Montreal is still declared a state of war.

The Nordenfjard expedition is reported to be safe in Behring's Straits.

Some 1000 men are now being sent to remain unsettled for some time to come.

The recent arrivals at Winnipeg, Minn., by the lakes made the trip for four and a half days.

Two farmers named King and Swain were drowned at Niagara, Ont., on the 26th inst.

The Duke of Edinburgh will not assume command of the B. N. A. W. 1st station this year.

Yakob Khan's brother, Ayoub, is at Hanoi, preparing to seize Cambois whenever it is vacated.

A Paris despatch says that M. Blandy D'Amson has renounced his threatened attack on M. Gambetta.

One hundred and eighty-six houses in a village in the Government of Ufa, Russia, have been burned.

The Ottawa volunteers, returned from Montreal on the 26th, speak highly of Montreal's hospitality.

Joseph Ross, farmer, was drowned in the Boye River, Winnipeg, Man., on the 26th, by his boat upsetting.

The Powers have requested Turkey and Greece to appoint commissioners to arrange the frontier dispute.

Prince Bismarck has submitted to the Prussian Parliament the treaty concluded between Germany and Samoa.

Catherine Churchill was executed in jail at Taunton, Somersetshire, on the 26th inst., for the murder of her husband.

The Rowing Match on the Tyne between Planted and Nicholas, 2100 yards, has been arranged for the 23rd of June.

A bill is to be introduced into the Spanish Cortes for the abolition of slavery in Cuba and the employment of Chinese labor.

A man named W. Demolin, 75 years of age, was run over by a train at H. N. W. Railway, near Barrie, Ont., on the 26th inst.

The members of the first Red River expedition have organized to celebrate annually the arrival at Winnipeg on the 24th August, 1870.

Of 14 Whittier court-martialed at Kief on the 22nd inst. will be shot, and the eleven others sentenced to various terms of penal servitude.

Glasgow met brought over by the Anchor Line Steam Company on Friday night, yesterday and went to work in place of the striking longshoremen.

An Alexandria despatch says that two companies of British troops, one of 200 men, and the other of 100 men, have been made prisoners by the natives of Bahr.

The treaty of peace between Yakob Khan and the British Government is signed. Every political and commercial advantage the British hold has been gained.

The steamer "Manicouche" has returned to a landing in the coastal strip up the Assiniboine to Fort Nelson, 800 miles by land. It is the first boat to ever penetrate to the mouth of the river.

It is understood that the Royal speech at the opening of the Spanish Cortes will express the Government's desire to render the position of the Colonies similar to that of the provinces of the mother country.

Negotiations for the treaty relative to the importation of coolies into Cuba are in progress at Madrid, but the Spanish Government will insist upon conditions as to the mode of passage, and require that the Chinese agree.

The Betting on the Derby stakes on Wednesday is now 375 to 10 against "Cadogan," 11 to 10 against "Plover," 11 to 2 against "Victor," 10 to 1 against "Falmouth," and 100 to 9 against "Caxtonian."

Private information has been received in Halifax, N.S., that Governor-General and Princess Louise will not spend the summer in Halifax, but may pay the city a visit for a week. They will visit and be formally received in St. John's, Nfld., and in the parts of Ontario. They will also visit the United States.

THE QUEEN'S BIRTHDAY.

HOW IT WAS OBSERVED IN ENGLAND.—LONDON, May 26.—Saturday, being the 50th anniversary of the birthday of Her Majesty, the Queen, the day was marked throughout the country, especially in the metropolis and at all the principal military and naval stations, to invest the occasion with more than usual solemnity. The principal event was the time-honored parade of detachments of the Household Brigade at the Horse Guards, on the occasion of the trooping of the colors. The battalions of Foot Guards were represented and two regiments of Household Cavalry, the bands being mounted on the parade. The ceremony being witnessed not only by the Field Marshal Commanding-in-Chief, who is always present in his official capacity, but also by the Prince and Princess of Wales, the Duke and Duchess of Edinburgh, the Duke and Duchess of Teck, and other members of the Royal Family. In anticipation of a large attendance to witness the display, the number of spectators having greatly increased during the last few years—positions and other services for viewing it had been constructed, and the Princesses, with the juvenile members of their families, from the windows of the Horse Guards, overlooking the parade. The day was observed as a general holiday in all the public offices, and the guns at the Tower and in St. Mark's, were fired in honor of the Queen. At noon, in accordance with annual custom, the 40th Middlesex (Post Office) Rifles, of which Sir Simeon Fitzmaurice, the Duke of Teck's Colonel, is the commanding officer, in Hyde Park, the parade terminated with an advance in review order, Royal salute, and three cheers for the Queen; and the Hon. Artillery Colonel, in the name of the Prince of Wales, is Captain-General and honorary Colonel, had a special parade of his three regiments, the Cavalry and Infantry, under Colonel Lloyd-Lindsay, at the Artillery ground, Finsbury. A Royal salute was fired from the six-pronged field battery, and the parade was closed by the firing of the London and Westminster Volunteer Corps, which was followed by Colonel Sir Charles Mansel, V.C., M.P., in the grounds of Lambeth Palace, at the 2nd and 3rd City of London Cavalry, in Hyde Park, and about 2,000 Volunteers and Militia at Wimbledon. At Aldershot all the available troops assembled in the Queen's birthday, paraded in review order, and fired a feu de joie, and there were similar parades at Woolwich, Portsmouth, Plymouth, Stonehouse, Dover, and other military stations. Her Majesty's ships at home and at sea were also "dressed" and fired salutes.
