THE QUEEN AND ROYAL FAMILY.

Her Majesty **ALEXANDRINA VICTORIA**, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, &c., Queen, Defender of the Faith, born at Kensington Palace, 24th May, 1819; succeeded to the throne 9th June, 1837, on the death of her uncle, King William IV.; crowned 28th June, 1838; and married 10th Feb., 1840, to his late Royal Highness Francis Albert Augustus Charles Emmanuel, PRINCE CONSORT, DUKE OF SAXONY, PRINCE OF COBOURG AND GÖTTA, who was born 26th Aug., 1819; died 14th Dec., 1861. Her Majesty is the only child of his late Royal Highness, Edward Duke of Kent, fourth son of King George III., and has issue—

For every cart, truck, or other two-wheeled vehicle—*Two Dollars*..... \$2.00

For every wagon or four-wheeled vehicle, drawn by one horse—*Six Dollars*..... 6.00

For every wagon or four-wheeled vehicle drawn by two horses, and made to carry a load under 4,000 lbs. weight—*Seven Dollars*..... 7.00

For every heavy wagon, float or other four-wheeled vehicle, drawn by two or more horses, and made to carry heavy articles or materials weighing 4,000 lbs., or upwards—*Nine Dollars* 9.00

For every diable—*Four Dollars*..... 4.00

The second-class shall include all carts, waggons or other vehicles used by merchants, traders, manufacturers, contractors, for the conveyance or delivery of the articles or effects dealt in, manufactured, or made use of by them, for each of which there shall be paid, in addition to the rates charged for in the first-class—*Two Dollar, and fifty cents*..... 2.50

The third-class shall include all carts, waggons, or vehicles used by expressmen, bakers, brewers, distillers, farmers or gardeners, for each of which there shall be paid, in addition to the rates charged for in the first-class—Five Dollars..... 5.00

Parties obtaining licenses, as aforesaid, shall moreover pay the annual assessment on all working horses, employed in drawing the above-mentioned vehicles or carriages at the rate of two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50) each, and also twenty-five cents for each number granted by the Chief of Police.

TARIFF OF CARTAGE.

Lumber sawn, from yard or boat, 500 feet broad measure, 15 cts. Salt or rice, six bags or six barrels, 15 cts. Firewood, dry from yard or boat, half a cord, three feet long, 15 cts. Firewood, green or from rafts, half a cord, three feet long, 20 cts. Furniture or luggage, per load, 20 cts. Lumber, green or hard from rafts, 500 feet broad measure, 20 cts. Molasses, sugar or oil, one puncheon, hoghead or load, 20 cts. Pig iron, lead, copper, or tin, one ton, 25 cts. Bar iron or steel, one ton 30 cts. For every additional half mile for all above description of goods 10 cents. And from any of the Harbor wharves to any place in the 2nd or 3rd division within $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile distance from the boundary line of the first division, and vice versa, or from any place [exclusive of the wharves] to any other in the City and vice versa, provided the distance do not exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ mile,—instead of 15, 20, 25 and 30 cts., the rates shall be 25, 30, 35, and 40 cents.

From any place in the Western section of the First Division.

To the stores and wharves below Wellington bridge, north side of the Lachine Canal, 20 cts. The stores and wharves below Wellington bridge, south side of Lachine Canal, 25 cts. The Basins above Wellington bridge, north side of Lachine Canal, 25 cts. The Basins above Wellington bridge, south side of Lachine Canal, and the Stores, Stations, Factories, etc., at Point St. Charles, 35 cents. The Stores, Factories etc., at and above St. Gabriel Locks, north of Lachine Canal, 30 cents. The St. Bonaventure Street Railway Station, 20 cents. The St. Bonaventure Street, from the lower wharves of the Harbor, 25 cts. And vice versa for one load.

And from any place in the Eastern section of the first Division—instead of 20, 25, 30, 35, 40, 25, 30 cents, the rates shall be 25, 30, 30, 40, 35, 25, 30 cents.

For any excess over the quantity or weight fixed for a load, additional *pro rata* rates shall be paid.

If delay is caused to the carter by the employer, beyond the time usually required for loading, the carter shall be paid *extra* for such delay at the rate of five cents for every quarter of an hour.

If a carter is called, and there be no load ready for him, or if he be unable to load the goods or articles for want of assistance, he shall be paid as if he carried a load the distance thus unnecessarily travelled.

DIVISIONS REFERRED TO ABOVE.

First Division.—The First Division shall comprise the East, Centre, and West Wards, (including the south-west side of McGill street, and the north-west side of Craig street) and shall be sub-divided into two sections, Eastern and Western, the line of demarcation between them being the centre of St. Lambert and St. Jean Baptiste streets.

Second Division.—The Second Division shall comprise the St. Ann, St. Antoine, and St. Lawrence Wards, (exclusive of McGill and Craig streets.)

Third Division.—The Third Division shall comprise the St. Louis Ward (exclusive of Craig street) the St. James and St. Mary Wards.

The course of studies, in which religious instruction holds the first rank, is divided into two sections—the classical and the commercial.

The classical course, principally taught in French, is designed to impart a thorough knowledge of the Greek, Latin, French and English languages and literature, pure and mixed mathematics, history and geography, philosophy and natural sciences, and whatever is necessary as a preparation for a professional career.

It comprises eight classes—Latin Elements, Syntax, Method, Versification, Belles-lettres, Rhetoric, 1st and 2nd year of Philosophy.

The commercial course, principally taught in English, embraces the English and French languages and literature, mathematics and the other branches named above, moreover bookkeeping, and whatever else may fit a young man for commercial and industrial pursuits.

It comprises four classes—Grammar, Literature, Rhetoric and Philosophy.

There are, moreover, elementary and preparatory classes for younger students.

The system of education is paternal—The teachers endeavour to unite kindness with firmness, and make use of the means of persuasion in preference to those of severity.

To be admitted into the college, applicants must present a certificate of good character.

Monthly reports of behaviour, application and progress are sent to parents or guardians.

None but relatives or those who represent them, are allowed to visit the boarders.

Half-boarders and day scholars must not absent themselves without the previous leave from the College authorities.

The collegiate year is of ten months, beginning in the first week of September, and ending in the first week of July.

Terms per year.—Board and tuition, \$150.00; washing, \$20.00; bed and bedding, \$10.00; music lessons, \$25.00; use of the piano, \$5.00; drawing lessons, \$20.00. Half boarders, \$80.00; day scholars, \$30.00.

Payments, which are required in gold, or its equivalent, and strictly in advance, are made in two instalments, 1st in the beginning of September, 2nd on the 1st of February.
