# 14-year-old virtuoso sees himself as 'normal kid'

VANCOUVER (CP) — Corey Cerovsek, a 14-year-old violin virtuoso, hates being called a child prodigy or a genius.

His tour schedule has him booked into early 1988 and he appeared recently with Johnny Carson on the Tonight Show.

But he describes himself as "just a normal kid, except for the fact that I'm somewhat more talented in some things."

Corey has won numerous prizes and awards since he was five and he is the youngest student ever accepted into the well-known School of Music at Indiana University.

Between appearances as a soloist with symphonies, he has advanced to within a year of an undergraduate degree in math and music and is already taking graduate-level courses.

## DEVELOP TALENTS

"Pretty well every kid has something they're better at," Corey says. "It's just a matter of seeing whether that can be developed. In my case, it's music and math."

Looking like a wispy cherub, he appears at least two years youn-

ger than his age, but his conversation dispels any notion of immaturity.

His press clipping file grows thicker, and the most recent addition is a glowing article in the December issue of Saturday Night magazine.

"I'm sort of nervous to read my own articles," he said in an interview in Vancouver, where he made two appearances with the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra and played one of his favorites—Bruch's Violin Concerto No. 1 in G Minor.

"I don't like reading things where the teachers say 'He's so bright,'" he adds honestly.

## FROM VANCOUVER

Corey was born in Vancouver to Austrian emigrant parents, who moved everything to Bloomington, Ind., two years ago when he was accepted into Indiana University's music program. His 16-year-old sister, Katja, a brilliant pianist, was the youngest piano student ever accepted by that university, where she is in third year.

Corey's mother, Sophia, is an attractive 38-year-old not much bigger than her son. Usually smi-

ling and polite, she comes close to bristling when Corey is asked about the difference between the performance of a child prodigy and that of an accomplished adult virtuoso.

Without waiting for Corey to answer, she says the best advice was given by one reviewer: close your eyes and listen and try not to notice that the sounds are coming from a teenager.

Adds Corey: "It's one of my principal objections to the child prodigy label. It's like saying, 'Yeah, he's good,' but it implies that although I'm good for young standards, it isn't saying anything about how good I am just as a musician."

## OUT OF TUNE

He has earned many standing ovations, but there wasn't one after his second engagement with the Vancouver symphony.

"My strings went out of tune," Corey offers unhesitatingly. "It didn't affect me really, but I was trying to get it back in tune."

His honesty is slightly disarming; there is no trace of pomposity; no hint of being patronizing.

His mother interjects to explain that the music "generalist"

would likely not have noticed.

Corey says he simply adapted to the situation by changing his finger placements.

"It can be quite tricky, because if you have to move one millimetre to the left on the A string, or to left on the G string...." He doesn't finish the sentence, but the message is clear.

## REMAINS POLITE

Corey and his mother had been out to a party until 1 a.m. on the morning of the interview. Corey dutifully and politely sits on the couch to answer the umpteenth interviewer's queries.

But the hurried events of the last few days, meeting old friends, the late night and the anticipation of a flight home leave him slightly reticent. He's not a morning person.

His mother more than compensates, however, by dominating the conversation.

Earlier, a friend of the family shed some light on the relationship between mother and son.

Corey turns 15 in June, but the friend said his mother-chaperone-aide-press agent still cuts his hair and nails and keeps constant watch on the wunderkind.

## NONE HIS AGE

He and his mother insist his childhood is comparatively normal.

"There are no kids my age in my classes, but I can always find them in my neighborhood," he says after Sophia finishes her reply to the question. "I think people my age always find something to talk about," he says with a chuckle.

After he receives his BA in math and music next year, he may begin work on his master's degree. The graduate courses he's already breezing through should make the next degree a cinch.

"I really don't see any difference between the graduate and undergraduate level," he says, again without any sign of bragging or snobbishness. "I believe I can do well in anything if I try hard enough."

The growing fame of Corey and his sister have taken the Cerovseks a great distance in the two years since they left Vancouver in a U-Haul. Father Helmut, who was an unemployed engineer, now commutes daily to a job in Indianapolis.

# It takes a whole month to fully enjoy islands' beauties

*This text, published in the New York Times, Aug. 10, 1867, was mailed to me by Mr. Alex Greene of Rockville, Maryland, (October 5, 1986) and since it is impossible to keep the flavor of this text unless published in its entirety we will do it in many parts. Today we are presenting Part III and next week we will give you the last part wherein he will explain something strange.*

But I commenced this letter with the intention of saying something about Lake Memphremagog and the beauties of this spot as a watering place. In order to appreciate the advantages of this comparatively new Summer resort, one should stay here at least a month. It will take him that length of time to visit and enjoy the beauties of the myriads of islands of all shapes and sizes that dot the surface of Lake Memphremagog through its whole length of 30 miles.

Among the more prominent of these is "Province Island", containing 100 acres, now owned by a Boston merchant, whose son, at present in charge of the island which is used the raising of blooded stock, was so unkind as to refuse permission to Jeff. Davis to land upon his place when he came down this way with a party of Canadians prospecting the other day; the "Twin Sisters", two beautiful islands standing alone together, and covered with evergreens; "Tea-table Island", a charming little islet spread with a thick growth of cedars and a favorite resort of picnic parties; "Whetstone Island", famous for its quarry of scythe-sharpeners; "Round Island", rock-bound, shady and circular; "Minnow Island", noted for its trout fishing facilities;

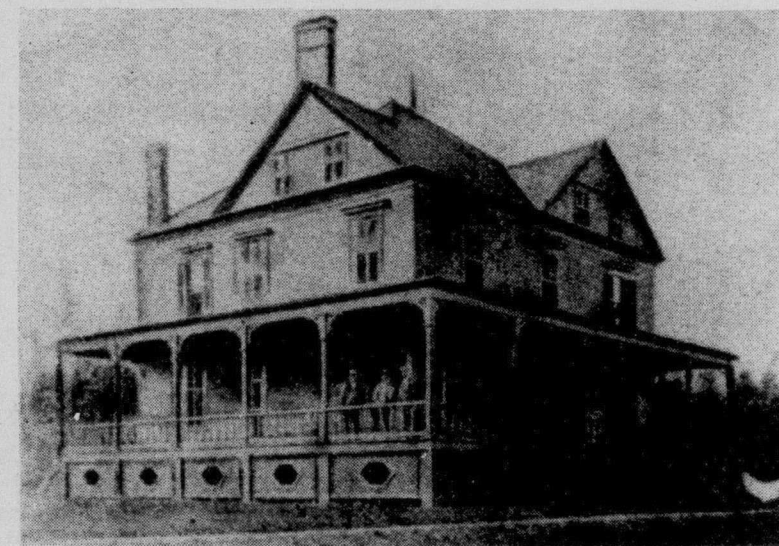
"Skinner's Island", containing the romantic cavern into which the old smuggler, Uriah Skinner, fled when pursued by the Custom-house officers, and from which, as the legend hath it, he never emerged alive; "Long Island", 1½ miles in length, with its palisades and its huge "balance rock", the wonder of all beholders; "Molson's Island", owned by Mr. Molson, a Montreal banker, who has a beautiful Summer residence on its sloping sides; "Lord's Island", "Gibraltar Point", and many other islands, promontories, "points" bays, islets, etc., which render the Lake one of the most romantic and attractive sheets of water to be found in the whole country.

Nor is the mountain scenery of the lake less attractive. First comes "Owl's Head", twelve miles distant and in full view of the Memphremagog House, rising up from the western margin of the lake to a height of 3,000 feet, and affording a magnificent view from its bad summit of the valley of the St. Lawrence, the Green Mountain range, the White Mountains, Willoughby Lake, Jay Peak, Montreal, Stanstead Plain etc. Further down the lake is Mt. Elephantis, or "Sugar Loaf" Mountain, the "Sebastopol" of the Magog country, and at the lower end of the lake towers aloft the majestic Mount

Oxford, the highest mountain in Lower Canada.

At the foot of Owl's Head Mountain, in a shaded nook close to the margin of the lake, stands an elegant and commodious hotel called the Mountain House, kept by Mr. Jennings. This is a favorite resort of visitors to the lake on account of the splendid trout fishing in the immediate vicinity of the hotel, and also from its being the starting point for parties about to make the ascent of the mountain. Mr. Jennings has a large St. Bernard dog which he has trained to act as guide to parties ascending the mountain. He is called "Joe Hookere", and is one of the most careful and intelligent guides it was ever my good fortune to follow.

If any of the party stray off into a wrong path "Joe" immediately leaves his post in the advance and runs in search of the truants, never giving up till he has put all bands on the right track again. The curiosity of tourists often puts the poor dog's sagacity to unnecessary tests, and he is made to travel the journey up the mountain two or three times over in order to convince the skeptical that he knows his business. The ascent of the mountain is always made on foot, and can be accomplished in two hours without difficulty. The ascent of Mount Oxford is now made a great portion of the way in carriages, but as it lies away down at the lower end of the lake among the "Canucks", who haven't had enterprise enough to build a house on the mountain, and can't furnish any comforts for visitors, it is seldom resorted to. The scenery of Lake Memphremagog resembles in many respects that of Lake George, though the variety is

greater.

The western slopes of the lake still retain for the most part their primeval forests, and the vegetation everywhere reaches clear down to the water's edge. On the eastern borders of the lake the land in many places has been cleared up for many years, and presents to the view many cultivated farms one of two villages, and a goodly number of private Summer residences belonging to citizens of Montreal and Quebec.

Among the chief advantages of Memphremagog as a Summer resort, in addition to the lake and mountain scenery and the facilities for rowing, sailing and steamboat excursioning, is the splendid trout fishing that everywhere abounds in the waters of the lake and vicinity. Little more than half

way down the lake there lies on its western border, elevated to the height of several hundred feet above the lake, and cosily sleeping in a narrow valley, formed by the mountain ranges, a beautiful little sheet of water two miles long, fresh, cool, clear and deep, called: "Concert Pond". Here the speckled brook-trout is found in great abundance, weighing all the way from one to ten pounds. The shining beauties from this pond and other places in the vicinity are served up fresh every meal at the Memphremagog and Mountain Houses, and inspire a New-Yorker with unutterable disgust for the reminiscences of stale fish that used to greet his eyes in Fulton and Washington Markets.

## How important is a wine's vintage?

What does it mean when someone says, "It was a vintage year for Champagne"? Or when a wine writer says that 1985 was a classic "vintage" for Piedmont? And how important, after all, is it for a wine to come from a good vintage?

The answer to the first two questions is relatively simple. The word vintage — vendage in French, vendemmia in Italy — means the wine of a particular year. Thus a 1981 vintage Barolo is merely a Barolo wine made from grapes harvested only in that particular year.

Not all wine, however, is necessarily produced from the crop of a single year. Therefore, many bottles that you will find on the shelves of the Société des Alcools bear no date. In these cases you can be almost positive that either the wine is a blend of more than one year's output, or the year and wine in question is not worth remembering.

Lacking a date on the label doesn't mean that the wine is 'second class', however. Sherry, Madeira, and many Champagnes are undated since they represent the result of the blenders art. An art dedicated to give the customer consistent taste and quality year in and year out.

At the other end of the scale, the many 'jug' wines produced by the SAQ such as Cuvée des Patriotes and Feu Follet remain undated since no matter what the year the quality would still remain at the lower end of the scale and would hardly be worth the effort to take note of the year or vintage.

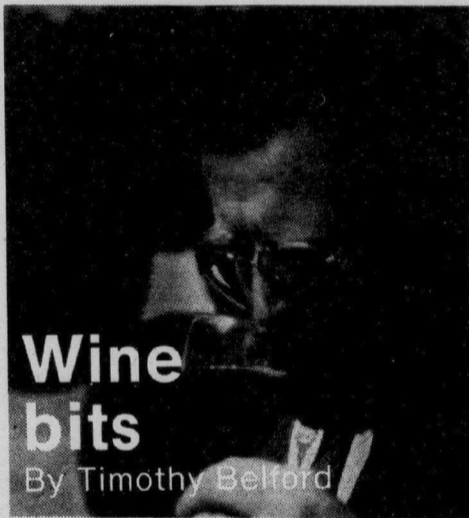
The third question I posed earlier — how important is the vintage — is more difficult to answer. In many cases, particularly in certain sections of Italy, Spain and California where climatic conditions are relatively stable, the year in which the wine was produced is of less importance than it would be in Bordeaux for example where it is common to see a wide variance in weather patterns from year to year.

The vintage date is also relatively less important for wines that are meant to be drunk young. Although too little sun and too much rain are bound to affect any wine, wines that need little time in the bottle seem to suffer less in a bad year. On the other hand, wines such as Barolo and Brunello di Montalcino from Italy, France's Grand Cru Bordeaux, and many of the most expensive German wines — all designed to last for many years — need a good vintage to bring out their truly classic qualities.

Many producers actually refuse to declare a 'vintage' unless the conditions during the year guarantee top quality. Among these are the makers of Champagne and Port as well as the producer of Riserva Ducale Chianti.

Even for the average wine, however, a good vintage can make a noticeable difference. I remember an experiment I carried out several years ago with a 1975 and a 1976 Zellar Swartze Katz in which the participants did a blind tasting and to a person chose the 1976 — according to the experts, the better wine.

As usual, common sense and a good book are probably the best guides. Cheers!

NEW YORK (AP) — ABC's Good Morning America wanted Ron Reagan, the president's son, to tour the Soviet Union for a series of stories, but Soviet officials didn't like the idea.

"We're disappointed," producer John Goodman said after ABC's Moscow bureau was told Wednesday that the Soviet Union had turned down the request. He said ABC would not reapply, "but hopefully they'll reconsider."

Good Morning America wanted Reagan, who has been a correspondent for the show since July 1985, to tour the country from Jan. 19-30 for stories about Soviet life.

"Obviously, it would interesting ... to see impressions of Soviet life through the eyes of our correspondent, who happens to be the president's son," Goodman said.

BURBANK, Calif. (AP) — Television producer Dick Clark apparently is finding his company's initial public stock offering less of a hit than he had hoped.

Dick Clark Productions Inc. said late Wednesday it has scaled back the size of the offering to 1.1 million shares from 1.6 million.

The company's underwriters priced the stock at \$6.50 a share, down from the \$8 to \$10 a share initially projected.

Clark, who has built his American Bandstand TV dance show into a modest entertainment empire, will retain about 86 per cent of the company. Proceeds from the stock sales will be used to expand the company's development, production and distribution of TV programming.

YORKTON, Sask. (CP) — The Yorkton Short Film and Video Festival, the longest continuous event of its kind in North America, will be held in May this year.

The 40-year-old festival is usually held in October, but its board of directors decided the dates should be moved up to attract entries from more film-makers.

Spokesman Mavis MacDonald said are too many film festivals held in October.

"It's difficult to compete with similar events going on in London, England, and Milan, Italy," she said.

# Assault on queen casts contrived pall over unsubtle book

**The Queen's Secret** by Charles Templeton (McCLELLAND & STEWART): \$22.95, 379 pp.

Based on an actual incident in July of 1982, when an unemployed laborer named Michael Fagan found his way into Queen Elizabeth II's bedroom, **The Queen's Secret** is delighting Royalists across Canada who watch the British royal family with almost the same degree of microscopic circumspection that our neighbours to the south devote to their tall cowpoke.

Charles Templeton has created a minor soap opera involving a fictional royal family — Mary III, her escort Edward, their child Victoria, the heiress apparent — in which the stealthy entrance into the Queen's boudoir has somewhat more severe consequences than the laughable incident of recent memory brought about.

Just at the time that Eric Mulholland is paying his midnight visit to the Queen, the British Isles are abuzz with a rumor that the young princess Victoria is contemplating marriage to a young American named Jeremy Walsh, who is a reporter for the *New York Times'* overseas bureau in London.

This marriage between the youngsters from two long-time friendly nations appears at first glance to be a perfect match — until it is revealed that Walsh is from an American family of Polish immigrants which is staunchly Roman Catholic, with several of the males firmly entrenched in the church,

and that Walsh himself has no intention of relinquishing his American citizenship to become a British subject as the consort of the future Queen Victoria would be obliged to do.

The succession laws in England being sacrosanct, as Edward VI and his lady Mrs. Simpson, and Margaret and her beaux learned, this love match between the beloved Vicky and the Yank appears doomed.

The further complication in Templeton's simply written, often blatantly predictable novel is that the visitation to the Queen's quarters was accompanied by an unthinkable assault on her person, with the result that the Queen may indeed be carrying a child fathered by this culprit. In view of the fact that Queen Mary and Prince Edward were just about to announce that they were expecting a new child, and heir, this unfortunate incident occurs just at a fateful moment to put the identity of the Queen's child's father into question, casting a rather contrived pall over this unsubtle book.

The succession coming under this double threat of Vicky marrying a foreigner and the Queen's

carrying an unknown heir, Templeton's British version of "Dallas" takes on the complexion of some of the slick political novels of Jeffrey Archer.

Templeton relieves the soap opera aspects of his book with some fairly well-known details about such royal institutions as Buckingham Palace, Windsor Castle, Sandringham, and No. 10 Downing Street. The players in the slowly unfolding drama include a Conservative prime minister and a sleazy Fleet Street scandal journalist who dogs the steps of Vicky and her young American lover.

Merely the royal flavors of this book, if not the title alone, seem to have been the only considerations that book buyers have thought about in making **The Queen's Secret** a bestseller in this country.

### RECORD REVIEWS

**Dave Clark's TIME (CAPITOL-EMI)**

One of the auxiliary groups who flanked the Beatles on their North American invasion of 1964 was the Dave Clark Five, the leader of which recently surfaced in the 80's with a musical that premiered at London's Dominion Theatre on April 9, 1986. Dave Clark's five year labor on the stage play saw him writing almost all of the 27 songs that are featured in the show, and now the soundtrack album has been released, with several of the two record set's tunes already being greeted with much airplay and video action.

The albums present some good songs sung by such luminaries as Freddy Mercury, Cliff Richard, Julian Lennon, Murray Head, Leo Sayer, Dionne Warwick and Ashford & Simpson, with Clark acting as executive producer of the entire package.

Already the song by the young Lennon, "Time Will Teach Us All" is garnering video attention, and the song "Time" by Freddy Mercury is on a par with some of the slower, melodic Queen arrangements such as "Find Me Somebody To Love" which have been all but abandoned on their most recent albums; Cliff Richard's rendition of "Born To Rock 'N' Roll" doesn't suffer from the presence of Dave Stewart on keyboards on the track, plus guitars by Billy Squier, who also helps out on the vocals; Leo Sayer provides a couple of animated tunes, "One Human Family" and "I Know I know", and generally speaking, most of the artists make favourable impressions.

All of the possible plays on the word "time" are made by Clark, and the voice-overs by Laurence Olivier add a toney aspect to the album which is the equivalent to about four Alan Parsons Projects in scope. Whether **TIME** has the longevity and appeal of **TOMMY** or **HAIR** remains to be seen, but there



is no question that several of the songs on the crammed-with-music four sides will make it onto the charts — even though the dance music and R&B orientation of some of the music has fortunately enough faded in popularity since Dave Clark began this ambitious project in 1980.

### VIDEO SCREENINGS

**CRAWLSPACE (LIGHTNING VIDEO)**

This horror flick has a very European flavour, making it just a touch more arty than its American counterparts, if scarcely any less bloody or horrible. It combines a number of genres — the haunted house angle with a young woman at the mercy of a crazed attacker, the mad Nazi doctor angle with a psychopathic son of a war criminal Nazi father who got his jollies from experiments resulting in his patients' death, an apartment complex inhabited by a bevy of curvy, voluptuous female targets — managing to rivet them together with the disconcerting cinema presence of Klaus Kinski, who plays the loony Karl Gunther. Gunther has constructed a diabolical crawlspace and air vent system that lets him view the secret goings on in the apartments of his tenants, and allows him to let loose mangy looking small rats to terrify them.

One by one the girls get knocked off in ingenious ways until the central figure of this horror arrives in the person of Lori Bancroft, played by Talia Balsam. Balsam presents a challenging victim for the mad Gunther and the climax to this film has a neat turnaround twist to its surprising ending. Not for the weak of stomach or heart.

**MY BEAUTIFUL LAUNDRETTE (CINEPLEX-ODEON VIDEO)**

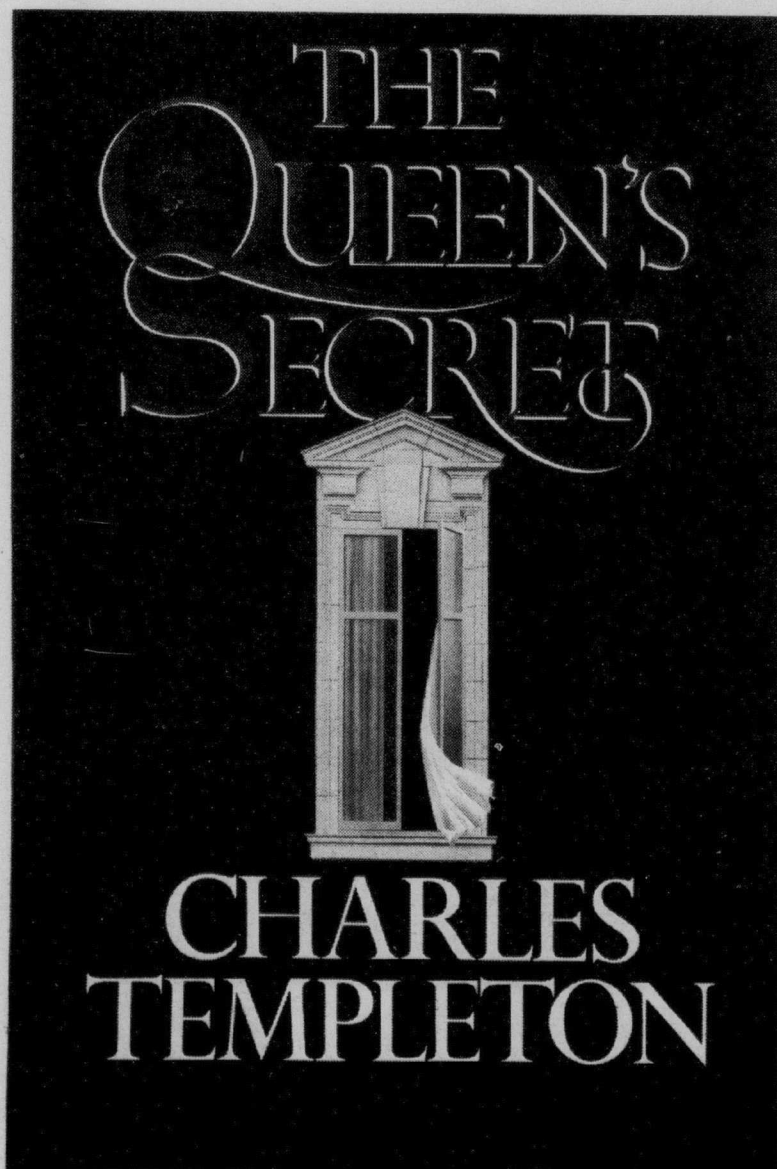
This tasteful little film has managed to make it onto a few Best Of 1986 lists as somewhat of a sleeper thanks to its sympathetic understanding of some volatile social conditions in London, England. It treats the subject of the influx of Pakistani immigrants into the tight British social system with humour and understanding, while telling an interesting story at the same time.

With an alcoholic, layabout father, Omar turns to his wealthy uncle Nassar for some gainful employment. Nassar puts Omar to work washing cars for a brief term, but then sees that his young Pakistani countryman, a bit of a go-getter, would be ideal for the managership of his small laundrette. Omar turns the laundrette into a going concern, tries to keep out of the grasp of Rachel, his hot-blooded cousin, and enters into a strange relationship with Johnny, a punkish, loutish cockney with whom he falls in love.

Omar's laundrette becomes the target for a savage bunch of street punks right out of "A Clockwork Orange", who try to show the Pakistanis that the British economic fabric has no room for interlopers.

While this movie has many solid performances from Gordon Warnecke as Omar, Saeed Jaffrey as Uncle Nassar, and Daniel Day Lewis as the sullen Johnny, its understated, easy pace catches the viewer up in this realistic story of contemporary life in England.

*La Maison du Cinéma***Repertory theatre going strong after 15 months**

SHERBROOKE — If Sherbrooke's repertory theatre, *La Maison du Cinéma*, is thriving after being open 15 months, it's not because the owners have taken the easiest and shortest routes.

In fact, they've deliberately included a liberal measure of what president Jacques Foisy describes as "difficult films" in their program.

There were plenty of mediocre films and recent box office successes to choose from in Sherbrooke before the *Maison* opened in October 1985, but the owners of the *Maison* felt there was something lacking. Market research suggested Sherbrooke was ripe for a theatre that offered high-quality artistic films that perhaps didn't make it so big at the box office.

Like any theatre, the *Maison* has its ups and downs, says Foisy, but with up to 3000 people buying tickets in a good week, business is going well enough to start expanding.

The theatre, once a 600-seater,

was purchased by Foisy and four others and with an investment of \$1½ million, converted into two smaller cinemas. Now, the crowds that turn out some weekends have made it necessary to add a balcony to one of the cinemas, and before the year is over, says Foisy, a third cinema will be added.

The success of *La Maison du Cinéma* might seem a little surprising given the slump movie theatres were going through just before the theatre opened. All the popular movies were beginning to be available on videos soon after they opened in the theatres, prompting gloomy predictions for theatre owners.

But it's becoming evident that home video cassette recorder revolution has not been the threat it was expected to be to the industry in general, and particularly to *La*

*Maison du Cinéma.*

"What we've found since we opened is that in our case, video doesn't hurt us," says Foisy. "The kind of films we have never get out on video."

"Video doesn't hurt good mo-

vies," he says. "Some movies that are available on video, the real cinema lovers will still come to see."

The effect of seeing certain kinds of movies is just not as satisfying on the small television screen, he says, and people are beginning to realize this.

The key to the *Maison's* success has been a good selection of high quality Canadian-made films, mostly in French; critically acclaimed foreign films with subtitles; and English films in the original version or dubbed.

Movies are frequently presented in the original English, says Foisy,

nothing changed." It became clear the existing movie houses had to fight the new competition by offering a better product.

"Sherbrooke is recognized as a good town for cinema," says Foisy. "This is a city where all the good

movies are shown. It's rare that a good film doesn't come to Sherbrooke."

A year in the movie theatre business has been a learning experience for Foisy and his colleagues. They've learned a bit about what succeeds and what doesn't, but above all, that there's always some risk involved.

Little has changed from their original plans except that they've practically had to abandon the showing of classics. "We showed several and only one out of five succeeded," said Foisy.

Some can be guaranteed successes, while others flop for no clear reason, he says. Show *Gone With the Wind*, *Last Tango in Paris* or *The Clockwork Orange* any time, he says, and it will draw a good audience. On the other hand, the theatre showed an Alfred Hitchcock series and several movies by French director François Truffaut, and they all bombed.

**NO GUARANTEES**

Another thing they've learned is that the Sherbrooke audience has its own peculiarities. "I've found if it works in Montreal and Quebec there's no guarantee it will succeed here," says Foisy. More came to see *Ann Trister* here than in Quebec, for example, and any Woody Allen film, no matter how old, is a sure hit.

"We learn things like that little by little," he says.

At times *La Maison du Cinéma* steps out of its role of repertory theatre, presenting movies that have passed their height of popularity in the other theatres, and has premieres — movies that have yet to be seen anywhere in the province.

It takes some clout to get hold of

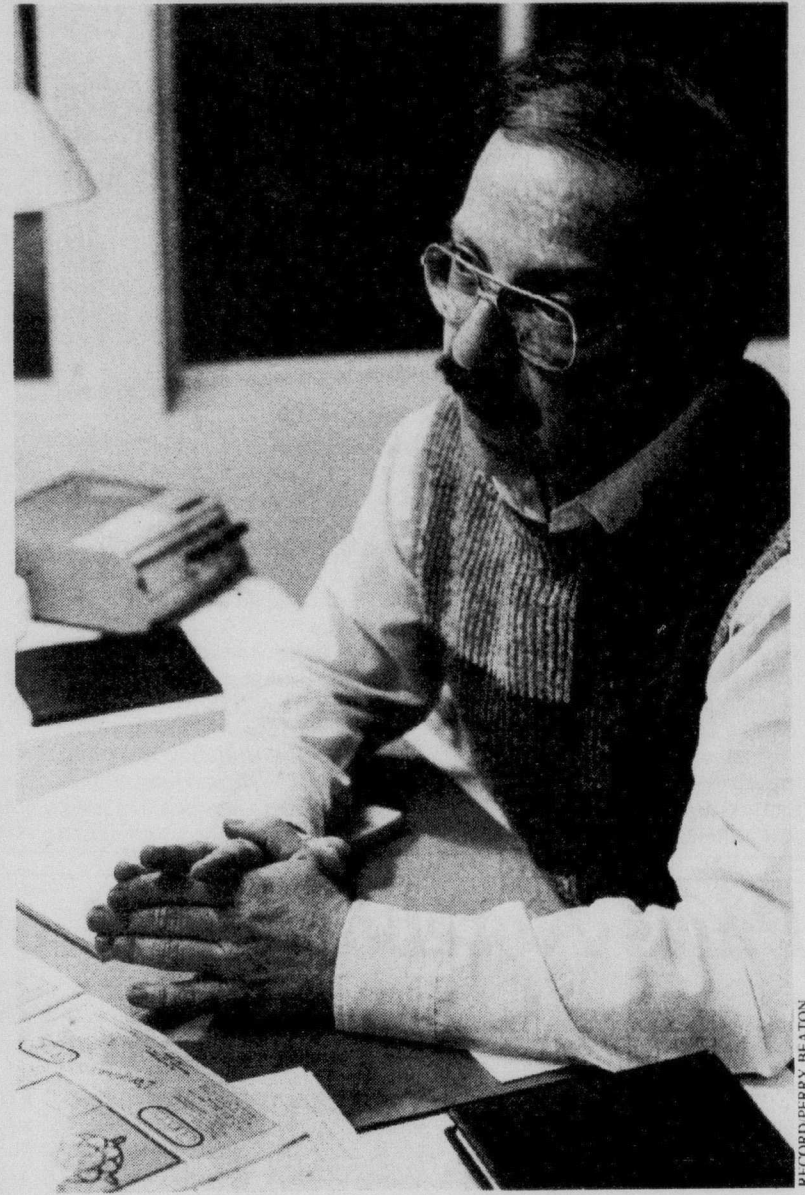
not to attract an English-speaking audience, but because they're quality films which have never been dubbed.

Although the theatre tries to present films with a somewhat deeper subject matter than other theatres in town, the owners don't want it to become a "cinema for intellectuals", says Foisy. That's why they mix in a few lighter selections, such as the animated *Astérix et les Bretons* shown during the Christmas season.

Still, the opening of the theatre seems to have prompted other theatres to go out in search of better movies, says Foisy.

**BETTER PRODUCT**

"Our arrival has had an effect on the other theatres in town," he says. "At the start they thought it was our prices (\$3.50 for adults), but they changed their prices and

these movies, and to do so the theatre owners get together with the three other repertory theatres in the province (in Outremont, Quebec City and Hull). They also work together when they want to have an English movie dubbed over in French.

As for the future, besides increasing the seating capacity of the theatre, the owners hope to attract more of the over-40 age group to their movies. Already the theatre attracts older people than the other theatres in town because of the ca-

libre of the movies shown, says Foisy, but there's still an audience to be tapped.

Foisy's dream is to have a film festival in Sherbrooke, much like the Montreal Film Festival, featuring critically acclaimed movies from all over the world. This could happen within the next two years, he says, once the theatre has gained the confidence of movie distributors.

**Prison documentary may be TV season's best**

TORONTO (CP) — *Prison Mother*, *Prison Daughter* — the last instalment of John Kastner's acclaimed series on the Canadian justice system — may prove to be the finest 90 minutes of the current TV season.

Gritty, realistic, penetrating — it's a one-way ticket down from the land of light entertainment to the lower depths of Canadian society.

Kastner began his work about five years ago, taking his cameras to Canada's prisons in search of what he calls the "irresistible

drama" within. Over the past few seasons, he has emerged with two documentaries — *The Parole Dance* and the Emmy-winning *Lifer and the Lady* — and the drama *Turning to Stone*.

Now, in the documentary set to appear Sunday on CBC, Kastner presents his most ambitious project yet: following two women into the prison system and out again. One is a middle-class offender given an unusually harsh sentence for importing soft drugs; the other is a habitual of-

fender, pregnant with her fifth child, heading into jail with serious emotional problems.

**FOCUS ON ONE**

The program is mainly concerned with the habitual offender, Marilyn St. Pierre, who gives birth to a son while in custody in her home town of Windsor, Ont. She hands the baby over to her unemployed common-law husband and then departs to serve yet another sentence for fraud at the federal Prison for Women in Kingston, Ont.

St. Pierre's record isn't violent

but she has lived a life of crime, mostly by passing bad cheques. As the program unfolds, it emerges that her new son and new mate — a "straight john" from outside her usual circle of friends in the criminal class — have given her a will to change.

After giving up four children to the state and having a tubal ligation at age 29, this appears to be her last opportunity for a normal life. And as Kastner writes: "Like many inmates her age, she had grown tired of jail."

# Book gives the low-down on New York high society

NEW YORK (CP) — Pity New York socialites.

They go to parties like the one where guests dug for planted jewels with Tiffany silver shovels. But in the eyes of author Sharon Churcher, they are dogged by the malady she identifies as thaasophobia — the fear of being bored.

In her book *New York Confidential*, Churcher describes their journeys up the social ladder and along the frontiers of self-gratification, where the outrageous becomes the ordinary and today's thrill becomes yesterday's tepid news.

Insatiability may explain why a Park Avenue doctor cited by Churcher does a good business dispensing cocaine-laced swabs to wealthy and celebrated patients needing a pick-me-up.

During one visit, she reports, "half a dozen patients, including the receptionist, were standing around the doctor's office, some with as many as five swabs protruding from their noses."

## SEX FIZZLES

Even sex loses sizzle for some members of New York's indulgent elite, writes Churcher, a journalist with experience at *The*

*Wall Street Journal*, *New York Post* and *New York* magazine.

She quotes the owner of a now-defunct after-hours club as saying the beautiful people would go home disappointed if a police raid didn't spice up their night of sex and drugs. She also writes of a listless sadomasochism party at which guests could barely summon enough enthusiasm to get out the paddles.

Just as New York's rats have developed an immunity to the pesticide warfaring, "its people have acquired a steadily increasing genetic barricade against shock."

Someone, however, is always cranking up the voltage. For instance, Churcher recalls a nightclub's re-enactment of actress Sharon Tate's 1969 murder by Charles Manson and his four young female followers.

Then there was a chic art exhibit that featured a painting of the slashed wrist of a local politician before his second and successful suicide attempt.

## FIND A DISEASE

Churcher's book is a cynical account of how ordinary folks can join New York's ruling class. Flirting with depravity is only one way. Joining charitable

committees is another, especially if the cause is a hot disease.

"Everyone wants cancer," one veteran socialite is quoted as saying dreamily. Another complained that heart disease just doesn't rate because "you can't get someone with a heart attack standing up in the middle of the room. They don't look different."

Adnan Khashoggi, the Saudi billionaire said to have turned to Canadian investors for some of

declared pet puma.

## USE SHORTCUTS

Churcher offers shortcuts for people lacking the minimum \$10 million she says is needed to crash the top social circuit by the sheer force of wealth.

One way to become a celebrity is to claim to have had an affair with one, and then go on TV. Churcher says the targets should be dead stars, who cannot deny the claim, or live politicians, whose denial no one will believe.

his financing of covert arms sales to Iran, is a prominent figure in Churcher's social registry.

His possessions include the high-tech yacht Nabila, manned by a crew of 40, that was used in the James Bond movie *Never Say Never Again*.

His Fifth Avenue condominium features a full-size swimming pool and a bed more than three metres wide, covered with sable. One of his companions has been a

Churcher names restaurants where stars go to be recognized and restaurants where mobsters like to eat.

Her rundown of the nightclub scene chronicles the lengths some will go to to generate publicity through controversy.

## BISHOP BRISTLED

Several have engaged in what Churcher calls sacrilege frenzy. The Canadian-owned Limelight disco has a built-in advantage on this score because it is housed in a former church.

After Limelight's opening night, when a woman was carried in on a cross, the Episcopalian bishop of New York became publicly enraged. Another disco, Area, tried for the same publicity effect by writing to New York's Roman Catholic archbishop to inform him of its plan to feature a Jesus impersonator.

Area's officials "could hardly contain themselves waiting for the photo-opportunity-packed responding blast," Churcher writes.

But shock immunity had apparently set in.

Archbishop John Cardinal O'Connor's secretary wrote back: "The concept of finding the divine within the secular is indeed the beginning of holiness and peace. Please be assured of the archbishop's best wishes on your endeavor."

## Paris Notebooks full of Mavis Gallant's lean style, acerbic wit

Author Margaret Atwood once wrote: "She's terrifyingly good; Mavis Gallant's insights into her characters are achieved with breathtaking economy and rightness of detail."

Writer Clark Blaise commented that Gallant's stories "are built of the purest sentences I know, and they will endure."

Both were referring to Gallant's fiction, which has earned her Canada's highest literary honor — the Governor General's Award in 1981 for *Home Truths: Selected Canadian Stories*.

But Atwood and Blaise could just as easily have been commenting about Gallant's most recent book, her first collection of non-fiction.

## STYLE INTACT

*Paris Notebooks: Essays and Reviews* is filled with the hallmarks of Gallant's prose: the lean, taut, dense style; the acerbic wit; and the cool, cerebral, yet not detached view.

It's not surprising that Gallant can write fact as well as fiction. She had a budding career as a feature writer with the now-defunct weekly *Montreal Standard* before abruptly heading to Paris in 1950 to see if she could make a living from her short stories.

What is surprising is that the book's longest essay, the 96-page *Events in May*, was written on

the run. It was drawn from her journal entries during the upheaval of May 1968, when Paris was brought to a standstill and France was plunged into a crisis by a wave of demonstrations, occupations and riots.

For more than a month, the country hovered on the brink of something, but nobody knew what it was.

France "was either within a breath of armed revolution or merely involved in a vast group-therapy session," Gallant writes.

## INVOLVES READER

With her literary eye for telling details and gift for the anecdotal, she draws her readers into the vortex of the civil unrest.

The crisis finally fizzled out when President Charles de Gaulle — who strangely disappeared for a number of days at the height of the confusion — resurfaced. His government defused the tension, partly by replenishing long-dry stocks of gasoline to allow Parisians to escape the city for a holiday weekend.

The denouement, Gallant observed, was "like the feeling after a miscarriage — instant thanksgiving that the pain has ceased, plus the feeling of zero because it was all for nothing."

One of the most poignant essays in the book recounts the story of Gabrielle Russier, a 30-year-old school teacher who committed suicide in the late 1960s after being hounded by

French society and the courts for a brief affair she had with one of her students.

## DOUBLE STANDARD

In the best of journalistic traditions, Gallant tries to put this case in the broadest possible context. She paints Russier, in part, as a victim of the legal and moral double standards facing women in France.

"A Don Juan is admired" but a woman who has an affair is "a disgrace to womanhood, as well as a whore, a pervert, and a nymphomaniac," she wrote.

The result provides a telling glimpse of an uglier, more unjust side of contemporary France, the country Gallant has made her home for the past 36 years.

"Gabrielle Russier was seven before women were allowed to vote, 28 when married women could have bank accounts, and 30 before she could legally get advice from a doctor about contraception.

"She died before women were allowed to enroll their children in kindergarten without the husband's written consent, or have a say in where the family would live."

The same highly critical view of France and things French is woven into many other articles in *Paris Notebooks*.

## New annex will bring treasures out of storage

MONTREAL (CP) — In a locked, dimly lit storeroom in the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts, a 2,500-year-old sandstone bird stares serenely into space.

Nearby are a mummified 19th-century Maori head from New Zealand and a delicate Egyptian vase that was made between 3,000 B.C. and 4,000 B.C.

The public has never seen these works of art and thousands of others because a lack of exhibition space at the museum has relegated them to storage, museum officials explained recently.

But the officials hope that the public will see the objects in the spring of 1990, when the museum is slated to open a new annex across Sherbrooke Street from its downtown location.

Officials estimate that 97 per cent of the museum's 24,000 works of art are currently in storage.

"It's very frustrating not to show more of the collection," said Suzel Brunel, the museum's communication director.

The expansion project will more than double the exhibition space to about 10,000 square metres from the current 4,230 square metres, said museum director Pierre Theberge.

## SMALL IN COMPARISON

The Art Gallery of Ontario has about 27,000 square metres and the Royal Ontario Museum 67,500 square metres, Theberge said.

The Quebec and federal governments have each pledged \$25

million as part of the \$60 million it will cost to build the annex. The museum plans to launch a fundraising drive in the spring to raise the remaining \$10 million.

Theberge refused to say how much the hidden collection is worth, but he said that entire collections are in storage, including about 200 items of African art and about 200 pieces of Roman glassware dating from the Roman Empire.

Also in the hidden museum are more than 300 pieces of pre-Columbian art — including pottery, sculpture and textiles — a large collection of silverware, furniture, metalwork and Oceanic art from the South Pacific.

Also included are a painting by Fernand Leger, a French artist noted for his images reflecting the advance of the technological age in the early 20th century, a painting by French expressionist Georges Rouault, one of Toronto artist Micheal Snow's works and canvases by Quebec painters Jean-Paul Riopelle and Paul-Emile Borduas.

Of 1,300 paintings owned by the museum, barely 200 are on display, said Joan Thornley, assistant head of collection management.

Museum chairman Bernard Lamarre said in a recent interview that construction of the new annex is expected to start in 1988. Preliminary sketches of the plans will be released in April.

# Jerry, Jo'Anne and friends open music store in Sherbrooke

SHERBROOKE — For most, becoming a country musician means taking a leap into an unstable financial life.

It was no different for the country duo Jerry and Jo'Anne back in the late 60s.

But now, after establishing themselves on the national and even international country music scene, the pair have joined up with eight other musicians in a scheme to provide a little more financial security for them all.

In early December Jerry and Jo'Anne, five members of the group Texas Quebec, and three others with experience in music stores opened Musikville, a store selling musical instruments, sound systems and sheet music.

The plan, says Jerry, is to provide "a padding" for the musicians, so that they know they're not going

to be destitute when the concert engagements aren't coming in thick and fast. It also lets them be more selective about accepting gigs, and lets them reject those that don't seem profitable enough.

"By padding ourselves we become more independent," says Jerry. "We can say to ourselves, 'Hey, we don't have to go out and do this'. The guys don't have to go out in the midst of a snowstorm."

The music store is located in the Carrefour Dunant in Sherbrooke and several of the co-owners are usually around to help the customers find what they need.

The idea for the store came from Jo'Anne's brother, Yvan Moreault, who also plays bass guitar, fiddle and harmonica with Texas Quebec. He says the store is different from other music stores in the city in the quality of the service.

"We're the only store that can inform any type of musician on ins-

truments," he says. "Anything that's playable, there's somebody here who knows how to play it."

The group is pleased, says Jerry, with the lines of instruments they've been able to set up deals

with, mainly Lowrey and Peavey.

And business has been good so far as well, he says. Sales for December were 20 per cent higher than projected.

The structure of the business is like a family, says Jerry. When planning to start the business, the group sat down together and found that each had a different talent to contribute. Jerry, for instance, fit right into the role of public rela-

tions person.

The opening of the store by a group of musicians is quite a rare occurrence, says Jerry.

It has been done by others in Nashville, where the musicians usually put their name on the store, but Jerry and Jo'Anne decided not to do this.

"If we put our name on there we're limiting our market to a country market," he says.

## Throat lesions not cancerous

# Full recovery expected for Elton John

SYDNEY, Australia (AP) — Rock star Elton John was discharged from hospital Thursday after being told he doesn't have cancer.

The singer's surgeon, Dr. John Tonkin, said a biopsy following his throat operation Tuesday disclosed he had a non-malignant lesion.

"He is expected to make a full recovery," Tonkin said.

John's Australian publicist, Patti Mostyn, said John was resting at his hotel and probably would stay in Australia six more weeks.

"It will take that long for the wounds to heal, and Tonkin wants to keep a check on his progress," she told The Associated Press.

She said John, who has been told he can't sing for several months, was nursing a sore throat but had not indicated any major discomfort.

Mostyn said John, 39, would remain on a diet of light food and has been ordered not to speak for at least a week. He was released from St. Vincent's private hospital a day ahead of schedule.

John was plagued by throat problems throughout his 15-month, 200-concert world tour that ended Dec. 14 in Australia. He cancelled a concert in Perth because of throat problems, and later collapsed on stage in Sydney.

Mostyn said he has decided to give his voice a rest and has cancelled all remaining performances in 1987, including a 32-concert American tour.

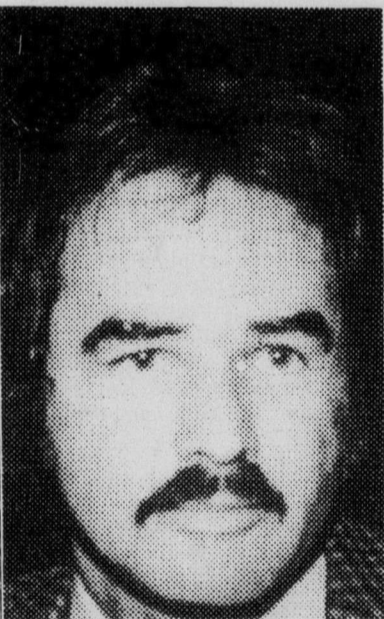

## B.C. communities attracting holiday money and stars

**NELSON, B.C. (CP)** — Steve Martin, wearing a fireman's uniform and a fake Cyrano de Bergerac nose, was gallivanting around town last summer.

At about the same time, Burt

Reynolds was being coached on his acting by a 73-year-old local resident in the town of Princeton, B.C.

The two communities were the sites for three major movies. Nelson, a town of 9,000 in southeastern British Columbia, was chosen as the location for Martin's comedy **Roxanne**, in which the star plays the chief of a volunteer fire department. Nelson was also the location of a drama called **Housekeeping** by **Bill Forsyth**, the director of **Local Hero**.

Princeton, on the mountainous highway between Vancouver and the Okanagan valley, served as the backdrop for Reynolds's thriller **Malone**, also starring **Cliff Robertson**.

Mayor **Gerald Rotering** says "it's not overplaying or being melodramatic to say that Hollywood producers have discovered Nelson."

## NOTES SCENERY

The mayor said his city, on the shores of Kootenay Lake in the Selkirk mountains, offers colorful scenery and a town with an authentic turn-of-the-century look, thanks to \$2.5 million in restoration work.

In exchange for offering itself as a movie location, Nelson got an economic boost (Rotering said

people associated with **Roxanne** and **Housekeeping** have spent about \$1.5 million) as well as the fun, generosity and pure excitement that movie people provide.

For fun, there was a comedy night **Martin** and comics from **Roxanne** staged to raise money for the firemen's muscular dystrophy fund. For generosity, there was the \$3,000 worth of art books that **Martin** gave the Nelson public library after finding the library had none.

And, for excitement, there were bit parts for Nelson residents. **Rotering's** daughter donned 1950s-style clothes and coiffure as an extra in **Housekeeping**.

In true movie fashion, there were also added attractions. **Olivia Newton-John** was in town to be with her actor-husband, **Matt Latanzi**, of the **Roxanne** cast.

The Reynolds movie, **Malone**, not only brought Hollywood glamor to Princeton and nearby **Headly**, but also a few jobs as extras for the locals.

## DOES SCENE

**Marshall Johnson**, 73, did a scene with Reynolds that went to seven takes before Johnson told the star: "You and me are together on this thing so let's get 'er done." And they did.

Princeton Mayor **Gloria Stout** says **Malone** left more than \$500,000 in the area from the rental of city hall and the court house as well as purchases from businesses like the local lumber yard and tire store.

"They bought from everybody but the second-hand store and the mortuary," Stout said.

If small British Columbia towns are a favorite location with producers, so is a cavernous building in **Burnaby, B.C.**, that will soon become a major movie making

centre.

Known simply as **The Bridge**, it was originally built by the **Dominion Bridge** company to make bridge parts, then served as an armaments factory during the Second World War and later as a transit bus barn.

## MAKES STUDIO

More recently, it's been used as a movie studio, its huge space (longer than a football field, higher than a four-storey building) serving as a stage for everything from a cave to the surface of another planet.

Now the **B.C. Development Corp.**, a Crown company, is using \$5 million in private-sector funding to renovate the building in readiness for sale or lease to a private operator.

Corporation vice-president **Jim Mclean** said the finished development will feature 3,700 square metres of studio space, making it the second-biggest stage in the world after **Pinewood Studios** in Britain.

It will also be the cheapest such building in North America, renting for about 20 cents a square metre compared with \$2.20 in **Los Angeles**.

The development will include three separate sound stages and there are plans for an office and post-production centre, hotel and cinema.

**Mclean** said there are three serious proposals from the private sector to operate the centre, and some time this year a deal with one of them should be in place.

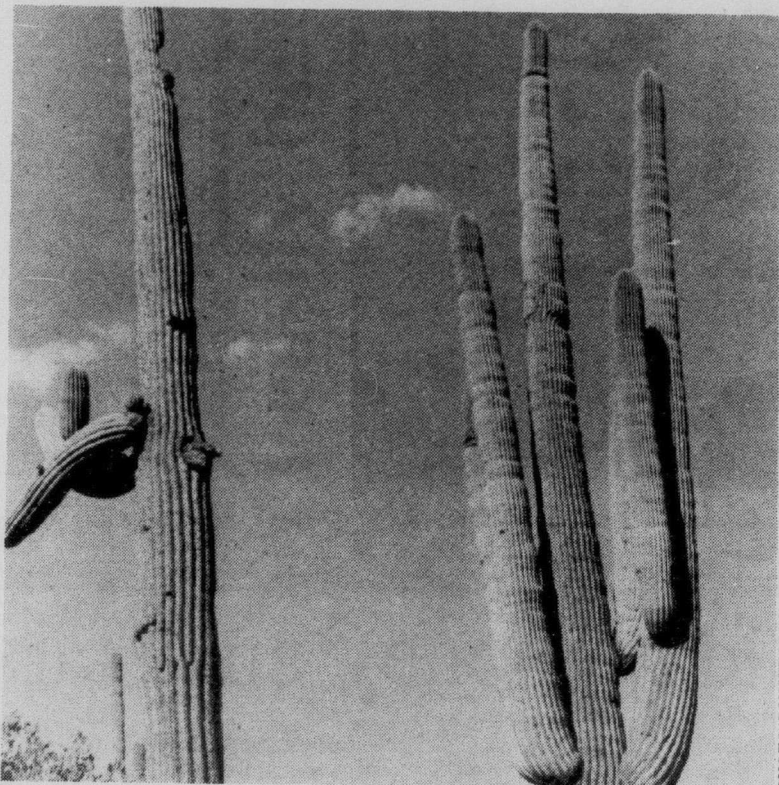

## Museum gives live, close-up view of Sonora desert

TUCSON, Ariz. — If you've never been to the Sonora Desert, you can't imagine what a strange place it is. The mountains are covered with scrubby vegetation. They look mysterious, almost like headless camels. And the local plants are straight out of moviedom's special-effects department.

The wildlife is more familiar. Tarantulas, snakes, lizards, and coyotes do well here, of course, and in the higher elevations, bears, mountain lions, and mountain goats. In the more southern reaches of the desert, in Baja California, you get some pretty fancy birds — thick-billed parrots, for instance.

As for plants, it takes a genuine oddball to survive here. Like the saguaro cactus — the plant that lets you know you're in the Sonora. Or the cholla cactus, whose flabby, grayish fruit can latch on to the unwary passerby with nasty prickles.

Over 300 different kinds of animals and 200 kinds of plants inhabit 15 landscaped acres, set in the heart of Tucson Mountain Park. Most zoos and botanical museums have to range far and wide to get specimens, but the Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum is strictly regional and proud of it. The curators don't even water their plants.

### COMPRESSED, INTENSIFIED

The great thing about the museum is that the local surroundings have been compressed and intensified for you. A few of the plants you'll easily see elsewhere in Arizona, but as for the wildlife — you'd have to be a naturalist to find it.

And now the museum is doing its best to make you forget that it is a zoo at all. A new \$2.5 million habitat has just opened, designed so that you can see white-tailed deer,

mountain lions, brown bears, and other mountain animals, all in enclosures of convincing-looking fake rock, with the natural mountain backdrop behind them.

This is part of a grand reorganization plan to take place as funds are available over the next few decades. The old format showed caged animals sorted by classification: snakes with snakes, cats with cats, and so on. The modern approach is putting predators and prey and the plants that go with them, close together in a natural setting.

cage area to see the mountain lion, who was at that point in the "cage stage" of the adjustment process. The mountain lion had just lost his mate and was sitting alone in his new cage. His opinion of the situation was expressed in the low set of his ears, a resigned look in his steady golden eyes, and in a certain lack of animation about the tail. He seemed glad to be visited though and began making an irregular hoarse growling noise that Siminski said was the sound of a mountain lion purring. "He likes you," he said.

It is a wrench to tear yourself

### ANIMALS TROOP OVER

Peter Siminski, curator of birds and mammals, took me for a behind-the-scenes tour. There's something enchanting about seeing a zoo with an insider; the animals all come trooping over to you. An exception was one of the jaguarundis, a recent mother; she bared her fangs at me — a savage red and white snarl in a small chocolate-colored face.

We visited the animals' kitchen, which included a walk-in freezer full of, among other things, great bags of Purina Dog Chow. It was the animals' monthly "goodie day," so plates of special raw meats were everywhere.

He led me over to the cage of the vampire bats — small furry balls hanging upside down. They have nasty expressions and are fed bowls of blood at mealtime, according to Siminski.

We went behind the scenes to the

away from a purring mountain lion. But we went on to the museum's wonderful walk-through aviary. On our way, we wandered past a coyote, looking like a friendly husky dog grinning and squinting in the hot sun; fat prairie dogs, like overgrown hamsters, surrounded by a crowd of admirers; and a cardinal on top of an ocotillo. We also passed several docents, one with a beautiful owl on a leash, another holding a large turtle.

The Sonora Desert Museum was founded 33 years ago by a self-taught naturalist named Bill Carr, who thought of what was then the standard museum of natural history as a "dead animal museum," according to Christopher Helms, development and public affairs officer.

"Most zoos are postage stamp collections," he says. But this one permits "a willing suspension of disbelief."

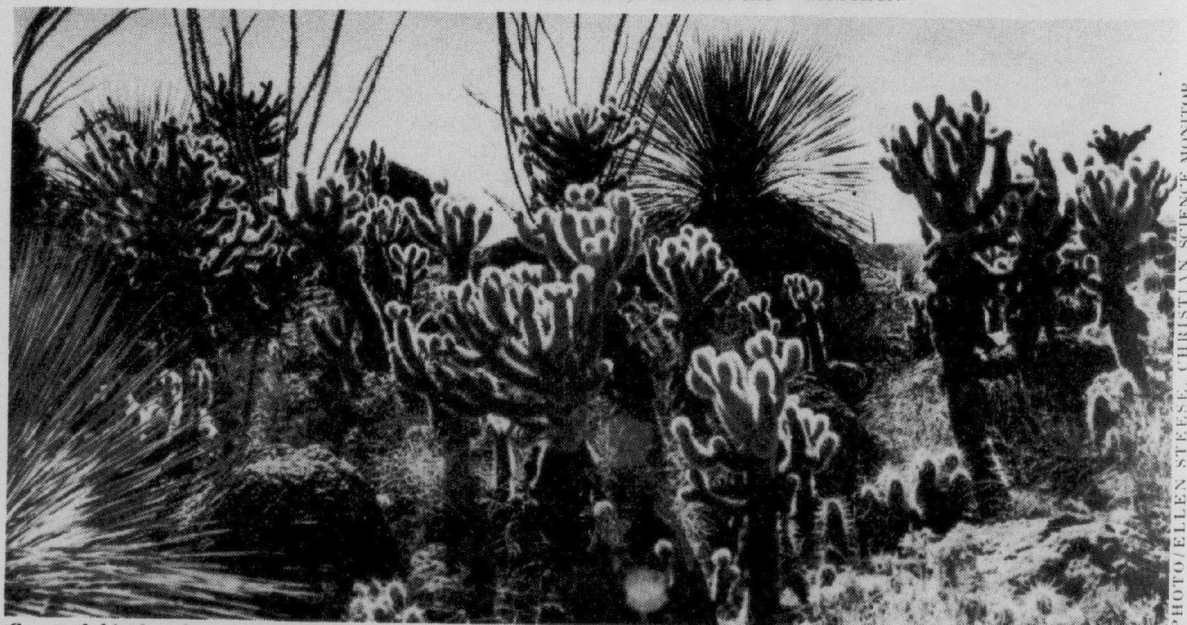

## Include gifts, jewelry when paying duties at Customs

OTTAWA — Travellers who assume gifts received while travelling outside the country don't have to be declared at Customs are wrong, says a Canadian Customs official.

"The requirement to declare all goods applies to items received as gifts outside Canada," says Dale Colter of the Customs program branch at Canada Custom. "Some travellers think that gifts received at weddings or religious ceremonies are exempt from this requirement, but this isn't true."

Jewelry in particular causes a lot of confusion at Customs, says Colter. Not only does it have to be declared upon re-entry if it was received as a gift, but it also has to be declared if it's taken out of the country to be worn while away, or if it is changed in any way while out of the country.

Unlike a camera or watch, says Colter, a piece of jewelry cannot be identified by a serial number. If the traveller can't prove where it is from, the inspector might believe

it was acquired abroad.

To avoid this problem, he says, people planning to take jewelry on a trip should first have it appraised and photographed by a jeweller, and carry the documents to prove where the jewelry came from.

Also, any item taken out of Canada that is changed in any way is considered by Customs as a new item and thus must be declared.

"Let's say you take an old gold ring setting with you on a trip outside Canada and replace the diamond," explains Colter. "When you come back to Canada, the whole item — the diamond and the setting — is considered to be new."

Even though part of the ring is made from Canadian material, the ring is treated like any other piece of jewelry acquired outside the country. The same duties have to be paid unless the traveller has reported the item to Customs before departure and received authorization to have the repairs or additions made. This kind of authorization will only be given if a similar service is not available here, and this is not likely, says Colter.

People who fail to declare goods acquired or modified outside of Canada risk having them detained or seized by Customs, Colter warns. In most cases, these goods are

returned when the traveller pays the proper duty and taxes, as well as an additional amount which could be as high as twice the cost of the goods. This amount varies depending on the circumstances, such as whether the jewelry was worn or carried in the luggage.

A person caught intentionally smuggling goods into Canada could also face prosecution.

People who are unsure about what to declare or what they can bring back into Canada, can pick up a copy of *I Declare* at their local Customs office. The booklet explains the rules regarding Customs declarations.

## Obstacles to travel for handicapped decreasing

"Why can't we travel like anyone else?" demands André Leclerc, slouched in his wheelchair behind his desk.

Leclerc is head of Montreal-based Keroul, a government-funded agency which promotes tourism for the handicapped. He says handicapped travellers face many obstacles, not the least of which is their own attitudes.

Many are intimidated by going as far as the neighborhood shopping centre, and often a trip planned well in advance can hold some unpleasant surprises.

Still, handicapped people are travelling more than ever before — whether it's by car, plane, ship or bus, Leclerc says.

In Montreal, there's even a travel agency for them — Mobile Travel, which specializes in tours for people in wheelchairs. Organizers say the recently formed company is the first such enterprise in Canada.

Leclerc says that despite the difficulties, travelling can be a therapeutic experience for the handicapped.

### OFF TO FLORIDA

Mobile Travel, which is offering its first trip in February to Orlando, Fla., guarantees that facilities in its tours are accessible to people in wheelchairs. The agency says its rates are comparable to those for equivalent tours for the non-disabled.

Yves Belair, who runs the agency, can personally vouch for the facilities on the Orlando trip because he has been there in his wheelchair.

Belair, 29, whose legs were amputated above the knee after a road accident, has to ensure that there is ground transportation to and from the airports, that hotels have ramps, wide doors, practical bathrooms and elevator buttons he can reach.

In Orlando, Belair found a hotel with 19 rooms especially equip-

ped for the disabled, and he arranged tours of Disney World, the Epcot Centre and Sea World. Volunteers from local handicapped associations will accompany the travellers.

In the spring, the agency will offer a trip to Amsterdam.

### LIMITED TO 10

Belair plans two trips a month, with a maximum of 10 wheelchair customers each, as well as their attendants if required.

Belair does not know yet if there will be a big demand for his service. "There are 90,000 people in Quebec in wheelchairs," he said in an interview. "If we just get one per cent (of them), we'll have steady work for six years."

Keroul has just published an illustrated guide for tourist-related businesses which explains how hotel rooms, telephone booths, bars or cinemas can be made attractive to handicapped people.

Leclerc, who is confined to an electric wheelchair because of cerebral palsy, said the guide is not meant to force businesses to act out of guilt. "The approach is strictly commercial. There's a large market to explore."

### TAKES TIME

"Mentalities have to change," says Leclerc, "it will take a lot of time."

Hotels often have two or three rooms adapted for people in wheelchairs but consider such facilities to be a financial loss. Leclerc said a hotel can redesign as many as half of its rooms to accommodate all customers — and attract new business.

Air Canada and Canadian Pacific Air Lines currently allow an attendant for a disabled, dependent traveller to travel at half price. The Canadian Transport Commission said in December that the practice was discriminatory, although it has not yet changed the rules.
