Tracing the patchwork of the past

*Quilt exhibition
provides intimate
look at history*

Readers of The Record will want to take a trip to Colby-Curtis Museum in Stanstead where Winnie Buckland Channel's magnificent crazy quilt dating from 1886, is featured in 'A Celebration of Quilts', the museum's current exhibition featuring 15 quilts which runs until Nov. 27. The quilt was created from the year 1886-1887 when Buckland Channel was only 16-years-old.

After the death of her husband in 1907, Buckland Channel served as vice president and president of The Sherbrooke Record.

"She was quite a remarkable businesswoman - The Record flourished," said Monique Nadeau-Saumier, curator of Colby-Curtis. "She was really working in a man's world early on in this century."

In the Victoria era, quilting evolved from a practical, thrifty craft into an art that appealed to women of the upper classes featuring pieces of silk, velvet and brocade which could be purchased from stores. The Buckland Channel quilt probably makes use of stencils and iron-on embroidery transfers, popular at the time. Panels of the quilt are hand-painted and some of the embroidery is free-form.

The designs on the quilt hold special meaning for the quilter. "Each of the flowers has a special meaning which makes it very personal," explained Elsie Sullivan, vice president of the Stanstead Historical Society and the exhibit's curator. "The pansy symbolized

thought. There were always spider webs on these quilts. They stood for strength and stubbornness. Rosemary represented remembrance and the rose, beauty."

The quilt toured Ontario as part of an exhibit called 'Folk Art Treasures of Quebec from 1980 to 1981, coordinated by the Art Gallery of Ontario and the Ministry of Cultural Affairs of Quebec. It was seen in Toronto, Thunder Bay,

Laurentian University, Kingston, Guelph, Hamilton, and Windsor.

Leonard Channel Webster saw the quilt as it toured. He and his cousin Barbara Misner are pleased at the renewed interest in their grandmother. Barbara Misner has offered to donate

Festival Folkmass in Knowlton

The Island City Singers & Instrumentalists, an ensemble of 60 voices and instruments often heard in Montreal and the Townships in the 1960s and 1970s, will be coming to Knowlton from across Canada and the United States to perform their original Festival Folkmass in Knowlton United Church under their former director, Donald Patriquin, this coming Sunday, Sept. 24, at 11 a.m.

The Island City Singers & Instrumentalists began in 1960 and continued into the '80s. The choir, which developed out of the Bishop's University Alumni Singers, was made up of young Montreal men and women who enjoyed the musical and social aspects of the ensemble. Performed more than 50 times, the last performances of Festival Folkmass were held in England and Wales during a tour in 1973 which included concerts in the Church of St. Martin-in-the-Fields, Wormwood Scrubs prison, and the Llangollen Eisteddfod.

To celebrate the year 2000, and their 40th 'birthday', 60 alumni of the ensemble will meet 27 years after their last folkmass to present Festival Folkmass as a culmination of two days of singing together once again. The service will be celebrated by The Rev. Burn Purdon who some 30 years ago was one of the first clergy to recognize and promote the work of the Island City Singers in the Townships.

Canadian cooks shine in new cookbooks

Cookbooks make us feel good. We linger at cookbook counters, savour the recipes, dream over the pictures, digest the encouraging words of the writers, even plan imaginary dinner parties.

And we buy these books even if we instinctively realize they are unlikely to change our three squares and might end up next to our easy chair or bedside rather than in our kitchen. Booksellers are well aware that cookbooks sell as much to readers as to cooks.

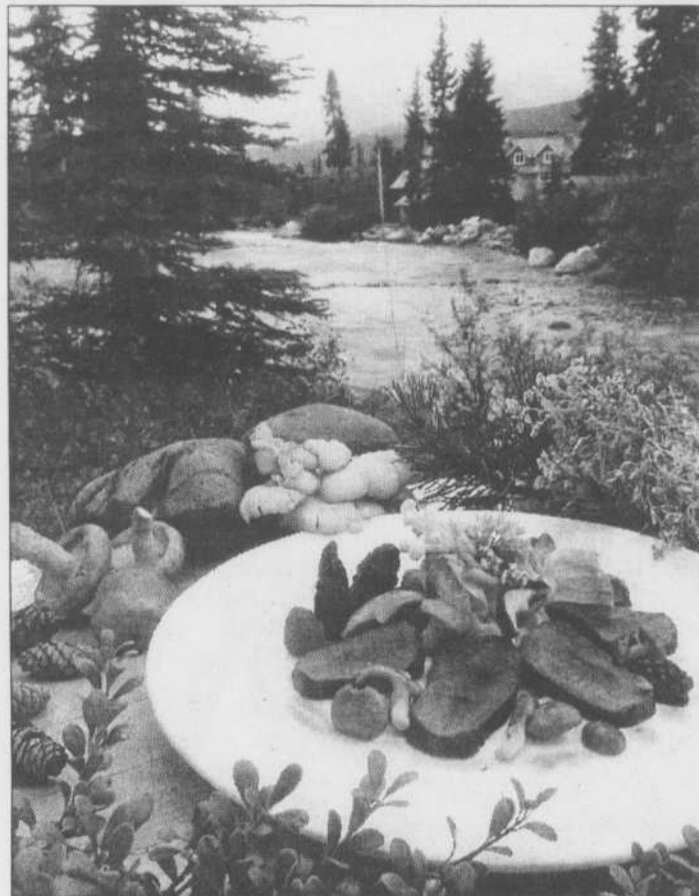
But whether for cooking or reading, these books are getting better all the time, Canadian cookbooks included. Recently, four excellent new books have appeared from experienced Canadian food writers.

The biggest and fanciest is an inspiration. Called *The Flavours of Canada*, by Ontario-based Canadian food enthusiast Anita Stewart (Raincoast, \$34.95), this glamorous-looking book will make you proud of what she identifies as our distinctive, regional cuisines.

And you'll probably want to call your travel agent and go see the beautiful places and exceptional food depicted by Toronto photographer Robert Wigginton.

Another good read is a five-decade recollection of Canadian home cooking by Diane Clement, a Vancouver cookbook author who is also a fitness pro and restaurateur. It's called *Zest for Life* (Raincoast Books, \$36.95) and readers are going to wish they were on her dinner-party list.

In paperback are *The Chef's Table*, by

three Toronto writers who have adapted restaurant food for the home cook - Lucy Waverman, James Chatto and Tony Aspler (Random House Canada, \$24.95) - and Pam Cooks, favourite recipes from the TV shows of Ottawa food writer and TV cook Pam Collacott (Creative Bound, \$17.95).

Anita Stewart's book is a tour de force. Long a fan of Quebec, Stewart wrote the first of her 13 cookbooks about Canada's best inns,

duck foie gras seared in the pan of Chateau Frontenac chef Jean Soulard. The recipes, interspersed with appreciative inserts about fancy food producers in every corner of Quebec, make this book a fine read.

Each part of Canada gets similar treatment.

Stewart, a small and intense person from Elora, Ont., has spent the past decade as the pied piper who preaches appreciation for this country's regional cuisines. This book is her latest effort and it deserves to be in every food-loving Canadian home.

Diane Clement has been writing useful, healthful cookbooks for more than 40 years. The

former Montrealer and one-time Olympic sprinter is a partner in a Vancouver bistro called The Tomato Cafe.

To Clement, food fads and fashions come and go, but the classics - whether haute cuisine or family favourites - are always in style. The writer takes her mother's macaroni and cheese as an example of the Saturday-night casserole that's even better today, given Clement's use of three different cheeses (Cheddar, Parmesan and chevre), plus some Dijon mustard and Hungarian paprika.

Clement's lively personality shines in little notes and anecdotes and she stays health-conscious with a finale on how to cook with health in mind. A good book, except for the lack of metric measures.

The Chef's Table stems from Toronto's annual fund-raiser for the hungry organized by Second Harvest and called Toronto Taste. More than 60 chefs participate, along the lines of Montreal's Taste of the Nation event. The three veteran authors have dipped into recipes served over 10 years, and Random House has donated any book profits to Second Harvest.

For the reader and cook, the small book is an easy-reading collection of lively, classy, innovative recipes from top Ontario chefs. The celebrated Susur Lee is represented by a tuna, avocado and potato dish. John Cordeaux, former Queen Elizabeth Hotel chef and now at the Royal York Hotel, is obviously relishing his new region with a smoked Manitoulin trout dish.

Pam Cooks, by an experienced food writer and cooking teacher, is equally modest in looks, but packs plenty of flavour in its well-designed pages, plus margins rich in tips and quick recipes.

The recipes read temptingly, and yet look easy to make. It's an international collection - Pam and husband Reed are inveterate travellers. There are dishes like a carrot and potato vichyssoise, freezer spaghetti sauce, turkey and pesto pizza, couscous with fruit, and lemon meringues, each recipe seeming to promise success. Why no metric measures (except for grocery packages) is puzzling in today's metric-friendly world. Many family cooks will buy and cook from this book.

First-class musicians kick off Bishop's Centennial Theatre season

On Saturday, Sept. 30, trumpet player Tiger Okoshi and the Jean Beaudet Trio kick off the season at Centennial Theatre. The show will feature Tiger's original tunes as well as jazz standards.

Jazz aficionados have learned to appreciate the precision and dynamism of Tiger Okoshi's playing. He was at Centennial last time with pianist Lorraine Desmarais. The same week, he had played for Archbishop Desmond Tutu's special convocation and had amazed everyone with his rendition of "When the Saints Go Marching in" by

Louis Armstrong. He even made Archbishop Tutu dance. His energy and warmth when communicating with the public worked wonders then and during the Desmarais show. His career, mostly in the States where he teaches, plays and records, doesn't stop him from associating with musicians from Quebec and presenting unique jazz evenings of standards and improv jazz.

It is the first time Jean Beaudet and his trio will make their first and surely not their last visit to Centennial. Jean Beaudet is considered "One of Canada's most important pianists, "exhilarat-

ing...percussive...there's' surely not a finer piano trio in the country." (The Globe and Mail). His last album demonstrates the multiple qualities of his playing: "very effective, often dense and intense, a dazzling example of his formidable imagination (The Toronto Star).

There will be a meet-the artist "apéro" at 7 p.m. in the art gallery next to the Centennial Theatre lobby with Tiger Okoshi who will be introduced by Bishop's music teacher and jazz guitarist Michael Gauthier. All are invited to come and ask questions.

Pierre Bruneau's 'Work in progress' at BU

The Bishop's University Art Gallery in collaboration with Centennial Theatre has invited artist Pierre Bruneau to prolong his adventure started in August 1999 with choreographers Sylvain Émard and Louise Bédard from "Te souvient-il?"

During a three-week residency, Pierre Bruneau created a site-specific phosphorescent installation working in conjunction with lighting engineer and designer, Marc Parent. This residency offered the artist an opportunity to expand on his exploration of the juxtaposition of light and darkness through his revelation of phosphorescent matter.

This exhibition kicks off the new 2000-2001 season for

the Bishop's University Art Gallery and marks the first artistic collaboration between Centennial Theatre and the Art Gallery. The main objective of such a step is to build a bridge between two disciplines: dance and the visual arts and their respective publics'. The goal of this project is to bring together people from different groups by bridging barriers, which too often separate both of these contemporary artistic disciplines.

Meet the artists talk - "Apéro-Danse" - in the Art Gallery on Oct. 17 2000, at 7 p.m., evening of the performance of "Te souvient-il?" at Centennial Theatre, with Pierre Bruneau, the choreographers Louise Bédard and Sylvain Émard as well as the lighting designer Marc Parent.

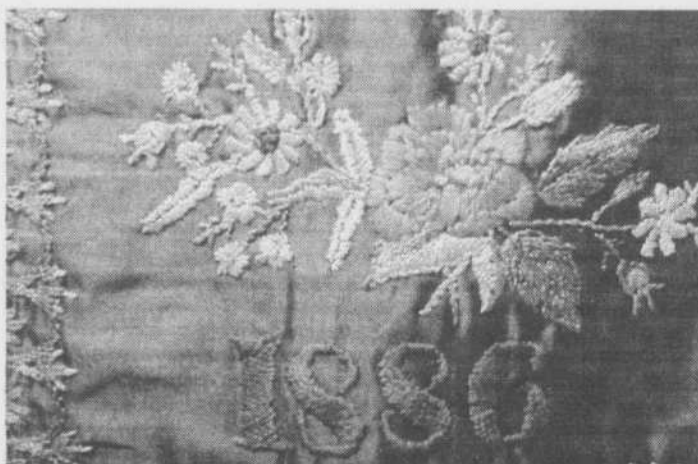
Winnie Buckland Channel's wedding dress to the museum and Leonard Channel Webster wishes to donate a memory book from the family.

The Tinker-Churchill Quilt is also featured in the show. It originated in Connecticut and was brought into Canada in 1809 by the Tinker family, one of the American families that crossed the Plymouth on the Mayflower. The quilt was acquired through marriage by the Churchill family.

The Whole Piece Quilt is also of interest. Spun from the wool of the sheep of the Mack family, it is also symbolic. A big heart in the centre bears the date of the wedding of the quilter. The stars in the corner symbolize fertility.

Upstairs, the complementary hand-quilted wall-hangings of John Willard of Burlington, Ontario (originally from New Brunswick) illustrates the quilting technique in a modern context. Subjects of the quilt include the Titanic and a colourful dancer.

Quilting the patchwork of human existence

*Musical drama
Quilters opens this
weekend at the
Haskell Opera House*

Quilters', a musical story of a mother and her six daughters, is a fitting finale for QNEK Productions' season highlighting women.

"The whole thrust of this year has been a celebration of women. Each show focused on the strength of women. 'Quilters' is the culmination of everything we've been focused towards," said Lynn Camp, artistic director and founder of QNEK productions.

'Quilters' by Molly Newton and Barbara Damashek chronicles Sarah McKendree Bonham and her daughters as they cross the American plains.

"It tells of how they chronicle their lives through quilts, along with their stories of other people and other families. It covers everything from childbirth to coming-of-age, teenagers, marriage, miscarriage, death and life," explained Camp.

"Everything you could possibly think of - it's in there."

"The show is formatted like a quilt with pieces of the characters' lives connected lyrically through the music. The whole show is a quilt of lives," said Camp.

For the first time, QNEK is working with a small orchestra, featuring The Record's Perry Beaton playing stand-up bass, André Geoffrey on guitar, Phil Desormeaux on banjo and Mark Viollette, as conductor and piano player.

"The music is very much period music of the mid-1800s - Americana," said Camp.

"These are very familiar tunes. When people hear these tunes although the words are different, they're going to say, 'I recognize that!'"

'Quilters' is an ensemble production. All the actresses are on stage for the entire show.

"Each year we do an apprenticeship show featuring as many young actresses as possible. All the young ladies in the production are part of the apprenticeship program except for Anita Morin, the music director, who plays one of the daughters," Camp said.

The cast of 15 and 16-year-olds playing the daughters includes: Kiowa Bryan, Kristin Camp, Sarah Comtois, Nicole Dagesse and Nicole Desjardins. Becky Canedy plays the role of the Sarah McKendree Bonham.

The ability for women to survive is the theme of 'Quilters'.

"This is really a story about the women and the strength of women -

not just physical strength, but the inner strength of women. Most women died by the age of 40. In those days they had so many children in succession - 12, 13, 14 kids and the body went into trauma, or people got sick. It's about the legacy of womanhood - it's quite a story too," Camp said.

The Pajaro Quilters Association in Boulder, California donated the Legacy Quilt used as the backdrop for the set and all the quilting squares for the show. Twelve quilts are on display at the Haskell Free Library on the border of Stanstead and Derby Line. These include: The Millennium Quilt, made up of 2,000 pieces (front and back) collect-

ed from quilters around the world, by Judy Hurd, Newport Centre 1999; the 9 Patch/Hourglass Quilt by May S. Churchill, 1999; the Neck Tie Quilt by Dorildu Patenaude/75 made out of her son-in-law's old neckties dating back to 1958, owned by Celeste Aiken, an antique Yo-Yo Quilt circa 1920, owned by Lynn Camp.

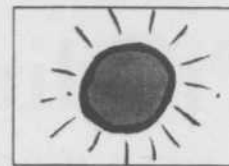

Reaching the skies with an outing at Mount Chapman

From the beginning of time, man has wanted to get closer to God, the sky and the stars. This is why he always built the temples on the highest mountain of the region. Our ancestors are no exception to the rule. As a matter of fact, in the last years of the 19th century, Reverend T.S. Chapman with his followers, built a small cabin or a small temple at the top of Bald Peak.

Bald Peak is the highest mountain (600 meters) of a small chain of mountains called Stoke Mountains. It is situated in the Stoke district approximately eight kilometers from Bishopton. It was named Bald Peak because the top of this mountain was flat and free of all vegetation. From this exceptional spot, we could admire part of the Eastern Townships: from East to West the Monts Ham and Orford and the Vermont mountains and from the North to South the Monts Wotton and Mont Mé-gantic.

Reverend Chapman was always interested by this mountain and during the last years of his life, with the help of his old horse called Dolly, he laid out a road leading to the top. Later he convinced a few of his friends to help him build a small house

which was called "the peak House." The 2,500 feet of wood required for the construction of this building was transported to the top of this mountain during the winter of 1895. Once completed, it measured 12 feet by 24 feet. It contained three rooms: two bedrooms, one at each end of the building, one for the men and the other for the women. The middle was the kitchen. The cottage was anchored to the rock by metal cables to prevent it from being blown away by the gusts of wind.

Outings and picnics were regularly organized and once the hunger was satisfied,

people would discuss the problems of the day. There were many important personalities who participated in these activities.

At the beginning of the century, when Reverend Chapman celebrated his 85th birthday, the people of the Township of Dudswell made a recommendation to the authorities asking that the name of the mountain be changed from Bald Peak to Mount Chapman. This was to perpetuate the name of a man who did so much for his region, a man who was known as "The Grand Old Man of Dudswell."

After the death of Reverend Chapman, the Peak House was torn down and Mount Chapman returned to the wildlife. About forty years ago, we could still find signs of this construction.

To commemorate these events, the 200th committee has organized an outing and a picnic at Mount Chapman on Saturday, Sept. 23. In case of rain it will be held on the next day. Please bring you lunch and a pair of binoculars.

To get to the top of Mount Chapman, the trail of "Sentiers de l'Estrie" (2.5 km) will be used. The price of this outing will be \$2 per adult and \$1 per child.

People are everywhere on those hot silver scooters, on city streets and suburban bike paths, in parking lots - and emergency rooms.

Kids of all ages who have been whizzing around all summer on those ubiquitous push scooters that are sold out everywhere are also ending up bruised, scratched and battered.

Dr. Ken Shaw, director of the surgical emergency room at the Montreal Children's Hospital, has personally treated three seriously injured scooter-accident victims in the past few weeks. One was a young man who broke his arm while attempting to execute a turn on his brother's scooter, another a child who lost her balance and broke her arm, and the third a youngster admitted with head injuries after a spill without a helmet.

And there are bound to be more - manufacturers are predicting sales of more than five million scooters across North America before the end of the year.

The Canada Safety Council has issued an advisory urging scooter users to wear helmets and protective gear, to avoid riding at night and to take the same precautions they do with skateboarding

and rollerblading.

"There is perhaps a view that these scooters look so easy to handle - like they were in the old days," said Raynald Marchand, manager of traffic safety and training for the national non-profit association dedicated to accident prevention.

However, Marchand warns that the latest scooters are designed with smaller wheels that are easily trapped in potholes, sidewalk cracks and grated sewer covers.

"It looks so friendly and it takes very little skill for a beginner to get on and get going. But if you have a spill and you're not wearing a helmet, chances are you'll be headed for the hospital."

In the United States, the Consumer Product Safety Commission in Washington, D.C., has reported more than 9,400 incidents involving scooters so far this

On roads and in emergency rooms.

year. More than 4,000 of them entailed visits to emergency rooms. Children age 15 and younger accounted for about 90 per cent of the accidents.

Most of the reported scooter injuries were scrapes and bruises, but a third involved broken or dislocated bones, mostly in the arms and hands.

The ultralight scooters with in-line wheels retail for \$100 to \$200 and they have been selling out fast in sport shops and department stores across the Montreal region since the fad first arrived via Europe and Asia last spring. They have been equally popular among 30-something urban professionals and 6- to 12-year-old teenyboppers.

Stephane Juillet of Sports Experts says the problem isn't with the scooters, but how they are being used, especially by kids. Take, for example, the "tail whip" - a tricky stunt in which the daredevil leans on the handlebars and executes a 360-

degree midair rotation of the platform.

"They were conceived for use in Tokyo and Hong Kong, to navigate crowded city streets quickly and easily," said Juillet, whose Fairview Centre store is currently sold out of all its Oxygen (\$139.99) and the foldable Firefly (\$199.99 with a backpack) models of scooters.

"These are perfectly safe for getting around. The trouble is that when youngsters latched on to them, they began doing jumps and spins and twirls and they're not made for that."

Juillet says the standard five- to six-inch-wide scooter platforms are too narrow to balance easily, unlike skateboards that measure up to 12 inches or more across. And scooters have just two wheels, unlike skateboards with four wheels, so they are less stable.

Scott Arkin, owner of Diz, a snowboard and skateboard shop on Westminster Ave. in Montreal West, says many of the scooters currently on the market, especially the portable ones weighing six pounds or less, are not sturdy enough for stunts. And the collapsible ones especially have a tendency to bend and break where the aluminum or plastic folding mechanism is welded into place, he said.

"I'd really rather be selling skateboards," he said. "With any luck, this will be a quick in-and-out kind of fad."

Artist celebrates the resurgence of the Tartan

Calgary artist Ted Godwin still remembers the woman with the tartan panties.

It was Feb. 26, 1968, and Godwin, then part of the famous Regina Five group of abstract painters, was introducing his new style of plaid painting in an exhibition entitled Tartan Follies in the Saskatchewan capital.

The people of Regina were well into what Godwin calls "the winter crazies" and they showed up at the opening in various tartan-related apparel.

"One young woman wandered around the party at our house, flashing everyone to reveal tartan panties," Godwin recalls in an article he wrote for a catalogue accompanying his latest exhibition of those devilish tartans.

Ted Godwin: The Tartan Years 1967-76 has just opened at the Carleton University Art Gallery as part of a cross-Canada tour organized by the Nickle Arts Museum of Calgary.

Unlike many of the art fads of that period, Godwin's bold, brassy tartans do not seem glaringly dated. But they are far more joyous than most of the far more gloomy contemporary abstracts in favour these days.

The exhibition includes 25 works that use a tartan-like grid pattern as both medium and message for what the artist calls the "warp and woof of life."

Actually, Godwin thinks of his paintings as "serial colour interweaves," but he realizes tartan is a far catchier label.

Think of the tartans as art that uses grid patterns rather than the blobs, drips and swirls normally associated with abstract art. Take The Orange Popsicle Tartan, 1970. It's done in blue and

orange. The blue evokes the coolness of the popsicle; the orange the sharp taste.

Ann Davis, the curator of the show, describes the paintings this way: "I see Godwin's overriding concern in the Tartans as being a search for order without a loss of spontaneity."

The description is perfect, especially for those who know that Godwin started painting the tartans by accident in 1967 and then spent the next decade refining the process, seeking the perfect plaid, referencing several genres of modern art, from abstract expressionism to pop.

Back in 1967, Godwin was experimenting with different materials, trying to determine why overlapping layers of paint disappeared sometimes, but not all the time. At one point he produced a grid of red and green and was mesmerized.

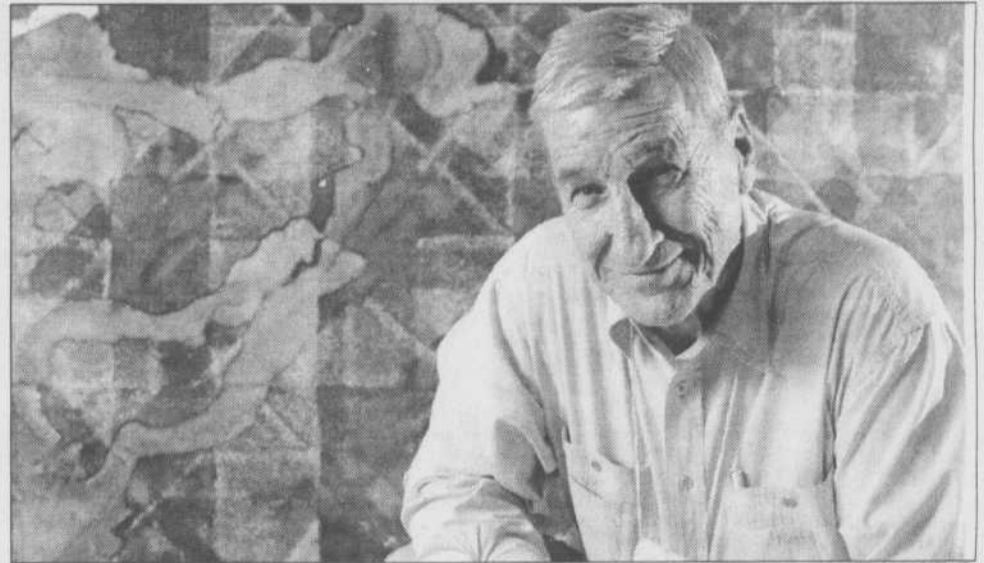
"I wasn't sure whether I had a painting or an interesting colour test."

He decided it was a painting and he quickly became obsessed with his "serial colour interweaves."

Godwin, somewhat like tartans, moves in and out of fashion. His tartans, just like plaid clothes, are back in fashion and have been garnering mostly positive reviews.

Mary-Beth Laviolette, reviewing the show for the Calgary Herald last fall, said the tartans are rooted in the ideas and esthetic practices of the '50s and '60s but also "speed beyond them into the next century" by making us think of more contemporary readings, such as bar codes and digitized images.

Godwin was a charter member of the Regina Five in the '50s, when he was still in his 20s and part of what is considered to be the most exciting art movement ever found on the Prairies.

In 1961, the group had a landmark show at the National Gallery of Canada. It was a rare event, indeed, for an artist who was young, from Saskatchewan and alive to be exhibited at the gallery.

"I was a national hero when I was 28 and forgotten when I was 30," Godwin said during a recent talk at Carleton with Ottawa artist Ken Lochhead, another member of the Regina Five.

The public did not like everything Godwin created over the years. Back in the '60s, for example, the tartans were not big hits.

Now, at age 67, Godwin seems back in fashion. And it's not just his recycled tartans. Originally famous for his abstracts, he is now more known for his landscapes and shows regularly at both commercial and public galleries across the country.

Will audiences vote off Tom Hanks?

Twentieth Century-Fox bosses are getting a trifle nervous over *Cast Away*, the film slated as its big Christmas release. A few months ago, the studio thought it had a sure-fire winner because of its star (Tom Hanks) and a storyline involving a Federal Express employee stranded on a desert island for years. But now there's a worry that audiences won't take what was intended as a harrowing dramatic film seriously. The reason is the phenomenal TV success of *Survivor*. The concern is that scenes of Hanks eating rats and desperately crying out for "anybody" to come to his aid will

smack of parody. *Variety*, the show business weekly, reported recently that whenever a trailer for *Cast Away* shows up in movie houses, audience members yell "Vote him off!" at the screen.

An industry equivalent of *The Gunfight At The O.K. Corral* is shaping up for the fall and winter of 2001. New Line Pictures was first off the mark in announcing that it would launch the first instalment of its *Lord Of The Rings* trilogy for Christmas of that year. But then rival Warner Brothers jumped in with the announcement that the first of its *Harry Potter* movies will now open Nov. 16 of next year just prior to the Ameri-

can Thanksgiving. The big question in the industry is whether the season can support two big fantasy movies. Concerns have already been expressed by New Line executive David Tuckerman, who said recently: "I don't think it would be good for either one of us to go head to head."

Ask John Goodman how being on the TV series *Roseanne* changed his life and he has a two-pronged reply. "It made me very nervous," chuckles Goodman who found costar Roseanne Barr a demanding and temperamental colleague. "But it also made me very rich. What else can I say?"

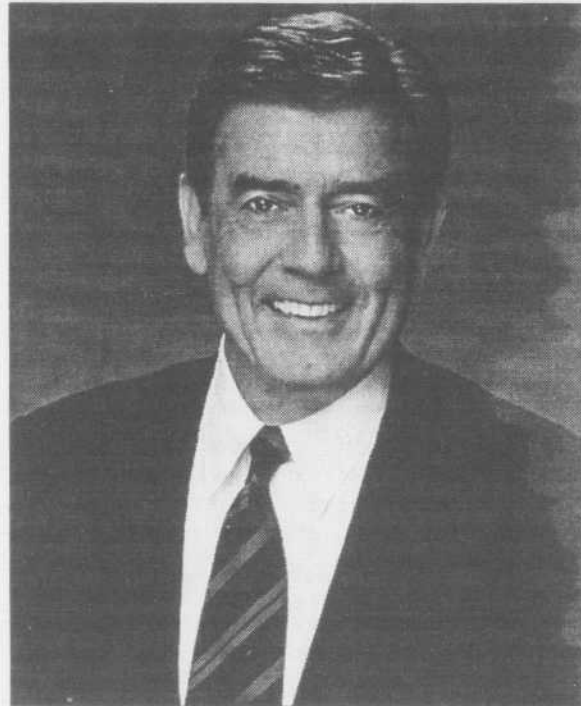

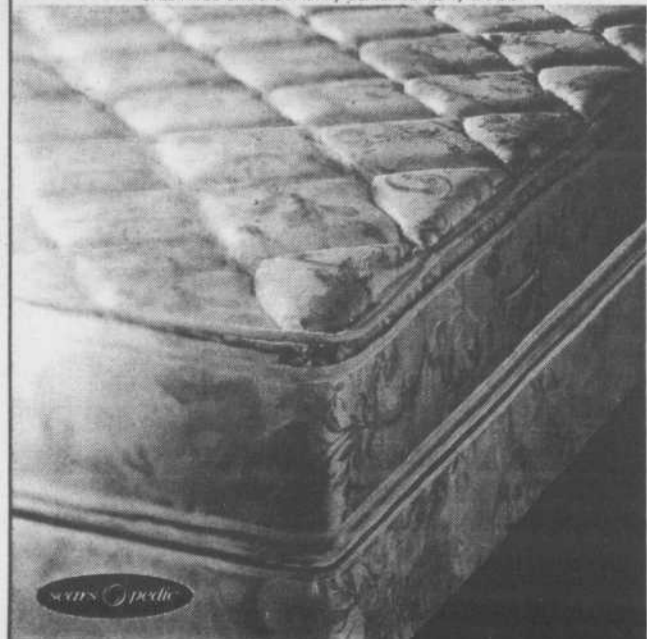

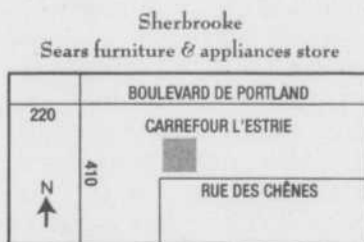
