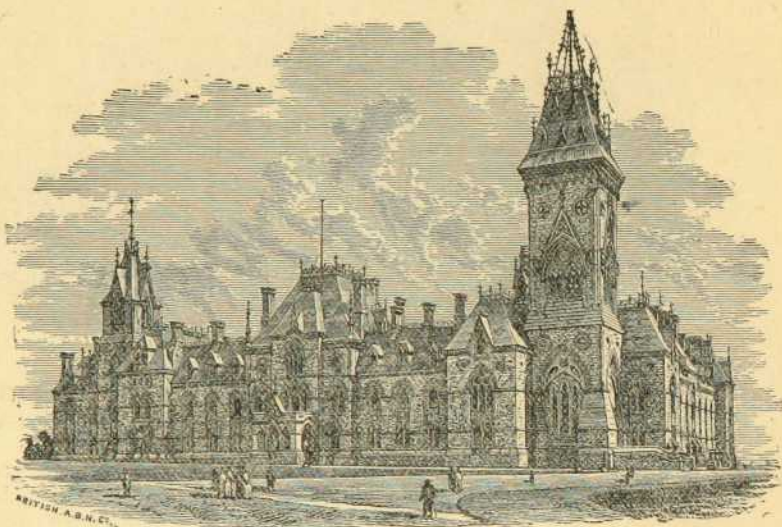

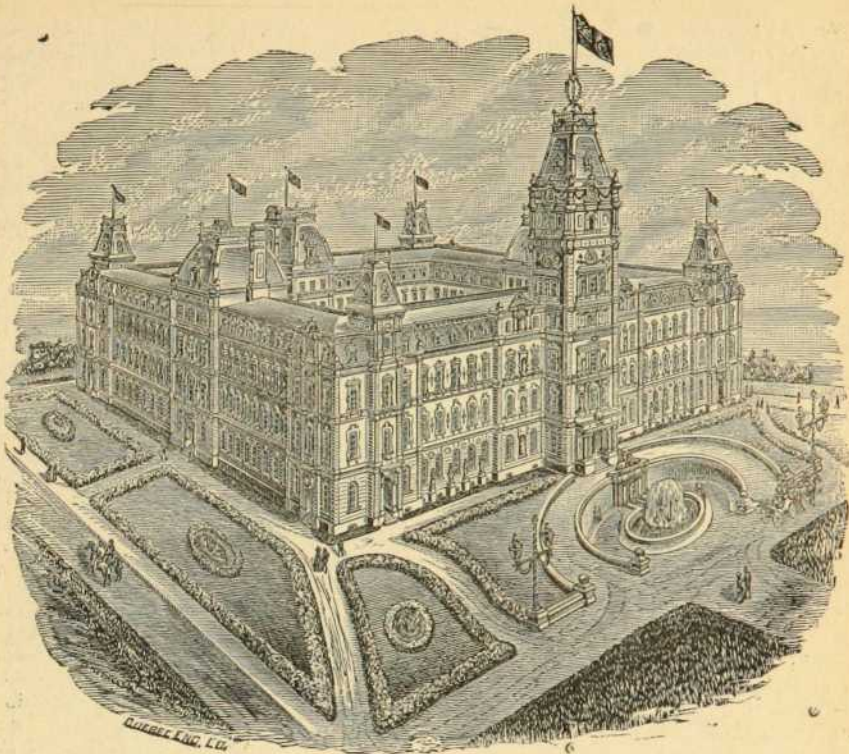

RATES OF CARTAGE IN THE LOWER TOWN AND ST. ROCH'S.

For loading, carriage and unloading of every load called a common or ordinary load, for one of the distances mentioned in the above Schedule, or for any proportional or other distance not otherwise described, *thirteen cents*, to increase *five cents* per load when carried further than the distance between the two stations and so on *increasing five cents* for every additional distance.

FLOUR BARILS, &C.

For every one hundred empty flour barrels and for all other empty Casks of an equal dimension, the Carter finding cribs or *échelles* and ropes, carried one distance, *sixty-two cents*, to increase twenty-one cents for every additional distance.

GRAIN AND SALT.

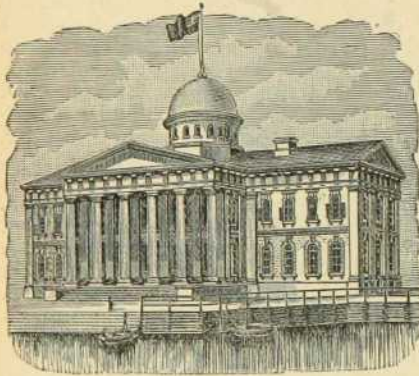
