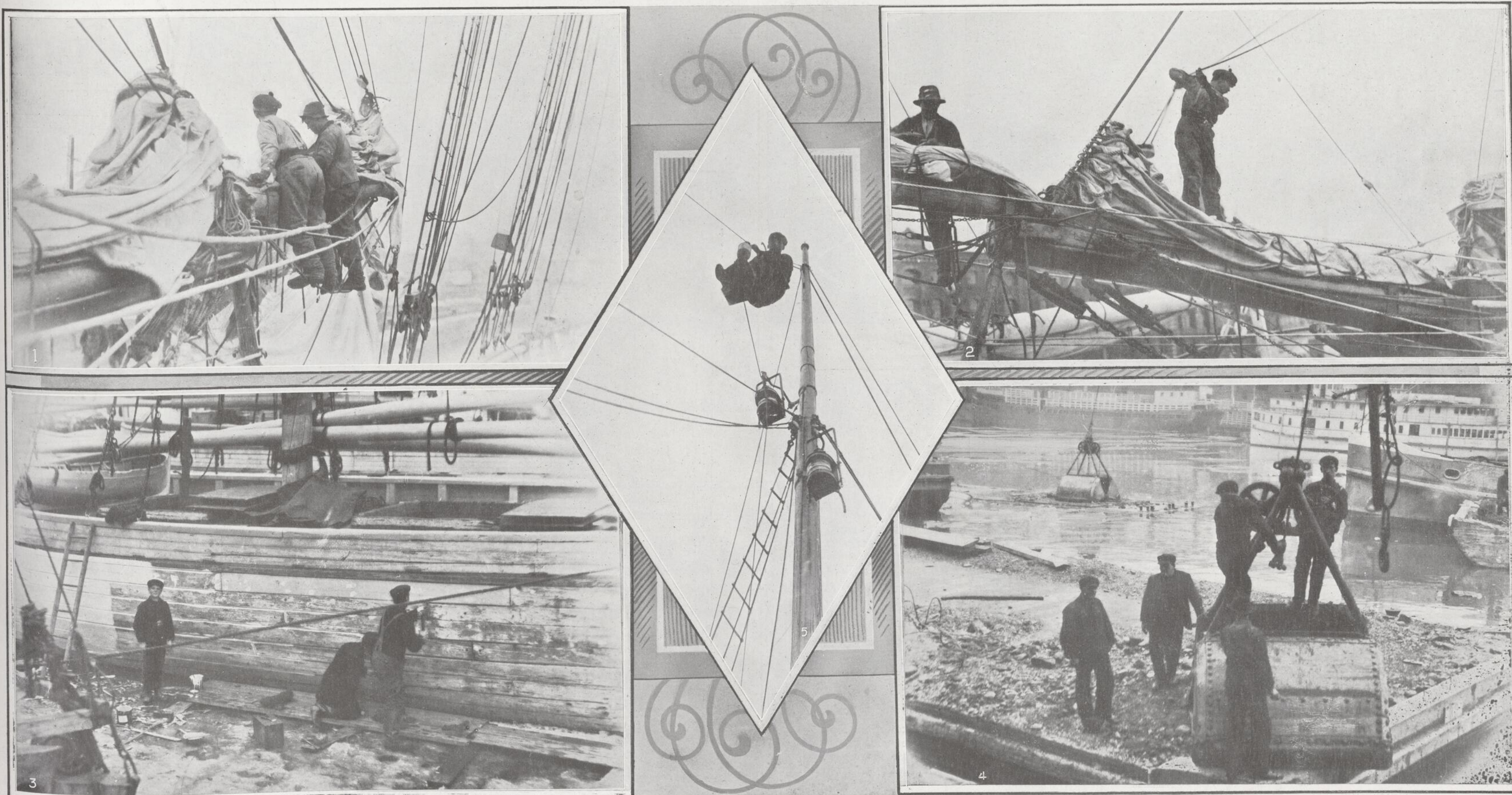


## Montreal Troops Marched to Church Sunday to the Accompaniment of Martial Music and the Skirl o' the Pipes

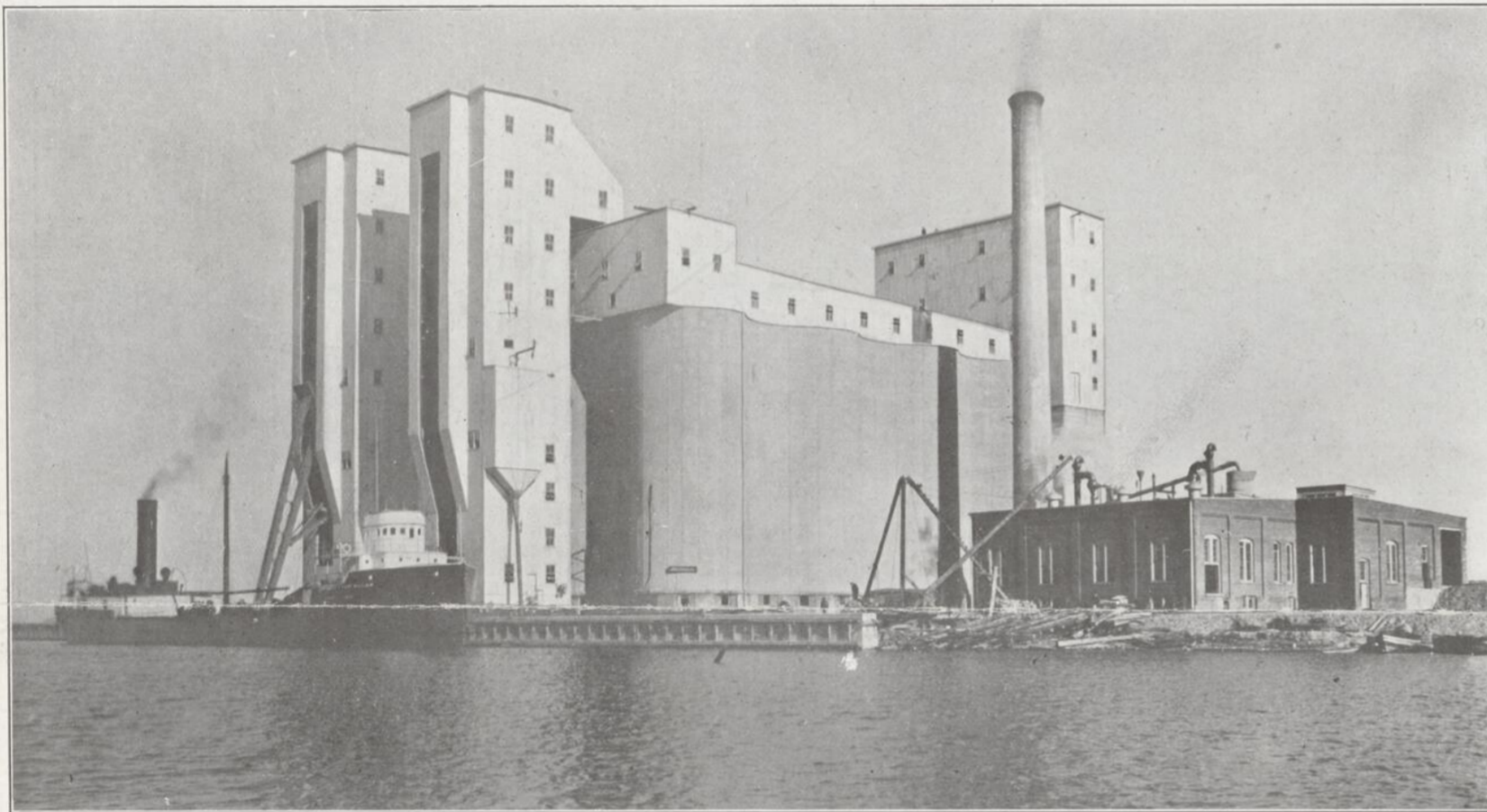
## The Opening of the Port of Montreal this Year Gives Promise of the Greatest Season in the Harbor's History

THE FIRST STATUE EVER ERECTED TO THE MEMORY OF AN AVIATOR—His Grace, the Duke of Argyll, a former Governor-General of Canada, recently unveiled the statue erected at Dover to the memory of the Hon. 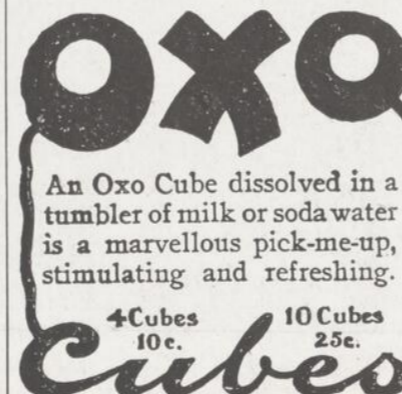

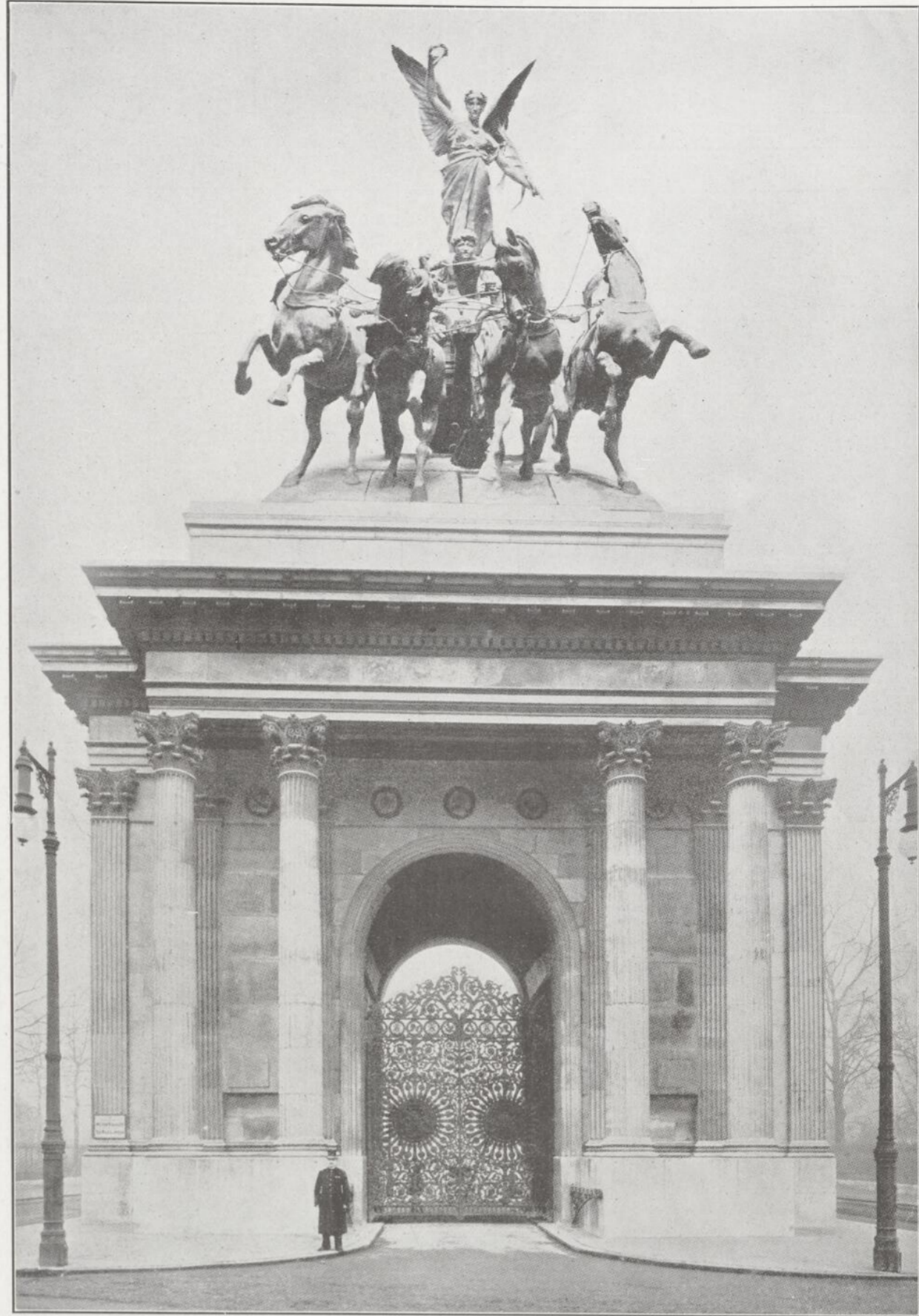

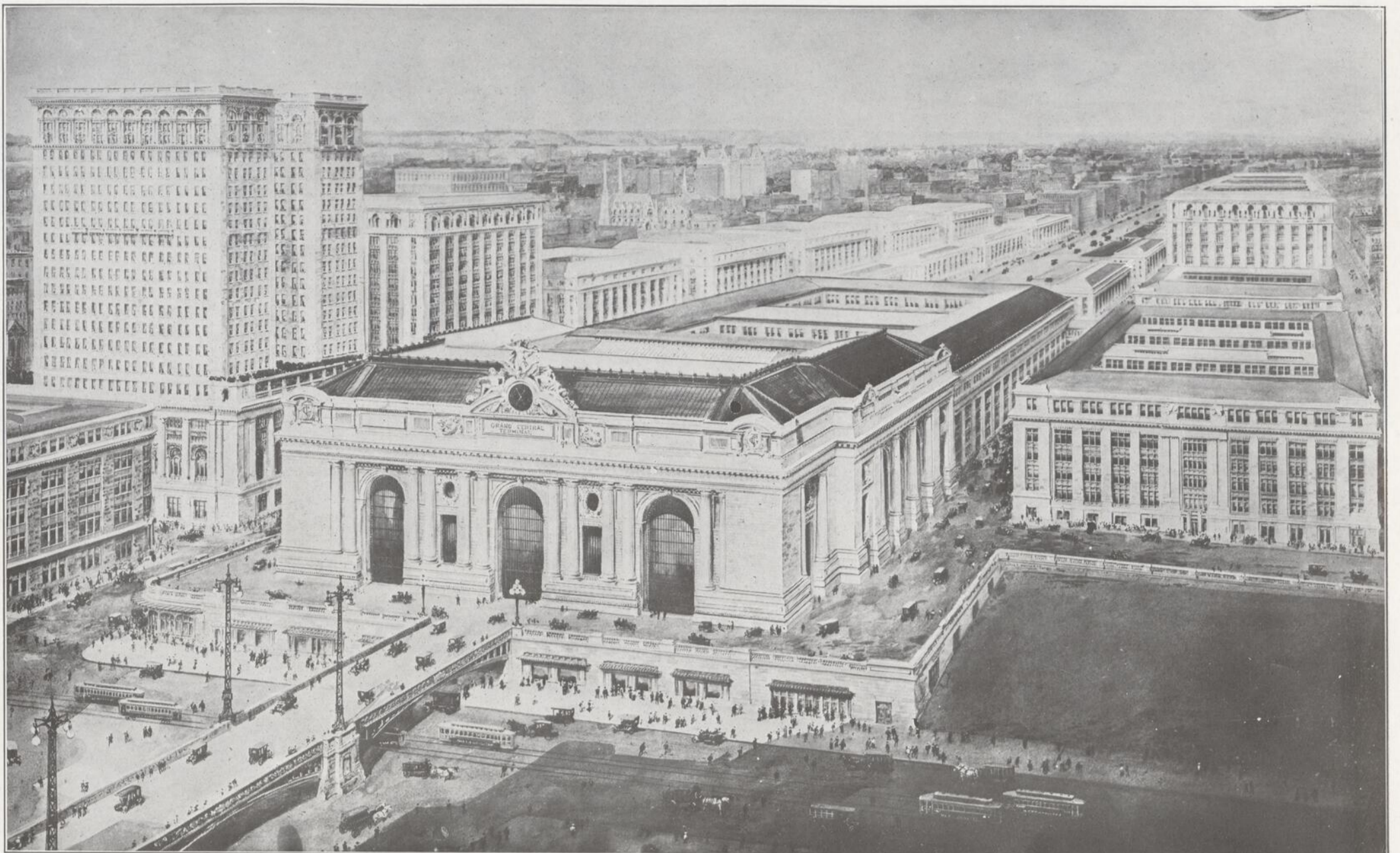

**WINDSOR'S MEMORIAL TO EDWARD THE PEACEMAKER**—This splendid monument was recently unveiled by the Mayor of Windsor in the absence of H.R.H. the Princess Christian, who was to have performed the ceremony. It is of more than ordinary interest, inasmuch as it was designed and modelled by a first cousin (once removed) of the late King, the Countess Feodora Gleichen. The Countess is a daughter of the late Prince Victor of Hohenlohe, who was the third son of the Princess Anne Feodora of Hohenlohe, half-sister to Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria. Prince Victor married the sister of the Fifth Marquis of Hertford, and his children, in consequence, are known as Counts and Countesses, instead of Princes and Princesses. **THE WORLD'S GREATEST RAILWAY TERMINAL**—A bird-eye view of the Grand Central Terminal, New York, which, when finished, will be the keystone in a magnificent development of the largest city in the New World. It will be the centre of the most extensive combination of passenger transportation lines in the world. It is expected that over 90,000 people will use the Terminal daily.

**HONORING THE MEMORY OF KING EDWARD.**

The picture of the King Edward Memorial at Windsor, Eng., which is printed elsewhere on this page, will be of more than usual interest to Montrealers because of the fact that arrangements are now being made in this city for the erection, on Phillips Square, of a splendid monument to His late Majesty, who was the first in the long line of British Monarchs to make a tour of Canada. The Montreal Memorial will face the Cathedral in which His late Majesty attended divine service in 1860.

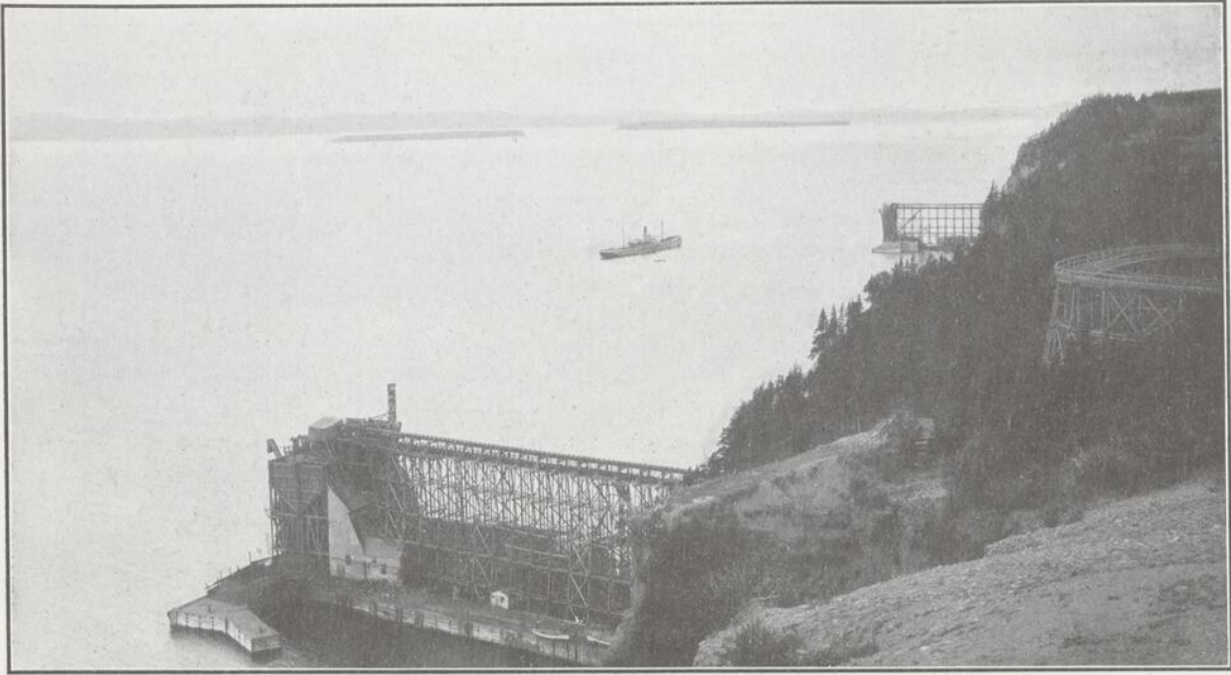
**TWO UNCOMPROMISING OPPONENTS OF HOME RULE**—The Irish Home Rule Bill, which recently passed its second reading in the British House of Commons, will soon be further debated and amended by a Committee of the Whole House. It will then pass its third reading, after which it will be sent to the House of Lords, where it is expected that it will be rejected by a big majority of the peers. In order that it may become law without the concurrence of the House of Lords, it will be necessary for the Commons to again pass it at two successive sessions. After its second rejection by the Lords and its adoption for the third time by the Commons, it will be sent to the King for the royal assent. Thus, it is not anticipated that an Irish Parliament will come into existence in the near future, as it will probably take two years for the promoters of the Bill to overcome the disabilities that will follow its double rejection by the House of Lords. The above picture shows two of the most uncompromising opponents of the measure, namely, Mr. Bonar Law, and Sir Edward Carson. The latter has said that Ulster will never submit to Home Rule. 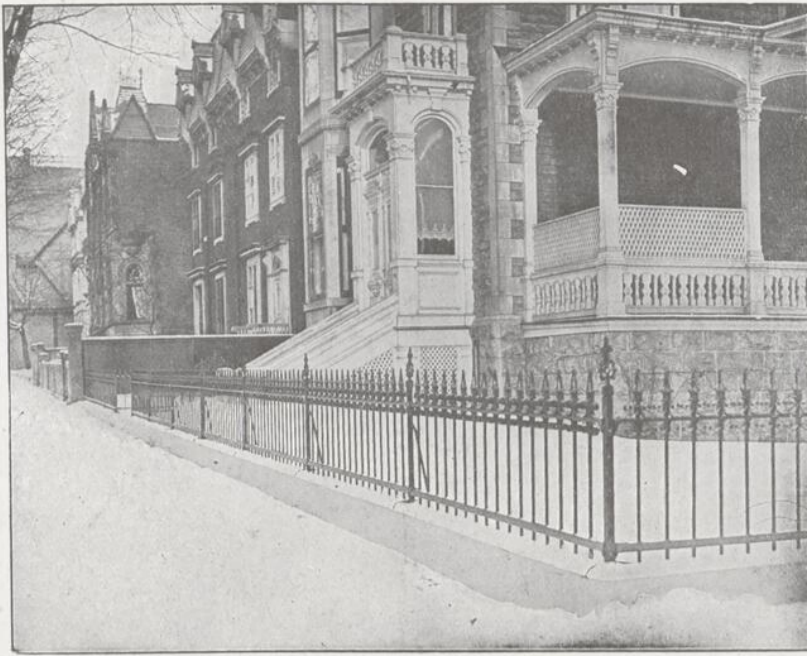

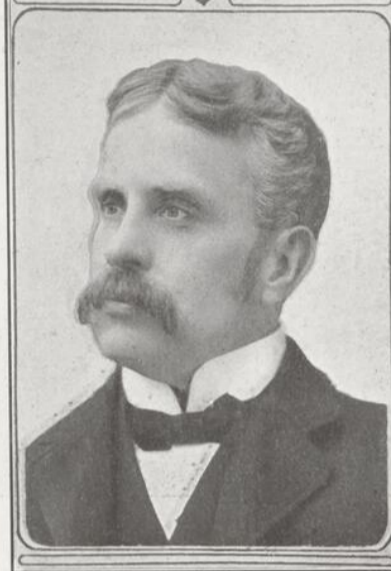
