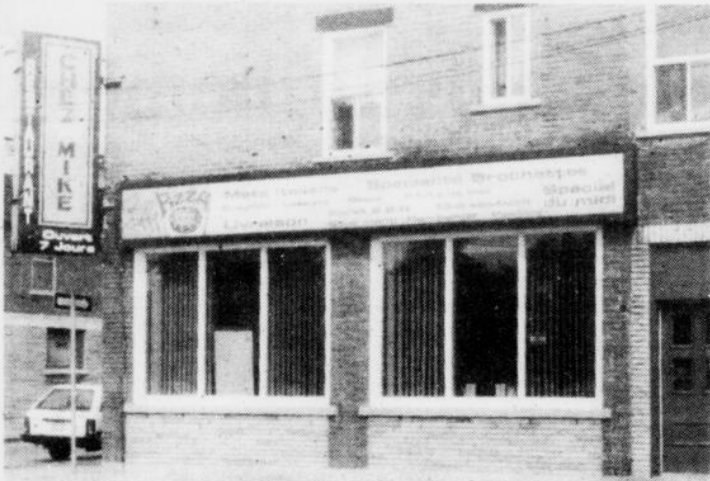
Warner Bros. Second only to Disney with a 16.3 per cent market share, Warner had three big hits — *Batman Forever*, *Ace Ventura: When Nature Calls* and *The Bridges of Madison County*. The studio stumbled with some of its action films, as both *Fair Game* and *Assassins*. The studio's *A Little Princess* was among the year's best family films, but a bad marketing campaign killed it. *Les Misérables* was a well-intentioned commercial disappointment. Grade: B plus.

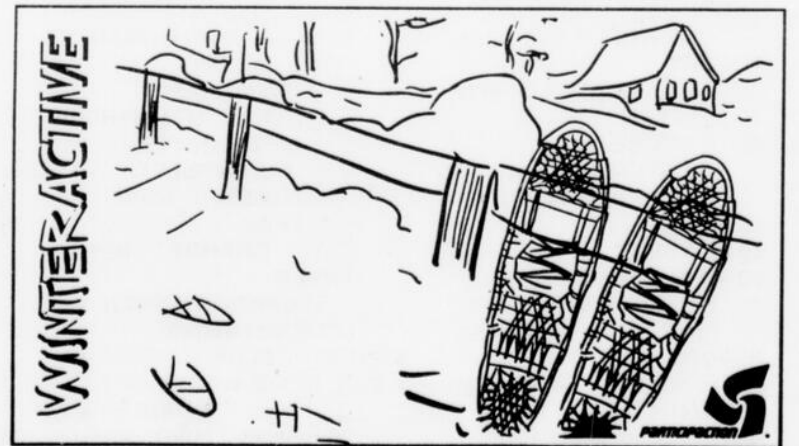
