HERE AND THERE.

The death of the old Duke of Devonshire deprives the Unionists of their able leader in the House of Commons.

He is an unquestionably good man, politically. Born and trained in the school of Liberalism, he at once placed his services at the command of Mr. Gladstone.

and followed that statesman in Opposition, and in the Cabinet, until the ways parted on the Irish Home Rule question.

He practically severed the life-long tie, which had existed between the two men, and created, as it were, the Unionist party.

It was composed of Liberals, who, on the question of Home Rule, joined the Conservatives, though on all other questions, they reserved the right to keep in touch with their old friends, and vote with them.

This scheme worked very well at first, but towards the last, the Unionists on all questions, have gradually drifted away from their old allegiance, and pinned their faith on the acts of the SALISBURY-SMITH Government.

Lord HARTINGTON had always high respect for his old chief. But some of his colleagues took other ground, notably Mr. JOSEPH CHAMBERLAIN, in whose hands the leadership will now likely fall, despite his unpopularity, and despite the fact that he is not wholly trusted by his confederates.

Lord HARTINGTON will sit in the House of Lords, and his voice and vote will be given to Lord SALISBURY, but he is not needed there, while in the House of Commons, he was a source of great strength to the Government.

LORD HARTINGTON never married, but rumor says that he will marry in the course of a few months, Her Grace, the Dowager DUCHESS OF MANCHESTER, the story being that in the days, when both were young, the Marquis was a beau of the future Duchess.

The latter will not have need to change her station or rank. Instead of being the Dowager DUCHESS OF MANCHESTER, she will become the actual DUCHESS OF DEVONSHIRE,—a title of great antiquity. This account of the CAVENDISHES, which we find in an exchange, will interest some of our readers.

"The Duke of Devonshire, whose death took place on Monday, traces the prosperity of his family back to the founder of

his house, William Cavendish, who, about the middle of the reign of Henry VIII., was an obscure Suffolk squire who was quite content with a baronetcy and plenty of church lands as a reward for his services.

His second son rose to the rank of a barony in 1605, and won or received an earldom from James II. in 1618.

The family drifted along, successful in the arts of courtiership and with no great merit or achievements until the Earl Charles his heroism during the reigns of Charles II. and James II. by befriending Sydney and Russell in their persecution by those monarchs, the Earl going so far as to offer to change clothes with Russell in order that the latter might escape execution.

He corresponded with William of Orange and was one of those who invited him over from Holland. It was from the earl, and his eldest son, the Duke of Devonshire, that the loyal friend received the titles of Duke of Devonshire and Marquis of Hartington, which have never lapsed, although they have two or three times been held by collateral descendants.

The fifth and sixth dukes distinguished themselves mainly by their capacity for peace getting and holding, and the fourth made a fortunate marriage and thereby added greatly to the family fortune. The fifth showed little interest in politics, but is mainly known to history as the husband of that Georgian Duchess of Devonshire, who, in the most celebrated of West Indian elections, purchased with a kiss the vote of a butcher for Charles James Fox. The sixth duke never married, but made his country seats famous for their horticultural magnificence. At his death the vast possessions of the Cavendishes, Hardwicks, Boyles, Cliffords and Spencer-Comptons became united by the accession of the Earl of Burlington, the seventh duke, who has now died.

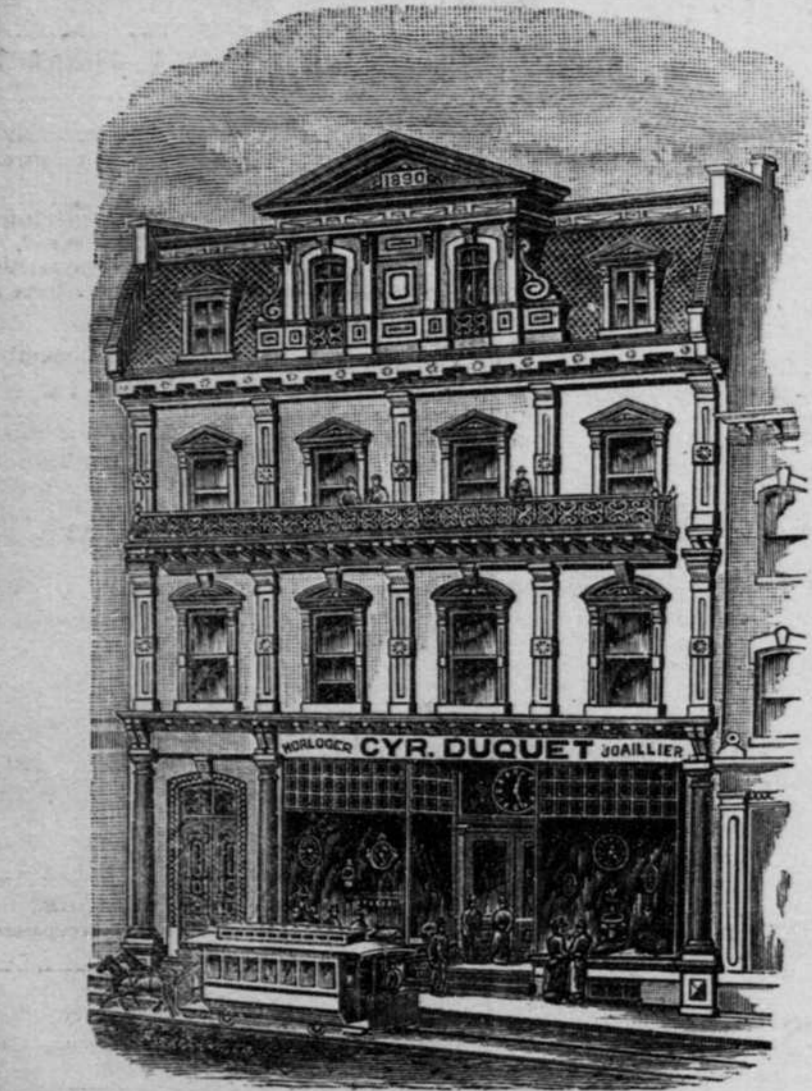

ACCESSION. - London, Dec 23 - It is ascertained by an examination of the log book of the "Spreo," that she took 100 tons of coal and passengers about 120 miles further south and a long distance further west than at first reported.

HER SHIP BROKEN. - London, Dec 23 - The British steamer "Lons" from West Hartlepool, Dec. 7, for Baltimore, was spoken by the "Spreo" on Dec. 20, in lat. 49 N., long. 29 W. She had her mainmast broken.

THE ISLAND ASHORE. - London, Dec 23 - A despatch received here says that the Danish steamship "Island," of the Thingvalle Line, is ashore at Midlandville, on the coast of Greenland.

COMMERCIAL. (From London Times, Dec. 13.) TYNE. - Not a single cargo has come to hand during the past week, and the only arrivals are a few varied parcels and broken.

GLANCOG. - There is nothing in the state of trade this week calling for special notice. The situation is practically unchanged, and the tendency continues in the direction of improvement.

CARDIFF. - During the past week an advance seems to have been established in all descriptions of goods. Buyers are buying more freely, and they are paying locally better figures than hitherto.
