## THE QUEEN AND ROYAL FAMILY.

Her Majesty ALEXANDRINA VICTORIA, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, &c., Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India (in India, Shri Shri Rani Victoria, Kaisar-i-Hind). Her Majesty was born at Kensington Palace, 24th May, 1819; succeeded to the throne 20th June, 1837, on the death of her uncle, King William IV.; was crowned 28th June, 1838; and married 10th February, 1840, to His late Royal Highness Francis Albert Augustus Charles Emmanuel, PRINCE CONSORT, DUKE OF SAXONY, PRINCE OF COBOURG AND GOtha, who was born 6th August, 1819; died 14th December, 1861. Her Majesty is the only child of His late Royal Highness, Edward Duke of Kent, fourth son of King George III. The children of Her Majesty are:

Her Royal Highness Victoria Adelaide Mary Louisa, PRINCESS ROYAL OF ENGLAND AND PRUSSIA, born November 21, 1840, and married to His Royal Highness William the Crown Prince of Germany, January 25, 1858, and has issue living, three sons and four daughters.

His Royal Highness ALBERT EDWARD, PRINCE OF WALES, DUKE OF SAXONY, CORNWALL AND ROTHSAY, EARL OF DUBLIN, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., K.T.S., G.C.B., P.C., general, colonel of the 10th Hussars, and colonel-in-chief of the Rifle Brigade, born 9th of November, 1841; married 10th March, 1863, to the Princess Alexandra Caroline Mary Charlotte Louisa Julia (born 1st December 1844), eldest daughter of the King of Denmark, and has issue His Royal Highness Prince Albert Victor Christian Edward, born 8th January, 1864; His Royal Highness Prince George Frederick Ernest Albert, born 3rd June, 1865; Her Royal Highness Princess Louisa Victoria Alexandra Dagmar, born 20th February, 1867; Her Royal Highness Princess Victoria Alexandra Olga Mary, born 6th July, 1868; Her Royal Highness Princess Maud Charlotte Mary Victoria, born 26th November, 1869, and His Royal Highness Prince Alexander John C. Albert, born 6th April, 1871, died 7th April, 1871.

Her Royal Highness Alice Maud Mary, born April 25, 1843, married His Royal Highness Prince Frederick Louis of Hesse, July 1, 1862, died Dec. 14, 1878; issue living, four daughters and one son.

His Royal Highness Alfred Ernest Albert, Duke of Edinburgh, born Aug. 6, 1844; married the Grand Duchess Marie of Russia, Jan. 9, 1874, and has issue a son and four daughters.

Her Royal Highness Beiena Augusta Victoria, born May 25, 1846; married to His Royal Highness Prince Frederick Christian Charles Augustus of Schleswig-Holstein, Sonderburg-Augustenburg, July 5, 1866, and has issue living, two sons and two daughters.

Her Royal Highness Louisa Carolina Alberta, born March 10, 1848; married to the Marquis of Lorne, eldest son of the Duke of Argyll, March 21, 1871.

His Royal Highness Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, born May 1, 1850; married Princess Louise Margaret of Prussia, March 13, 1879; issue, a daughter, born Jan. 15, 1882, and a son, born Jan. 13, 1883.

His Royal Highness Leopold George Duncan Albert, Duke of Albany, born April 7, 1853; married April 22, 1882, Princess Helen of Waldeck; died March 29, 1884; issue a daughter, born Feb. 26, 1883, and a son born July 9, 1884.

## POLICE ALARM.

Art. 1.—12 strokes repeated twice on the alarm gongs in each station, and on the alarm bells, will be the signal for all officers and sub-constables on duty in the station to proceed at once to the central station.

Art. 2.—14 strokes repeated three times will be the signal for all officers and men at stations, and on beat to proceed at once to the central station.

Art. 3.—In day-time, after 12 strokes are given, all officers and men, not on duty, will report immediately at the central station. This rule will apply to men off duty during the night.

The first class shall include all carts, trucks, waggons, and other vehicles running within the city for hire or reward, not otherwise expressly provided for, and shall pay:—

For every cart, truck, or other two-wheeled vehicle— <i>Two Dollars</i> .....	\$2.00
For every waggon or four-wheeled vehicle, drawn by one horse— <i>Six Dollars</i> .....	6.00
For every waggon or four-wheeled vehicle drawn by two horses, and made to carry a load under 4,000 lbs. weight.— <i>Seven Dollars</i> .....	7.00
For every heavy waggon, float or other four-wheeled vehicle, drawn by two or more horses, and made to carry heavy articles or materials weighing 4,000 lbs., or upwards.— <i>Nine Dollars</i> .....	9.00
For every dible— <i>Four Dollars</i> .....	4.00

The second-class shall include all carts, waggons or other vehicles used by merchants, traders, manufacturers, contractors, for the conveyance or delivery of the articles or effects dealt in, manufactured, or made use of by them, for each of which there shall be paid, in addition to the rates charged for in the first-class—*Two Dollars and fifty cents*..... 2.50

The third-class shall include all carts, waggons, or vehicles used by expressmen, bakers, brewers, distillers, farmers, or gardeners, for each of which there shall be paid, in addition to the rates charged for in the first-class—*Five Dollars*..... 5.00

1. For every hearse drawn by one horse ... 10 00.

2. For every hearse drawn by two horses. \$14 00  
Parties obtaining licenses, as aforesaid shall moreover pay the annual assessment on all working horses, employed in drawing the above-mentioned vehicles or carriages at the rate of *two dollars and fifty cents* (\$2.50) each, and also twenty-five cents for each number granted by the Chief of Police.

**TARIFF OF CARTAGE.**

*From any place to any other in the First Division, or from any place exclusive of the Harbor wharves to any other place in the City, and vice versa, provided the distance do not exceed ¼ of a mile.*

Articles not herein enumerated of a convenient bulk, not over 1,500 lbs weight, 15 cts. Ashes, pot or pearl, two barrels, 15 cts. Beef, pork or fish, five barrels or tierces, 15 cts. Coal or coke, half a chaldron or half a ton, 15 cts. Crockery, one crate or one hoghead, 15 cts. Flour or fruit, seven barrels, 15 cts. Grain not over 1,500 lbs. weight, 15 cts. Lumber sawn, from yard or boat, 500 feet broad measure, 15 cts. Salt or rice, six bags or six barrels, 15 cts. Firewood, dry, from yard or boat, half a cord, three feet long, 15 cts. Firewood, green or from rafts, half a cord, three feet long, 20 cts. Furniture or luggage, per load, 20 cts. Lumber, green or hard from rafts, 500 feet broad measure, 20 cts. Molasses, sugar or oil, one puncheon, hoghead or load, 20 cts. Pig iron, lead, copper, or tin, one ton, 25 cts. Bar iron or steel, one ton, 30 cts. For every additional half mile, for all above description of goods, 10 cents. And from any of the Harbor wharves to any place in the 2nd or 3rd division within ¼ a mile distance from the boundary line of the first division, and *vice versa*, or from any place [exclusive of the wharves] to any other in the City and *vice versa*, provided the distance do not exceed 1½ mile.—instead of 15, 20, 25 and 30 cts., the rate shall be 25, 30, 35 and 40 cents.

*From any place in the Western section of the first Division*

To the stores and wharves below Wellington bridge, north side of Lachine Canal, 20 cts. The stores and wharves below Wellington bridge, south side of Lachine canal, 25 cts. The Basins above Wellington bridge, north side of Lachine canal, 25 cts. The Basins above Wellington bridge, south side of Lachine Canal, and the stores, stations, factories, etc., at Point St. Charles, 35 cents. The stores, factories, etc., at and above St. Gabriel Locks, north of Lachine Canal, 30 cents. The St. Bonaventure Street Railway Station, 20 cents. The St. Bonaventure Street, from the lower wharves of the Harbor, 35 cts. And *vice versa* for one load.

And from any place in the Eastern section of the first Division—instead of 20, 25, 25, 35, 30, 20, 25 cents, the rates shall be 25, 30, 30, 40, 35, 25, 30 cents.

For any excess over the quantity or weight fixed for a load, additional *pro rata* rates shall be paid.

If delay is caused to the carter by the employer, beyond the time usually required for loading, the carter shall be paid *extra* for such delay at the rate of five cents for every quarter of an hour.

If a carter is called, and there be no load ready for him, or if he be unable to load the goods or articles for want of assistance, he shall be paid

as if he carried a load the distance thus unnecessarily travelled.

**DIVISIONS REFERRED TO ABOVE.**

**First Division.**—The First Division shall comprise the East, Centre, and West Wards (including the south-west side of McGill street and the north-west side of Craig street), and shall be sub-divided into two sections, Eastern and Western, the line of demarcation between them being the centre of St. Lambert and St. Jean Baptiste streets.

**Second Division.**—The Second Division shall comprise the St. Ann, St. Antoine, and St. Lawrence Wards (exclusive of McGill and Craig streets).

**Third Division.**—The Third Division shall comprise (exclusive of Craig street) the St. Louis, St. James and St. Mary Wards.

**TARIF OF FARES FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES.**

**One horse vehicles.**—Time allowed—Fifteen minutes, for one or two persons, 25 cents; for three or four persons, 40 cents. Time allowed—Thirty minutes, for one or two persons, 40 cents; for three or four persons, 60 cents.

**For the first hour.**—For one or two persons, 75 cents; for three or four persons, \$1. For every subsequent hour, for one or two persons, 60 cents; for three or four persons, 75 cents.

**Two horse vehicle.**—Time allowed—Fifteen minutes, for one or two persons, 50 cents; for three or four persons 65 cents. Time allowed—Thirty minutes, for one or two persons, 65 cents; for three or four persons, 75 cents. For one or two persons, \$1; for three or four persons, \$1 25 cents.

**Baggage.**—For each trunk carried in any such vehicle, 10 cents;

No charge for travelling bags, valises, boxes or parcels which passengers can carry by the hand;

a. When the drive exceeds half an hour, hour rate to be charged: fractions of hours for any drive exceeding one hour shall be charged *pro rata* hour rates as above established for drives by the hour;

b. For drives between midnight and four o'clock in the morning, fifty per cent shall be added to the tariff rates above established;

c. The tariff by time shall apply to all drives extending beyond the city limits provided the engagement be made within said limits;

d. Children under five years of age and sitting on their parents or guardians' lap will be admitted free of charge and shall not be held as being included in the word "persons" in the said tariff;

e. The word "drive" wherever it occurs in the tariff shall be held to admit stoppages within the time fixed for said drive.

**CHIMNEY SWEEPING.**

*Clauses of Municipal Act regulating dates of sweeping, tariff to be charged therefor, &c.*

Sec. 93.—Each chimney in use in the said city shall be swept by licensed sweeps three times at least in the course of every twelve months, to be computed from the first day of January in each and every year, name—once between the first of January and the first of May, once between the first of May and the first of September, and once between the first of September and the first of January in each and every year.

Sec. 94.—The said inspector may grant

licenses to sweep chimneys as aforesaid to so many qualified persons as he may deem necessary; and he may revoke and withdraw the said licenses whenever and as often as he may deem expedient; provided, however, that no licensed sweep shall use any brush, broom or other contrivance for the purpose of sweeping chimneys without first having submitted the same to the inspector of buildings for his approval.

Sec. 95.—The inspector may for the purposes aforesaid divide the city into as many districts as he may deem necessary to efficiently carry out the provisions of the next preceding sections, and he may assign a district to every such sweeper, subject, however, to such changes from time to time as the said inspector may deem expedient to make.

Sec. 96.—Such sweeps will be under the superintendence of the said inspector, and it shall be their duty to obey such orders and instructions as he may from time to time issue in connection with the sweeping of chimneys.

Sec. 97.—The following shall be the fees to be demanded and received by each licensed sweep for cleaning and sweeping chimneys.

For sweeping each chimney in a one story house, eight cents.

For sweeping each chimney in a two story house, ten cents.

For sweeping each chimney in a three story house, thirteen cents.

For sweeping each chimney in a house of four or more stories, fifteen cents.

When any sweeper is specially called upon, outside of his ordinary rounds, to sweep any chimney, the charge in that case shall be twenty-five cents.

Sec. 98.—Such fees shall be payable by the occupant of the house or building wherein such chimneys have been swept, so soon after, and as often as such chimneys are swept; and any person who shall refuse or neglect to pay such fees, or shall prevent any such sweeper from entering into any house or building, or shall in any way obstruct or molest him in the execution of his duties, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.

Sec. 99.—Whenever any chimney shall take fire, and it shall appear that the occupant of the house or building where such chimney may be had refused or neglected to have the same swept at any of the periods hereinbefore specified, every such occupant shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.

Sec. 100.—The word "Chimney" as applied to the next preceding sections shall mean the interior or flue of such chimney.

The course of studies, in which religious instruction holds the first rank, is divided into two sections—the classical and the commercial.
