This book is respectfully dedicated to its generous patrons — **THE PUBLIC.**

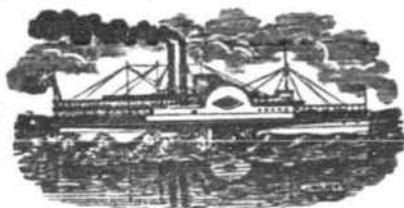
