Cree Summer big in Hollywood

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. (CP) — Amid the palms and panache of Beverly Hills, actress Cree Summer seems out of her element.

The free-spirited flower child would be more at home on a mountaintop, on the open road or on the northern Saskatchewan Indian reserve where she was raised.

But here she is, sitting in a publicist's office only a short Rolls ride from Rodeo Drive. She's a TV star now, appearing as the compassionate but klutzy Freddie Brooks in NBC's *A Different World*.

It has been a long, colorful journey for Summer, returning to where she started 20 years ago.

A few kilometres away, in the Los Angeles suburb of Encino, Summer was born into an entertainment family. Her mother, an American, was a dancer; her father, Canadian actor-musician Don Francks, was working in Hollywood movies.

But her father got fed up with Hollywood, so he took his mate and their baby girl to the Red Pheasant Indian reserve, about 160 kilometres north of North Battleford, Sask.

Summer's parents were not Indians. Her name and the move to Saskatchewan were simply due to her father's great admiration for Indian people.

LIFE ON RESERVE

On the reserve, young Summer

learned about life in an earthy setting.

"The Indians had, of course, a major white man's influence and were living in houses and some even had television sets," says Summer. "We were living in a mud house, which is traditional for the Plains Cree Indians. We used to have to chase pigs away. They'd try to eat our house."

"It was a beautiful foundation for me. I was never plunked in front of an idiot box because my parents had other things to do."

She stayed on the reserve until she was nine. Then her parents, "a pair of dusty, old freaks," took her on a tour of Canada in "a psychedelic school bus" before settling in Toronto.

It was in the big city that she was introduced to a totally new experience — school.

"It was quite a drag, actually. I wasn't into it at all. I walked in and I had moccasins on and two braids down to here. I could have been from outer space, I suppose."

SKIP SCHOOL

She hated school, but her father would rescue her sometimes. He'd pull up on his Harley Davidson motorcycle and pluck her from class.

"He'd say, 'It's too beautiful outside for my daughter to be in class.' So, he'd come and get an excuse slip and we'd leave and we'd go for a ride somewhere."

She added: "I was raised around nature so I take great pleasure in sitting with trees and with water."

Following in her parents' footsteps, she pursued a career as a performer, first by joining in Indian ceremonies on the reserve and later by singing in her father's jazz bands.

While accompanying her father to a voice-over audition for a cartoon, the teenaged Summer was asked to audition. She ended up creating several cartoon character voices for the *Care Bear* movies.

That led to more work in television — commercials and such feature films as *The Return of Billy Jack*, *Wild Thing*, and *Hearts of Fire*.

Meanwhile, she was studying music and dance and attending the Toronto High School for the Performing Arts.

She dropped out of school after Grade 10, and spent two years acting in various productions in Canada.

GETS PART

Shortly after arriving in California a year ago — she was living up to a dare from her friends to try her career in the United States — Summer was told about an opening on *Different World* after Lisa Bonet left the series. She read for the part and got it.

When she's not working, she spends time reading eastern philosophy and enjoying nature.

Late at night, she likes to grab some bottled water and cherries and motor up to a lookout above the city.

"I like look at the skyline and the moon. I'm really fascinated by the moon."

She isn't bent on a show business career. In fact, she says she'd rather get married and "live on a mountain somewhere."

On the Road Again star will slow down

PAKENHAM, Ont. (CP) — In most parts of Canada, Wayne Rostad is pegged as either a resonant-voiced country musician, or as the amiable host of a popular weekly CBC television show, *On the Road Again*.

But in the Ottawa Valley and in western Quebec, the towering, moustached Rostad has a special status — musical giant.

His ballads about people who inhabit the back roads and main streets of the rugged, rolling valley have made him a sellout from Pembroke, Ont., in the west, to Alexandria, Ont., in the east, and from Low, Que., in the north, to Cornwall, Ont., to the south.

His songs have also made him a workhorse for good causes — or did until his right arm, the one that brings his guitar to life, began to stiffen and feel as though it was turning to stone.

It took a week in an Ottawa hospital before doctors found a viral infection was numbing the nerves in his arm.

"I had been going full tilt for 10 years and I would have gone on like that for 10 more years," Rostad says. "But maybe something like this is a sign that I had a life to live and that I should get my priorities in order."

"And when I came home to my farm, I realized it was getting to the point where I could enjoy it. And that I should."

LOVELY FARM

Indian Creek Farm, about 60 kilometres west of Ottawa, is a picture postcard rural retreat. There's a stream at the front of the 25-hectare property and a renovated wooden farmhouse set back from the road amid rolling fields

where Rostad's small but growing herd of quarterhorses graze.

Rostad, who grew up in an Ottawa working-class district, loves to show off the farm. There's the wooden fence he built and the old cow barn he converted into a horse stable.

But he keeps coming back to his role in the life of the Ottawa Valley. He says he realized as he waited in hospital that he couldn't be all things to all people.

And that means saying no to many requests from all over the valley for his appearance at a benefit or a concert.

Rostad can play his guitar now that the virus has disappeared, but his arm tires easily. He'll still help raise funds for the Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario and run the mid-summer Gatineau Clog, which has grown into a major country music festival.

Rostad doesn't want to offend his legions of fans in the valley, but he wants to save more time for his 16-year-old son Josh, "the most forgiving and understanding kid in the world."

He also wants more time for his farm and the TV show.

The show is basic Rostad.

TRAVELS COUNTRY

He travels the country doing vignettes about ordinary folk and their extraordinary talents or hobbies. And he writes an original song for virtually every episode of the TV show, seen early in the evening.

CBC spokesman Glenn Luff says that "for a Canadian program running at that time, it does well in the ratings, getting about 11 per cent of all English TV viewers."

Jane Patterson, the show's Ottawa-based publicist, says there's a common thread in the public response to the program. "He doesn't seem condescending and that's what people appreciate. He has a rapport with the viewers."

Rostad is also working on a new album, his third, when he can find the time.


"The problem is finding the time to do it right," he says. "I can't just do a job. If a job is worth doing, it's worth doing right."

Many of the songs will be from his television show.

"The album will be a reflection of the incredible odyssey I've been able to make across the country (on the show)... It will depict real slices of life in this country and give the listener a sense of the people who live here."

Ted Daigle, music director at CKBY, Ottawa's country music radio station, says his old pal Rostad would be a superstar "if he was as popular in the rest of the country as he is here in the Ottawa Valley."

But to make the big time would force Rostad to do all the things he doesn't want to — travel a lot more and take the whole music business more seriously.

Bobby Bare still sang up a storm at Big Valley Jamboree

CRAVEN, Sask. (CP) — In a business where billing says it all, Bobby Bare had good cause to be insulted.

Playing a 2:30 p.m. slot at the recent Big Valley Jamboree — sandwiched between a couple of (shudder!) Canadian acts and a pair of novice, big-haired singing sisters — hardly befitted Bare's status as a country music legend.

"Wooo, it's hot up here," he drawled, peeling off a fringed leather jacket while the crowd hooted encouragement. "I thought I was gonna be playin' a little later in the day."

But if the organizers of the annual country music festival saw Bare as belonging in the Where-Are-They-Now file, the audience quickly corrected the perception. His hour-long show of country classics, from Detroit City to Dropkick Me Jesus (Through the Goalposts of Life), rated one of the four-day jamboree's few standing ovations.

In a pre-concert interview, Bare betrayed no anxiety about how he would be received.

REMEMBER NAME

"Country music fans are dependable, loyal and long-lasting," he said confidently. "Once you have a country hit, they'll remember your name forever."

By contrast, fame can be fleeting

in the world of pop music. Bare got his start on the rock 'n' roll charts back in the early 1960s with singles such as Shame on Me, 500 Miles From Home, and Four Strong Winds.

"Pop fans are fickle," he said. "That's because with pop you're dealing with mostly very young people and their tastes change every three or four weeks. With my first few hits, they didn't know what my name was. I was completely anonymous until Detroit City came out."

By the time stardom hit, the young baritone had already had an extraordinary life. The Bare facts: he grew up dirt poor on the Kentucky-Ohio border and his mother died when he was five. The family had so little money, one sister had to be put up for adoption. His first guitar was fashioned from string, a stick and an old coffee can.

That background accounts for much of Bare's stubborn independence. He was one of the first artists in Nashville to negotiate control over the artistic content of his records, resulting in what many call country music's first "concept" album, with the songs tied to a single theme.

TOTALLY NEW

"At the time, it didn't seem like such a fight," Bare recalled with a laugh. "They agreed to give me

control if I gave them safe records. So I did a couple of safe ones and lulled them to sleep. Then when they weren't lookin', I went into the studio and did Lullabies, Legends and Lies, which was a total departure from anythin' they'd ever seen before."

Power turned out to be a tasty morsel for a young man who had once supported his family as an ice-cream pedlar. Before long Bare had started up his own song-publishing company and produced a couple of albums for his friend Billy Joe Shaver.

Crystal keeps Soviets in stitches

MOSCOW (AP) — Soviets don't have much to laugh about these days, but American comedian Billy Crystal had them in stitches with slapstick and stand-up routines poking fun at long lines and superpower politics.

"I was raised thinking you were the enemy. You were raised thinking I was the enemy," Crystal told an invitation-only audience of 600 people, about half foreigners and half Soviets. "We were both wrong: It's the French."

The 41-year-old native New Yorker, whose grandmother emigrated from Russia, brought his irreverent humor to the communist

"It's a battle sometimes to convince record company executives that just because we have southern accents doesn't mean we're not very bright," Bare said. "But then, those executives are usually older guys in suits and ties who don't really know anythin' about country music."

Now 55, Bare is busier than ever. He's working on a new album to be produced by his old RCA colleague Chet Atkins and doing tours and television appearances. He also endorses a variety of fishing products

and a brand of chewing tobacco.

Although he hasn't had a chart-topping hit for a few years, he doesn't for a moment consider resting on his laurels.

"Sure, I think a lot of the stuff I've done over the years has opened doors to makin' country music more successful all over the world," he said with a shrug.

"But I think there's this big pendulum that swings back and forth, and whatever's happenin' now, in 10 years it'll be exactly the opposite. You gotta keep on your toes."

heartland to tape On Location: Midnight Train to Moscow for broadcast in October on Home Box Office.

He spent a few days taping skits for the special around town, then put on a 50-minute show Monday night at Moscow's Pushkin Theatre.

With staples such as meat, sugar and toothpaste in short supply, and ethnic violence, strikes and crime on the rise, Soviets need some comic relief. A few, at least, got it from Crystal.

A Soviet woman who spoke English said she had never heard of him but decided to attend the show

"because we need positive emotions." She roared throughout but admitted afterward the "dialogue was hard to understand."

SQUARE TALK

In an interview on Red Square, Crystal agreed comedy was sorely needed in the Soviet Union.

"Here, there is a desperate need to be more open and have more fun," he said.

The comedian, known for his imitations of Sammy Davis Jr. and other celebrities, studied with a language coach and opened his show with a few minutes in Russian.

Woodstock more of a milestone than show

NEW YORK (AP) — Echoes of the Woodstock festival reverberate in U. S. society 20 years after the counterculture concert rocked the country. But when it comes to rock 'n' roll itself, most people say the tune's gone flat.

Eight in 10 American adults have heard of the Woodstock festival, held Aug. 15-17, 1969, on a muddy farm in upstate New York — and three in 10 of them wish they had attended, a Media General-Associated Press poll has found.

That high level of awareness was rooted in a view of Woodstock as more of a historical milestone than simply a show. Most regard it as the expression of a social movement, and half of them said that movement continues today.

Yet the view of Woodstock was not an idealized one. While almost six in 10 of those who knew of the festival said it has had a lasting effect on U.S. society, only half of them said the effect was a positive one.

Even more striking was the widely held opinion that times have changed for the better. Just a quarter said the Woodstock era was a better time than today, while half viewed it a worse time than now.

But respondents were critical of the course of rock 'n' roll music, the raucous hallmark of the Woodstock era: Rock music of the Woodstock days was rated twice as highly as the rock 'n' roll of today. Nearly half of all respondents said they still listen to Woodstock-era rock.

The poll, conducted among a random sample of 1,163 adults countrywide, had a margin of error of plus or minus three percent.

tage points.

As could be expected, it found a dramatic generational division in views of Woodstock. For example, 40 per cent of those younger than 45 would have liked to have attended, compared with just 10 per cent of the older respondents.

SOCIAL IMPACT

Moreover, among those who saw a lasting social impact of Woodstock, more than 60 per cent of the younger group said it was a positive effect, while only about a quarter of the older group agreed.

Interest in rock music followed similar lines. More than 60 per cent of those under 45 said they listen to Woodstock-era rock 'n' roll now, evidence of the sizable audience for "classic rock" radio programming. Of those 45 and older, just 22 per cent were tuned in to Woodstock rock.

Overall, 50 per cent rated rock music of the late 1960s and early 1970s as excellent or good, while just 27 per cent gave those favorable ratings to the rock 'n' roll of today. Among respondents under 45, seven in 10 gave high ratings to Woodstock rock, while only four in 10 approved of newer rock.

The Woodstock festival, featuring most of the top rock bands of the day, drew half a million people to Max Yasgur's farm in Bethel, N. Y. The term "Woodstock Nation" soon came to refer to young people who were agitating for an end to the Vietnam War and the loosening of social mores.

Twenty per cent of the poll's respondents said they knew someone who attended Woodstock, and 25 of the 1,163 people polled said they were there.

Jazz veteran is working hard to keep alive the big band sound

NEW YORK (Reuter) — Illinois Jacquet, the honking tenor saxophonist whose solo on Flying Home is a jazz classic, has a mission.

The jazz veteran is determined to keep the big band sound alive.

Jacquet has been leading his own big band for several years now, burning up New York nightclubs and the European jazz festival circuit.

At this year's JVC Jazz Festival in New York, Jacquet and his band drew the festival's largest crowd at a free concert held in the spacious riverside plaza of the World Financial Centre in downtown Manhattan.

Jacquet pulled out all the stops, leading the band through a rocking set of 1940s swing standards from the books of Count Basie, Benny Goodman and Lionel Hampton.

Jacquet's big-voiced tone and energetic honking technique were a key influence on rhythm and blues and early rock 'n' roll saxophone players.

But he feels at home fronting the polyphonous wall of sounds a big band horn section builds. He soloed relentlessly to the ecstatic response of the festival audience.

STILL HEAR DUKE

After the show Jacquet stuck around to sign autographs and chat with the crowd. He was clearly loving every minute of it.

"I heard Louis Armstrong when I was three years old," he said,

"and it had such an effect on me that I still can't get him out of my mind and I'm 66. I can still hear Basie. I can still hear Duke. I can still hear Jimmy Lunceford.

"So what about the three-year-olds out there today? If this music can make such an impact on me, it's my responsibility to make that available to the young people today so they can be affected too."

Jacquet, who moved to Los Angeles and joined Hampton's band in 1941, was only 19 when he recorded the famous Flying Home solo.

Jacquet's reputation soared during the '40s and he was one of the most popular members of the wild Jazz at the Philharmonic jam sessions produced by Norman Granz.

HIS OWN BANDS

After replacing Lester Young in the Count Basie band, Jacquet went on to lead his own groups in the 1950s and '60s.

In the 1970s Jacquet followed a trend that saw many veteran jazz players shift their operations overseas, where French and Italian record companies gave them more support than they could get at home.

Jacquet was playing in a quintet he formed with bassist Slam Stewart at the beginning of the 1980s when he received an invitation to lecture and play for a jazz history class at Harvard. The visit was such a hit that Jacquet returned as artist-in-residence in 1983.

The response of the students led Jacquet to put together his big band in 1983, recruiting both veteran players and some of his best students.

"I started the band after teaching at Harvard," he said, "because I wanted to bring this out to the young people who never got a chance to hear what it sounds like."

RECORDS ALBUM

The band became an instant hit at New York nightclubs, leading to Jacquet's first mainstream American record contract in 20 years and the outstanding album Jacquet's Got It!

Jacquet feels the key to the emotion in jazz is in its blues roots.

"You can have a guy playing guitar and singing at a picnic. He doesn't know anything about music, maybe he knows only two or three chords, but he can play jazz from the soul because he's singing his feelings about the hardship of life.

"Basie revolutionized the blues, then built it up into big band arrangements. Basie's music is much more sophisticated than that guy playing the guitar, but all the players in the group have that feeling in themselves and bring it to the music when they play it."

That feeling is the spirit that animates Jacquet's life.

"Playing this music," he said with a smile, "it's a score that never ends."

Cole Porter's *Nymph Errant* never did make it as a Broadway musical

NIAGARA-ON-THE-LAKE, Ont. (CP) — In the Roaring '20s and early '30s, London's West End did a roaring business in imported Broadway musicals.

The English loved 'em.

They loved them so much they started importing American composers and writers to create their own made-in-Britain American musicals.

But, strangely, those musicals —

by such greats as Cole Porter, George Gershwin and Rogers and Hart — hardly ever made the trip in the other direction to Broadway.

One such show was Porter's *Nymph Errant*, written especially for the late, great Gertrude Lawrence.

It never made it to Broadway and now, in one of its rare recreations at the Shaw Festival, it's hard to understand why. It's a dilly of a musical, even in the cramped, small-stage production at the Shaw's Court House Theatre, where it opened Friday.

The feeling at the time — Porter wrote it in 1933 — was that it was too sophisticated, with its "in" jokes, sexual overtones and racy theme.

In Britain, the wealthy, fun-loving, world-travelling Porter tended to write his musicals to fit the tastes of such fellow travellers as Noel Coward, Fanny Brice, Lawrence and columnist Elsa Maxwell.

But U.S. audiences of the day, it was reasoned, liked their musicals uncomplicated and more in the tempo of vaudeville and music hall humor.

Old Norman molds continue to be used in Compton County shop

Townships guitars make their way 'round the world

LA PATRIE—When rock superstar Bruce Springsteen goes on tour he takes along a little bit of the Townships.

That little bit of the Townships is a Godin guitar crafted by artisans right here in the rolling hills of Compton County. In fact accoustical and electric guitars made in the Townships are becoming the chosen guitar of a growing number of folk, country and rock artists.

There are only three guitar factories in Canada. One of them is in Vancouver, B.C. The other two are in the tiny municipality of La Patrie, population 357.

The two local factories are now owned by Guitabec which recently bought out the family-owned Norman Guitar plant.

Pioneer Normand Boucher started making his famous western and folk guitars 25 years ago. Later he opened a small plant, and later still his son expanded the business making classical guitars.

MARKETING FAILURE

According to people in the music business while the Bouchers were good at manufacturing guitars they failed when it came to marketing.

Now the Boucher family has sold its interest in the plant to former partner Robert Godin. However, the handmade quality of the guitars is still a part of the tradition in the new corporation. They continue to use Normand's old molds

and make a large number of original designs, including the popular Seagull, Simon and Patrick Luther, Minstral and Kamouraska accoustical guitars as well as more than 100 kinds of electrical guitars at a second factory. One line has even retained the Norman signature.

Guitabec owner and sales director Godin said the company also manufactures electric guitars for all the major American companies like Washburn, Signature, Zion and Steinberger, as well as electronic violins for Zeta.

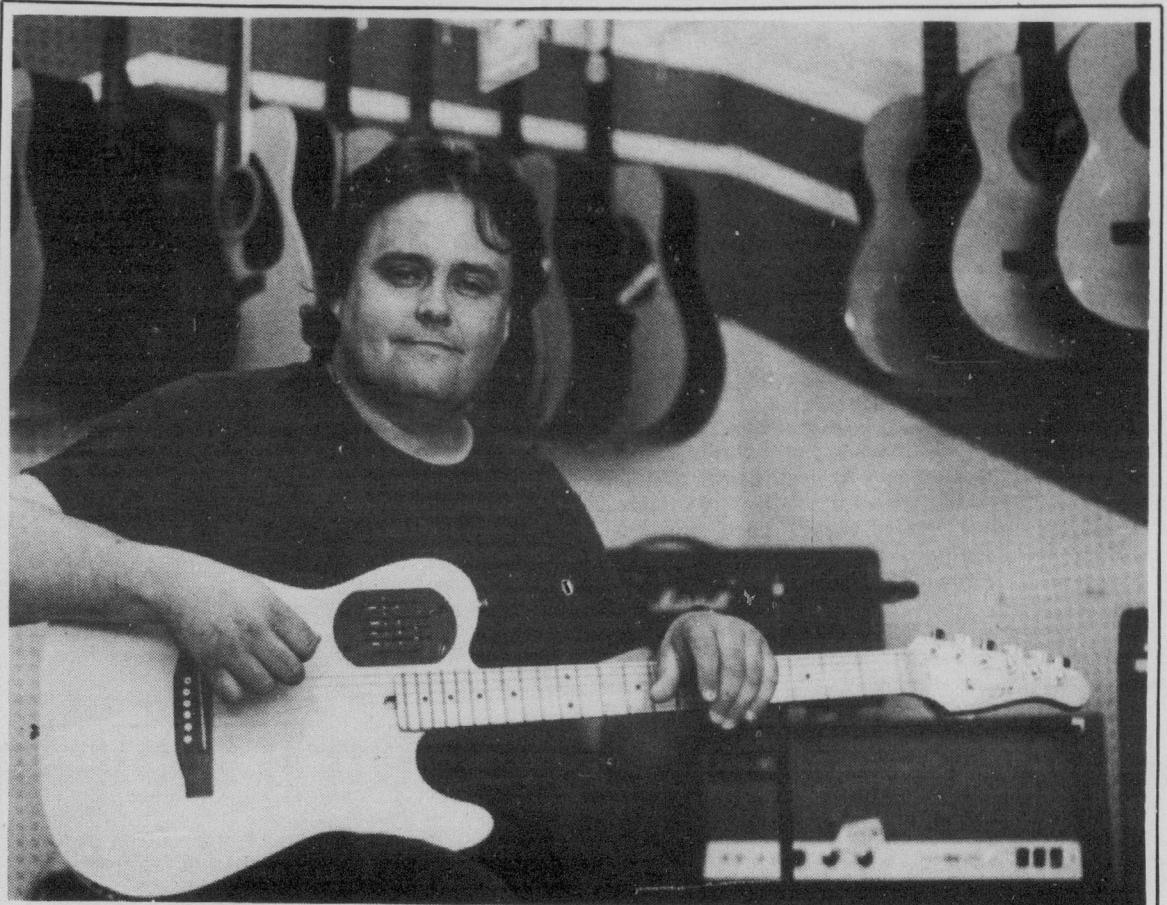
Godin added these subcontracts helped the company get a foot hold on the internationals market.

According to plant manager and director Pierre Vézina, what makes the guitars really special is the fine materials and craftsmanship with which they are made. And Godin adds that it is one of few guitar factories in the world where production is done completely on the spot.

COMPLETE FACTORY

"We start from the log to the finished product," he said. "You don't see many factories who do that anymore."

The factory even has its own engineer to design new models and improve on old ones, Godin said. Most other assemble pre-manufactured pieces or subcontract out their instruments to Korean factories where they are mass-produced.

Each accoustical guitar goes through a series of 250 operations, each one essential and precise, from the wood pile to the music shop, explained Vézina. And the company manufactures not only each of the components of the guitar but also the molds, tools and machines which are used in the production of the instruments.

"They are special because of the special attention brought to each instrument," Vézina said.

"We start from the log to the finished product. You don't see many factories who do that anymore."

This, he said, means a disciplined staff of 35 workers with good manual dexterity which produces about 60 guitars a day. Each one of the workers touches the guitar which is checked each step of the way.

The company uses a number of imported woods including rose wood, ebony and mahogany as well as some local ones like cedar and spruce.

BETTER SOUND

"The guitars are lacquered and not painted like the Japanese ones," Vézina said. "It makes a better sound."

The instruments are put to-

gether with glue and no nails or screws are used except in the joining of the neck to the body of the instrument.

The accoustical guitars are handcrafted at one of two plants which employ about 80 locals. The second plant down the hill in La Patrie manufactures electrical guitars.

This is where Springsteen's guitar "the Godin" is manufactured, named after the company's president and director of sales, who designed the avant-garde model.

Springsteen is pictured with his Godin guitar in the latest issue of Rolling Sotnes magazine. Godin proudly named some of the celebrities who also use this model: Eric Clapton, Randy Travis, Bruce Coburn, Mark Knoffler of Dire Straits and Michel Cusson the lead guitarist of the Quebec jazz band Uzeb.

And Godin added that in the first eight months of production they have already sold 5000 of his name-sake instruments worldwide.

According to local musician Bruno Berthold, lead guitarist for the local band Clover, the Godin is a revolutionary guitar that is part electric, part accoustic. He says it's the only one of its kind.

ONE GUITAR, TWO SOUNDS

"You get both sounds with the same guitar," Berthold said, adding that it is shaped like an electric guitar but is hollow with an electronic pick-up under the bridge of the instrument for the electric sound.

Berthold, who has seven other guitars, said the Godin is now his favorite because of its versatility and its weight.

"You can play for five hours

standing up and not get tired," said the musician, who is also a part-time salesman at Sherbrooke's Painchaud music store which once had the largest sales of Norman guitars in the province.

Berthold said he has always liked Norman and Guitabec products because of their quality.

The company also has about 30 sales representatives selling a large variety of locally produced guitars throughout North America and Europe.

"We are virtually unknown here in Quebec," Vézina said, adding that between 80 and 90 per cent of the guitars produced in La Patrie are exported outside the country.

While the guitars are not well-known here in Quebec — aside from Norman models — they are finding a growing market in the United States and Europe.

NO MARKETING

Perhaps the best sign of Guitabec's success is their lack of marketing.

Godin said the company doesn't have a catalogue of products and doesn't have ads in music magazines. The guitars market themselves by the old fashioned word-of-mouth method through satisfied clients.

"Our best promotion is the best product for the best price," Godin said.

Last year the company sold more than \$2.5 million worth of guitars. This year that number is expected to grow to about \$4 million.

In fact, Godin said, the company is expanding so fast he and partners Pierre Vézina and Daniel Gervais are desperately in search of about 30 new workers.

B.C. Shangri-La restores the one-and-only Capitol

NELSON, B.C. (CP) — The Capitol Theatre is more than just the only show in town.

"It's the only theatre between Calgary and the Okanagan," boasts theatre manager Marg Stacey. "I call it a regional theatre.

"Touring shows don't have many other places to go (in this area)."

The theatre, designated a provincial heritage building, was the darling of Nelson when it first opened in the West Kootenay community in 1927. Time and neglect, however, left it crumbling — abandoned and forgotten through most of the 1960s and '70s.

It reopened more than a year ago, although an intensive restoration effort really began 10 years ago, inspired by nothing more than a dream to transform a decaying shell.

Members of the Capitol Theatre Restoration Society scratched and scraped for financial support, at

times fighting bitterly among themselves.

"Some people looked at it as a hole to pour money in," Stacey recalls.

But dogged persistence triumphed and about \$1.2 million was raised from three levels of government and private contributions.

Nelsonites now hope the theatre will boost tourism in the southeast B.C. town of 9,000, building on the base provided by the annual summer Kootenay Festival of the Arts and by a community theatre group.

BRINGS CROWDS

Some 48,000 people attended theatre events last year, including school productions, plays, musicals, and travelling one-night events.

This summer, the highlight is 25 performances from three productions: *Love is Strange*, a musical-comedy; *Saltwater Moon*, a comedy-love story set in Newfoun-

dland; and the thriller, *I'll be Back Before Midnight*.

"My job is to make this place approachable," says Stacey. "Even if it means putting on church and school functions.

"Whether it's a union vote or a ski film, I'll get them in here," she says, nodding appreciatively at the surroundings. "As soon as you get them in here and they see it they'll come back."

She's probably right.

The original Capitol theatre was art deco, but it's doubtful it has ever looked better than it does now. Its transformation borders on breathtaking.

Ten years ago, it was a dungeon. Its location, below street level in the basement of a half-block of low-rise office buildings, guaranteed a dank, rotting, water-stained derelict.

Today, from the comfort of one of its 426 plush crimson seats, the eye takes in a meticulous restoration.

Wooden corbels jut from the top of the walls, each one restored — and initialled — by woodworking students at the senior secondary school.

Two organ lofts await the first production of *Romeo and Juliet*, but serve mostly as ideal locations for the local cable TV outfit.

MURALS ON SHOW

On the side walls are illuminated murals, restored and bathed in gold leaf. Each wall has a line of flower designs at eye level, painstakingly hand-painted in acrylics. Electrical wiring circa Thomas Edison was ripped out and replaced by modern equipment.

And then there's the sound, enhanced by new acoustic baffles in the ceiling.

"The Capitol is one of the best theatres anywhere in Canada," says Lyle Moon, a 29-year-old Vancouverite hired to be the theatre's co-ordinating director for the summer repertory.

"It has perfect sound. A whisper can be heard over 400 people. I've been on stage here and in the audience, and it's a pure joy."

The theatre does not have a resident troupe. "We debated it at length, but decided to be a home for everybody," says Stacey.

The theatre has a full-time staff of two — Stacey and Paul Pokorny, a Czechoslovakian defector who divides his time equally as technician and janitor. There is also a part-time secretary.

The box office and concession staff is voluntary, says Stacey.

Moon fell in love with Nelson a couple of years ago when he visited as a member of a travelling troupe called Theatre Action.

"The audiences here are very smart and culturally aware," he says backstage. "It's one of the most thriving artistic communities anywhere."

"It's Shangri-La in the mountains."

DALLAS (AP) — It wasn't because Elton John and his four guests ordered a \$1,000 bottle of 1959 Chateau Latour, smoked shrimp and oven roast pheasant on corn puree with poblano chili ranchero.

They let him keep his hat on at The Mansion despite their rigorous dress code, restaurant spokesmen said, because the British rocker has a reputation for unusual attire.

"We allowed it only because it's a costume look which you kind of expect from Elton John. We allow clothes that are native to a country or a costume or uniform. The whole look has to be right."

The hat was a military envelope-type, with a jewelled brooch attached and a tassel hanging down.

TACOMA, Wash. (AP) — Water-

gate figure Gordon Liddy says he isn't worried about being typecast as a bad guy.

In the early 1970s, the former Nixon aide supervised the burglary of psychiatrist Daniel Ellsberg's office, concocted a campaign of dirty tricks against Democratic presidential candidates, and masterminded break-ins at the Watergate headquarters of the Democratic National Committee.

Liddy, 58, was in Tacoma recently filming *Nowhere Man*, in which he plays a character who fakes his death as part of a scheme to throw the cops off his trail so he can make a huge drug score.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. (AP) — Oprah Winfrey, in town to throw

her diminished weight behind a black theatre festival, joked that everyone had shown up to see whether the once-plump talk-show hostess had "gained the weight back."

Black theatre was instrumental in her rise to television stardom, Winfrey said.

She recalled, at a Monday news conference, watching Ruby Dee perform in *A Raisin in the Sun* on her family's small black and white television when she was growing up in rural Mississippi. That production, and participation in the black church — with its theatrical elements — inspired her to build a career she knew would one day involve acting, she said.

ATLANTIC CITY, N.J. (AP) — Cher's show will finally go on at the Sands on Wednesday after a wait of nearly a year and a half.


Six giant billboards with Cher spelled out in huge pink letters have been set up in New York and New Jersey. An exhibit of Cher memorabilia in the Sands lobby has attracted television's *PM Magazine*, *Entertainment Tonight*, and the fan who set it up has been on Sally Jesse Raphael.

Mutation — a simple, tedious thriller by Cook

Mutation by Robin Cook (PUTNAM'S): \$26.50, 367 pp.

As an ophthalmologist, Robin Cook has an extensive medical training which serves him well when he spins out his simple thrillers. Giving a Stephen King twist to his stories about medical malfeasance, Cook has taken pervasive fears of the lay population about medicine — the ethics of organ transplants, or the psychologically traumatic fear of the operating table — and turned them into the stuff of fiction.

His latest book, **Mutation** picks up on the fascination with genes and DNA chemistry and creates a book about a young child who is a mutation with extraordinary mental powers.

Victor Frank, a biomolecular researcher, tinkers with the fertilization of his wife's egg, taking elements of animal husbandry and the molecular genetics of human reproduction, to aid him in an experimentation that radically affects the birth of their own child, VJ. Two other families in Dr. Frank's medical empire, known as Chimera, have similar gene manipulations, resulting in the birth of two other children through this breakthrough in genetical engineering.

SUDDEN DEATHS AND FEAR

When the two children die suddenly, Dr. Frank and his wife Marsha have fears about the fate of VJ, although Marsha has no knowledge of the true circumstances surrounding VJ's conception. All of this detail is trotted out in very pedestrian, plodding prose by Cook, who may be a genius in the lab, but has Victor choke on such casual husband/wife conversations as: "I'm immune to your worst epithet".

HE TRIES

Cook's book attempts to catch us up in the curiosity about VJ's overdeveloped mental capacities — he sets up a secret laboratory on the grounds of his father's Chimera complex, commandeering funds for electron microscopes and other paraphernalia by accessing the companies files and making shifts in large amounts of capital to cover his youthful indiscretions — but the read is nothing like Greyhound's old pledge "getting there is half the

fun".

The reading is tedious, and the rewards very slender in Robin Cook's **Mutation**, although the audience for this kind of book is about as extensive as it is for pulp horror fiction.

RECORD REVIEWS

Marshall Crenshaw Good Evening (WARNER BROS — WEA)

Take a rock primitivism of Buddy Holly, add verve, flavour and stripped down basics, and you come up with an approximation of how Marshall Crenshaw fits into the design of modern rock n' roll.

Crenshaw, who even played Holly in a movie treatment of the Lubbock, Texas native's life, has the knack of writing simple, but humble melodies that skip easily through the chord changes, underplays the structure with heavy bass patterns, blending in acoustic guitars, piano and neat lead licks when needed.

If you can listen to "Whatever Way The Wind Blows" and not want to get up outa your seat and boogie then you're probably on serious medication. This Crenshaw track, with a supercharged guitar lead by Elvis's ex-fasthand James Burton, (bass by a suspiciously named "e. pressley": "Elvis has left the K-Mart in Minneapolis!"), is but one of many Crenshaw tunes on **Good Evening** that will be commanding AOR radio prime-time.

A couple of other prime suspects are "She Hates To Go Home" and "Radio Girl", the latter ably boosted by a slick slide-guitar solo by veteran session man David Lindley, who also plays steel guitar, fiddle, and mandolin on various other tracks.

A John Hiatt song seems to be de rigeur on albums by many performers lately and Marshall Crenshaw chooses to interpret "Someplace Where Love Can't Find Me", backing the track with the trademark slide guitars that Hiatt favours, this time being played by Sonny Landreth.

Landreth also plays something called "weird experiment guitar" on "Radio Girl", a tune that is a reversal of the scenario that usually has the dreamy teenaged girl falling in love with the dulcet tones of a big city D.J.: "She's playing all my favorite records/ She tells me all the latest news/ I take her into my bed each night/ And she rocks away my blues/ 'Cause she's my girl, my radio girl."

Crenshaw wrote this one in tandem with the Bo Deans, who also backs him up on the vocals on the kicker that opens this set, "You Should've Been There".

There are more cover tunes than is usual on a Marshall Crenshaw project, but when they include a Richard Thompson song, "Valerie", an Isley Brothers tune, "Live It Up", and Bobby Fuller's "Let It

Dance", not many fans will complain over the choice of material. When he writes with Leroy Preston (of *Asleep At The Wheel*, and author of some Roseanne Cash hits), as on "She Hates To Go Home", it's obvious that Crenshaw is at the stage of his career where every new album outing defines a new side to this artist who began as the John Lennon in a touring *Beatlemania* production.

From head Beatle, to Buddy Holly-lookalike in *La Bamba*, to turning in this kind of record performance is a pretty impressive trifecta for Marshall Crenshaw.

Pink Cadillac Original Motion Picture Soundtrack (WARNER BROS — WEA)

However you may regard the relative merits of Clint Eastwood's granite-faced acting style, it is a certainty that the mayor of Carmel, California has a keen ear for a good country tune.

In past movies he has included, and titled his flick after, good country tunes such as "Every Which Way But Loose", or its sequel, "Any Which Way You Can", besides giving monkeys a high cinema profile. Current case in point regarding Clint's ear for music, ignoring for the moment his tin ear dialogue, is **Pink Cadillac's** very successful soundtrack. There have been at least four, if not five, country singles that have been culled from this flick, which are currently being shown as videos or climbing the highly competitible country charts.

Michael Martin Murphey's tune "Never Givin' Up On Love" leads off this hit-packed set, with his popular song, but it's "Reno Bound", by Southern Pacific that supplies the title for Clint's movie.

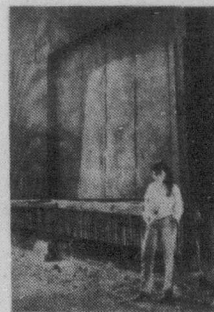
This fine vocal group gets to add a second number to this sequence with "Any Way The Wind Blows", a rich harmony song that will make an impression for these guys. "Rollin' Dice", by Billy Hill is a country/crossover track that is reminiscent of the Mel McDaniels style of song, while Jill Hollier's "If It Wasn't For The Heartache" serves notice that she may invade some of Reba McEntyre's territory.

Prettiest song honours goes to J. C. Crowley for his doleful ballad "Beneath The Texas Moon", a tear-jerky, mournful ditty that may join the long parade of "moon" songs, thanks to the inspired reading that J. C. gives to this haunting melody.

Randy Travis hardly needs the exposure, but he scores big with "Card Carryin' Fool", to keep his string of country chart-toppers intact.

Robben Ford's "Born Under A Bad Sign" proves that album producer Jim Ed Norman (veteran Nashville session-jockey who's worked with our Ann Murray extensively) can pick out a winning track that is anything but country.

TISH HINOJOSA



HOMELAND

Even Dion Dimucci, underway with a renaissance of sorts, chimes in with "Drive All Night", produced by its author Bryan Adams.

But these rocking numbers only add variety to the spice of country sounds present. You can't get more country, of course, than having Hank Williams, Jr. provide a bit of Struder tape-machine legerdemain so that he is double-tracked and teamed up with one of his dad's old songs, "There's A Tear In My Beer". Young Hank mixes a vocal of his own with the original by Senior, which comes out quite well. It's not often that a movie soundtrack album turns into a hits collection, but **Pink Cadillac's** lineup of heavy-hitting winners appears to be just that.

Tish Hinojosa **Homeland** (A&M)

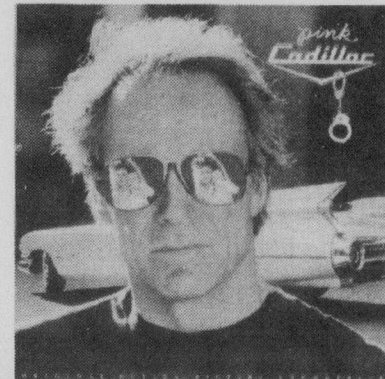
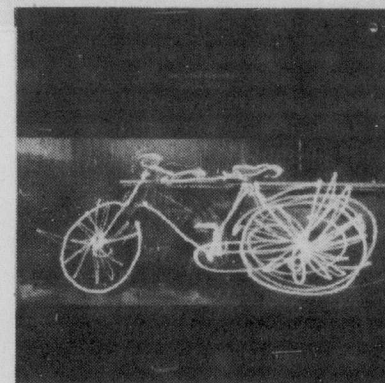
The popularity of Linda Ronstadt's *Canciones de Mi Padre* and Los Lobos's album of Mexican music has opened the door for young artists such as Tish Hinojosa (pronounced Ee-no-hoe-sah), a second-generation Mexican-American raised in San Antonio, Texas.

Like a lot of American kids she listened to Baez and The Beatles, wasn't quite old enough to go to Woodstock, (twenty years ago this week!), but Tish's perspective on music is enhanced by her ear to the folk music of the honky-tonks in Northern Mexico and the hispanic heritage of the American southwest.

Her release **Homeland** also happens to be the first of a series from A&M Records, ever the innovators in the recording industry, which will be known as "Americana", showcasing what Artists and Repertoire head Steve Ralbovsky calls "young progenitors of native music, folk, country, or anything else".

The wise choice of the big-voiced Tish Hinojosa is revealed in the range that this singer brings to her wide choice of material, in that she covers literally all of Ralbovsky's criteria on this one album.

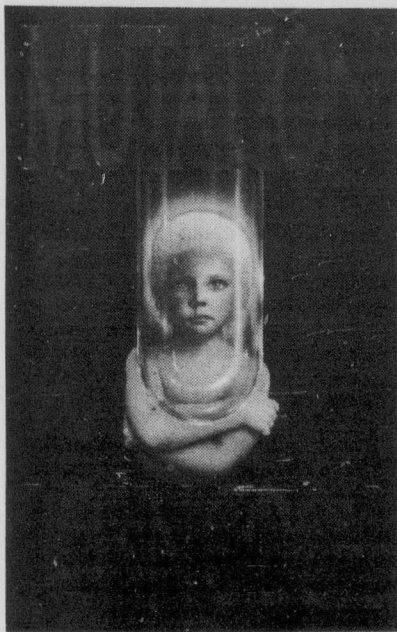
"Till You Love Me Again" is a boucy country track with a catchy



pedal-steel guitar vamp pushing it along. "Voice Of The Big Guitar" has a brooding dobro backing behind a song that is obviously influenced by the Baez folkishness that Hinojosa admires. "Who Showed You The Way To My Heart" should immediately be pulled off this album and rush released as the first single from this artist. It is a lyrical, lilting ballad with a hook that keeps coming around again, and a beautiful melody.

The Mexican influences come through on "Rancherita" (Little Ranch Girl), "Amanecer" (Daybreak) and "Donde Voy" (Where I Go), but also on the beautiful Spanish guitar licks that are inserted everywhere on this album, which was lovingly produced by Steve Berlin of the aforementioned hispanic/rock group Los Lobos.

With a voice that fits into any of the styles she chooses to follow on **Homeland**, Tish Hinojosa merely needs to decide which format she prefers to grace: folk, country, or pop rock.

Luxury tours pamper customers but it costs a bundle

If Sam Blyth has his way, train passengers between Montreal and Vancouver will be pampered with gourmet meals, room service and private marble bathrooms.

The price per person, he says, would be \$2,495. For three days. One way.

The Toronto tour operator wants to purchase Via Rail's transcontinental train and turn it into — as one newspaper headline put it — a Millionairail.

Passengers would pay some \$830 a day, more than many pay for a week or two for a sunspot vacation in winter.

That may seem exorbitant, but it's just one of many luxury tours planned or already offered by the travel industry.

The most expensive trips are round-the-world cruises. For example, prices start at \$43,000 US and go as high as \$53,000 US per person for a 97-day cruise aboard the Cunard Line's *Vistafjord*, which departs New York in January.

But round-the-world tours aboard luxury jets — airliners that have been refurbished to seat a limited number of people in spa-

rious splendor — work out to be even pricier on a per-day basis.

A new tour operator, Private Jet Expeditions in Seattle, has spent some \$6 million US to revamp a Boeing 727-100 to seat 68 people for its inaugural global tour.

The trip departs San Francisco on Sept. 21 and stops in Tahiti, New Zealand, Bali, Nepal, India, Kenya and Egypt.

Price for the 30-day trip? A mere \$25,000 US per person.

COSTLY CARAVAN

Private Jet's plans for next year include another world tour with a different itinerary, a 16-day tour called Saharan Kingdoms for \$15,000 US a person and a 22-day tour of volcanic South Pacific islands for \$25,000 US.

At those prices, obviously, aircraft and accommodation are deluxe and each group will be accompanied by experienced guides and expert lecturers.

Similar round-the-world jet tours, at similar prices, are offered by several other luxury tour operators.

Which makes the round-the-world trip offered by Travel Guild Inc. of Toronto a bargain — \$11,900 Cdn for a 33-day trip aboard a DC-8

carrying 140 passengers instead of the normal 181. Accommodation is in first-class hotels and most meals are included.

Ben Nierop, president of Travel Guild, says he's able to offer a lower price partly because he has more people on each tour and doesn't deal with travel agents, meaning he doesn't have to pay a commission.

Other types of luxury travel — cruises, train trips, resorts — are generally less expensive than round-the-world trips.

BARGAIN CRUISES?

For instance, it costs about \$4,000 Cdn per person for a week at the peak Christmas period at some posh resorts in the Caribbean, and the same or more for a week-long cruise aboard the luxurious *Seabourn Pride* between Florida and Los Angeles via Acapulco.

So what do you get for such prices?

In a word, service.

Charles Baptist, president of Gold Club Travel in Toronto, which offers sojourns in deluxe resorts around the world, likens it to flying first class.

"You're checked in faster, whisked away to a private lounge, escorted to the plane and offered a

drink as soon as you get on board. There are fewer people, you're in a wide seat, you get champagne, the food is much better, your baggage is off-loaded first.

"It's like getting private treatment in the same setting you would have at home."

Luxury tour operators say their trips appeal to the discriminating, sophisticated traveller — in other words, people with plenty of money.

However, some travellers save up for a once-in-a-lifetime trip. And sometimes relatives and friends will kick in for a special trip for honeymooners or a couple celebrating an anniversary.

For trips of a month or longer, many of the clients are retirees. But tour operators say they also attract business executives who work hard, make a lot of money and feel they deserve a long, luxurious trip.

On the other hand, it appears there are limits to what even the well-to-do will pay for.

GROUNDS CONCORDE

Last spring, an Air France Concorde was supposed to take off from Toronto on a three-week round-the-world tour that would

have cost \$32,000 Cdn per passenger. That's \$1,500 a day.

But it never happened. There simply weren't enough reservations.

Meanwhile, there's still time to save up for the ultimate in adventure travel: an eight-hour trip into space for \$52,500 US.

Prior to the Challenger disaster in 1986, Private Jet Expeditions was booking people for the first scheduled flight in 1993 of a space shuttle carrying paying passengers.

Plans to build the reusable shuttle, the *Space Explorer*, were put on hold indefinitely following the tragedy, but Private Jet says it will happen some time in the next decade.

As to Blyth, he expects his projected deluxe train service between Montreal and Vancouver to attract mainly tourists from overseas. He hopes to begin the service by next May, assuming he receives approval from the federal Transport Department by September.

Fortunately for the rest of us, he also promises that part of the train will remain economy class, with ticket prices similar to what they are now.

Spanish fiestas can have quite bloody traditions

EL CARPIO DE TAJO, Spain (AP) — The goose hangs by its feet from a thick rope stretched across the town square on the feast day of Santiago, the patron saint of Spain. A rider on horseback passes underneath and yanks the head off.

He has his prize and the crowd cheers. Another goose is brought out and strung up for another rider. Critics call it barbarous.

But to the thousands of Spaniards in the villages and towns, yearly fiestas that often involve the ritualistic killing of a goose, rooster or a bull are an essential part of their lives and an affirmation of their cultural identity.

At El Carpio de Tajo, an agricultural village of 2,500 in central Spain, onlookers at the fiesta weren't sure why the eight male riders dressed in black britches and embroidered jackets try to pull the heads off geese.

But they know young men have been doing it every July 25, the feast day, for 400 years at least.

GEESE DRUGGED

The practice gained notice abroad about five years ago when photographs of the event appeared in the British press. Headlines called the Spaniards barbarians and worse. Nowadays the geese have been injected with a tranquillizer.

"They're numb, they don't feel anything, that's all I'll say," said

Mayor Pedro Villalba Cedeno.

Anthropologists surmise that the practice grew out of a celebration of the legendary appearance of Santiago, or St. James, at the Battle of Navas de Tolosa in 1212, sparking a Christian victory over the Moors.

The geese represent the Moors, who ruled much of Spain for more than 700 years.

In some towns, the sacrificial victim is a bull, whose ritualistic importance in Spain can be traced back to the prehistoric caves across the northern part of the country.

The bulls at one time were burned alive. Now the ends of their horns are set alight with flaming balls of tar, sending them into panicked flight. Young boys chase them and beat them with sticks until the fire in the tar balls dies out. In one town, the bulls are killed after that but in others they are then left alone.

In other towns bulls are driven over cliffs into the sea. Townspeople rescue them from the water, but if the bulls break their legs or are otherwise injured they are taken to the slaughter house.

Julio Caro Baroja, the dean of Spanish anthropologists, has done extensive studies of the fiestas, their relation to the seasonal cycle and the role of animals in them.

Travel guru now likes offbeat trips

NEW YORK (Reuter) — Arthur Frommer sent a generation of travellers overseas in the 1960s clutching his guidebook *Europe on \$5 a Day*.

But Frommer has decided that tourists are doing it all wrong — that they're mostly wasting the opportunities travel offers.

"It was only six or seven years ago that I realized that budget travel was not enough," says Frommer, 59.

"I started seeing a lot of my readers living in one-star hotels in Paris and eating in workingmen's restaurants, but then I saw they were spending their days just as senselessly as the rich tourists were doing."

To Frommer, that means piling into tour buses to gaze at the same old ruins and the same old monuments. It means travelling physically without ever leaving home psychologically.

TAKE BYWAYS

He has come to believe that the solution is to take the road less travelled.

That means staying at Seventh-day Adventist spas, learning yoga, visiting developing countries, trekking in Nepal and doing everything possible to shun "tourist ghettos."

"I started to ask myself: Is there a better way of going to Indonesia or going to Hawaii? Is there another aspect of life to London

and all the rest?" Frommer said in an interview. "And I've discovered that there is."

He believes that demand for alternative travel is so strong that his book *New World of Travel*, now in its second edition, will soon out-sell his guide to Europe — the world's single best-selling travel guide.

New World of Travel offers ways of breaking down barriers and meeting local people, learning about their culture and possibly giving something back to them.

It details the industry of tiny companies that has sprung up to cater to the growing number of people who, Frommer says, are looking for a new and better way to travel.

"I think I wasted a lot of time doing standard things," said the former lawyer, whose guide to Europe — one of a series of 104 Frommer travel books — is now in its 33rd edition. "This is far more interesting."

ESCAPE SWARMS

Frommer remains true to his philosophy that spending a lot of money does not ensure a good time. He suggests travellers go to lectures and fringe theatre in London, try folk dancing in New York, visit cultural events in Hawaii and explore "undiscovered" vacation spots that are not yet thronged by package tours and swarms of tourists.

Among destinations virtually

ignored by North American travellers are Wales, Malta, Belgium and the island of Bonaire off Venezuela, says Frommer. Costa Rica and the Dominican Republic's north shore also offer great beauty and great value and deserve to be better known, he says.

In the Far East, Indonesia and Thailand are being discovered, as are destinations in the Soviet Union outside Moscow and Leningrad. Travel to Turkey, Frommer says, "is booming by leaps and bounds."

In the United States, he recommends Lafayette, La. — "the capital of Cajun country and very cheap" — and Eugene, Ore., which he predicts will become "the Athens of America."

GUIDE FOR ARMY

Frommer says his travels began on the eve of his departure to fight in the Korean War. But when the army found out he spoke fluent Russian and French, it sent him instead to work in intelligence in Berlin.

His guide *Europe on \$5 a Day*, first published in 1957, was the civilian version of Frommer's self-published *GI's Guide to Travelling in Europe*, which quickly sold out in army canteens.

"Travel to Europe was in its infancy," Frommer said. "Those people who went were being told by the travel industry that it was a very expensive activity and you couldn't risk staying in any establishment below the first-class."

Samurai film epic is shot in the Rockies' shadow

MORLEY FLATS, Alta. (CP) — The battle of Kawanakajima, a fierce struggle between two powerful Japanese warlords 420 years ago, rages this month on a sweeping plain in the shadows of the Canadian Rockies.

The clanging of swords mixes with the staccato cries of Kenshin, the spiritualist leader of the Echigo district, and his pragmatist rival, Shingen, as they command their forces on the dusty, sweaty, bloody battlefield.

As Kenshin's mighty army advances under the standard of the Bishamonten, the Shinto god of war, to oppose the red-armored forces of Shingen, the tranquillity of the plains is shattered as almost 3,000 foot soldiers and 800 warriors on horseback clash in one of the fiercest battles in Japanese history.

It's a fight for wealth, honor, and power to rule a united Japan.

It's also one of the most ambitious motion picture projects ever undertaken by a Japanese film company.

Heaven and Earth is a \$40-million Samurai epic directed by

Haruki Kadokawa, considered one of Japan's most dynamic and successful independent movie producers.

USED A NOVEL

It's based on a novel by Chogoro Kaionji about the real-life battle of Kawanakajima in the restless era following Japan's civil wars in the 16th century.

Filming began in Japan in April and is to wrap up there by year's end for release next June. But the battle scenes are being filmed on a grassy, wind-swept Indian reserve 60 kilometres west of Calgary. The area was also used in filming Little Big Man with Chief Dan George years ago.

The remoteness of the site means little interaction with the public. There are few, if any, curious onlookers and many Calgarians seem unaware the film is being shot. Between 250 and 300 of the reserve's Stoney Indians are extras.

Kadokawa said he chose the site because it closely resembles the terrain in Japan at the time of the battle. He also needed the space for the two huge sets and thousands of extras, mainly students who are

being paid \$75 a day for the grueling work — \$95 if they stick it out for the entire six weeks.

Being able to round up 800 horses easily was also a consideration.

"You could not find so many horses in Japan," he said through an interpreter at a religious ceremony to open the filming earlier this month.

Kadokawa, who is also a high Shinto priest and poet, says he was first drawn to the story by the spiritual similarity between himself and the character of Kenshin, portrayed by a brooding Ken Watanabe.

TELLS OF KENSHIN

"I am telling the story of Kenshin, a man whose strong character

and spiritual beliefs make him a man we should emulate today and in the 21st century," Kadokawa said.

"The ideology, motivation and strength of warring generals are often closely linked to religion. The power of Kenshin's belief in the Bishamonten is vividly demonstrated by his strategy and confidence on the field of battle.

"I, too, have battled in life and business, motivated by my belief in the Bishamonten. I will use the same strength to guide me in my production of Heaven and Earth."

It is no small undertaking for the unassuming, 47-year-old director, who insists on historical accuracy down to the last detail. Researchers spent months tracking every

source of information on the actual battle.

The result is a set straight out of the 16th century — from the 4,900 costumes to the two fortresses built on the the 1,400-hectare site.

The riders and extras rehearsed for six weeks with experts well-versed in the tactics of 16th-century Japanese warfare. A special horse trainer was hired to look after the horses and train them to fall without hurting themselves during the battle scenes.

"I had no intention of shooting a historical drama in which the warriors are immaculately made up, costumed in handsome armor and return from battle looking as though they never broke a sweat," Kadokawa said.

Actress Amanda Blake star of Gunsmoke, dies

SACRAMENTO (AP) — Actress Amanda Blake, who played the kindhearted Kitty in the Gunsmoke television series, has died at age 61. The cause of death was not released.

Blake underwent surgery for oral cancer in 1977, and afterward made appearances throughout the United States on behalf of the American Cancer Society. She was once a two-pack-a-day smoker.

Gunsmoke, one of the most popular television shows ever, was set in Dodge City, Kan., in the late 1800s. Blake played Kitty Russell, the owner and operator of the Longbranch Saloon.

She left the show in 1974 after 19 years and only worked sporadically, usually in guest appearances for television game shows, movies of the week and such series as Edge of Night, Hart to Hart, and Love Boat.

NEW YORK (AP) — Actor Jimmy Stewart used to hunt big game with his wife, Gloria, but now he's changed his stripes and is working for conservation.

"Back in my garage, I've got antelope horns and a tiger head from India," Stewart is quoted as saying in the latest issue of Parade magazine, which appears Sunday. "But after two years of hunting, we changed to conserving the game," he said.

Stewart is campaigning on behalf of the African elephant, whose numbers have been greatly depleted by hunters seeking its valuable ivory tusks.

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — Her days of glamor and glitz are over. Jade,

an eight-year-old star chimpanzee, is retiring.

Known as Zippy during her career, Jade is a Clio and Emmy award winner. Among her credits are stints on Late Night With David Letterman and appearances in rock music videos.

She arrived Tuesday at a primate sanctuary about 50 kilometres northwest of San Antonio known as Primarily Primates Inc. The privately funded facility cares for animals that might die by abandonment or laboratory experimentation.

Jade's owners, Frank and Beverly Krevens from New York, said they were surprised at how quickly she adapted to her retirement environment.

"I thought she (first) would be in a period of mourning," Beverly Krevens said.

In human years, Jade is 40 to 50 years old.

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — Graceland, with his mama there, would be Elvis Presley's idea of heaven, say two fans who decorated the big front window of their motel room Wednesday with their idea of the singer's hereafter.

"What would Elvis think heaven was? It would be Graceland with his mama there," said Lynn Watson, 42, of Tucson, Ariz.

Presley died of heart disease at his Memphis residence, Graceland, on Aug. 16, 1977, and hundreds of his faithful are in town for Elvis International Tribute Week, a nine-day string of memorials, parties and fan get-togethers.

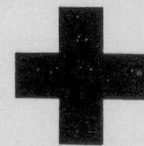

IN NOSTALGIA

Among the strangest shows in '60s television was "The Munsters" (1964-66), a comedy about a family of freaks that mysteriously resembled classic movie monsters.

Herman Munster (Freddie Gwynne), the man of the house, was a well-meaning, suburban Frankenstein monster, intent on bringing up his wolfboy son Eddie (Butch Patrick) to be a proper man like himself. Grandpa (Al Lewis), a plump, gauche Count Dracula, represented the family's Transylvanian roots. Spending his leisure hours in his musty basement laboratory, Grandpa repeatedly foiled Herman's attempt to run a conventional household free of hocus-pocus. And Herman's wife Lily (Yvonne DeCarlo) was the only housewife in the neighborhood who resembled a vampire.

One aspect of the show's humor lay in its portrayal of suburban monsters and their version of the typical "Leave It to Beaver"-type household: Instead of a family dog, they had a pet fire-breathing dragon (named Spot) who dwelled under the staircase; when Lily "cleaned" the house, she used a vacuum that blew dust out instead of sucking it in; and the family's cuckoo clock housed an erratic raven, which crowed, "nevermore," instead of the standard "cuckoo."

Another odd aspect of "The Munsters" was the family's relationship with the rest of the world. The Munsters believed that they were the only normal-looking "people" around, with the exception of their poor niece Marilyn (Beverly Owen, later Pat Priest), a blond beauty (to us) whom they considered their ugly duckling.

Although "The Munsters" was only moderately popular during its network run, two decades of reruns have gained it a considerable cult following. A new version of the show (with different actors) is on the air now.

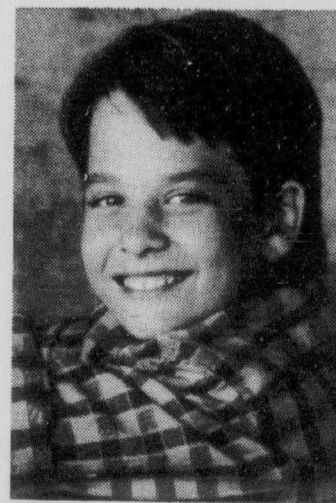
