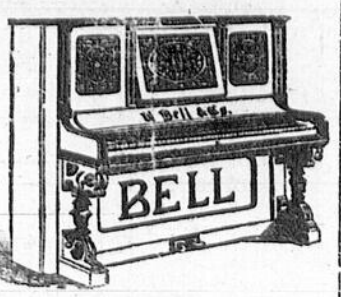

NICOLET CHURCH TROUBLE.

Taxpayers Petition the Lieutenant-Governor to Intervene.

QUEBEC, May 8.-The Lieut.-Governor has been presented with a petition signed by those opposed to the attempt of the Bishop of Nicolet to compel the taxpayers of the town to contribute \$8000 towards the reconstruction of the cathedral, asking him to intervene. It was only after the bishop had threatened to move his episcopal seat that the by-law to raise the money was passed. The town is deeply in debt. The petition says that the total revenue of Nicolet is \$2200, and that if the absolutely necessary expenses of the Corporation are deducted, there is only \$1000 left. In 1891 the Corporation of the town of Nicolet borrowed a sum of \$11,000 at 5 per cent, making an annual interest of \$550. It has never yet been able to raise a sinking fund to extinguish the said debt, and as to the interest on this sum it is very true that it has been regularly paid to the creditors, but it is also true that it has been paid only by means of new loans made at a rate higher than 5 per cent. The town's liability to-day is \$46,500. In the present state of the finances of the town of Nicolet, when it finds itself incapable of facing its obligations formerly contracted, the fact of charging it with a new debt of \$8000, which new debt would have for effect to give the town no new improvement, but of which the only aim would be to make taxpayers pay obligations against their will, would probably a course of ruin for the taxpayers.

HARBOR COMMISSIONERS.

[SPECIAL TO THE STAR.] OTTAWA, May 8.-The Senate was occupied yesterday with the consideration of the bill to consolidate and amend the law governing the Harbor Commission. Hon. Mr. Desjardins, the Opposition should have greater powers over what was really the harbor of the Dominion.

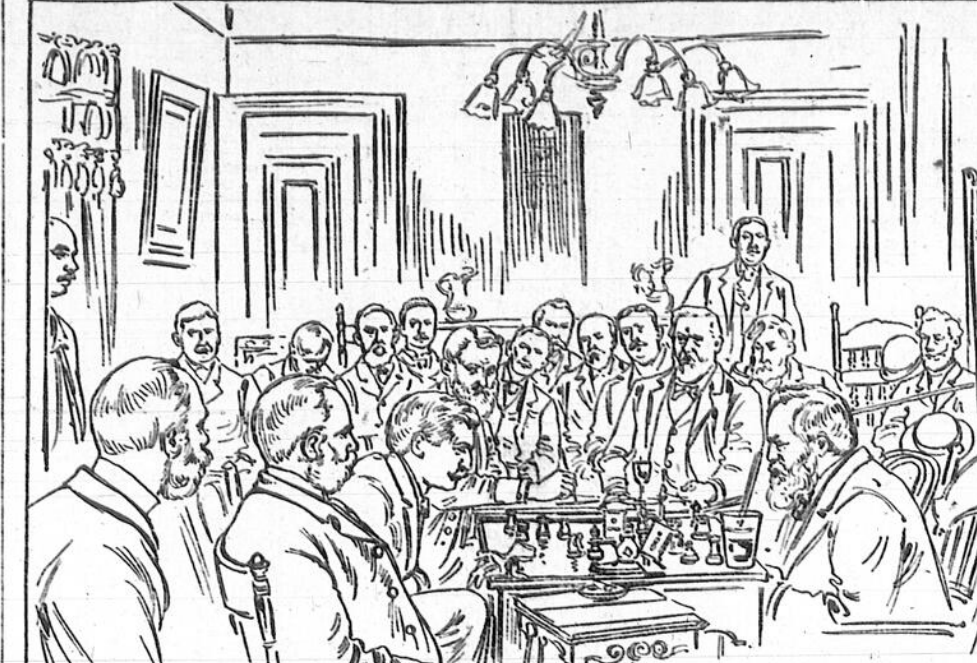
