

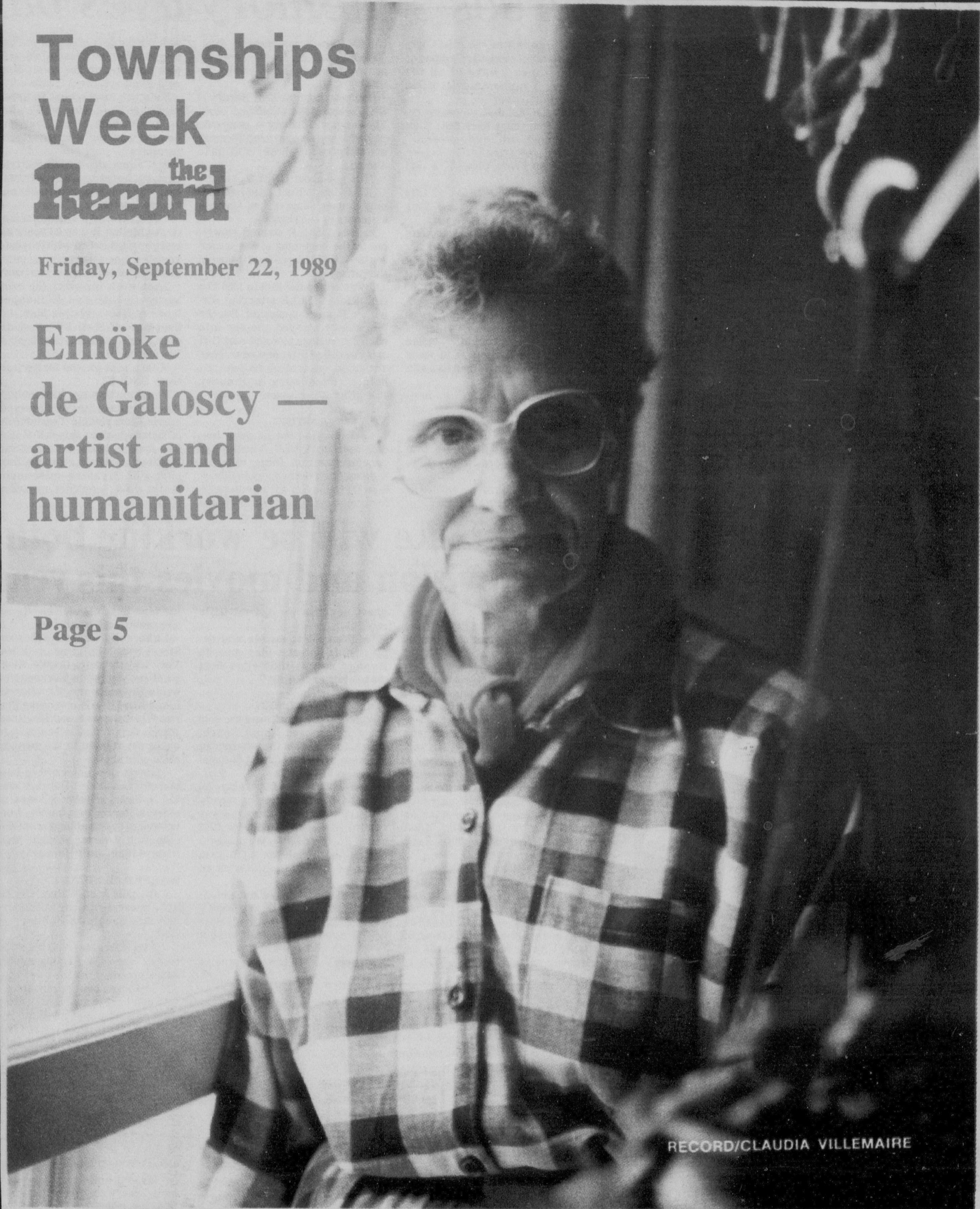

Uncle's gone, but heroes's memory lives on

Television's favorite UNCLE is turning 25.

The Man From UNCLE had its premiere on NBC on Sept. 22, 1964, pitting superspies Napoleon Solo and his Soviet-born partner Illya Kuryakin against the evil organization Thrush and its plots against mankind.

Robert Vaughn played Solo in the hour-long show, with David McCallum as Kuryakin and the late Leo Carroll as Mr. Waverly, the head of the United Network Command for Law and Enforcement.

The show featured such gadgets as a cigarette package that was really a radio (Solo called up headquarters with the phrase "Open Channel D"), a pistol that could be converted into a rifle, and guest stars ranging from veteran actors Vincent Price and Joan Crawford

to singers Nancy Sinatra and Sonny and Cher.

It was the first TV series to capitalize on the spy craze set off by the 1963 release of the original James Bond movie, Dr. No.

In fact, Bond creator Ian Fleming had a hand in the birth of the TV show. He suggested the name Napoleon Solo and drafted a background sketch of the character for Norman Felton, executive producer of the series.

But it was writer-producer Sam Rolfe who dreamed up UNCLE, Thrush and other elements of the show, such as hiding UNCLE headquarters behind a tailor shop.

RERUNS STILL ON

Although he first appeared in the Solo role a quarter of a century ago, Vaughn, now 57, says it doesn't seem as if so many years have passed.

"Not at all, because it's constan-

tly in rerun around the East Coast and also my children are looking at all the tapes I have of all the shows," Vaughn said from his Connecticut home.

"And the fact that we did the revival a few years back puts it all pretty much still in the present," he added, referring to The Return of the Man From UNCLE, a 1983 TV movie.

McCallum, who turns 57 this month, said ardent UNCLE fans won't let him forget the series.

"People are constantly stopping me and being very kind on the street and saying how much they enjoyed it, as if it were yesterday," he said from his New York home.

Vaughn said the show was popular because it offered light, escapist entertainment — "a James Bond movie every night" — while McCallum said simply: "I think we must have entertained an awful lot of people."

They still do. The CBC ran first-season UNCLE episodes last year and the TNT cable network in the United States is currently airing the series, although Vaughn said he sees only sporadic royalties from the show.

The series was also chronicled in The Man From UNCLE Book by

Jon Heitland, published in 1987. Fan clubs still exist, and some fans are even writing their own spy fiction.

One is Winona Kent of Burnaby, B.C., whose first published book, Skywatcher, is about a man who played a spy on television 20 years ago and goes to Vancouver to make a movie.

"It's not about UNCLE, but it's UNCLE-ish," Kent said, explaining it uses some of her favorite elements of the show.

In 1964 UNCLE started slowly, but by the beginning of the second season it had jumped to 13th spot in the ratings.

It was so popular that in 1966 The Girl From UNCLE (starring Stephanie Powers) appeared. But the two shows strayed too far into comedy, ratings plunged and Girl was cancelled after one year. Man struggled on another half-season before cancellation in January 1968 after 105 episodes.

NO TYPE-CASTING

Since playing the dashing leading man in UNCLE, Vaughn has concentrated on doing villains, ranging from the bad guy in Superman III to his Emmy-winning performance as a top White House

aide in the 1977 mini-series Washington: Behind Closed Doors. He also appeared in the series Emerald Point and the A-Team.

Vaughn's most recent TV appearance had him saving people's hair — as the host of an hour-long commercial for a hair-restoring formula.

McCallum also hasn't felt typecast, but he betrays a little frustration with fans who remember only the '60s spy show.

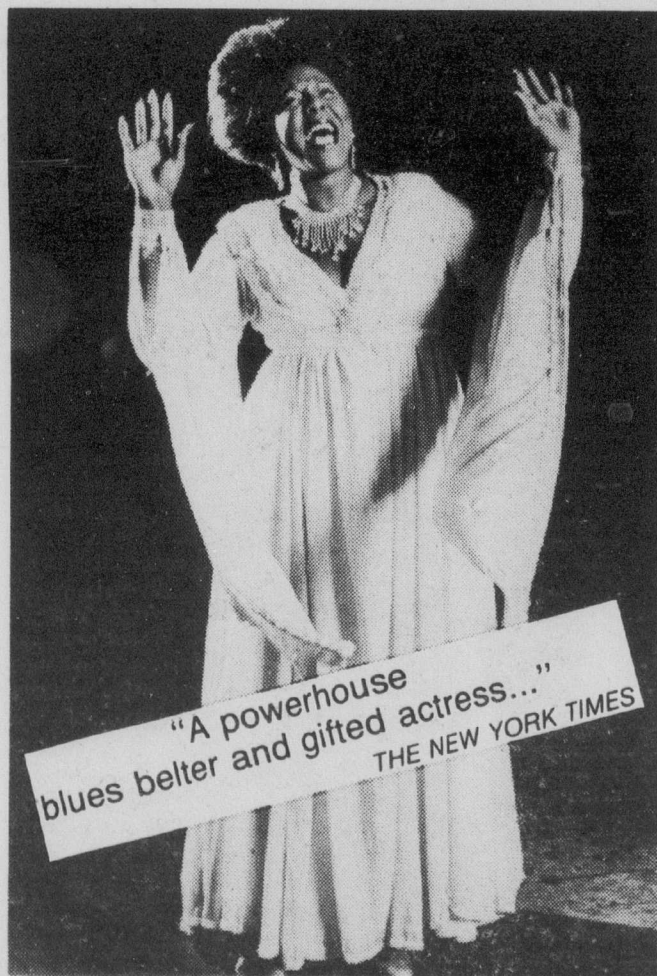
"UNCLE was a wonderful time of my life but it was 25 years ago and you must get on with the rest of your life," he said, pointing out he has done lots of other screen work.

That work includes the mini-series Colditz and Kidnapped, leads in The Invisible Man, and Sapphire and Steel TV series, and even a role in the daytime soap As The World Turns.

What's next for the former men from UNCLE?

Vaughn plays no lesser villain than Dracula in the horror-comedy movie Transylvania Twist due out in October, while this fall McCallum appears in the Return of Sam McCloud on ABC and in the four-part PBS Mystery mini-series Motherlove, co-starring Diana Rigg.

Ricki Lake will be working both in television and movies this year

LOS ANGELES (AP) — When Ricki Lake smiles, which is most of the time on screen and off, it's not part of the act.

The 21-year-old actress has plenty to smile about. She joins the cast for the third season of ABC's China Beach as Holly Pelligrino. She will work often with Dana Delany, who just won an Emmy for her portrayal of nurse Colleen McMurphy.

She's in the current movie release Cookie, and Cry Baby is coming out soon. Her happy face has brightened such movies as Hairspray, Working Girl, Last Exit to Brooklyn and TV's Baby Cakes in recent years.

"Holly's well aware of why she's in Vietnam," said Lake. "She's a smart girl but she's the baby of all those there."

"Her perky energy makes the guys happy. She reminds them of home. But she also grates on McMurphy's nerves, which is

great because we have a little conflict.

"McMurphy is moody and depressed. It's great to play opposite Dana. She has that edge that makes her endearing."

FOCUSES ON WOMEN

When Lake was offered the role she'd never seen China Beach, which focuses on the women in Vietnam at an evacuation hospital and recreation centre.

She was hesitant about taking on the role. She'd been doing mostly features but had devoted six months to a comedy pilot for CBS called Starting Now. She played a "gofer" on a children's program who was trying to make it as an actress.

"It's too bad it turned out a bummer," she said. "I did my best. I had a great time. But things happen for a reason. Had it worked out I wouldn't be in China Beach."

She will be a recurring character

in China Beach, which has its season premiere Wednesday.

Lake calls herself a Sesame Street baby who grew up in New York's Westchester County. At one point she wanted to be change her name to Laura Ingalls, after the heroine on Little House on the Prairie. When she watched The Brady Bunch she wanted to be Cindy because she related to the youngest child on a show.

"I never saw movies when I was young," she said. "I always wanted to be on television. I was the older sister in my family, but I wanted to be the youngest child on television. I never thought about feature films until Hairspray."

WARPED MUSICAL

Lake calls John Waters' Cry Baby a musical comedy about juvenile delinquents in Baltimore in 1954.

"It's a kind of warped West Side Story," she said. "I play Pepper, who's pregnant for the third time. She just loves being pregnant."

"I don't get to sing it. In fact, I don't sing in any of my films. But it's the first project I've ever been on that I felt was going to be really, really good."

She was also pregnant in Last Exit to Brooklyn, one of her few non-cheery roles.

Lake lives in Los Angeles with her two Blue Russian cats, Annie and Molly. Ricki Lake is her real name and she said for years she hated having a boy's first name.

"My mother kind of held me back. She was afraid I couldn't take the rejection. You still face rejection. It's part of the business."

Tadeusz digs into a bit of the Prince of Devil's dirty work

Baal-Zebub still sows contempt, reaps corruption

News has just leaked out of Israel that teams of archeologists at Ekron are excavating the temple of the Lord of the Flies.

They've unearthed 3-meter high walls plastered in red and blue, a great basalt altar and four horned altars believed to be 3,000 years old and sacred to Baal-Zebub, Prince of Devils. Milton ranked Beelzebub second only to Satan.

This news sheds light on recent mysterious events. It explains why Townships farmers and housewives have been plagued with an extraordinary number of flies this summer. It explains Hurricane Hugué, the Gouge and Squeeze Tax, Jacques Parizeau and the result of Monday's election. It explains why poor Jim Bakker is being so brutally martyred for not doing his sums correctly.

BAKKER GETTING HIS TOO

Bakker is facing 120 years before Judge Robert 'Maximum Bob' Potter for bilking the faithful of millions. Tearful Tammy stays clear of court lest her mascara run but continues to pray for a miracle and plead for cash on the dozen TV stations remaining of their empire. Just last week she compared her husband's ordeal with the sufferings of Christ - and got away with it.

It's tempting to gloat and murmur little homilies - see how the mighty have fallen and pride goeth before a fall and a shitten shepherd and a snowy flock - but the really extraordinary thing about it all is that it's happened so many times before - *deja vu* all over again - yet the money keeps rolling in.

Jimmy 'I Have Sinned' Swaggart is back up to a million dollars a week. Oral 'Call Me Home' Roberts, after accusing God of extortion, got the \$11 million he needed to save his ministry and himself. Prayerful Pat Robertson, who ran for the Democratic nomination on the Holier-Than-Thou platform until it was revealed he had impregnated his wife without benefit of clergy, has increased his network from 100 to 180 stations and is planning a brand new Christian confe-

rence center at Virginia Beach.

All this ballyhoo - and the architecture it seems to spawn - is a peculiarly American phenomenon and proves beyond a doubt P.T. Barnum's belief that people are willing - even eager - to pay good money to be flimflammed and humbugged.

In the early 70s, the Rev. Carl McIntyre boosted the Vietnam War, attacked civil rights and Catholics, gun control and census takers, Communists and Billy Graham. The money came rolling in and he built a Bible college and conference center in Cape May, New Jersey. Then he bought the Cape Canaveral Hilton, installed a scale model of the Temple of Jerusalem he'd picked up cheap from Montreal's Expo, and planned a multimillion dollar 'Gateway to the Stars' nearby.

BAD ARITHMETIC TOO

But he, too, failed his arithmetic, neglected to give unto Caesar, and New Jersey slapped hefty tax liens on his empire. His Bible college lost its accreditation and the FCC revoked his broadcasting license.

Remember Father Coughlin? During the Great Depression, his raspy rabble-rousing was heard by 30 million Americans and a 1934 poll placed him second in influence only to his archenemy, FDR. He fulminated against a world-wide conspiracy of Communists and Jews, claimed Jews had financed the Russian Revolution and were getting exactly what they deserved under Hitler.

CBS and NBC finally dropped him for his hatred, bigotry and ignorance but he managed to set up an independant network of 47 radio stations and crusaded on into the 40s and 50s.

Aimee Semple Macpherson, at the height of fame and fortune in 1926, was broadcasting 'Fours-

quare Gospel' around the world from her \$1.5 million Angelus Temple in Los Angeles when she disappeared from a California beach. Thousands walked the sands and prayed while boats searched for her body off shore and a diver perished from exhaustion. A young man shouted "I'm going after her!", plunged into the Pacific surf and was drowned. A girl committed suicide.

Then a ransom note demanded half a million for her safe return and Sister Aimee turned up next day in a Mexican border town. She said she'd been abducted from the beach and imprisoned in a desert shack until she'd escaped through a window and stumbled for miles across the blistering sands.

But newspapermen noted her dress was clean and neat, her coiffure unmussed and her ivory complexion unmarred by the desert sun. They began nosing around and discovered she'd actually been having it off for a month in resort hotels with a married man. Nevertheless, many of the Foursquare remained faithful and her popularity continued until she died from an overdose of sleeping pills in 1944.

Remember Father Divine? His followers chanted "He is God! He is God! God, God, God!" and he didn't bother to deny it - although he was one of the unlikeliest candidates imaginable for that high office. He was pot-bellied, bald-headed, 5' 2" in his socks, wore \$500 silk suits and rode in a chauffeured Duesenberg or a private plane and was sometimes sued by cuckolded husbands. When a New York judge died soon after jailing him for disorderly conduct, Father Divine said from his cell, "I hated to do it."

He probably began life as George Baker, son of a Georgia sharecropper and an early follower of Sam Morris who had a good thing going locally as 'Father Jehovah'. The sharecropper's son changed his name to improve his prospects and never looked back. He was once booked as a public

nuisance under the name 'John Doe, alias God' and given the choice of an insane asylum or a new state. He chose Harlem and began the 'Kingdom of Peace' which brought in millions. In his 70s, he married a 22-year-old Canadian girl named Edna Rose Kitchings and rechristened her Mother Divine.

AND REMEMBER..

Before him was Billy Sunday, a millionaire by 1917 when a million dollars meant actual money. He learned his trade from D.L. Moody who created the mix of evangelism and advertising, Jesus Christ and P.T. Barnum, that got the glory ride rolling and keeps it going today.

And before them was the great temperance crusader John Bartholomew Gough. He was scheduled to appear in Montreal when he vanished from a New York hotel after informing his wife, "I hope to spend a profitable sabbath in Brooklyn."

When he didn't return, his church went looking for him in the

confident assumption the dark forces of the 'liquor interests' had done him in. A reporter for the Police Gazette eventually led a constable to the Brooklyn bawdy house where the pious reformer had been roistering all week.

Even the thunderous Henry Ward Beecher had his comeuppance in 1874 when Theodore Tilton charged him with seducing his wife. Beecher took the stand in his own defence, denied the accusation, promised never to do it again and employed his dramatic eloquence to such effect that he was acquitted by a hung jury while poor Mrs. Tilton became a fallen woman.

The thread connecting all these hellfire hucksters is a sneering contempt for 2,000 years of struggle toward understanding, a devotion to one book that disdains every other. Such dramatic denunciation has certainly been profitable and if Barnum were alive today he just might murmur with his customary twinkle; "There's a sucker born again every minute."

True Love — the true life story of Nancy & Richard

Guess which of the following two scenarios is the plot of *True Love*, a new movie to be released nationally this fall.

Take 1:

Once upon a time, in an exuberantly Italian neighborhood of New York, two young people named Nancy and Richard fall in love.

They meet when Nancy's sister spots Richard working at the local deli and fixes them up by having him deliver hot sausages to their home.

They marry, go on to make movies together and live happily ever after.

Take 2:

In the same Bronx neighborhood, two 21-year-old sweethearts named Donna and Michael decide to spend their lives together.

Until they start planning their wedding, that is. They bicker over color schemes and bachelor parties.

Donna spends her wedding night in tears when Michael decides to go out for "a cupla beers wit da boys" after the reception.

If your guess was the first story with the happy ending, guess again.

WAS TRUE LIFE

The first, say film-makers Nancy Savoca and Richard Guay somewhat sheepishly, is their own true tale.

"It's a story to tell your grandchildren," Savoca said in a Montreal interview.

Savoca and Guay, both 30, really were fixed up by her sister in the tight-knit Italian neighborhood of the Bronx they grew up in.

They really did get married at 21 — the same year as most of their friends. And that nuptial-filled year really did inspire them to write *True Love*, their first feature film.

"It was almost as though (our friends) were following scripts," Savoca said of that year. "The guy organizing his bachelor party, the girl wanting more attention."

Fed up with the saccharine depictions of weddings in many Hollywood movies, the couple decided to tell it like it really is — even if their own story is a romantic ex-

ception to the rule.
WAY IT IS

"We wanted to get to some truths about what really occurs in those weeks before a young couple gets married," Savoca explained.

"Often, they try to ignore the fact that they are making a major commitment to each other by deliberately getting busy on all these preparations."

In *True Love*, Donna and Michael — played by unknowns Annabella Sciorra and Ron Eldard — become increasingly estranged as they immerse themselves in the intricate world of caterers, tacky orchestras and seating plans.

Michael is horrified when the caterer suggests blue mashed potatoes for the wedding reception. Donna wants to know what shade of blue he had in mind.

Donna demands Michael visit her after his bachelor party. When he doesn't, she throws a tantrum.

If some of the incidents in *True Love* seem hard to believe, Savoca and Guay insist that almost all actually happened to couples they know.

A groom who wants to go out with

his drinking buddies the night of his wedding?

"We know of two couples where that really happened," Guay said.

Even more far-fetched is the story of how *True Love* made its way to the cinema.

Savoca is a graduate of New York University's film school — the same department that produced such hot young film-makers as Spike Lee, Susan Seidelman and Jim Jarmusch.

But since Savoca graduated in 1982, she spent much of her time in small roles on film sets, working as everything from production coordinator to assistant auditor.

Guay is a chartered accountant by profession who "retired" at age 25 and began a new career as a film auditor.

When the two decided to collaborate on *True Love*, they found writing the script was easy. "Getting it out of the closet" was harder, Savoca says. "We were scared and wondered if anybody would want to read it."

SOLD BY PROMO

After rejections from every film

studio they contacted, they shot a nine-minute promotional trailer that attracted the attention of several people in the New York film community, including John Sayles and Jonathan Demme.

That enabled them to finance the film through private investment and "long, long lines of credit."

They spent the next three years conducting cattle calls to find their large cast. Savoca directed the film, while Guay acted as co-producer and first assistant director.

When *True Love* finally had its premiere earlier this year at the 1989 U.S. Film Festival in Park City, Utah, it won the Grand Prize and was picked up for distribution across North America by United Artists Pictures.

Guay and Savoca — parents of two young sons — said they make a good working team.

"It's great," Savoca said. "We really trust each other's judgment."

"I have no trouble getting her on the phone," Guay added.

Sometimes, they admit, true love is cornier than fiction.

Tom Kerr of Neptune theatre facing a tough second term

HALIFAX (CP)—Pity Tom Kerr as he begins his second term as artistic director of the Neptune Theatre.

When he first had the job in 1983, Kerr was luckier. He inherited the legacy of John Neville, who gained god-like status in Halifax by eliminating a \$200,000 deficit that appeared to threaten Neptune's existence.

Now Kerr finds himself in Neville's shoes.

He's facing the biggest deficit in Neptune's history — well over \$300,000 — and a list of subscribers that plunged last year to 7,500 from 9,000 during Richard Ouzounian's final season at the artistic helm.

Kerr, whose season begins Oct. 6 with the musical *Man of La Mancha*, had built subscriptions to 9,300 when he left in '86.

"But Neptune has a unique history," says an optimistic-sounding Kerr with a hint of an accent that reveals his Scottish heritage. "So many times it should have folded, and it didn't."

"It's a history of a tough, gritty, fighting theatre that has gone down, and of people like John Neville who have always appeared to lift it again."

Neville, a highly respected classical actor, has a knack for erasing debts. After four years as artistic director of the Stratford Festival in Ontario, he is leaving the once debt-ridden operation in the black.

FACE NEW FOES

Kerr says the battle at Neptune could be tougher this time around, noting that regional theatres such as Neptune have new foes standing in the wings.

For one thing, the multimillion-dollar mega-musicals have arrived, and it's getting harder than ever to lure top talent to Halifax when the big bucks are calling from Toronto.

"You have *Cats*, you have *The Phantom of the Opera*, and *Les Miserables*," says the 55-year-old Kerr. "They're charging big money and they're paying big money, and the regional theatres cannot compete with that."

"I have a musical director who usually works for me here ... but he just became the associate conductor of *Phantom*. I can't quote you his salary, but I can tell you it's at least twice what we could pay him."

Kerr says entertainment heavyweights such as Garth Drabinsky — chairman of the Cineplex Odeon theatre chain — have also begun to limit the number of stage productions available to Canada's smaller theatres.

BUYS THE RIGHTS

"You get a play like *Shirley Valentine*, it opens on Broadway, and a lot of top Canadian actresses say, 'Wow, I want to play that,'" he says.

"Suddenly you get a call from someone like Garth Drabinsky's office saying, 'I have taken the Canadian rights to *Shirley Valentine*.' So you're getting national rights of plays being taken before you can even look at them."

To his advantage, Kerr begins the job of resurrecting Atlantic Canada's biggest regional theatre with an impressive list of credentials.

A fellow of Trinity College, London, Kerr worked internationally with the late Tyrone Guthrie, the distinguished British producer and founding artistic director of Ontario's Stratford Festival.

Kerr has also worked at top-notch regional theatres in British Columbia, Alberta and Saskatche-

wan, as well as major and minor theatres alike in almost every other province in the country.

And he's quite well known for his money-management skills.

In order to muster the financial resources to entice the talent and plays that remain available, Kerr is sharpening his pencils and attempting to cut costs at every turn.

SAVING TIME

For example, he says some directors feel they need four weeks' rehearsal to bring a play to the stage. But Kerr will do it in three. With seven shows on the main stage this season, that will save seven weeks of salaries.

He's also critical of some Neptune directors who have allowed a two-week gap between productions. He'll likely shave that down to one week, thereby giving Neptune an extra seven weeks of potential income.

And three shows this season will share one set, "with clever changes," to cut down on labor and materials.

Despite the precarious financial position, Kerr is also fighting to bring back the second stage, Neptune North, to present alternative theatre.


Kerr resurrected Neptune North during his first term, but it died under Ouzounian.

His proposal to the board of directors was crafted with economics in mind. He has approached two of Nova Scotia's smaller theatre companies with a plan to co-produce plays as a means of saving money at both ends.

"We will give them design help, props, technical assistance — a huge percentage of their budget," he says. "In return, they can rehearse here and pay the actors."

Emöke de Galoscy: a successful Townships artist

ST-ÉLIE D'ORFORD—She fled from war-ravaged Hungary with her family in 1945, trying to time their arrival at the border before the Russians got there. But their timing was wrong and instead they

kept on going, first to Germany, then Holland and Switzerland, always trying to keep the family together, always looking for a final settling place.

"I remember my father, who was an engineering consultant in Budapest. (He) called our first fa-

mily conference at this point. I was 13. We were three children and we had the privilege of choosing whether we would divide at the border, perhaps with the hope of eventually going back home and keeping some of our belongings together. Or we could choose to stay

together and take only what we could carry."

"My Dad made each of us — that meant five — crates. They were about two feet wide, two feet high and four feet long. Since our decision was to remain together through thick and thin, then the crates were the only baggage we were allowed. Everything else stayed behind. It was a difficult time," she remembered.

Emöke de Galoscy came to Canada finally in 1952, to visit her beloved brother who had fled to Cap-de-la-Madeleine just two years earlier. "I decided that my dear brother would not spend another Christmas alone so far from his family — so, that's when I arrived," she told me.

During the years in Europe, she completed her schooling first in Holland, then continued to study art and sculpture through university and special workshops.

"Actually, I also took a degree in what is called social work here," Galoscy explained when we visited her studio and home this week. And when she arrived in Canada, all the years of training in fine arts was put aside to work with disturbed or delinquent children. For a time she returned to Brussels to continue working with children. "But there was no question about coming back to Canada. This country had won my heart and I returned as soon as I could," she added.

Galoscy's life is totally dedicated to her profound Christian beliefs. The artist-at-heart turned her undivided attention to people in need and devoted all her energies towards her fellow man.

"But, a few years ago, medical problems stopped me in my tracks. It turned out to be a time for retrospect, and, in the end, a time for serious decision. My doctor counselled that the artist in me was in a life-and-death struggle to get going again. He suggested I try being an artist for a year. So, that's what I did."

In former years, Galoscy had exhibited her work which, at that time, consisted entirely of enamelled copper. Enamel sculpture on copper was her medium and marked the Galoscy reputation, through exhibitions across Canada and the United States as well as through her boutique at La Ronde which won her world acclaim.

"But you know," she says, still speaking with a slight accent that hints just a bit of the five languages she speaks, "I started at the very first with watercolors. Then, when I developed this terrible allergy to the glass powders which are used for enamelling on copper, I went back to my first love — watercolors," she laughs.

We walked about her home where enamel-on-copper pieces mingle with more recent watercolors. "You know, I love doing watercolor so it wasn't as difficult as I thought to change mediums.

Galoscy believes being an artist demands a great deal from the person. "At least, in my case, I must

manage the purchase of supplies which include frames, mats, paints and all the paraphernalia I need. Then the actual work must be done. But there is always the promotion and marketing too."

"And you mustn't forget, being a successful artist means you have learned how to express, through the medium of your choice, the feelings of your spirit — and that's what makes artists special," she added.

Last year, the Galoscy works were on exhibition at various places in the Townships all winter long. Now, aside from teaching art at the Centre d'Art Nouveau on 11th Avenue in Sherbrooke and taking a few private students at her home, Galoscy is preparing to face the public again. This time, she'll be exhibiting at the Magog Municipal Library during October, with more exhibitions planned, including one at St. Jean de Brebeuf Caisse Populaire.

"I didn't think I could ever make a living as an artist. It's one thing to be told you are a great artist. But it's quite another to make a living at it."

The Galoscy work is precise, but at the same time spiritual. Her work is joyous, colors bright and vibrant. A tiny leaning to the surrealist side gives an ethereal quality to many of her works and her choice of quiet scenes and reflections give us a hint of her profound faith in the positive side of life. And demand for Galoscy work is coming from all over the world.

"You know, an artist, sometimes unknowingly, reveals through his work, the inside of his soul. The final result could be an expression of frustration or anger or even tell the tale of spiritual agony and strife. And the opposite is also true.

"I often have no idea what the final result might be when I first pick up my brush. The photograph I'm working from sometimes is soon forgotten, and the brush and colors appear as if another spirit is guiding my hand. I think, it boils down to the definition of a true artistic temperament, a special talent that can express the spiritual side of mankind as well as record a scene or depict a person or event."

She showed me her garden where a bouquet of broccoli was soon in my hands. We stood in her tiny studio where natural light filters through an old-fashioned window, emphasizing the spiritual quality of her watercolors that are perched here and there. We chatted in the kitchen where fruit was arranged on one of her enamelled copper plates, and we admired copper sculptures of finely detailed birdlife. In the living room oval wall-hangings depicting wildflowers is a breathtaking work showing two white swans surrounded by misty blue water and sky — the Galoscy spirit and faith never failing to shine through each piece.

This week, we meet Emöke de Galoscy — a true artist working successfully in the Eastern Townships.

The names of all 125 ticket holders were placed on a huge billboard on stage. Draw master for the evening, CJAD talk show host Royal Orr-assisted by his "Vanna White" partner, passed out prizes to holders of every fifth ticket drawn.

Excitement mounted as the final draw for the cash prize came down to two ticket holders—real-estate developer Robert Ronci and insu-

rance broker Fred Tanner.

Theatre president Diana Timmins presented a cheque for \$10,000 to Mr. Tanner — who had already agreed to split the take with Ronci — while all other names were returned to the hat for the draw for the trip to Paris.

When the winning ticket belonging to Fernand Roberge was drawn, a disappointed sigh ran through the crowd.

"He can travel free on Air Canada anytime he wants, and stay at the Ritz," groaned one disappoint-

ted ticket holder, adding Roberge is the manager of the Ritz and a member of the board of Air Canada.

In the spirit of the evening, Air Canada vice-president Denis Groom returned Roberge's ticket to the drum and drew the name of a new winner, Great Canadian Products, a Knowlton manufacturing business, owned by Robert and Christina Antoniadis.

Phantom of the Opera opened last Wednesday — in Pantages theatre

TORONTO (CP) — After a year of high-pitched publicity, an \$18-million theatre renovation and much-ballyhooed cross-country auditions, the Canadian production of the musical *The Phantom of the Opera* was at last ready for its glittering gala opening Wednesday night.

With world-record advance ticket sales of \$23.8 million, it's set for a run of between two and five years, says a company spo-

kesman.

The Andrew Lloyd Webber musical, a sensation in London and on Broadway, opens at the gloriously restored Pantages Theatre, built in 1920 as an up-scale "combination house," used for vaudeville and silent movies.

In later years the downtown theatre fell into disrepair, tiers of balconies were torn down and delicate mouldings and carvings painted over.

Now the Pantages has been painstakingly restored by Garth Drabinsky, chairman of Cineplex

Odeon which owns the Pantages and is producing *Phantom* in association with others.

Although this is a virtually all-Canadian cast — a notable exception is Dubliner Colm Wilkinson in the title role — the \$6-million Toronto production has employed the entire original creative team from London, headed by director Harold Prince.

BENEFIT CHARITY

Aside from drawing millions of dollars to the box office, the *Phantom* also will raise money for charities which will stage gala theatre evenings, often including dinners and champagne receptions, at prices ranging up to \$1,000 each.

The performance tonight will be followed by a party to raise funds for Toronto's Mount Sinai Hospital. About 22 other such events are scheduled before Christmas, hoping to raise about \$8 million for medical research, to fight AIDS, help street kids and study Parkinson's disease.

Regular *Phantom* tickets range from \$35 to \$75.

A spokesman said that despite the big advance sale, there still are tickets available for many scheduled performances. She said tickets are selling all across Canada to travellers planning to visit Toronto and some orders have come from as far away as Australia and New Zealand.

The show is based on the 1911 Gaston Leroux novel about a hideously deformed phantom who lurks beneath the Paris Opera House and falls fatally in love with young soprano Christine Daae, played by Toronto-born Rebecca Caine, who also performed the role in the original London cast in 1987.

The cast for the Paris-set story was recruited during auditions last January in Vancouver, Edmonton, Montreal and Toronto and a spokesman said it includes a large number of French-Canadians, notably Lyse Guerin in the role of Carlotta.

Meanwhile, the other supermusical in town, *Les Miserables*, which opened at the Royal Alexandra Theatre March 7, has just announced that because of brisk box-office business it will extend its scheduled run by another four months, to May 26.

Espy East — tells a tale of racism & incompetence

MONTREAL (CP) — A charismatic psychopath. A native Indian who spent 11 years in prison for a crime he didn't commit. A police investigation smacking of incompetence and racism.

Sounds like the script for a movie. And that's what it is. But it's also the true story of Donald Marshall — the Micmac Indian who at the age of 17 was wrongly convicted in the 1971 stabbing death of his companion Sandy Seale in Sydney, N.S.

"It had all the elements of a good drama," film-maker Paul Cowan said in a recent interview. "A bull-headed police chief, a tough Indian, lots of crazies."

Justice Denied, Cowan's documentary based on Marshall's ordeal, was first screened at the Montreal International Film Festival and more recently at Toronto's Festival of Festivals. It will be shown on CBC television Nov. 14.

The Montreal-born Cowan, 42, has long been fascinated by the workings of the Canadian justice system.

His last two films — *The Morgentaler Affair* and *See No Evil* — were part of Democracy on Trial, the CBC series on Canada's legal and judicial system.

And his award-winning *The Kid Who Couldn't Miss*, about fighter pilot and First World War hero Billy Bishop, led the Senate veterans' affairs committee to examine whether Bishop falsified some of his exploits.

Although Justice Denied was made as a fiction film, Cowan said evidence from the royal commission inquiry into the Marshall case was so plentiful that a dramatic recreation was not difficult.

Cowan was not allowed to film the inquiry — which is still in progress — but he sat through a good deal of it, observing the main characters.

Among them was the true killer, Roy Ebsary, an eccentric old man with a goatee, a wild wardrobe and a penchant for guns, knives and young boys.

"I was amazed by this man," Co-

wan said. "He held the audience spellbound through his two days of testimony."

Ebsary, who was finally convicted of the crime, is played with frightening effectiveness in Justice Denied by Wayne Robson.

Robson's is one of several remarkable performances in the film, including that of Billy Merasty — the nephew of Cree playwright Tomson Highway — who plays Donald Marshall.

ROLE FOR PARENTS

Marshall's parents — who spent months with Cowan sifting through the details of the case — were cast as themselves.

"They had such natural dignity and stature that I always saw them" in that role, he said.

Marshall gave Cowan his consent to make the film and filled in some background on the story but for the most part seemed uninterested in its telling.

"He never read the screenplay, never expressed an interest in it," Cowan said. "I think he'd just like to forget a lot of painful memories."

Most disturbing for Cowan was the role of the police in sending Marshall to federal penitentiary for 11 years.

"The most interesting thing was the number of times it was revealed to the authorities that Junior (Donald Marshall) didn't do it," he said. "And yet they chose not to act on that."

Because the case is still before the royal commission — which began more than two years ago and has cost more than \$5 million to date — Cowan would not say whether he believes incompetence or actual malice were to blame.

"Any justice system — even a good one, and Canada's is clearly a good one — is fragile," he concluded.

"It's dependent on good people doing the right thing. Sometimes people don't, sometimes for reasons of prejudice or because of incompetence. It's incumbent upon the rest of us to be constantly vigilant."

Make Believe Ballrooms is hilarious & delightful

Kaleidoscope

Make Believe Ballrooms by Peter J. Smith (ATLANTIC MONTHLY PRESS — LITTLE BROWN): \$23.95, 292 pp.

To trace Peter J. Smith's literary pedigree it would be necessary to cite such influences as *Tristram Shandy*, Holden Caulfield, Jay McInerney, and Tom Wolfe.

Smith manages to incorporate elements of Laurence Sterne's comedy classic, Sallinger's portrait of unsettled youth, McInerney's scatter-gun of popular culture, and Wolfe's portrait of the city of New York in *Bonfire Of The Vanities*, mixing them liberally with a witches' brew of comic characters who are as original as they are hilarious.

At the opening of the novel, the hero Hal Andrews is recovering from the mind-numbing experience of having his cat "Kitty" plunge to its death from the window of a New York apartment.

JOURNEY FROM SADNESS

Trying to forget this sadness, Hal journeys to Massachusetts to attend the wedding of his older brother Beck, who is marrying Lisa Lyman, heiress to a napkin fortune, and one of the many comic portraits that Peter Smith creates in his eccentric novel.

The early chapters of *Make Believe Ballrooms* immerse the reader in the oddities of the Lyman family, including the horse-devotee Mrs. Lyman, and the young boy they call "Sir", who was the youngest student ever admitted to the fine New England Academy to which his generous father had made a shopping contribution.

Lisa Lyman is a hopelessly conceited young woman, totally oblivious to any feelings but her own, to whom Hal, and his strange sister known as "Fishie", take an instant dislike. Fishie is an olympic swimmer who has a tendency to spew forth all kinds of vitriolic put-downs of her competitors and even the products she supposedly endorses, anytime she finds an interviewer's microphone poised at her lips.

STRANGE BEDMATES

The Andrews/Lyman wedding occupies the first half of Smith's novel with its wonderfully topical comedy of modern manners, but it is when Hal Andrews moves into a friend's ghetto apartment in the last half of the book that *Make Be-*

lieve Ballrooms really comes to life.

Hal's apartment sitting comes about as he does a favour for his girlfriend Veebka, moving into a shabby dwelling that appears to be the home of a guy named Bob, a professional bowler who happens to be on the road. Hal answers the telephone one day, only to hook up with a very strange, but delightfully oddball, young lady named Mary-Ann Beavers. Mary-Ann is calling from the small town of Patent, Texas, hoping to talk to the bowling star Bob Moore, having traced his number through a train of coincidental circumstances. Dumbfounded at Mary-Ann's mistaking him for Bob Moore, Hal Andrews spins out a long tale of whimsical creativity, turning the impersonated Bob Moore into a medical doctor who bowls on the side, and thoroughly captivating the outrageously naive young Texan.

SIMILAR TO AUTHOR STERN

Smith's novel appears to operate on the same premise as Laurence Sterne's *Tristram Shandy*, appearing to change directions on whim, getting caught up with a minor character who charms her way into the novel and takes it into an unexpected path of development. As Hal despondently whiles away the hours in Bob Moore's depressing apartment, he is surprised by the arrival of Mary-Ann and her totally redneck, stereotyped Southern boor of a brother, Frank.

Mary-Ann's inability to adapt to the realities of New York City, a lot like the experience of Crocodile Dundee in many respects, provides some scenes of satirical social comedy.

Just as quirkily, Peter Smith packs Hal and his nutty companion into the family car known as "Son", and they head south in a riotous odyssey that includes a sojourn in Memphis, Tennessee, where the magnetic appeal of viewing Elvis's Graceland estate has captivated Mary-Ann's compulsive star-worshipping imagination. The travelling companions spend one night within the cavernous confines of a gigantic Target store, a southern version of the ubiquitous K-Marts, it appears, where they sample the wares: Pringles potato chips, the *Carson Show* on a gigantic bank of T.V.'s, a short sleep on inflatable kid's pool toys, and Mary-Ann's manic ride around the acres of showroom corridors on a bicycle. The ultimate visit to Mary-Ann's sleepy Texas town brings the novel to its unexpected ending, adding surprise to the reader's list of reactions to Peter J. Smith's comic novel, which include delight, wonder, and perplexity.

RECORD REVIEWS

Paul Kelly & The Messengers' *So Much Water So Close To Home* (A & M)

There must be at least some kind of spiritual relationship between the southern part of Australia, namely Adelaide, where Paul Kelly hails from, and the countrified side of the Mason/Dixon Line in the United States.

Kelly's first two American releases, *Gosspi*, a double album, and *Under the Sun*, a platinum success, really had none of the distinctly country edge that *So Much Water...* displays. But there's no question on this one that influences such as The Louvin Brothers and Lee Hazelwood are coming through clearly.

Far from being easy covers of Waylon, Willie, Randy or Hank Junior, as sung in the Outback, Kelly's country songs are forced through the cultural filter of Australia, emerging as distinct entities, with far more national integrity than results when the same kind of music is Canadianized.

Kelly takes some bold narrative chances with his songs: on "South Of Germany", one of three songs narrated from a woman's point of view, the speaker is a 60-year-old woman who is dying but pauses to reflect on the fortuitous train of events that allowed her to meet her true love in the south of Germany. "Sweet Guy" features a female voice wondering "what makes such a sweet guy turn so mean", as her lover persists in physically abusing her: and on "Pigeon/Jundamurra", Kelly uses the setting of the Kimberly Ranges of Northwestern Australia to tell the western desperado tale of the Aboriginal resistance hero Jundamurra, who was killed by police on April Fool's Day, 1897.

The material for the title track derives from a story by the American short story stylist Raymond Carver, "So Much Water So Close To Home", in which a wife is recounting the events surrounding a tragic fishing trip that her husband went on: the trip becomes a horror story when the men find the nude body of a young woman in the river, and the man's wife Claire narrates the complications that arose over the unfortunate discovery. Kelly shows with this song and several others on the album that he is able to find songs in all kinds of places: "Cities Of Texas" is obviously an outgrowth of the two visits he and his Messengers made to America in 1987 and 1988 on album promotion tours.

By the sounds of this current release the cities in Texas and other southern venues may replace some of the northern towns on the itinerary, provided that country purists can accept the unique way that these really southern boys have developed country music in Australia.

BoDeans *Home* (SLASH/REPRISE — WEA)

Eddie Cochran, one of the

earliest of the rock pioneers who were rudely stricken from the pantheon of stars, would be justly proud of the BoDeans, a band that shares his approach to rock. Had Cochran not been killed in April of 1960 on his way to Heathrow Airport after a very successful British tour, he might still be making the kind of raw, unadulterated rock statements that are carried on by Kurt Neumann and Sammy Lianas of the BoDeans.

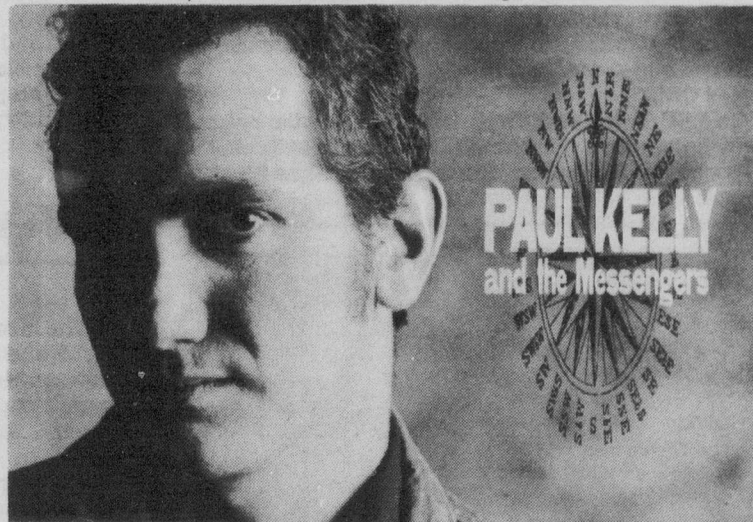
Cochran, composer of such minimalist rock stories as "Summertime Blues", might like the simplicity of "Good Work", the BoDeans song dedicated to "the Killer", which weaves rock trivia into the body of their song: "Well, I'm playing six string down at the corner bar. Be-Bop-A-Lula on a Berry Guitar". The writer of that rock classic, coincidentally, was badly injured in the same accident that claimed Cochran, and anyone who knows a duck-walk from the Stroll could pick Chuck Berry's fat-body Gibson out of a rogue's gallery of guitars.

Sammy's vocals on "Far Far Away From My Heart", a road ballad about a missing love, composed on a 1988 tour, reveal the senti-

mental side of the BoDeans on a gentle acoustic song that gains from the whiskey narration. "Brand New" features a guest shot from Marshall Crenshaw, whose sensibility in songwriting is not that far removed from Kurt & Sammy's.

The influence that wily veterans can have on upcoming young bands is revealed on "Red River", a tune written in a New York City hotel room between shows with Robbie Robertson. The Band's inspiration on guitar adds subtle shadings to this tune that even the BoDeans may not be aware of, with Kurt's vocals taking on Robbie's inflections on certain words. "Beaujolais", the soft Cajun-like lament that closes the album speaks volumes about the way the BoDeans feel about the song traditions that they liberally sprinkle throughout their songwriting.

Many of these tracks may very well follow the crossover moves that several John Cougar Mellencamp songs have enjoyed. For the BoDeans, *Home* can only mean expanded appreciation of their strange hybrid music that glances stylistically at Eddie Cochran, the Band, and Hank Williams, Senior, in the scope of one album.

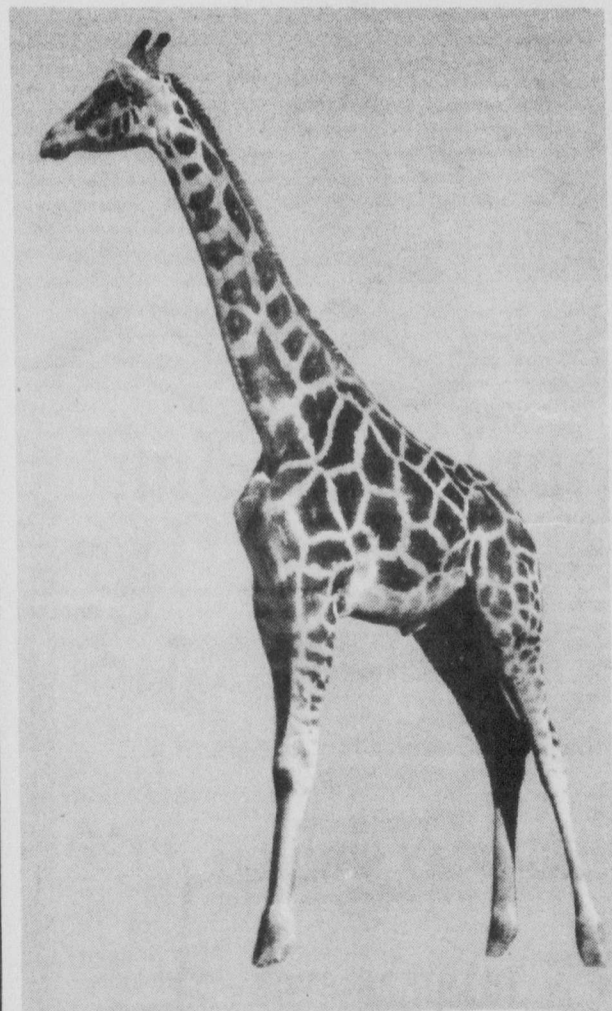

Flexipass — Europe's popular flexible rail pass

People using rail passes in Europe often used to feel compelled to keep moving.

The passes were good for unlimited train travel during a certain period, so the more ground covered, the more the passholders felt they were getting their money's worth.

But a couple of years ago, Eurail introduced a new type of pass. Good for travel on any nine days within a 21-day period, the Flexipass was both less expensive and more flexible than the regular Eurail pass.

The concept has proved so popular that Eurail plans to introduce two new flexible passes in January — one for five days of travel within a 15-day period and one for 14 days of travel within a one-month period.

The 1990 prices in U.S. dollars (Canadian prices have not been set yet) will be \$198 for 15 days, \$360 for 21 days and \$458 for one month. That compares with \$340 for a 15-day non-flexible Eurail pass, \$440 for 21 days and \$550 for one month.

Italy and Britain have also begun offering flexible passes. Following are prices in Canadian dollars:

A Flexi Rail Card in Italy, good for four days' travel in a nine-day period, costs \$85 in economy class and \$130 in first class; eight days' travel within 21 days costs \$120 and \$190 respectively; and 12 days' travel within a 30-day span goes for \$150 and \$235.

The new BritRail Flexipass offers four days of travel in any eight days for \$169 in economy or \$239 in first class; eight days of travel in a 15-day period for \$249 and \$359 respectively; and 15 days of travel within a calendar month for \$359 and \$499.

LOCK THAT DOOR

An open-door policy has always been part of Club Med's "antidote to civilization" image — the implication being that life at a Club Med is so carefree, guests don't even need to lock their room doors.

Yet in a two-week trip through Mexico last summer, the only thing stolen from me was a new

pair of running shoes that vanished from my room at Club Med Huatulco, which I visited for 24 hours.

It's to prevent such incidents that Club Med has now decided to install room locks at all its 110 resorts worldwide.

Until now rooms at Club Med could be locked only from the inside.

Most of the resorts have safes in each room, and guests can leave valuables in a safe at the front office. But all belongings in the rooms have been unprotected while guests were elsewhere on the grounds.

Spokesmen for the chain of all-inclusive resorts admit to only "a couple of incidents" and say the open-door policy is ending because it may be alienating prospective customers.

"I think some people are reluctant to go because their belongings are not locked up," says Club Med's Natalie Gysel. "And as some of the villages are located in increasingly built-up areas that are not so isolated, I think it may be a safety measure to make sure that nothing happens."

Citadel mecca now a tourist stop

PHARAON ISLAND, Egypt (AP) — For more than 800 years, a medieval fortress honoring the dreaded Muslim warrior Saladin knew only wars or rumors of wars.

Now Saladin's Citadel, rebuilt on a tiny island in a turquoise gulf, enjoys the fruits of peace — it has become a tourist mecca.

The citadel was little more than rubble when Egyptian antiquities officials came in 1985. They put archeologists and restorers to work piecing together the long-forgotten history and architecture of the once-proud fort, Egypt's eastern gateway.

The rebuilt citadel stands again, its walls up to 30 metres high.

From the site in the northern Gulf of Aqaba, visitors can see four countries with the naked eye. The fort's doorway faces Saudi Arabia, its curving wall Jordan and Israel. The peaks of Egypt's Sinai Peninsula and the coral reefs of the gulf complete the panorama.

COME BY BOAT

Many tourists arrive by launch from mainland Egypt little more than a stone's throw away. Others come by passenger ferry from Jordan. Still others, like Jordan's King Hussein and Queen Noor, pass by in private yachts.

Visitors from Jordan and Israel, still technically at war with each other, scamper side by side up, down and around walls and mazes that cover Pharaon Island.

Until September 1988, the fort's future was uncertain because of a protracted struggle between Egypt and Israel over Taba, 100 hectares of Israeli-held beachfront six kilometres to the north that had been seized by the Israelis in the 1967 war.

International arbitrators, however, have given Taba back to Egypt and now Saladin's Citadel holds a large share of the area's tourist market.

At night, its lighted walls can be seen against the backdrop of the Sinai's seemingly endless starry sky.

It's a peaceful setting now, but in the late 12th century it wasn't so.

BATTLED KNIGHTS

Saladin spent his adult life fighting. He fought Islamic holy wars against the Crusades' most famous knights, and he fought local skirmishes with rival Muslim groups throughout the Middle East.

Saladin became sultan of Egypt, Syria, Yemen and Palestine, founding the Ayyubid dynasty in 1171.

Known not only for his battle prowess but also his statesmanship and courtliness, he was driven by the idea of jihad — Islamic holy war. In 1187 Saladin captured Jerusalem — which had been in Frankish hands for 88 years — for the Muslims.

"War was everywhere," said Fahmy Abdul-Alim, a leading Egyptian archeologist.

"Many battles happened here.

This fortress is of major historical interest because it was the gateway to Egypt, strategic for Saladin.

"He built many fortresses in Egypt, but this one is especially important. It helped to prevent the enemy from cutting the caravan and supply routes east and west, which enabled pilgrims to continue making the hajj to Mecca."

The hajj is the pilgrimage Muslims make to Mecca, the prophet Mohammed's birthplace.

FORT WAS USED

Though much smaller, the fort's architecture bears some resemblance to Saladin's masterpiece, Old Cairo's hillside Citadel. The Pharaon Island installation was an active fort until early this century.

A front tower holds the remains of a roost for carrier pigeons used by Saladin for communicating with Cairo and Damascus.

"The fortress has storerooms for food and a water system that would have allowed the soldiers to survive for months at a time until reinforcements arrived," Abdul-Alim said. "You even have a mosque for their religious needs."

During excavations last winter, Egyptian archeologists uncovered a weapons-making area, the first such furnace at a citadel in Egypt.

"You have to remember how isolated this fortress would have been," Abdul-Alim said. "The soldiers naturally would have been required to repair their weapons on the spot, make new ones if necessary."

SENIORS' FARES

Air Canada's flat-rate fares for seniors this autumn are more restrictive than they were last year. On the other hand, more people can take advantage of them because the eligibility age has been lowered to 62 from 65.

The Freedom Flyer fares are good for travel on Air Canada routes throughout North America. But whereas last year a flat price bought a series of return tickets to different destinations, this year all destinations must be visited during a single trip.

The fares, good for travel until Dec. 12, are \$599 for one trip with up to four destinations, \$699 for one trip with between five and eight stopovers, and \$799 for one trip with nine to 12 destinations.

A companion of any age may accompany the senior passenger at the same fare, provided the two travel together on all portions of the trip.

The airline has also reduced the eligibility age to 62 on all its other fares for seniors.

ON ELDERHOSTEL

Would-be students aged 60 and up should note that a new guide to Elderhostel programs has just hit the bookstores.

Elderhostel is a non-profit organization that enables seniors to study anything from marine life to photography at some 1,200 colleges and universities worldwide. The sole prerequisite is that participants be at least 60, or, as the companion of a participant, over 50.

Elderhostels: The Students Choice (\$16.95, published by John Muir-Raincoast), evaluates 100 of the most popular Elderhostel programs on the basis of instructors, environment, housing, food and courses.

The guide was compiled by Mildred Hyman with the help of 61 contributors who provided their "personal, unscientific" views on each program.

Soldiers are tourists in Beijing, China's capital

BEIJING (CP-Reuters) — The Chinese capital is taking on an air of normality by day — except for Tiananmen Square and guards at major junctions.

But at night Beijing is heavily patrolled with many roadblocks.

Shopping streets, parks and other popular places are gradually filling up but have not regained their normal bustling intensity.

Since the army attacked demonstrators in Tiananmen Square on June 3-4, the number of foreign tourists in the Chinese capital has dropped 82 per cent.

Meanwhile, the estimated 200,000 troops from all parts of China, who have been based in and around Beijing since martial law was declared on May 20, are turning into tourists.

The green-clad soldiers descend upon many of the city's "Sixteen Scenic Spots" — famed throughout China but visited by only a small proportion of the country's 1.1 billion people.

PHOTOS TAKEN

Each morning several thousand soldiers march from a souvenir photo session on Tiananmen Square — still closed to the general public — to the Forbidden City, the walled and moated former imperial palace.

Group by group they are led by officers carrying numbered placards, just like the groups of Japanese visitors on package tours who until recently were a common sight.

Unlike the Japanese, however,

the plan to follow the leader and see the sights in an orderly fashion is not adhered to by the soldiers. Once through the main entrance the troops break ranks, snapping photographs of their fellows and buying souvenir postcards, beer and snacks.

When the noon scheduled departure time was up recently, half the military visitors were still astray in the palace and the public address system had to be used to recall stragglers.

SHOPS STOCKED

The China Daily newspaper, looking on the bright side, sees benefits for Beijing in the present situation. It says shopping and travel are much easier because normally overcrowded trains are sometimes only half full and shops are better stocked.

Bookshops in Wangfujing Street, one of the city's renowned shopping areas, are still doing a brisk trade in fashion magazines, such as Harpers Bazaar, Vogue and Elle, which have somehow escaped a ban on sales of foreign newspapers and magazines.

Also on sale are biographies of Hu Yaobang, the former Communist party leader whose death on April 15 sparked the wave of anti-government protests.

But many other products on sale are beyond the reach of the soldier-tourists who are paid the equivalent of about \$12 Cdn a month.

The furs, Swiss watches and gold pens in the shops await the return of foreign visitors.

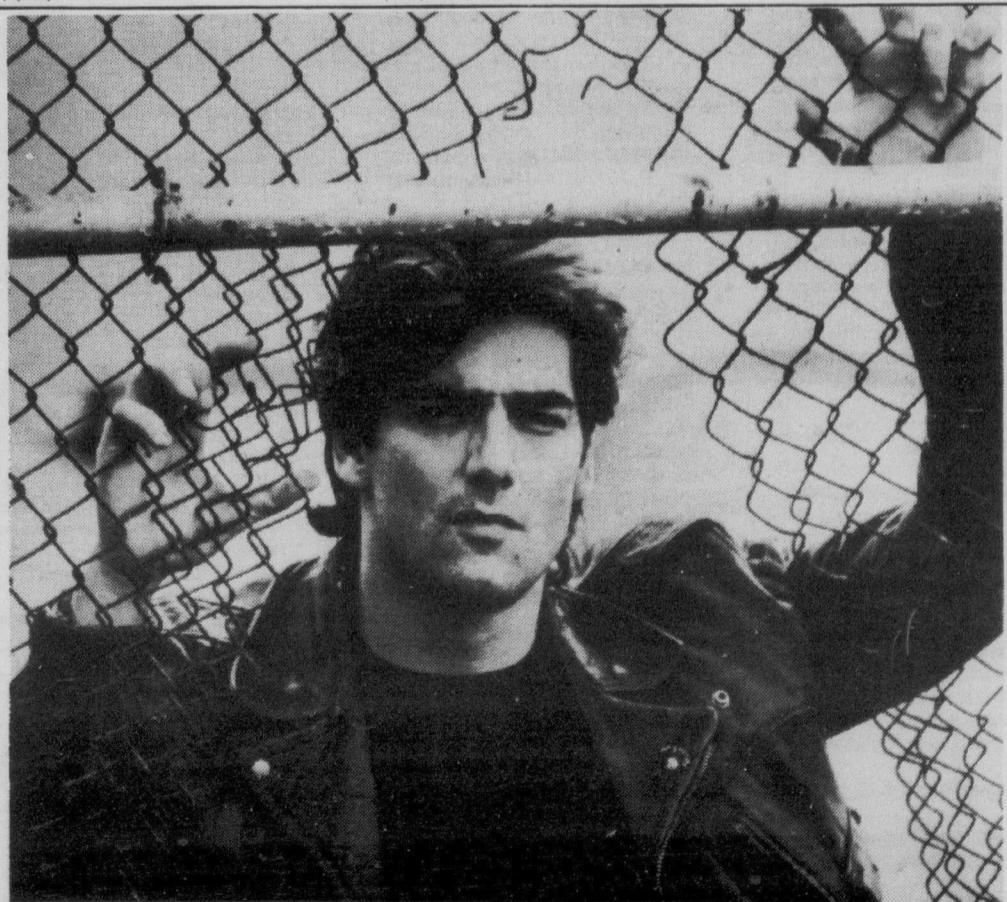

"When Cerrico was introduced, you can see that there was some kind of power struggle going on. The writers didn't want to make him a traditional kind of character. They wanted to make something interesting. So he's written as a well-rounded human being who loves opera. You'll get to see several sides of him, and that makes for some real powerful stuff."

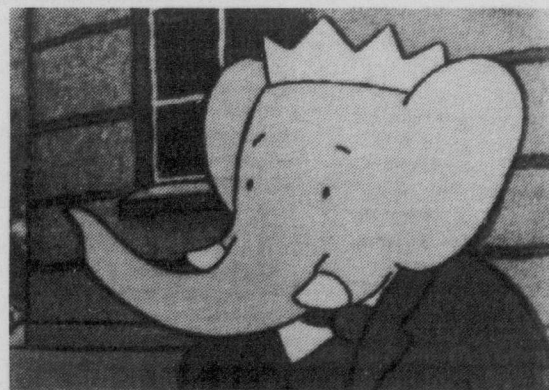
Born in Astoria, N.Y., Davi began his career as an opera singer. After studying in Florence, Italy, he returned to New York and made his debut at 19 with the Lyric Opera Company of Long Island. His motion-picture credits include "Raw Deal," "Wild Thing," "Action Jackson," "The Goonies," "Die Hard" and "Licence to Kill." Davi also received critical acclaim for several TV roles including the psychotic vice-squad cop on "Hill Street Blues," a PLO leader in the TV movie "Terrorist on Trial: The U.S. vs. Salim Ajami" and now "Wiseguy." The actor also has just completed filming "Deceptions," a feature film co-starring Harry Hamlin. This is Davi's first starring role as a "good guy," in this case an undercover detective.

"This arc in 'Wiseguy' should be good," says Davi. "One reason why I thought about doing the series, besides the quality, is 20-30 million people a night will see us, and it would just help cement further in their minds who I am. With the magic of movies and television, you can do anything."

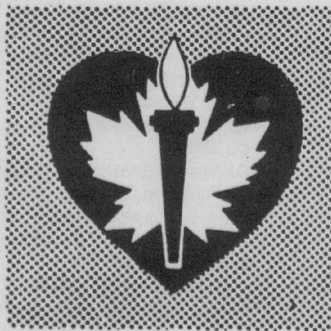

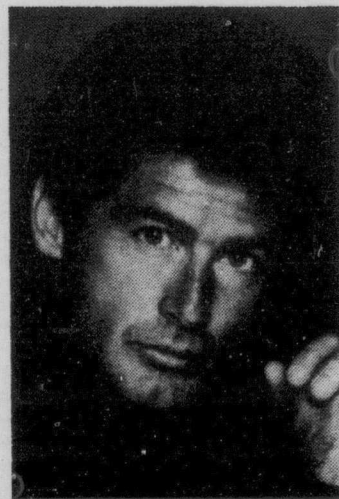

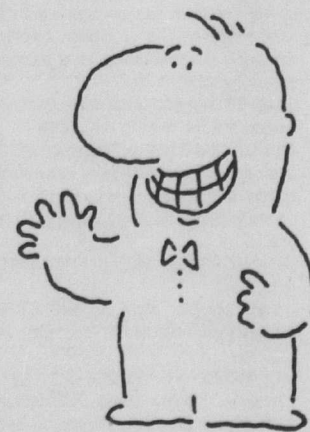

Many movies promise glamour and wit, tears and laughter. But few deliver it like George Cukor's "The Women" (1939).

The all-female cast is a gaggle of MGM's biggest stars. Norma Shearer stars as Mary, a rich society wife who is completely unaware that all of New York is talking about her husband's affair with a shoppirl, Crystal Allen (played by Joan Crawford). Mary's "friend," played by Rosalind Russell, hears the rumor and, caring little for the parties involved, spreads it further and tries to instigate a confrontation between the two women. When the confrontation occurs, tongues lash, and claws are bared. Mary warns Crystal that she will not give up without a fight. Besides, Stephen is a man of quiet refinement and doesn't take to the flashiness of a shoppirl's wardrobe. To this Crystal replies, "When Stephen doesn't like what I'm wearing, I take it off."

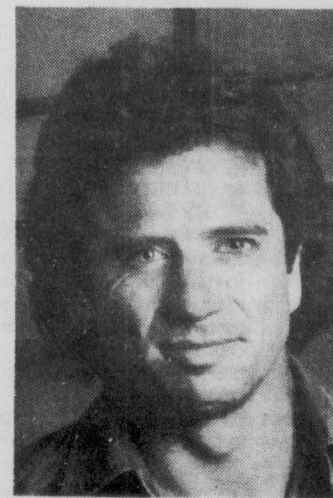
The film is filled with catty, gossipy barbs — skillfully aimed and executed. From the opening titles that portray the characters as animals (the delicate deer, the dangerous tigress, the wise owl, the portly cow) to the party scene on the train to Reno where the women celebrate their impending divorces, the film is truly hilarious.

"The Women" also manages to deal with the serious issues of the feelings of children amid a divorce, the growing self-sufficiency of women and problems of infidelity.

An interesting highlight is a color fashion-show sequence with gowns by Adrian. It's a camp delight.

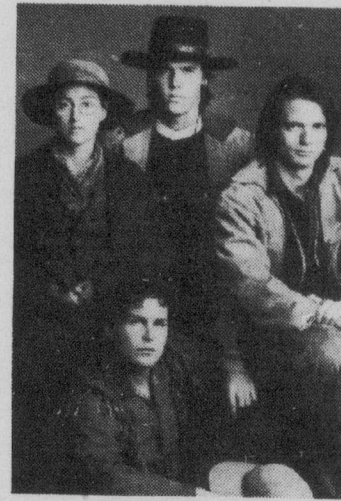

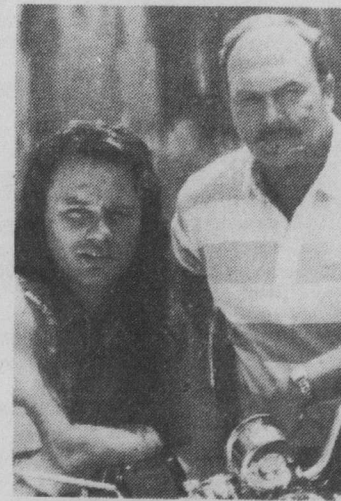

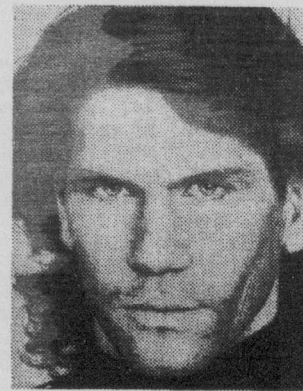
