

## Unique View of Montreal Harbor Showing Wonderful Transformation of Port in Recent Years



NEW WHARF SHEDS AND GRAIN CARRIERS HAVE MADE PORT OF MONTREAL ONE OF THE BEST ON THE CONTINENT—The above illustration is a reproduction of a photograph taken from the Harbor Commissioners' shops on the guard pier. It shows the central part of the harbor, where the principal ocean liners are usually berthed. On the extreme right is the City Hall; on the left the Customs Warehouse. During the past few years gigantic new piers have been built on the waterfront lying between these two extremes, and these are included in the picture. The sheds and grain-carriers on these piers are among the best and most up-to-date on the American Continent. In the centre of the picture will be noticed the Harbor Commissioners' mammoth elevator, No. 1. At the first pier on the elevator's left the SS. Laurentic (the biggest ocean liner that ever came up the St. Lawrence to Montreal) is berthed. On the left of the illustration is the R.M.S. Virginian and other transatlantic vessels. MAKING JOAN OF ARC A BEATA; THE SCENE IN ST. PETER'S BASILICA AT THE RECENT BEATIFICATION—The official beatification of Joan of Arc took place before an enormous congregation. In the centre of the Gloria above the altar was a picture of the new Beata. At the beginning of the ceremony a veil covered this. This fell away immediately Joan of Arc had been declared worthy of the honor of beatification. At the same time, the bells of St. Peter's rang out, the lights on and about the Gloria were lit, and the choir began the "Te Deum."



A STREET PICTURE OF THE NEW SULTAN OF TURKEY—His Majesty Mohammed V, arriving at the Mosque of St. Sophia to make his first Scamluk. As the cortege emerged at Seraglio Gate a band played the national hymn, and a mighty shout went up, "Long live the Padishah!" entirely drowning the muezzin's calls to prayer from the lofty minarets of the mosque. By the side of the Sovereign's entrance, which was open to-day for the first time in twenty-six years, were two bound rams. A black-robed ulema held uplifted the sacrificial knife, and as the Shadow of God upon earth approached the knife descended and deftly cut an animal's throat, thus heralding the coming of the Padishah. The Sultan Mohammed was met by the Chief Mufti and other members of the ulema body, and was conducted to the Imperial seat, which is opposite the Friday pulpit. The officiating sheik mounted this with a drawn sword, symbolizing the capture of Saint Sophia by force of arms.

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The Beatification of Joan of Arc.

JOAN OF ARC, the peasant girl who led the armies of France at Orleans in 1431, and was burned by the English for a witch, had conferred upon her the ceremony of beatification in St. Peter's, Rome, on Low Sunday. This ceremony is one of the degrees in the process of canonization—a prelude to final sainthood; and although it has been under the consideration of the Roman Curia since 1876, ten years more must still elapse before Joan finally takes rank among the sanctified. The services were of an imposing nature, brilliant with ecclesiastical splendor, and were witnessed by a multitude of eighty thousand people, thirty thousand of whom were pilgrims from France. This ceremony cost \$125,000, and an equal amount must yet be expended before the completion of the canonization.

Joan of Arc is now to be entitled "The Blessed," "Venerable Servant of God," and, in addition, "Protress of France." Cardinals Rampolla and Marinelli, with the other cardinals attached to the Congregation of Rites, conducted the ceremonies. The Pope, who, according to the Rubric, does not attend beatifications, as a mark of special devotion assisted at a solemn benediction on the afternoon following the ceremony, when he knelt in prayer before a picture of "The Maid."

St. Peter's was gorgeous with decoration and radiant with illumination. The walls were hung with paintings and relics, depicting the martyrdom of "La Pucelle." The climax of the proceedings came when Joan had been declared worthy of the honor of beatification; the veil fell away from the great picture of the new Beata, above the altar, and she was revealed as receiving a sword from St. Michael. This climax is reproduced in the illustration on this page.



A GREAT MERCHANT PRINCE; THE LATE SIR DONALD CURRIE AND LADY CURRIE—Sir Donald Currie, who died at Sidmouth recently at the age of eighty-four, was born at Greenock of Belfast stock and began his career in Liverpool. He founded the Castle Line in 1862, running clippers to India, and five years later threw down the gauntlet to the Union Line, which ran to the Cape. After years of competition the two lines combined in 1900, with Sir Donald as chairman. He was a great friend of Mr. Gladstone and took the veteran statesman and Lord Tennyson on a trip to Norway in 1893. He was knighted in 1881. He married in 1851 Miss Margaret Miller. One of his daughters married Mr. Molteno, first Prime Minister of Cape Colony. The line began with two vessels of 1,400 tons; it has thirty-seven to-day, with the 13,000 tons Armadale Castle seen in the background of the picture.

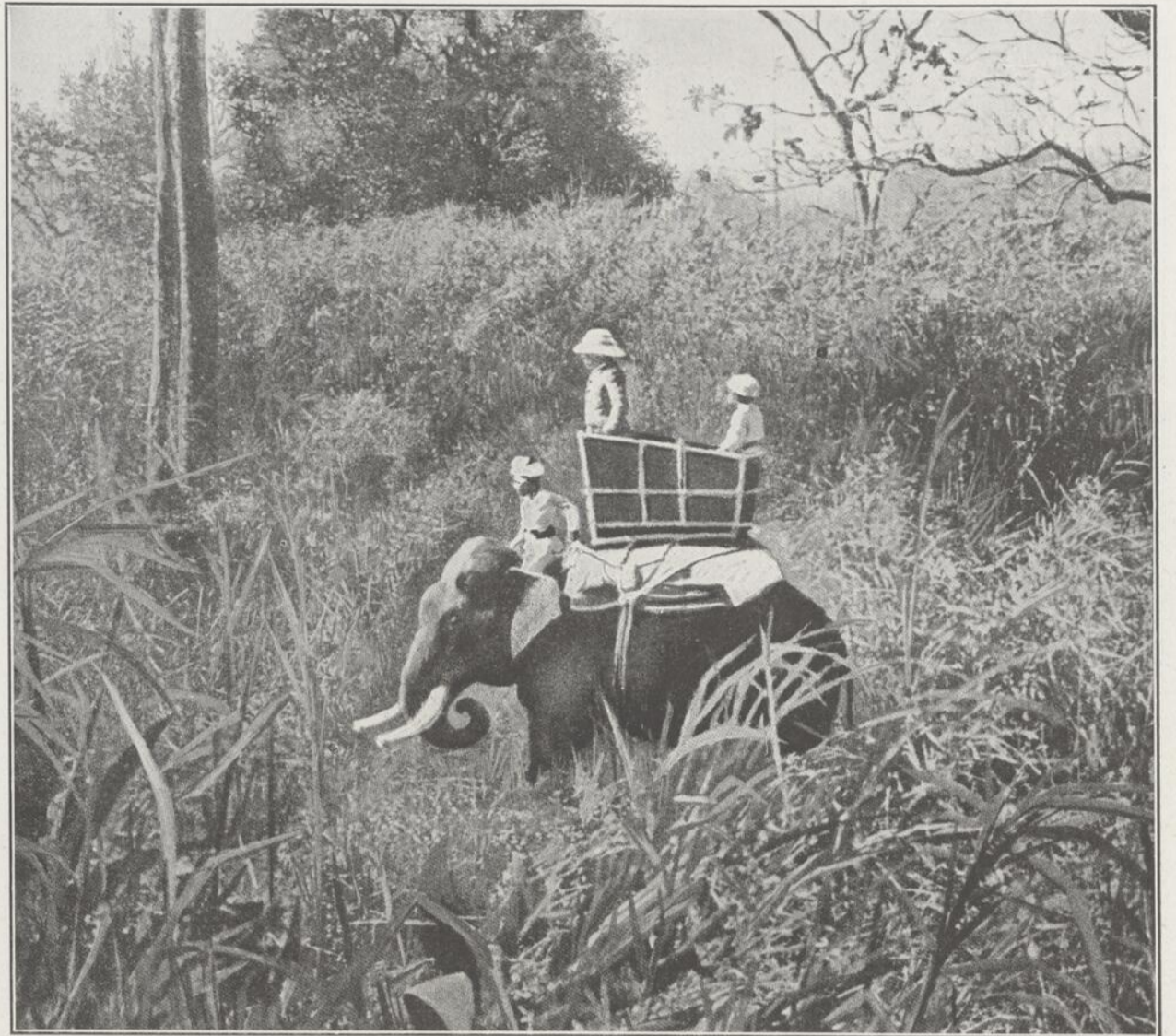
BASEBALL FROM THE OUTSIDE

LAST fall during the great championship series between the Giants and the Chicago Cubs, an unknown man climbed up a telegraph pole on the outside of the fence. He climbed clear to the top, and wrapped his legs around the post. The people on the ground had to laugh at him, he made such a comical sight. He looked like a monkey. But it was hard work hanging on there, inning af-

ter inning. The man's legs began to cramp, but his enthusiasm would not let him come down. When a good play was made he held his elbows tightly against the post, and clapped his hands. He was seeing a great game of baseball; nothing else mattered. But the unknown man's legs became cramped, and he fell to the ground. He was killed. Why was it that this nameless man risked his life to see a score of men throw and knock a wad of leather around over a field? The answer is hard.

But everybody else is just like that unknown man; only everybody doesn't climb a pole. Everybody, whether young, old, or halt, likes baseball. It would take some subtle psychologist like Hugo Munsterberg to tell just why everybody likes baseball. It is love—it defies analysis. One day last fall I overheard one Englishman, who was just new to this country, tell another Englishman about a game he had seen at the Polo Grounds. Said the first Englishman: "It was a fine game. Somebody threw a ball, and somebody hit it, and some-

body else caught it, and then somebody else picked up the same mallet and tried to hit the ball again. It was a great game." He didn't know a home-run from a shot-out, but still there was something about the game that he liked. Not many weeks ago a celebrated literary critic and lecturer, while making an address, said in speaking of the Great American Novel, which is yet to be written: "We are all anxiously awaiting the Great American Novel, and we are all wondering just what it will be about, what phase of life it will cover, whether it will be of horse-trad-

The Assam grass is twelve to fifteen feet high, and the clearings are made by turning twenty or thirty elephants to trample down the growth. The view shown was taken by Colonel Victor Brooke, the Viceroy's Military Secretary, who, on the same trip, was charged by a rhinoceros and had his right arm fractured in two places while photographing the animal, which he was attempting to head back to the Viceroy.

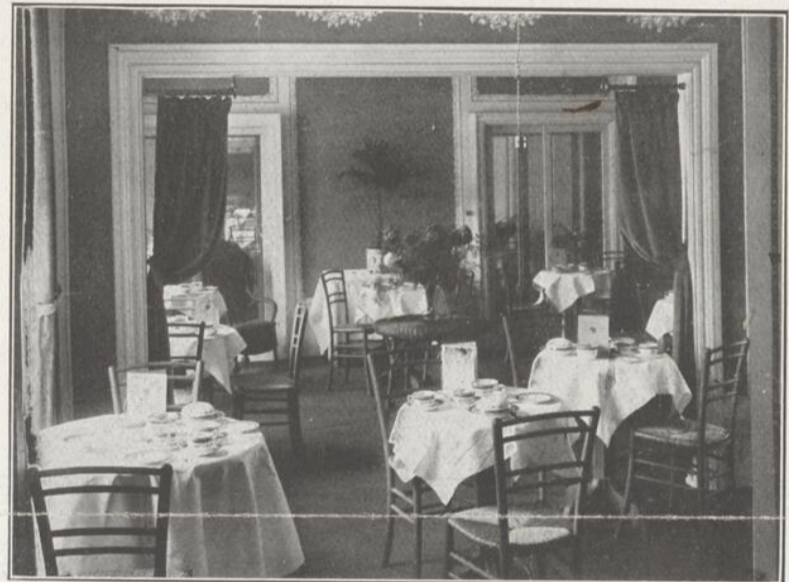
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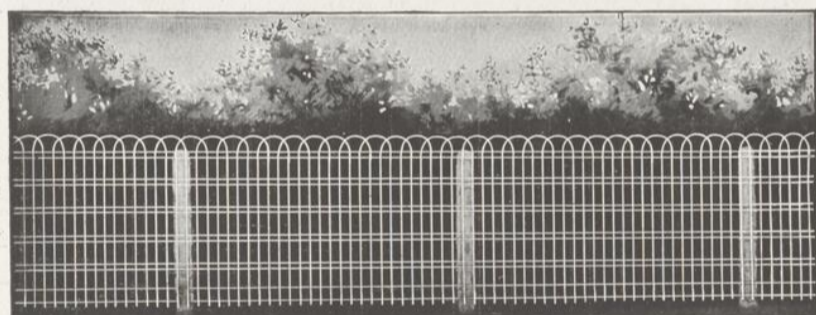

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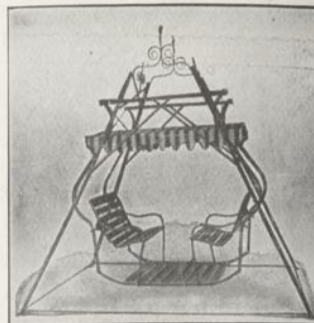
