Cdn. labels deceiving

Just how seriously wine makers take the naming of their product was reflected recently in a decision handed down by the Ontario Supreme Court. According to the province's highest judiciary body, Canadian sparkling wine makers may in fact call their wine **Canadian Champagne**.

The decision is bound to anger producers in France who have maintained that Champagne is not a generic name but the name of a specific wine produced only from designated grapes and grown in a clearly delineated area of France. French producers have

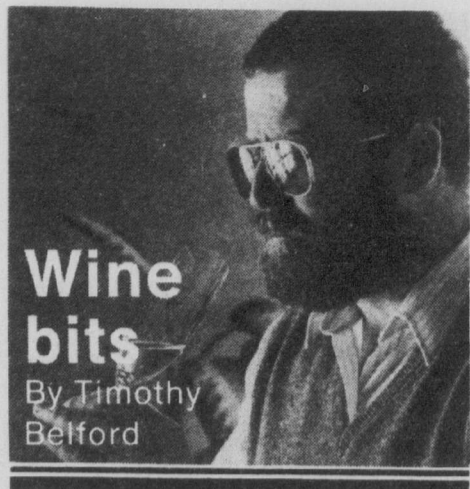
already managed to convince the other members of the European Economic Community of the validity of their cause and perhaps rightly so.

Most systems of 'appellation' outside North America are based upon the premise that the customer should be given as much information as possible in order to make an educated and knowledgeable choice. To falsely name a wine is to deliberately deceive as to its origins and content. Within North America, however, producers, with government compliance I might add, have been less inclined to be honest. Thus you have such things as **Californian Chablis** and **Burgundy** from New York State. This reluctance to be completely forthright extends to Quebec where the **Société des Alcools** neglects in many instances to point out that certain French or Italian wines were actually bottled in Quebec. Allowing the companies that produce apple-based 'vermouth' to copy the labels of French and Italian vermouths is another shoddy attempt to deceive the public.

Unfortunately, the attempt by Canadian producers to use the name Champagne, or Burgundy or Chablis for that matter, is merely symptomatic of the inferiority complex that has always dominated the Canadian wine industry — a complex that results in pretending we are something we are not.

What is sad about this whole thing, is that many Canadian producers in both Niagara and the Okanagan have proven that we can and do produce wines that can stand on their own merit alone. In short, Canadian producers and the Canadian public would be better served if we called a Champagne a Champagne.

One more note for German wine enthusiasts. The makers of the ever popular **Blue Nun Liebfraumilch** have recently come out with two new brands: **Blue Nun Riesling** and **Blue Nun Sparkling**. The former is a Mosel wine made from the classic German grape while the latter is made from a combination of German, Italian and French grapes. Don't look for them in Quebec just yet, however, but if you pass through Ontario, give them a try. cheers!

Caricature and landscape series

After the long run of the centennial series, Canada Post issued another very interesting issue of definitive stamps known as the Caricature and Landscape series. Not as complicated as the Centennials, it is none the less an excellent study subject.

The series was issued in complete reverse with the high values, one and two dollar denominations appearing on March 17, 1972. The medium values, which include from the ten cent to fifty cent landscapes were issued on September 8, 1972. The low values, which are known as the caricatures were issued on October 17, 1973, that is, up to the six cent **Lester B. Pearson**. The seven cent was issued on April 8, 1974. The eight cent **Queen Elizabeth** in the fall of 1976 while the ten cent **Q.E. II** was issued on September 1, 1976. The eight cent coil was issued on April 10, 1974 and, the ten cent coil on September 1, 1976. There were several printings of each issue. The dates shown above are when the stamps first appeared.

The most interesting portion of this series of stamps is the medium values or the landscapes. Because of the date they were issued, all four types of tags were applied. **Winnipeg** tag in 1972, **OP-4** general tag in late 1972 along with the **OP-2** (3mm). In 1973 the general tag **OP-2** (4mm) was applied to these stamps as are all stamps tagged today.

There are two different types to each denomination of the Landscapes except for the twenty cent **Prairie**, which has no discernable type and, the fifty cent depicting the eastern Canada coastline which has three types.

The difference between type I and type II in the ten cent is the green to the left of Canada. that

portion of the design is light and appears cross hatched, while type II is heavily inked and darker.

Type I is **Winnipeg** tagged, General tagged **OP-4** and **OP-2** (3mm). The perforation on Type I is 12½ x 12.

Type II is general tagged **OP-2** (4mm) with perforations 12½ x 12 and 13 x 13.

The distinguishing factor between Type I and Type II of the fifteen cent **Mountain sheep** are the trees on the side of the mountain. In type I the trees appear to be separately visible while in Type II they appear as a solid mass. The same tags and perforations apply in this denomination as in the ten cent and the remainder of the denominations.

The twenty cent, as mentioned above, has no discernable types. Yet, it has all the tags and perforation characteristics of the other denominations.

The twenty five cent **Polar Bears** have two types which are a little harder to distinguish. In type I the shadows of the bears are a little

lighter than those of type II. I think the easier method of separation is by tag and perf. Type II is general tagged **OP-2** (4mm) only. Type two has two perforations. 12½ x 12 and perf. 13. Type I is **Winnipeg** tagged, General tagged **OP-4** and **OP-2** (3mm).

The difference in the three types of the fifty cent denomination are based on the ink shades of the photogravure portion of the printing.

Type I; the 50 is deep blue violet while the sea is pale violet.

Type II; the 50 and the sea are both deeper blue violet. The surf is purple, not white.

Type III; the 50 and the sea are blue and the surf is white.

Each denomination has its varying degree of fluorescent paper. In order to find these, you will need a fluorescence chart. The most common degree of fluorescence will be dull with some high fluorescence but, not much.

If your appetite has been whetted for more, I suggest you purchase **David Gronbeck-Jones'** book, **The Caricatures and Landscape Definitives of Canada**. The price is about \$4.00 and is available by writing direct to the author at, **Box 147, Petawawa, Ont., K8H 2X2**.

World Cup water-skiing returns to Lac des Nations

SHERBROOKE (JES)—*La Fête du Lac des Nations* is on again. But this year's festivities will have an event that brings back memories of the lake's origins. A world cup event will be held here, similar to the one held 20 years ago, from which the lake got its name.

World cup water-skiing came to Jacques Cartier park in 1967. From this international competition, the lake got its name, Lake of the Nations, and the pavillion with the crossed skis roof was built. The sixth annual festival usually featured water-skiing events, but this is the first time the Junior World Cup water-skiing championships will be held in North America, let alone at Lac des Nations.

Aside from this event which started Friday morning and will continue until a winning country is decided on Sunday, the festival has much to offer. There are over 50 shows to see during the five day festival which ends late Sunday night. Approximately 250 artists will sing, dance, juggle, and show

off their talents. Tonight two bands will play starting with Fine Touch at 9 p.m. Saturday and Sunday follow suit with different bands. A great display of fireworks will be something to see Saturday night at 9 p.m.

There are events during the day — all of which are free. Jean Perrault, president of *La Fête*, said he expects more than 100,000 visitors this year.

Many will be coming to see the two Canada teams compete in the Junior World Cup. Seven countries will be competing in the three sections of the cup. The slalom and figure ski events will be held in the morning while the ski jumping will be on in the afternoon. The last two cups have been held in Italy and this will be the first of its kind in Canada.

Two of the Canadian team members are from Sherbrooke and St.-Elie. Benoit Villeneuve, 16, is on Team A and Mélanie Perrault, 13, (the youngest on the team) is a substitute for the B Team. The entire Canadian teams have been together for the past few days, using the opportunity to ski with the offi-

cial driver, Canadian Craig Rutherford, and to learn from each other. Sitting on a raft, across from a large ski jump, team members were heard to "ooh" and "aah" as Jaret Llewellyn, last year's gold medalist in figure skiing, did back flips — on skis!

But being at the site also means they have to make time for press conferences. This could mean cutting into their training time. Canadian coach and former world class water-skier, Marlene Graham says it does, but she says it also does some good. "What's a session or two if it boosts them (their spirits)?"

Villeneuve defined a training session as consisting of five or six rides, each about two or three times around the lake. This sounds like it wouldn't take up his whole day, but it does. "I don't only train in the water, I drive the boat and we coach each other."

What he means by each other is not only team members such as young Perrault, but also his older brother and world competitor, Pierre.

The Villeneuve family seems to

have been born on the water, on skis. Benoit started with his father and brothers at Lake Bromton. By the time he was eight, he was on the Sherbrooke team. This is not his first competition, but will work hard for himself and his team.

Working for the team is important, as the cup is won by total team points, not by individuals.

Another Canadian member, Danny Rini of Kingston, Ont., feels the team has a good chance of winning. "The American team will be tough, but we can be work hard and get it."

Graham had the same reply.

They looked good at their practices, let's hope the judges think so too at the competition this weekend.

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. (AP)— The one-year-old daughter of Johnny Carson's son Chris has to live in a trailer surrounded by "crack" cocaine addicts, the girl's mother said Wednesday as she asked a judge to quadruple her child support payments.

Tanena Love, mother of Christal Carson, is seeking to increase her \$125-a-week child support to \$500 a week. She said outside court that she's been ignored by the Carson family because she is black.

Chris Carson, 36, testified Wednesday but did not respond to the race issue. The unemployed golf player's only income is a \$35,000 annuity from his father, the host of NBC's *The Tonight Show*.

A ruling on the case is expected to be made later this week.

AUSTIN, Tex. (AP)— He arrived in a white limousine, but television star Bruce Willis was wearing jeans and a baseball cap and told the woman at the door of Antone's nightclub that he just wanted to meet the guys in the band.

Willis, co-star of ABC's *Moonlighting*, showed up unexpectedly Monday for the club's 12th anniversary blues party, and his appearance was apparently as much a surprise to the club's managers as it was to the audience, said bookkeeper Diana Ray.

"He just suddenly showed up and said he wanted to come back and meet some of his idols," Ray said. "He came into the office and met Jimmy Rogers and Pinetop Perkins and some of the other guys waiting to go on stage. He was real friendly and real respectful of the musicians."

Club founder Clifford Antone persuaded Willis to get on stage.

But when Willis was introduced to harmonica player Lazy Lester as "a fellow harmonica player," Lester's reaction was: "Who do you play with?"

Book about killers is good argument for death penalty

Two Of A Kind: The Hillside Stranglers by Darcy O'Brien (SIGNET): \$4.95, 423 pp.

Compared to Charles Manson and the Son of Sam Killer, the two lowlifes who became known as the Hillside Stranglers — Angelo Buono and Kenneth Bianchi — make Manson and Berkowitz look like choirboys. Darcy O'Brien's chilling account of the mass murders that kept Los Angeles in a paralysis of fear and loathing from October 1977 until January of 1979 makes for breathtaking, if often repulsive reading.

O'Brien used as a basis for his lengthy research for this book the five thousand pages of interview transcriptions that psychiatrists amassed while questioning Bianchi, plus the over fifty thousand pages of trial transcript that was recorded at the Buono prosecution. What emerges is a work of stunning realism in which the author attempts to piece together the depraved lives of Buono and Bianchi.

He uses a semi-fictional technique, much like that employed by Truman Capote for *In Cold Blood*, taking us along with Bianchi and Buono, the pair of cousins who treated Los Angeles as their sexual playground, as they stalk, molest, and subsequently torture and mur-

der a total of ten very young women with cold-blooded, unemotional savagery.

Buono, a slow-thinking, ugly man, yet having a certain sexual magnetism for women, became the mentor for the smooth-talking, slick Bianchi who moved to L.A. from the east, and took up residence with his cousin. Together, these social misfits pulled off an unthinkable crime when they used phoney police badges and intimidation to entice a fifteen-year old hooker into their Cadillac, giving her the impression that they were taking her in on a morals charge. Instead Buono and Bianchi took the girl to the former's upholstery shop and house in Glendale, where they brutalized her, forcing her into degrading sexual acts and finally strangled her in a slow and inhuman manner.

Their initial success fed their hunger for more victims, and when they were through there had been ten young women subjected to inhuman tortures such as suffocation by plastic bags, being gassed with propane while their heads were in bags, electrocuted by household electric current applied to their hands, after being subjected to a wide array of incredible sexual assaults.

O'Brien tells the story of how Bob Grogan, Frank Salerno and other members of the L.A. police tried desperately to solve the killings that became known as the Hillside Stranglings, due to the dumping of the nude bodies by the two cousins on hillside locations spread around Los Angeles. As well he documents the bizarre workings of the American criminal justice system whereby the innocence or guilt of the killers can hang on such a slender thread of evidence as the fact that some of the fibres found on several bodies seemed to be cat hairs.

Investigation showed that Buono did not own cats, nor did Bianchi. Buono did, however, have a pet rabbit, and it was rabbit fur that was found on the persons of some victims.

Bianchi tried a clever ruse that almost worked once he had been

apprehended in Washington state for a further two murders. He had viewed the television movie "Sybil" about multiple personalities, and effected a three personality split for some rather dumb psychiatrists who fell for his atrocious acting completely. Bianchi hoped that his alter-personalities would be accused of the crimes, rendering him criminally insane and allowing him to avoid the death penalty.

As it was, the court case which involved the unrepentant Angelo Buono, takes up about the last 200 pages of this book, revealing the types of devious testimony, courtroom trickery and deceit that defense attorneys can indulge in which they attempt to keep their clients from the death penalty.

The chilling fact that Buono and Bianchi came within just a whisker of never even being taken to trial, and that they almost were acquitted due to some courtroom skulduggery should be a reminder to our elected officials in the Canadian government. If there was ever an eloquent argument for the death penalty in certain cases, then *The Hillside Stranglers* must be it.

Those M.P.'s who recently voted with their own "conscience" to reject the death penalty, disregarding the feelings of the people they were elected to represent, should pick up a copy of this paperback for some pleasant beachside reading this summer.

RECORD REVIEWS
Roy Orbison IN DREAMS: THE GREATEST HITS (VIRGIN-A&M)

He may have to shift into falsetto a lot more frequently that he had to do when his first hit broke out exactly twenty-seven years ago this week ("Only The Lonely"), but Roy Orbison still has one of the most distinctive and powerful voices in all of rock. The title track's being utilized in the strange movie

BLUE VELVET seems to have rekindled an interest in the Big O's music, but two years earlier, in 1985, Roy put himself into the able production hands of keyboard ace Mike Utley for the cutting of 18 new takes of the original Orbison songbook hits. And there are hits here that mark the unfolding of the pages of rock history — songs such as "Oh Pretty Woman", "Crying", "Running Scared" "Dream Baby" and "Mean Woman Blues" helped to define the melodic appeal of the new bastardized music that had seemingly become an amalgam of black delta blues, country music and other influences such as boogie woogie.

The voice that Orbison used on his stunningly dramatic tunes may have lost a bit of its edge, but on the nineteen tracks on this double album the musicians and Utley gain the sophisticated digital state of the art recording techniques that balance out the slight ravages that time has taken on Roy's powerful tenor. Not that the voice here is in any way to be faulted, it's just that hearing the closing notes of "It's Over" or "Blue Bayou" was a memorable part of experiencing the early rock phenomenon that Orbison embellished with such vocal purity.

The fact that a man born on April 23, 1936 in Vernon, Texas is still able to sing rock 'n' roll with such inspired intensity is amazing, and Orbison, like the revived Everly Brothers currently touring and recording again, sounds wonderfully young thanks to the tonic of rock.

The biggest hits are included here, as well as such memorable flip sides as "Working For The Man", "Lana", "Uptown" and one of the earliest non-hit tracks that Orbison recorded with the Teen-Kings, "Ooby Dooby", some four years before his initial success in 1960 with "Only The Lonely". On this track Orbison plays the lead guitar part, and the fact that this song was originally cut at Norman Petty's Clovis, New Mexico studios can be clearly verified by listening to the Buddy Holly style of guitar that Roy lays down on this bouncy track.

Orbison fans, and they are legion, have a fond reverence for the man who could sing both rockers and tender, moving love ballads, and it would be interesting to attempt to compute the number of romances which were kindled

while a Roy Orbison love ballad of hurtin', rejection and dreamin' was being spun by a disc jockey at some high school sock hop.

Even the fact that the Boss, Bruce Springsteen, has his induction speech commemorating Roy Orbison's Rock and Roll Hall of Fame entrance on January 21, 1987, included on the liner notes of this album may well send a new generation of Springsteen fans scurrying to learn more about this legend. They could do much worse than using these 19 great songs as an introduction to the timeless singing of Roy Orbison.

VIDEO SCREENINGS
CRIMES OF THE HEART (MGM/UA)

Putting together three of the hottest box office draws who regularly vie against one another in the best female actress category may not always be a good idea in current film casting. But the performances by Diane Keaton, Jessica Lange and Sissy Spacek in *CRIMES OF THE HEART* are absolutely outstanding, turning the play by Beth Henley into a heartwarming, soaring in emotional intensity cinematic experience.

Henley's story is about three sisters in a small Mississippi town who are brought together on the occasion of the outrageous act by Babe (Spacek) in having shot her husband in the stomach to everyone's dismay. The trauma brings home Meg (Lange) from Los Angeles where she has supposedly been forging a career as a singer. The third girl, Lenny, played by Keaton in one of her finest bits of acting, has been the spinster of the trio, afraid of men, meek and content, until the shooting fiasco, with living a quiet life alone. As the events leading up to the shooting come out, it appears that Babe's husband has been brutalizing her often, and that this Senator is quite a boor to boot.

With their aged grandfather dying in hospital just at this point, and the Senator having photos of his wife Babe in the arms of a young black youth, the opportunities for dramatic tension in this film are multiplied. The ladies are full measure for the stretches in acting ability called for by the touching, emotional screenplay.

Even in the moments of potentially tragic intensity, such as when Babe decides to hang herself on a chandelier, and then despairs of this and places her head in a gaspouting oven, the humour of the writing by Henley comes through in Spacek's fine performance.

CRIMES OF THE HEART is truly one of those movies that has the rare ability to make viewers go from laughing to crying in the space of a couple of minutes. The rare character portrayals of this lovable, confused trio of southern belles make for fine cinema and further confirmation of the talents of Spacek, Lange and Keaton. Quebec's small libraries: A lot of catching up to do

QUEBEC CITY — A special commission on the state of Quebec's public libraries has found these institutions to be in terrible shape.

The commission, set up by Cultural Affairs Minister Lise Bacon in January, released its report July 7, showing that Quebec lags behind nearly all the other provinces in almost every aspect of library service.

Claire Côté, one of the commissioners and director of the Pointe Claire Public Library, says public libraries in Quebec are grossly underfunded.

INCREASED FUNDS REQUESTED

To remedy the problem, the Commission recommends that the provincial government increase its funding for libraries from \$16 million per year to \$28 million.

At that rate, the government would invest \$170 million in libra-

ries over the next five years.

"The library system in Quebec has developed very slowly," Côté says, "and we have a lot of catching up to do."

Côté summarizes the commission's major findings, saying that most of the province's public libraries don't have enough space, books, funding, or personnel to put them on a par with national standards.

SMALL TOWNS HIT HARDER

And, she says, rural libraries are generally worse off than urban ones.

"When you have a small community of fewer than 5,000 people, say 1,200 or 2,000, it's difficult to give an adequate library service because the needs of each individual are practically the same as in a big city."

However, Côté points out that that, in general, English libraries are more developed than the French ones, because there is a stronger tradition of library use and support in English-speaking

centres.

The Commission, chaired by Philippe Sauvageau, recommends that both municipal and provincial governments must contribute more to public libraries if current needs are to be met.

TWO EXAMPLES

In the Eastern Townships, for example, the Pettes Memorial Library in Knowlton is one library suffering from tight funding.

Susan Bailey-Godin, head librarian, says, "We're certainly among those hard-hit by the current situation in Quebec."

Knowlton is starting to feel the economic impact of the Hyundai auto plant which is coming to nearby Bromont.

Bailey-Godin says, "I'm happy membership is up, but it's so drastic, we're just managing to keep our heads above water with the funding we're receiving."

In recent years, the government cut back its subsidy to public libraries by almost 15 per cent, leaving it at 12 per cent of the library's an-

nual budget. A substantial part of the budget is covered by fundraising campaigns in the community.

WAY BEHIND

Bailey-Godin says her library is way behind in its services. The library has no audio-visual equipment, needs more books, and desperately wants to expand and renovate.

"But we shouldn't even be dreaming of these things at this point in time," she says.

At the newly-renamed Legion Memorial Library, formerly the Potton Library, in Mansonville, a dream is coming true, at least for Louise Oliver, a retired nurse who acts as librarian.

It's been an uphill battle to establish the library standards Oliver envisioned when she and friend Jean Brown first set up the library 12 years ago.

SUCCESS STORY

The library has just been renovated. The Ministry of Cultural Affairs helped to subsidize the renovation. The grant was available because the municipality also contributed.

"We have many new shelves," Oliver says with pride. "There's always room to expand further — I could use more reference books — but we're adequate for a small town."

This library is largely funded by the municipality. It also belongs to a network of community libraries

serviced by the central library in Sherbrooke.

NETWORKING A PARTIAL SOLUTION

The network is a strategy, Côté explains, to help solve the predicament of libraries serving rural areas.

And Côté emphasizes that it is vital to encourage community involvement in public libraries. That's not news to Oliver.

"Until you get the community interested, you're not going to get anywhere."

Oliver has held open houses at the library, organized an old-fashioned Christmas dinner which attracted 75 local residents, and given story hours for the children. The Legion Memorial Library is run entirely by volunteers from the community.

SOME OPTIMISM POSSIBLE

Côté says even though the state of libraries in Quebec is sad, "I feel optimistic. I feel we have recommended several things that stand a chance of being implemented over the next few years."

Minister Bacon says she will study the report over the summer. In the fall, she will announce what action the government will take to improve the situation.

But Bacon has already said that she won't meet the full funding recommended. She says the municipalities will also have to get involved.

Potton Township library blossomed from one woman's dream and government and town grants

MANSONVILLE — Twelve years ago a recently-retired Montreal nurse packed up and moved down the autoroute to Mansonville with a load of books and a dream: to start a library.

Most of the books were her own. Oliver had never worked in a library before, but she had taken some night courses on the subject and she loved children. A library, she thought, would be just what they needed.

"I brought a truckload of books down from Montreal and was open in two weeks," she recalled this week.

Now, sitting in the bright and newly-renovated rooms where convent school children once struggled through the three r's, Oliver laughs at the early days.

HUMBLE BEGINNINGS

The bright paint, shiny floors and comfortable furniture are a far cry from the library's first quarters.

The Legion Memorial Library, formerly the Potton Library, spent its first winter squeezed into the Catholic Church's unheated basement kitchen.

Sitting in the sunny main floor of the old Legion building it's hard to imagine that kitchen library.

And for many people in Potton Township, it's hard to imagine Mansonville without a library.

The truck load of books has grown to 7000, not including the children's books, and Oliver said she has about 100 active members.

With the help of a government grant, the town council and many volunteer hours, the little library has finally outgrown the room

above the Legion Hall.

It hasn't been easy. Oliver said that at the beginning, the idea took a long time to catch on. People in a small community have little time to loaf around reading books, even if they'd wanted to. Money for libraries wasn't exactly the top priority of the town council. But Oliver stuck to her dream and now it is starting to pay off.

GOVERNMENT GRANT

"They weren't reading people," she said. "But now the times have changed, people's interest has changed."

For Oliver, that interest meant a \$18,000 government grant matched by the town council. At the same time the Legion, with too few to warrant all that space, gave their building to the town on one condition: that they use it for a library. Everything fell into place and by last March volunteers were carting the books downstairs to their new shelves. Oliver said she even had the elementary school children helping out.

"They carried them down in shopping bags. They worked so hard, they all tired themselves out pretty fast," she said.

Helen Benson has been using the library for years and started helping out as move downstairs began.

"When I got here there were books all over the floor in boxes," she laughed. The place was a mess. Oliver said Peter Downman has also been a great help.

"He's our Mr. Fix-it."

BOOKS ON LOAN

The library's first paid employee, Sonia Maheu, has been helping out thanks to a Challenge '87

grant. A Sherbrooke University student, Maheu said she's not planning to work in a library for the rest of her life but she likes her job "because it means working with people and I love working with people."

Since 1979 Oliver has been part of the 60 odd chain of libraries that receive a rotating book collection from the central library in Sherbrooke. Most of the library's French books come from Sherbrooke.

For Oliver, the satellite library system makes sense. Small communities have a chance to borrow books that they would not have been able to afford otherwise.

"What's the point of spending \$30 on a book that will only be read by a few when Sherbrooke can buy it and it will circulate so that many people will get a chance to read it?" she said.

She explained that Potton Township could never have an independent public library because the 1,700 people scattered within a ten mile radius are would never warrant a government grant.

WON AN AWARD

The central library also sends them music and framed prints that can be borrowed for three months at a time.

Oliver said the central library had been very helpful over the years. They obviously appreciate her too: on one wall a huge print of a page from the Gutenberg Bible bears a plaque dated awarding the Legion Memorial for its expansion.

Oliver said that now that the library is on its feet she'd like enough help so that she can spend more time at home.

"After all, I'm not young. I already retired once," she grins.

Entertainment shorts

BANFF, Alta. (CP) — When Peter Lougheed was asked if he would agree to a new building at the Banff Centre being dedicated in his honor, the former Alberta premier wanted to share billing with his wife.

He consented, providing it be named the Jeanne and Peter Lougheed Building, said Pat Judge, vice-president of development at the centre.

"He's very proud of Jeanne's involvement in the arts and she's taught him a great deal about the importance of the arts in Canada and the importance of the Banff Centre," Judge added.

Jeanne was an opera student at Banff and Peter, whose family has a home in Banff, has always actively supported the centre, Judge said.

Construction on the building has just begun.

LONDON (AP) — The British actors' union said Wednesday it has ended its ban on the sale of television and radio programs to South Africa.

The union, Equity, instituted the ban 12 years ago to protest the apartheid policies of South Africa.

British television programs sold elsewhere in the world will be available to viewers in South Africa as soon as negotiations are completed on the fees payable to actors involved, a union statement said.

The statement said Equity's go-

vernment body voted to reverse the ban in light of a court ruling in July 1986 that forced Equity to lift a ban on members performing in South Africa.

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States scrapped plans to send an art exhibit to China as part of a cultural exchange program after Beijing insisted that portraits of Gen. Douglas MacArthur and Golda Meir, former Israeli prime minister, be removed.

Charles Wick, director of the United States Information Agency, decided this week to cancel the exhibit after the Chinese refused to back down from their demand that the two portraits be taken out. Joe O'Connell, spokesman for the information agency, said Wednesday. The USIA was helping arrange the cultural exchange.

O'Connell said Chinese officials apparently wanted the two portraits removed from the 51-painting exhibit because of "the potential for offending the sensitivities of the Chinese people."

MacArthur, who died in 1964, led U.S. and United Nations forces during the 1950-53 Korean War that pitted his troops against Chinese and North Korean forces.

The objection to Meir, who died in 1975, is believed to be because of Beijing's policy of supporting the Arab states in their dispute with Israel.

Local cartoonist Sheldon gets second cultural grant

SHERBROOKE — The road to the top of any profession is long and tedious. Oh, one more adjective

should be added; poverty-stricken. The latter is not the case, at least for the near future, for the 22-year-old Sherbrooke native Daniel Sheldon. He recently received notice that he would be entitled to a second consecutive \$10 000 grant from the Ministry of Cultural Affairs to pursue his studies as a cartoonist at the Joe Kubert School of Art in New York.

Sheldon, who's comic strip "Quark" ran in *The Record* last summer for five months, says he learned a lot about his trade in New York this past year. "The first year was very positive in every way." He says the good thing about school, and unlike working by contract as a freelancer, is "you get the chance to practise and experiment."

Sheldon was very impressed by the staff at the school. While some art schools seem to subsist with staff members who never quite made it in their field, Sheldon says at the school, "all the teachers are pre-retirement cartoonists who teach like they have some debt to pay to the medium."

Synonymous with good teaching is plenty of homework. Sheldon said he worked up to 12 and 15 hours a day. "You work very hard, they are strict as far as marks and absenteeism goes." The hard work seems to have payed off, with at least one customer — the city of Sherbrooke.

Sheldon has been doing contracts for the city for the last three years, and they like his work enough to give him some freelance contracts during the school year. They could not wait for him to get back from the "Big Apple" for the summer.

"The day after I got back the city

called me and asked me to do some work." When he works for the city he does mostly graphic art such as drawing pictures for a recent children's pamphlet on what to do in the city during the summer. He also is the creator of SIDAC's (the association of downtown merchants, professionals, and all businesses) mascot. While this work, and especially the money, comes in handy, it is not exactly what Sheldon wants to do.

He is more interested in comic strips. He feels that they are a "way to reach people effectively, they reach millions of people everyday." Sheldon was close to that goal a couple years ago when he came out with his comic strip "Quark". It was in the process of being syndicated — meaning that it would have been sold to newspapers across North America, which is the only way a strip can survive. But when it came time to

complete the deal, the syndicator discovered there was already an American prototype for his futuristic strip. What this meant was an end to a idea that already had tentative acceptance from papers such as the *Ottawa Citizen*, and the *Hamilton Spectator*.

Sheldon believes the strip would have been a success, had it not been for the American strip which appeared just a few months before his. He has some impressive sources to back up his opinion.

"I showed Jim Davies (Garfield's creator), and Mort Walker (Hi & Lois, and Beattle Bailey), they all thought it was pretty cool."

Sheldon has some strong ideas about his chosen career. He says what he does is art, unlike some of the more commercial stuff that is being produced in the U.S., "they are stuck on having super-heroes." For that reason he is happy he is a Quebecer, as he has been influen-

ced by European comics such as *Tin Tin*, which he says are less commercial.

With two years left in his program, Sheldon is trying to perfect his art, while at the same time taking on freelance contracts to offset the financial burden of tuition fees and other living expenses — last school year cost him \$14 000. This is where the grant comes in handy, the \$10 000 from the government — "God, I never thought I'd get it two years in a row. — helps defray most of the costs.

As with most artists Sheldon knows the fine line between taking on commercial contracts, and selling his soul for money instead of furthering his creative ambitions. But for now Sheldon will continue to walk that line, because as he puts it, "there aren't too many artists who can afford to put on sandals, grow long hair and pray to the mountains."

Superman: truth, justice, and the American way

He is unquestionably the first multimedia superstar of the 20th century. His initial appearance nearly five decades ago caused a sensation. Yet, despite his age, he is not superannuated. He is still faster than a speeding bullet, more powerful than a locomotive and able to leap tall buildings in a single bound.

The Man of Tomorrow, a.k.a. Superman, made his debut on the cover of Action Comics #1 dated June 1938, ushering in the era of the superhero fantasy and establishing the comic book as a distinct, native form of American art and literature. The Smithsonian Institution's National Museum of American History is joining in the celebration of Superman's upcoming 50th birthday with a yearlong exhibition, titled "Superman: Many Lives, Many Worlds."

The supereminent character of his genre left generations of children breathless with his adventures, not only in comic books, but in a newspaper comic strip, a long-running radio serial, animated cartoons, movie serials, a novel, a television series, children's books, a Broadway play and a string of films.

The idea of a hero endowed with powers and abilities far beyond those of mortal men was not new in the early 1930s. But applying that concept to a comic-book character was. Superman was the brainchild of two teen-agers from Cleveland, Jerry Siegel and Joe Shuster, who did free-lance work for the company that later became DC Comics.

THE MAN IN STEEL

The Superman character instantly gained wide popularity and, in 1939, he became the first costumed hero to have his own regular comic book title. The stories revolved around three fantasy themes: the visitor from another planet, the superhuman being and the dual identity.

Superman easily moved from comic books into other media, especially radio and animated cartoons. If anything, his amazing feats seemed even more fantastic accompanied by sound effects or the sight of the Man of Steel actually outrunning bullets.

The radio drama, which began airing in 1940, helped define the character of Superman, according to Jenette Kahn, president and publisher of DC Comics. "The kryptonite angle was introduced on the radio show, kryptonite being a potentially deadly fragment of Superman's home planet," Kahn explains. "Since Superman was invincible, the writers needed to come up with something that would allow the actor possessing the voice of Superman to go on vacation.

"They dreamed up a plot where Superman would be exposed to kryptonite, causing him to fall ill. The result was anonymous off-stage moaning for two weeks as the show continued without its hero. The kryptonite concept was then picked up and expanded in the

comic books."

PATRIOTIC LOOK

Cub reporter and sidekick Jimmy Olsen was a major character on the radio show before he appeared in the comics. But, the idea of Clark Kent changing into Superman in a phone booth originated with the writers in the mid-1950s TV shows. The series was a pioneer in its own right. During its last few seasons, it was one of the earliest color TV shows ever produced.

While the basic story line was altered slightly to fit a particular medium, graphically, Superman's appearance has undergone little variation over the years. "Superman's costume has been refined, and his physique has become more streamlined," Kahn points out. "The 'S' emblem on his chest has become more stylized. He's always had the blue-black hair and his costume has always been drawn with bold, pure colors, giving him a very strong, patriotic look."

Dozens of artists have worked on the Superman comics, Kahn adds. "In the early days, the character was drawn with a blocky look. Now the trend is to define every muscle. It's the difference between Charles Atlas and Arnold Schwarzenegger — exaggerated to super proportions."

Since soaring to stardom in 1938, Superman has become firmly entrenched in American folklore. "The Superman comics were a welcome diversion to America's Depression-era kids," says Carl Scheele, curator of the Division of Community Life at the National Museum of American History. "And he quickly became identified as the champion of the oppressed and downtrodden."

IDEALIZED AMERICA

At that time, there were two kinds of lawlessness for the all-American superhero to deal with — the homegrown variety in the form of gangsters and organized crime and the emergence of the Axis leaders on the international scene. "These were formidable foes indeed for Superman, who offered the hope that truth, justice

and the American way would always prevail.

In the comics, Superman spent the first half of the 1940s defending those values and battling such villains as the Nazis and the Japanese. "Superman's character has consistently reflected the times," Smithsonian historian Ellen Roney Hughes observes, "and during World War II, his image was warriorlike."

The postwar decade saw Superman dispatching bad guys with names like Atom Man. In the early '60s, Superman focused on an idealized America, meeting President Kennedy and visiting the United Nations. During the '70s, he touched upon social issues, such as environmental pollution, women's liberation and drug abuse.

AMERICANA

Scheele thinks that there is nothing out of the ordinary about organizing an exhibition around a comic-book character. "The museum is interested in the history of everyday life in America. In order to understand American society, one must look at all representative aspects. And, Superman is certainly a unique slice of Americana."

"Literary characters play an im-

portant role in our society. They take on a certain reality. Superman's images and adventures become 'real' in many peoples' minds—as real as their knowledge of the major battles of the Civil War, for instance."

CRIME

The Smithsonian exhibition focuses on the myth of Superman and his changing roles regarding such cultural and technological upheavals as crime, political corruption and war. It features public service posters, buttons, comic and coloring books; radio, TV and movie scripts; bubblegum cards, and from the Superman film series, a cape and a pair of mild-mannered Clark Kent's glasses (used to disguise Superman's true identity).

Most of the exhibit's artifacts have been donated by DC Comics, and some are on loan from private collections but, generally, Hughes says, Superman paraphernalia is hard to come by. "We've acquired some valuable objects concerning the Superman character, but not all of them — say, scripts, for example — may be considered visually exciting. Few tangible objects from the old TV serial can be found. There is an interesting photo of the TV character in Superman regalia. However, many items were routinely discarded or altered and reused on other shows."

"The same fate often befalls costumes and props in films," Hughes laments. "Naturally, everyone in-

involved in making a movie hopes that film will become a classic. But everything can't be saved for posterity. For every pair of Dorothy's ruby slippers, there are thousands of artifacts that are simply lost."

Artifacts of the legendary do-gooder were never superabundant in the first place. Shortly after Superman was rocketed to Earth from the doomed planet Krypton, World War II erupted, producing shortages of materials for non-essential items, meaning few wartime Superman collectibles.

It is also rare to find early, pre-war editions of those Superman comics. They, along with other comic books of the era, were printed on cheap, acidic paper that all but disintegrates with age. And, many simply did not make it through the war years. It seems Superman and many of his comic peers of the '30s and '40s made their most heroic contributions to the war effort in paper drives.

Actor Christopher Reeve, an expert of sorts on Superman, predicts the character will continue to appeal to future generations. "Superman represents basic values admired by society," the star of four Superman movies says. "And, despite his superhuman powers, he's not a show-off. He displays a real decency of character and a kind of romantic optimism toward others as he goes about his business of foiling criminals and their evil deeds."

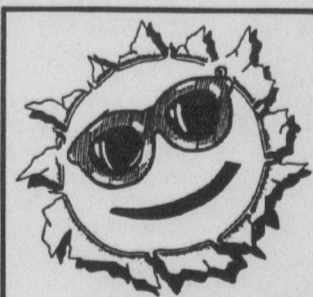

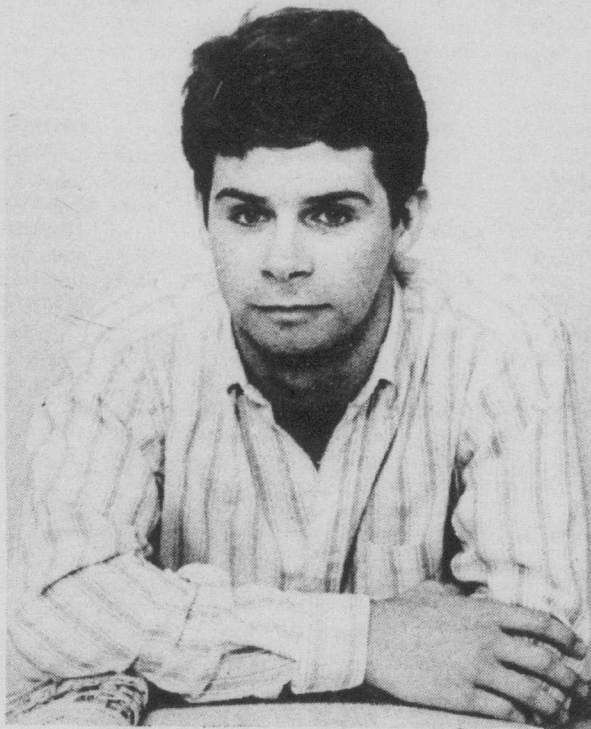

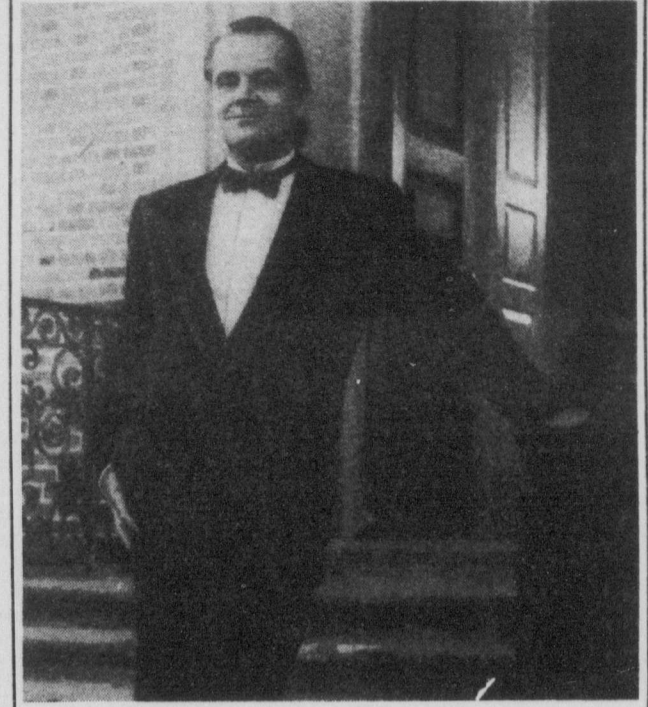

Exhibition depicts perfume-making as an age-old art

SHERBROOKE — For most people, trying to describe the impression a scent gives is difficult enough.

Putting that feeling onto canvas would be impossible.

But that was the challenge artist **Jeannine Bourret** had to meet for the **Odeur/Art** exhibit at a Sherbrooke perfume boutique.

Bourret has created a collection of watercolors to express the themes used in perfume. The paintings were done especially for the exposition, and **Bourret** says they are a different style than most of her work.

Johanne Thibault, owner of **L'O de l'Aube**, has been thinking about an exhibit combining paintings, perfume and jewelry for the past two or so years. She explains its theme as "a way of concretizing the art of making perfume."

Bourret's work tries to capture that theme.

IMAGES OF FLOWERS

Thibault's assistant **Claire Lorange** explained that the paintings depict flowers and wind, images that signify the artist's

idea of beautiful fragrances.

André Godbout's handcrafted jewelry uses metals such as yellow and white gold and silver, that focus on the idea of perfume as something natural that enhances those who wear it.

Parisian perfume maker **Jean Laporte** fits into this trio perfectly. He is an artist trying to express visions and feelings through his work. Unlike most perfumers, he only uses natural scents. Most start with something natural and end up using additives that only imitate reality. Natural fragrances are expensive, and man-made scents are cheaper.

The exhibit coincides with the release of **Laporte's** newest perfume, **Or de Fleurs**, its name tying in with both **Bourret's** images and **Godbout's** precious metals. The premiering of a Paris perfume is also a first in Canada. Usually an olfactory product remains in its own country for at least a year before it is exported. This makes this exhibition all the more special.

KNOW WHAT SUITS YOU

Thibault put these three artists together very effectively to give

the message that perfumes are creations. Making it is probably the least known art. She says the people who can best appreciate its artistic qualities are the ones who know what scent suits them best.

Thibault and **Lorange** both said their exhibition is a way of introducing to people one of the oldest, yet least understood creations. They said many people don't realize fragrances concentrate on the most sensitive of the sensory organs. Many memories can be evoked by a single smell. Often the type of scent that someone wears is really the impression that will stay rather than what she was wearing.

So as there is music for our ears, paintings for the sight, food for the palate, we have many scents for our pleasure. **Thibault's** exhibit gives her impression of what perfume is. A look at the presentation will probably evoke your own ideas of what these olfactory tantalizers are.

The **Odeur/Art** exhibition will be on until Monday during regular business times at **L'O de l'Aube** at the **Les Tourelles** shopping centre on King St. W.

New Zealand's Milford Track: finest walks on earth

LAKE TE ANAU, New Zealand — Billed as "the finest walk in the world," the Milford Track has lured hikers from around the globe for almost a century now. Nestled in the alps of New Zealand's South Island, the 34-mile track stretches from Lake Te Anau to Milford Sound. Entrance and exit are by boat only. Away from cars and highways, "tramping" here, as hiking is called in New Zealand, can be a three-day discovery of this nation's finest alpine scenery.

The track's route resulted from efforts to link the west coast to Lake Te Anau. In 1888, explorer Quintin Mackinnon pushed west from Lake Te Anau and cut his way through dense brush in what is known today as Mackinnon Pass to join a path to Milford Sound. Soon afterwards, the route was developed as a tourist hike with Mackinnon as head guide.

Today the Milford Track plays host to thousands of hikers during its November-to-March season. Yet few signs of human intrusion appear. An occasional hut and a well-maintained trail with drainage ditches are among the few reminders of the world beyond.

There are two ways to tramp the Milford Track. The Tourist Hotel Corporation (THC) runs a guided trip, providing staffed huts with hot showers and drying rooms for wet clothes. With an issue of sleeping sheets and rain gear, the THC eliminates the hassle and extra weight of gear. A pair of sturdy boots and some physical conditioning are the only requirements.

For the independent minded, the Fiordland National Park runs an unescorted trip. The "freedom walkers" stay in FNP huts and carry their own cooking and sleeping gear.

My husband, Joseph, and I chose the THC trip. Since we were including the hike in our tour of New Zealand and Australia, we liked the idea of not having to lug extra gear.

Our preparations for the track began in Te Anau, a lakefront town trafficked by tourist buses and sightseeing planes. Checking in at the track headquarters, we lined up behind a woman from Auckland. In an accent that was more cockney than New Zealand, she shyly told us that this was her first hike. "My children took bets if I will finish," she drawled, as she struggled to stuff gear into her pack.

At 1 p.m., we boarded the bus for the 20-minute drive to the dock, where a steamer waited to take us across Lake Te Anau. Our group of 28 included both the elderly and the overweight, the novice and the veteran. The average age was about 50. Many had never hiked before.

As the Tawera slid across the lake, we relaxed in the warm November sunshine. Around us,

mountains cascaded down into the clear lake, creating mysterious inlets. The boat turned, and the lake narrowed as we approached the starting dock.

Greeting us at the Glade House dock were the notorious sand flies. Smaller than the mosquito, the sand fly creates misery for the hiker who forgets his repellent.

During a 15-minute walk to the hut, we lingered in the dim beech forest, trying to identify strange new birds. Having no indigenous mammals, New Zealand compensates with an abundant bird life. We saw a tui, a tit, and the friendly long-legged South Island robin. Unseen above, bellbirds struck their ding-dong notes.

On the steps of Glade House, Phil Turnbull greeted us with a smile. Phil and his wife, Betty, have hosted hikers every season for 16 years. The hut was simple but comfortable, with separate bunkrooms for men and women and a large living and dining room.

That night after dinner, Phil called a group meeting. Urged on by Betty on the out-of-tune piano, we sang various national anthems. The Turnbells seemed to know them all. After describing the next day's itinerary, Phil advised: "Take your time. Enjoy the scenery and relax. That's what the Milford Track is all about."

The next morning, after a hearty breakfast, we set off. The trail led across a meadow to a suspension bridge over the Clinton River. Crossing the bridge, we walked under trees dripping with thick moss. Feet sank into a cushion of soft earth. Overhead, the forest brimmed with an amazing array of birds. The path followed the river, gradually climbing uphill, passing under the towering "Black Forest" and winding through an impressive avalanche field.

Six Mile Hut was our lunch stop. Ron, our buide from Glade House, turned back, and Louis took over. Assigned to specific huts, the four tracks guides ferry the groups from one part of the trail to another. While we munched our roast beef sandwiches, kea birds — large, multihued parrots — begged for tidbits, occasionally snatching whole lunches from the unsuspecting hiker.

Soon after Six Mile Hut, the trail turned a corner, and there it was — the pass, a 3,835-foot saddle, surrounded by 6,000-foot snowcapped. It looked imposing. Remembering my lax training, I felt a twinge of anxiety. The trail passed several lakes, fed by waterfalls gliding down the side of cliffs. The terrain steepened, and the trail began to climb. Breathless, we arrived at Pampalona Hut, which was named for the fried scones that the guide Mackinnon used to serve his hikers.

After dinner, the guide narrated a slide show that showed the pass in sunshine, in drenching rain, and under snow — in January (New

Zealand's summer). "You have to be prepared for anything," Louis commented coolly.

Dark skies greeted us the next morning. Anticipating a long day, we hurried to get an early start and arrived at Lake Mintaro around 10 a.m. Suddenly, the low-lying clouds obscuring the pass lifted, allowing a view of the vertical slope leading to the top. Where do we go up, I wondered.

The climb was easier than it had appeared from below. Eleven switchbacks led us up at a moderate incline. At the 10th switchback, the trees disappeared, and we could look down. Below lay the serpen-

tine river valley, like a map of our accomplishments. Reaching the top, we dropped our packs by the cairn erected to commemorate Mackinnon and rushed to look down what is known as the "seven-second drop." Far below, the roof of Quentin Hut glimmered next to an airstrip used to bring in supplies.

The top of the pass was an alpine wonderland. Like small jewels held in giant hands, ponds reflected the snow-tinged peaks. While Mount Cook lilies dotted the paths. Posted signs warned hikers to stay on the trail, since walking on the

mossy undergrowth could disturb an ecologically sensitive area.

After our euphoric conquest, the descent was a grind. On the west side of the pass, the terrain changed from alpine to arid. The sun beat down. Shedding layers, we maneuvered between jagged rocks.

Then the trail dipped into the cool forest — down, down, down, over more rocks. We couldn't relax yet. One wrong step could be dangerous. When it seemed as though my toes would bore a hole in my boots, the trail leveled out.

Leaving our packs at Quentin Hut, we hurried to make the round trip to Sutherland Falls before dinner, where the water descends from Lake Quill above, falling more than 1,000 metres in three spectacular leaps.

The hike to Milford Sound was a welcome relief. Passing through towering rain forests, the trail gradually dropped to sea level. We passed MacKay Falls, an impressive sight but lacking the drama of Sutherland Falls. Skirting Lake Ada, we arrived at Sandfly Point. Here a boat was waiting to take us across the sound to the Milford Sound Hotel. As we clambered aboard, the first-time hiker from Auckland smiled. "Ayh," she said, "that was fun."
