## STEAMBOATS.

The Richelieu Company's steamers leave at 4 o'clock daily (Sundays excepted) for Batiscan, distant 60 miles; Three Rivers, 90 miles; Sorel, 135 miles, and Montreal, 180 miles. The Company's steamers from Montreal, arrive daily between 5 and 6 a. m.

In 1643 was founded the Quebec Seminary, which afterwards became a regular College, and it had, by successive addition, acquired a high degree of importance, when it was erected by Her Majesty's Royal Charter into a University, under the style and name of *The Laval University*. By this charter, which bears date December 8th, 1852, no change was effected in the constitution of the Seminary itself ; but a Council composed of the Directors of the Institution, and the three senior professors of the several faculties, was empowered to possess and enjoy all the privileges granted to the Universities of the United Kingdom, and especially that of conferring degrees in the Faculties of Divinity, Law, Medicine and Arts. His Grace the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Quebec is, by virtue of his office, Visitor of the University. The superior of the Seminary, for the time being, holds the office of Rector.
