The Pooh deserves a place among immortal poets

I see in the news they've unveiled a statue in the London Zoo dedicated to Winnie-the-Pooh. Well, actually to the little bear from Winnipeg dropped off there by Lieut. Harry Coburn in 1914 who lent his name to Christopher Robin's teddy and inspired his father to immortalize them both.

I'm all in favor of erecting statues to poets rather than more damn generals. But I do

think they could have found space in the south transept of Westminster Abbey along with Milton, Spenser, Drayton, Southey and the rest. Who among us remembers anything by those stuffy old foofs? And who can forget Pooh's

deathless hum about winter? You know the one; "The more it snows (tiddely-pom) The more it goes (tiddedly-pom) on snowing."

It would need to be a dim little corner, of course, because Pooh was a bear of endearing modesty and never called himself a poet at all. "I am a Bear of very Little Brain," he used to say, "And Long Words Bother Me." And he readily confessed

a failing many suffer, but only a few admit — wobbly spelling! "My spelling is wobbly," he once explained. "It's a good spelling but it wobbles, and letters get in the wrong place." Exactly!

But, despite his modesty, Pooh was a profound religious thinker as was ably pointed out in *The Tao of Pooh*. And what other poet has been translated into Latin the past 2,000

years? Winnie *deserves* a place in Poets' Corner among the immortals.

And if I had the choice of an inscription for that statue, I might pick his *Anxious Pooh Song* which goes;

"3 cheers for Pooh!
(for who? for Pooh)
(Why? What did he do?)
I though you knew;
He saved a friend from a wetting."

Why do they use background music?

Q. Why do they play that background music during movies and shows? It is so loud it drowns out the actors' voices and is very annoying. As much as we would like to watch some movies and shows, we have to turn it off. I see no point to the music at all. — W.F., Cumberland, Ohio

A. Music has always been part of the Hollywood tradition from the earliest days. Admittedly, sometimes it's too loud, but you'd miss it if it weren't there.

Q. A friend told me he had read in a magazine that Isabel Sanford, who played Louise on "The Jeffersons," is the mother of Howard Rollins, who played Det. Virgil Tibbs on "In the Heat of the Night." Is this true or false? — D.G., Lockport, N.Y.

A. False.

Q. Sometime in the mid-'50s I watched a movie where a frontier family floated down a river on a raft to escape hostile Indians. I think Robert Mitchum was in the lead role, and I also think the movie was "River of No Return." How close am I? — R.C.B., Wilson, Okla.

A. Very close. "River of No Return" also starred Marilyn Monroe.

Q. I am wondering about a man I have seen in many movies that have been made. This fine actor I refer to is none other than Jack Elam. Has he ever received an Oscar? If

not, why not? — G.H.S., Miami, Ariz.

A. Jack Elam always plays Jack Elam very well. He's never had a chance to play an Oscar-winning role.

Q. I would like to know if J. Eddie Peck, who plays on "The Young and the Restless," is any relation to Gregory Peck. — W.T., Chance, Md.

A. No, he's not.

Q. I'm used to Sherlock Holmes mouthing his words while his voice trails off into nothingness. But I find it disturbing that many other actors are guilty of the same thing, which greatly detracts from what otherwise might be a fine story. Don't they teach them anything about speech delivery? — F.M.R., Pottstown, Pa.

A. Jeremy Brett, who plays Sherlock Holmes, is a stage-trained actor, and is trained to reach the back row with his voice. Most of the other actors on that series also come from the theater.

Q. Why was "Boy Meets World"

taken off the air? — M.P., Tinley Park, Ill.

A. It was briefly taken off early this year so that ABC could run some episodes of their other series. It will return this fall on Fridays.

Q. My primary question concerns "Columbo," starring Peter Falk. I cannot recall ever seeing an African-American on the show. What gives? Am I paranoid and imagining things, or is this a realistic point of view? — P., Fort Rucker, Ala.

A. I wouldn't read anything sinister into this. There have often been African-Americans as cops on the show.

Q. Back in the '40s, there was a popular deadpan female vocalist in movies whose only movements were her lips. Can you tell me her name? — R.L., Green Valley, Ariz.

A. That was Virginia O'Brien, who died in '74.

Q. I watched "The Towering Inferno" for the first time the other night and would like to know: Is one of the security officers in the movie O.J. Simpson? — J.E.K., Pottsville, Texas

A. Yes.

Q. I would like to know why they took "The Price Is Right" off the air. That was one of my favorite shows. Why don't they take off the stupid talk shows and have some musical or family shows? — L.H., West Lafayette, Ohio

A. They took it off the air because talk shows have higher ratings and are less expensive to produce.

Q. Do you remember a movie called "Little Lord Fauntleroy"? If so, what year was it made and who were the main actors? I remember it as a very impressive movie. Is it out on video? — D.E.Y., Lancaster, Ohio

A. "Little Lord Fauntleroy" was produced in '36. It starred Freddie Bartholomew, C. Aubrey Smith and Guy Kibbee. And, yes, it's out on video.

Q. My sister and I have a disagreement. My sister says that Ish Kabibble was with the Spike Jones group, and I maintain he was part of the Kay Kyser Orchestra. Would you please help settle this dispute? — J.P.S., Nashua, N.H.

A. Mr. Kabibble was with the Kay Kyser group.

Q. We have been watching "Winds of War." Whatever happened to Polly Bergen, who played Captain Henry's wife in that series? — E.M.R., St. Petersburg, Fla.

A. Nothing happened to her. She's still acting and still beautiful.

Q. I have a real problem. My mother told me, years ago, that I was named for Shirley Temple. However, I just saw an article which said that Shirley Temple was born the same year as me (1928). Therefore, it would have been impossible for me to be named after her. My mom is deceased so I can't ask her. — S.K., Mission Viejo, Calif.

A. That's the right year for Shirley's birth — 1928 — so your mother probably anticipated Shirley's stardom, or else, more likely, just liked the name Shirley and, later, came to believe that she had named you after her.

Q. Whatever happened to Major Bowes of the "Major Bowes Amateur Hour"? I understand he was ex-

ecuted as a German spy because every time he said those famous words, "Round and round she goes and where she stops, nobody knows," that was a secret code. Am I correct? I say he was. — D.B., Collegedale, Tenn.

A. The secret code says, "No, malarkey." Major Edward Bowes died in 1946, at 71, of natural causes.

Q. My mother and I have been arguing about this for some time. On the show "Home Improvement," Wilson's mouth is never shown. Is it because of a scar or defect, or is it just a trademark of his. — L.C., Pottsville, Ark.

A. It is just a gimmick on this show, to not show his face. No scar, no defect, just a gimmick.

Q. I am a big fan of Jay Leno, and think he gets better all the time. My question is: Whatever happened to the one who was going to kick his butt in the ratings, namely Mr. Arsenio Hall? He seems to have disappeared into oblivion. — K.B., Warsaw, Ind.

A. He gave it the old college try, but Hall's ratings were never high enough to worry Leno or his butt.

Q. Regarding the show called "True Blue" with Grant Show: What happened to it and will there ever be re-runs? — R.S.J., Tyngsboro, Mass.

A. "True Blue" was dropped because the ratings were poor. There weren't enough episodes made to make up a package for re-runs.

Q. A question about an old favorite of mine — Betty Grable. When did she die, how old was she, and what was the cause of her death? — S.S., Cumberland, Md.

A. Ms. Grable was 56 when she succumbed to lung cancer in 1973.

Q. On "Dr. Quinn, Medicine Woman," there is a recurring character who is a Native American. I would like to know who plays Cloud Dancing and what nation he is from — Cheyenne or Sioux. — P.L., Kalamazoo, Mich.

A. Cloud Dancing is played by an actor named Larry Sellers, who lists his background as Osage/Cherokee/Lakota.

Video gets kids away from television

Things to Do on a Rainy Day

Into the sunniest summer a little rain must fall. For those days, especially when you are smack out of fun ideas for your kids, you might consider checking out this video.

Divided into "Cooking Fun," "Creative Crafts" and "Tricks and Secrets," each segment of the video is color coded so kids can watch the section of their choice. It's certainly a diverse lot: In the cooking section, for example, kids learn to make ice cream, while "Tricks and Secrets" reveals how secret messages can be decoded. Some of our favorite ideas: making a "living mural" (you decorate it and then poke your head through); making a snack called "ants on a log" (don't worry — it's mostly celery); and having an indoor picnic.

The only strange choice was that of Roger Rose as host. While we are promised (in a press release) that kids will be sure to recognize him from the movie "Ski Patrol" and VH-1, he is best known for a nighttime talk show on CNBC — not exactly kid territory.

On the plus side, adult supervision is strongly stressed, and it may come as a relief that sets are simple and homey — no fancy special effects here. Max G., 7, explained, "They have a lot of activities. If you use your imagi-

nation, you can do them." He especially liked when they made the icicle pops, and said he would use the words "interesting, fun and different" to describe the video. He said they even tried the time capsule activity in school.

Even if parents are looking to get their kids away from videos when they're stuck inside, this one might do just that.

Ratings Scale: 1-10 (10 is the highest)
Appropriateness: 7 — Best for kids 6 to 10 who are motivated to try the activities.

Humor: 6 — The video has a cheery, upbeat feel.

Visuals: 7 — Clear, simple and effective, nothing fancy.

Social Value: 7 — A thoughtfully produced antidote to the bad-weather blues.

Believability: 7 — It's always hard to know which activities kids will respond to, but...

Fun Factor: 7 — Max said it was a winner, and the video does include a nice mix of activities.

Eyewitness
Dorling Kindersley, \$12.95

The innovative publisher Dorling Kindersley is known for a unique look in its books, catalogs, and now, videos. By placing images against a stark white background, attention is focused dramatically on the featured object.

This technique is used to good advantage in the "Eyewitness" series of videos, which also aired recently on PBS. Narrated by actor Martin Sheen, each video focuses on a group of animals, such as cats, dogs, sharks and amphibians; dinosaurs and the skeleton are also included.

The videos generally use high-tech imagery to make the viewer feel he/she is "inside" the picture; natural footage of the animal, in its own environment, is also shown, as are computer graphics, animation and anecdotes.

While the high-tech design can sometimes feel a little cold and anti-septic, many kids seem to like the format.

Chris, 9, watched "Amphibian," and he commented, "It teaches kids about

reptiles and it's educational." He did say it should be "funnier," and we wholeheartedly agree that if there's a drawback, it's that the videos feel so high-tech that we, the audience, sometimes feel too distanced.

However, the videos represent a unique way to focus on a subject. Chris did say the video was "exciting."

Ratings Scale: 1-10 (10 is the highest)
Appropriateness: 7 — Choose a subject of interest and try it with kids 6 and up (adults as well).

Humor: 4 — More is needed to add a "warmer" feel.

Visuals: 9 — Distinctive and striking, they may not be to everyone's taste, but they are unlike any other documentary-style footage you're likely to see.

Social Value: 7 — A well-executed series for anyone interested in watch-

ing an in-depth take on a subject.

Believability: 8 — It's a documentary taken to a new level.

Fun Factor: 7 — Kids may have mixed feelings, but it's worth a shot: try watching as a family.

Rodney Crowell visits Shannon on *TNN Video Session*

Cowboy poets a nice feature of Calgary Stampede

Something out of the ordinary was featured at the Calgary Stampede recently which served as an excellent compliment to the country music shows.

Cowboy poet Don Wudel, and friends dressed in blue jeans, recited their poetry for lunch-hour crowds in a downtown mall during the Calgary Stampede.

Their homespun recitals are a long way from an high school English class or the tales of hard-riding gunfighters in novels and Hollywood movies.

They tell the simple stories of real western life.

"It's not deep so you have to chew on it for days and days trying to figure it out," said Wudel. "It's just a story that happens to rhyme and be metred — which helps us remember it. It records an event, a situation, a thought — both humorous and serious."

Wudel's poems have titles like "The Shower" and "Misery". They recall childhood memories of washing up in ice-cold water on a winter morning or the heartfelt pain of a losing a friend, summed up in the phrase "Old Charlie's boots are empty."

He has about 80 of them in his head and recites all from memory.

"I don't consider it an art form," said Wudel, 40, who wears a patch over his left eye from a farm accident. "Those of us who write and recite poetry, we don't get our self-worth from the poems or reciting them. We all have other things

in our lives."

Wudel, raised in Alberta, is a real cowboy. He has more than 250 head of cattle on a farm 80 kilometres southeast of Edmonton.

He doesn't drive a pickup truck when he herds cattle. He doesn't compete in rodeos.

The "romantized" Hollywood images of cowboy life are far from reality.

"It has nothing to do with being a working cowboy. You come out branding with me for two weeks in the spring, you'll see there's no romance."

Here is a sample of cowboy poetry heard on the streets of Calgary during the Stampede.

The Modern Cowboy
Oh, the modern Cremona cowboy

*A mere shadow of those past
His horse is grazing freely
While his tires wear out fast.*

Memphremagog rivals Sutton tour

Circuit takes art fans around the bend

NORTH HATLEY — Like most two-year-olds, the *Circuit des Arts* Memphremagog is now walking on its own feet, but it's still searching for its own identity.

Similar to the seven-year-old Tour des Arts around Mount Sutton, the Circuit also allows visitors to walk through studios of artists and artisans at work — and to decorate their homes and cottages in the process if they choose to purchase an item.

It is an art tour that allows one to understand the creative process of the artist and discover the secrets of the artisan's trade.

Unlike the Sutton Tour however, artists on the Circuit (running from July 29 to August 6) can exhibit with colleagues at art galleries and other venues instead of just at their own studios. So while most of the 40 studios on the Tour des Arts contain one artist per location, the Circuit des Arts features a whopping 110 artists in 54 venues around the Lake Memphremagog area.

Two of those artists are photographer Hubert Vallée, also president of the organizing committee, and floral art designer Michèle Racine, who share a home in North Hatley.

Vallée said the Circuit develops an interest in artists and a taste for the arts among the public. It is an event for the family, he stressed.

"The younger you make them aware of the arts the better it is," he said.

That is one of the reasons why Vallée would like to see more workshops for people to visit in the future.

"Talking to the artist in his environment is a lot more interesting," he said. "The art work will then have more meaning to visitors."

Vallée, who said he had 200 visitors last year, said the Circuit has already come a long way since its first year, when three people from Memphremagog MRC organized the event on a volunteer basis.

Now it is run by a six-member organizing committee and seven people in charge of choosing the artists to appear on the tour. They are aided by various sponsors as well, including the MRC (regional municipality), which donated about \$2000 of the Circuit's \$7500 budget.

Last year more than 4000 people visited the various Circuit locations. To attract even more visitors this year, organizers have planned a contest with prizes including two weekend getaways and a brunch at

Townships resorts. All one has to do to enter is fill out the coupon available at any of the 54 locations on the Circuit. The more venues you visit, the better your chances.

Thirty-five thousand flyers have been printed to spread the word. And to get province-wide publicity, the Circuit couldn't have found a better honorary spokesman than retired senator Claude Castonguay, who happens to be a Sunday painter.

"Somebody like him can influence other people not to be afraid to visit the artists," said Vallée.

Former chairman of the Laurentian Mutual Management Corporation and a provincial Liberal cabinet minister, Castonguay has created an added bonus for the artists on the tour. A committee will visit the venues on the Circuit and choose one piece to purchase which will then be part of the Laurentian's permanent collection.

Vallée said plans for the future might include having a contest to choose a new logo for the event, and promoting the event outside the province as a tourist attraction.

Hubert Vallée and Michèle Racine moved to North Hatley four years ago. The artsy couple's work is quite different, but both describe their creative process as similar to a painter's.

In reality, Vallée's works are close to paintings. He takes black-and-white photographs and hand-paints them. It is an art he began 10 years ago.

Most of his photos are taken in cities such as Montreal and Quebec City, which he descri-

bes as "drab". Vallée then gives them a personal rendition, adding depth and life with vivid colors.

"I'm changing reality and I'm doing it on purpose," said Vallée, sporting a shirt that is bright fuchsia, a color that seems straight out of one of his photopaintings.

Vallée doesn't put political messages in his work, just a desire to transform a dull world.

"I just want to make the world more colorful," he summed up.

Vallée has had a desire to add color to the world for as long as he can remember. He recalled one of his projects for his industrial design class at Université de Montréal 20 years ago was about adding more color to the world.

Graphic designer for a granite company in Beebe, he also produces cards with depictions of North Hatley on sale at selected shops in that area.

Also transforming material is Michèle Racine, who creates stunning works with dried flowers.

What makes her creations unusual is that she uses freeze-dried flowers. Then the creative Racine adds dried fruits such as strawberries, figs, star fruit and artichokes to liven up her bouquets.

"It looks real," Racine stated, and it sure does.

Racine places her creations in everything from handmade terra cotta pots she purchases to the baskets she makes herself. A great deal of time, money and materials go into her work, she said, which she has been doing for about six or seven years. Prior to that Racine

are."

The creative Racine once developed a wreath based on a poem. It was for North Hatley art gallery owner Jeannine Blais.

"When she came to pick it up, I read her the poem and she cried," recalled Racine.

This year, Racine decided to do something different with her work by creating a series of small works with only about three similar pieces each.

"There's too many people doing dried flowers," she explained, "so this way they can have something distinctive."

Racine hasn't exhibited her work in galleries or museums very much. The first time was last spring, when her work was shown at the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts as part of a fundraising exhibition.

Her exhibit, *Paysage, passage*, dealt with landscapes and the stages of life.

Now, as Racine exhibits her work to the public on the Circuit, she is ready for the next stage of her own life.

Racine is influenced greatly in her work by the changing seasons and colors. Her Christmas baskets and wreaths are as colorful and bountiful as the season itself.

Festival trumpeter has no place to hide his mistakes

STRATFORD, Ont. (CP) — James Ford steps briskly with a polished trumpet in his hand and clear musical memories in his heart.

He's 75, but you'd never know it to look at him.

In fact, you might not even recognize this man, who's been a Stratford Festival fixture for 20 years. Ford leads Fanfare, the five-member band that performs before each show and at intermission at the Festival Theatre.

Composer Louis Applebaum established the music department at Stratford in 1955.

He wrote three 30-second bursts of sound, calling them fanfares. They are performed on the terrace, in the lobby and corridor at aisle eight. This last blast signals five minutes till curtain.

"Applebaum thought it would be better, you know, than sounding a bell to let people know they should get to their seats," Ford said.

JOINED IN '56

Ford joined the festival in 1956, the last year performances were held in the outdoor tent. He stayed for six years, but left to start a band camp in Beaverton, north of Toronto.

He ran the Canadian Bandmasters Association camp for almost two decades before a production of *The Mikado* lured him back to Stratford in 1982.

He leads Fanfare and performs in shows where needed — this year he trumpets in the middle of a mob scene in *Merry*

Wives Of Windsor and in an old-time band in *The Country Wife*.

Last year, he played in just one, *The Pirates Of Penzance*. "I thought I'd take it easy because I was doing the musical. Six days of musicals a week, that's an awful lot of blowing."

Ford was just 10 when, at

his father's insistence, he joined the Stratford Boys Band in 1930. He joined the Royal Canadian Regiment Band during the Second World War and was principal trumpet during the first 10 years of Orchestra London.

He taught music at the University of Western Ontario for

two decades, beginning in 1955.

"He had really long hair and wore purple leisure suits and big puffy shirts," said Don Sweete, Fanfare's bass trumpet player, who studied under Ford at Western and at the Beaverton band camp. "He was really popular with the girls."

"He is an excellent teacher who is very excited by young players. He takes time for young people. He's the youngest old guy you'll ever meet."

Ford has conducted Ontario town bands in Watford and Exeter.

In winter, he plays with the Kincardine town band, Lighthouse, "one of those old big bands that still keeps going." In Goderich, where he lives, he works with a choral group.

"You kind of have to do everything when you're a freelance player," summed up Ford.

Composer Menken pressured to be a dentist

TORONTO (CP) — When Alan Menken, reigning prince of the Walt Disney kingdom of music, was a kid, he would sit at the piano making up tunes, entertaining the family for hours.

"I wrote songs from when I was about seven years old," he says. "I was a gifted kid, I guess. The family was proud of me."

But music was a hobby, they figured. You couldn't make a living at it.

Boy, were they wrong.

At 43, Menken's a six-time Oscar winner and the much-in-demand composer of some of the most elegant music on stage and screen today, including Disney's recently released *Pocahontas* and the Toronto-bound Broadway spectacular *Beauty and the Best*.

Menken, here recently to promote the gala opening of *B and B* at the Princess of Wales Theatre on Aug. 8, recalled the career conflicts that gave him a boyhood ulcer.

"I come from a long line of

dentists," he said. "All the men in my family were dentists. To be a dentist would be nice, the family said. A doctor would be nice. My mother even thought being a rabbi would be nice. The pressure was great."

As a result, "by age 12 I actually had a peptic ulcer."

But the family came around and now he's happy, wealthy and wisely selecting future Disney projects, including the classic *Hunchback of Notre Dame*, already in the works.

"Don't laugh," he says. "The-

re are a lot of laughs in *Hunchback* — we're going to have talking, singing gargoyles."

Whatever critics think of Disney's productions — some called the Indian maiden *Pocahontas* a well-tanned Barbie Doll — they praise Menken's enchanting musical scores.

It wasn't always so.

After college "I had 10 years or so of being a fairly talented guy knocking around New York."

It was then, while working on a rock ballet, that he met his wife Janis and eventually, at 30, scored his first major triumph as composer of the off-Broadway show *Little Shop of Horrors*.

But success brought a second career conflict.

"After *Little Shop* I had a little money, enough to buy a farm in Pennsylvania," where their daughters, now seven and 10, were born.

"It was a beautiful, idyllic existence there. But I also kept an apartment in Manhattan, and commuted.

"In the city all the people around me were sick. It was this new thing, AIDS. It was shocking, frightening, depressing."

About that time his partner

lyricist Howard Ashman called to say Disney wanted them to talk about an animated musical based on *The Little Mermaid* — Would he like to work on it?

"Would I!"

Mermaid was their first animated feature and is generally credited with launching the renaissance of the animated feature.

They were already at work on *Beauty and the Beast*, which was to be their greatest movie triumph, when they attended the 1990 Oscars — they won the best song Oscar for *Mermaid's* "Under the Sea" and Menken won for best original score.

Later Ashman told Menken he had AIDS. "I was devastated," he says.

Ashman died in 1991. And when *Beauty* became a Broadway project, Menken turned to lyricist Tim Rice and they added six new songs for the show's Broadway triumph, which will open preview performances in Toronto July 25.

The Single Guy's lovable doorman

Ernest Borgnine afloat in new TV comedy

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A palm reader laid it all out for navy gunner's mate Ernest Borgnine 50 years ago: Nothing but good things. A great future. Lots of money.

Relaxing in his sunny, spacious hilltop home, his *Marty* best-actor Oscar standing guard on a bookshelf, Borgnine seems a testament to the soothsayer.

He is a robust 78, still an actor in demand and preparing to start work on the new NBC comedy, *The Single Guy*, in which he plays a lovable door-

man who meddles in the life of star Jonathan Silverman.

NBC gave it a choice Thursday night spot between the hit comedies *Friends* and *Seinfeld*.

"I'm not carrying the show," Borgnine adds. "But believe me, my little five minutes in there will be fun, and that's what I want."

Tova, his wife of 22 years, is a cosmetics tycoon and he has the freedom and energy to jump into his 12-metre-long bus, dubbed the Sunbum, and flit around the country from RV park to RV park, stopping happily to sign autographs and accept hellos from surprised

truckers.

His indelible portrayal of the kind, lonely butcher in *Marty* and the likable navy captain in the TV series *McHale's Navy* overcame his early, villainous screen image.

That suits Borgnine, who revels in the real-life role of forthright, good-natured American.

"My mother told me if you can make one person in the world happy every day, you've accomplished a great deal," Borgnine says. "I figure through my work, if I make one person smile, that's what it's all about."

TV, specifically the 1962-66 comedy *McHale's Navy*, also brought the celebrity that Borgnine freely admits he relishes.

"I worked all my life to be recognized," he says. "This is what's so foolish about people in my profession. They make a little name for themselves and they hide behind dark glasses."

"So ridiculous. Show the people your face. That's what it's all about, that's what you're selling."

After an apprenticeship in the theatre in the late 1940s, a series of TV and movie parts

followed. His breakthrough role came in *Marty* in 1955.

The small, poignant story almost didn't get made, Borgnine says. Its producers, including Burt Lancaster, had intended the project as a tax write-off.

It was no great financial windfall for Borgnine. "I made *Marty* for \$5,000, with the promise of another \$5,000 if I signed a seven-year contract — which cost me a half-million dollars to get out of," he said with a laugh.

Christine Baranski: *Cybill's* sidekick shines

NEW YORK (AP) — Christine Baranski, who plays *Cybill's* witty tippler friend Maryann Thorpe, was happy to learn that come fall her CBS sitcom will follow the highly rated *60 Minutes*.

With such proximity, she muses: "I think they should let my character do the commentaries instead of Andy Rooney."

An idea worth considering.

But for now, you'll find Maryann only on *Cybill* on Mondays at 9:30 p.m. on CBS and CTV. One of CBS's few bright spots, it stars *Cybill* Shepherd as an over-40 actress struggling with a fading career, sagging body parts and a pair of ex-husbands.

Cybill's pal is Maryann. Last week, Baranski was nominated for a Best Supporting Actress Emmy award for her performance as the chic washout from the Betty Ford Clinic and recovering divorcee — not to mention a sly observer of life.

"So you met a guy who couldn't do it!" she consoled *Cybill* on the July 3 repeat of the series opener. "If I had a nickel for every time my ex-husband couldn't perform" — a delicious

pause while she surveys her surroundings — "well, actually, I do!"

Make no mistake, it's not Gatorade that Maryann is sucking from that quart-size squeeze bottle.

"But we don't glorify drinking," Baranski insists. "The stuff of fiction is people's foibles. What would Anna Karenina be without adultery? Did Tolstoy mean to say adultery is the way to go?"

"Maryann is fiction, and as fantasies go, she's a lot of fun."

That's in no small measure thanks to Baranski, a TV newcomer who was an instant sensation when *Cybill* premiered last January.

"The funny thing is, most of America had not heard of me," she says. "For people who had never seen me before, I was this rather flamboyant, exotic bird. I think being an unknown quantity worked in my favor."

She was anything but unknown to New York's theatre-going community, however. With credits ranging from Shakespeare to Neil Simon and she had distinguished herself both on- and off-Broadway, with two Tony

Awards and an Obie to prove it.

"I've always had an odd but sophisticated-looking face," she says. "At certain angles it can look quite glamorous, but from another angle it's a very funny face."

"I was never an ingenue,

let's put it that way."

Baranski lives in Connecticut with her husband, actor Matthew Cowles, and their two daughters, ages seven and 10.

"We don't have a TV," Baranski says. "When my older daughter was four, I found her

watching male strippers on Sally Jessy Raphael.

"Now they have a computer, they play in the woods, they read. They even play cards. Once I found them playing poker using Cheerios as chips."

Jacksons receive 11 nominations

NEW YORK (Reuter) — Michael Jackson made a rare public appearance on Tuesday at the announcement of the nominees for this year's MTV Video Music Awards, including 11 nominations for himself and his sister Janet Jackson.

Wearing his trademark military-style jacket with epaulets, he spoke for a few seconds and then quickly retreated. "I'm very honored and I'm very happy to have been nominated for so many awards," he said.

MTV announced that this year's awards show will be held Sept. 7 in New York at the art deco landmark Radio City

Music Hall. The show will include performances by Jackson and rock groups including R.E.M., the Red Hot Chili Peppers and Hootie & the Blowfish. MTV has not announced the host.

Award shows have become a kind of trophy in the rivalry between New York and Los Angeles to be recognized as the U.S. entertainment capital. MTV awards started in New York in 1984, were split between New York and Los Angeles in 1986 and were then broadcast exclusively from Los Angeles until last year.

Their more established counterpart, the Grammy awards, had alternated between Los Angeles and New York for three decades. But this year, the Grammy's spon-

sor, the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences, announced it was defecting to Los Angeles and staying in 1996 for a second year in a row.

MTV's nominees for best video of the year were Green Day for "Basket Case", Michael Jackson and Janet Jackson for "Scream", TLC for "Waterfalls" and Weezer for "Buddy Holly".

Michael Jackson was nominated along with his sister — a major act in her own right — in 11 categories, including best dance video, best R&B video, best direction in a video and best choreography. The Jacksons were also nominated for best special effects, best art direction, best editing, best cinematography, best breakthrough video and the viewer's choice award.

Excelerate a hopeful book on 'new economy'

Recent arrivals in bookstores are reviewed by Canadian Press writers:

Excelerate: Growing in the New Economy
By Nuala Beck (HarperCollins, \$28)

At last, a pep talk. Canadian Nuala Beck isn't simply one of these embrace-the-change, get-with-the-program economists who tells people to stop whining and start rowing a little harder in the boat — especially you there, in the back.

She's positively effervescent, practically floating from the bubbles, on the opportunities of the so-called "new economy" where more people than not can be winners.

Her second lucid book, rocketing up the bestseller list, is armed with statistical silver linings to tell us we are a country needlessly uncertain and unaware of its creepy-crawler-to-butterfly transformation.

Please, she says, recognize this.

She argues 60 per cent of the economy is already in this zone and that much of the rest of it can be rescued from further painful restructuring shortly if politicians tackle waste, special interests park their special self-interests and iffy corporations pull up their socks.

Beck's prescriptive book counsels personal skills-building (math, computers, teamwork, communication), fastidious career choices and blameless, agile management of change. Unlike the glut of depressing books for Generation X, her challenges to people in school, coming out of school and recently out of school brim with confidence — which is to say there are options galore for the clever-minded.

One gem of many: there are big bucks to be made shortly in bird-watching.

But where others might float a book indulgently packed with only blue skies, Beck is grounded in research. Time and again, she comes back to her charts (half the book is taken up with compiled data and assessments of jobs).

It all makes for a compelling, hopeful but not polyannish argument we can all get through this mess in one piece.

A Clear Conscience
By Frances Fyfield (Knopf, \$26)

Only a few mystery writers capture the gritty vagaries of the British justice system with the detail offered by this London criminal lawyer.

In her latest novel, Crown prosecutor Helen West and police officer Geoffrey Bailey continue to balance their sometimes strained relationship against the demanding rigors of their jobs.

West has been assigned to domestic violence hell. These cases leave her frustrated and, looking for satisfaction elsewhere, she turns to fixing up her flat. Along comes Cath Boyce to help her, but it is soon clear that Boyce could be one of the victims of her domestic abuse cases.

Bailey, meanwhile, is suspicious that the beating death of a popular boxer is not as cut-and-dried as it appears. As the truth about Boyce is slowly revealed to West, Bailey's investigation into the murder starts to lead to her doorstep.

Fyfield writes in a spare way: every scene has a point; every detail helps build character and suspense. Her novels may be a lot thinner than others on the mystery shelf, but provide a bigger wallop.

This one even throws in a bonus — a surprise ending, which is a rarity in mystery novels these days.

The Late Child
By Larry McMurtry (Simon and Schuster, \$33.50)

The famed author of *Lonesome Dove* assembles a bizarre cast of misfits for what is billed as a comic and haunting sequel to *The Desert Rose*.

The haunting part comes as Harmony, a former Las Vegas showgirl, struggles to cope with the death of her daughter from AIDS.

She sets out on an aimless pilgrimage back to her home in Oklahoma with her two sisters — one a certifiable sex addict — and her irritatingly precocious five-year-old son.

But they take a detour — and this, one suspects, is the comedic part — joining forces with a black hooker and her pimp, whose home is a New Jersey dumpster; a trio of East Indian taxi drivers from New York, and a stray pooch that survived a fall from the Empire State Building.

They embark in a beaten up school bus, riding the dog's celebrity to a visit to the White House to meet the president and an appearance on the Letterman show.

This ensemble occasionally strikes a funny chord and Harmony's struggle against being swallowed by grief is vaguely haunting. But, as a whole, McMurtry's 18th novel doesn't score many points as either comedy or tragedy.

Bright Messengers
By Gentry Lee (Bantam, \$29.95)

Lee, who co-wrote three books in the highly acclaimed *Rama* series with Arthur C. Clarke, continues it solo with a novel that's an excellent read, if somewhat repetitive in developing characters.

Lee backs his imagination with scientific credentials that include a stint with the U.S. space program and collaboration with astronomer Carl Sagan on the *Cosmos* TV series. So there's plenty to please sci-fi fans.

This book finds Earth in the midst of the Great Chaos — a global economic and social depression so deep the collapse of civilization seems imminent.

But a strange vision, composed of many bright white droplets, appears before a selected

few — different on each viewing.

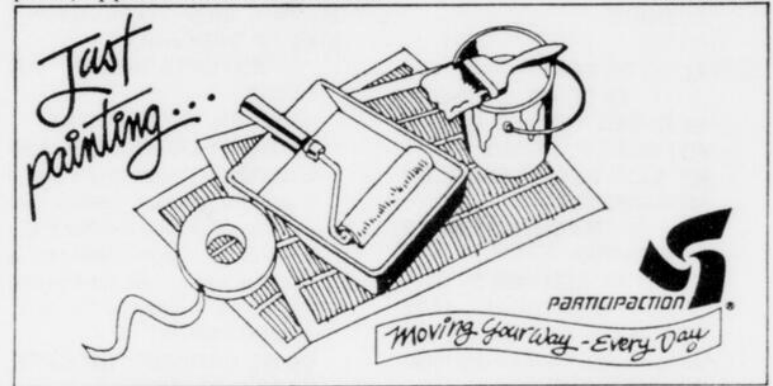
Johann Eberhardt, a German systems engineer, is convinced the vision has some rational explanation. But Sisters Beatrice and Vivien of the Order of St. Michael believe the droplets are angelic messengers from God.

The Rama society feels the visions are proof of contact with alien intelligence.

Whatever the truth, the principal characters are being invited — ordered? — onto a strange spaceship. Their trip deepens the mystery. What is the source of the vision? Are the humans being helped or studied?

Readers have to fork out for the sequel, *Double Full Moon Night*, to get the answers.
