The Queen-Consort, Victoria Mary, daughter of the late Duke of Teck, was born May 25, 1867, and was married to His Majesty (then Duke of Cornwall), July 6, 1893.

Letters addressed to all other countries 5 cts. for the first ounce and 4 cts. for each additional ounce or fraction thereof. Drop letters for the city, Westmont, Outremont, Massouneuve, St. Lambert, Longueuil, Montreuil, South, Verdun, West, etc., 2 cts. for the first ounce and 1 c. for each additional ounce or fraction thereof. Letters addressed to places in Canada or to other countries, if posted unpaid or partly prepaid, will be forwarded, subject on delivery to double amount of postage. Re-Directed Letters—Re-directed letters are not liable to any additional postage, if handed back to the Post Office with a changed address at the moment of delivery or as soon as possible thereafter, provided always the change in the address does not require the letter to be sent to any place to which the postage rate is higher than was first payable. Re-directed letters should not be dropped into a Post Office Box or receiver unless additional postage has been put on to carry them to their second destination. Request and Address Letters—Letters from places in Canada, Great Britain, the United States, Mexico and Newfoundland, covered by a revenue stamp, or letters bearing such letters be returned to the sender if not delivered within a certain specified time, or the address or name of the sender, if printed or written, will be returned as requested if not delivered in the time stated. Address letters having no time for return specified are held for 15 days and returned direct to sender. Special Delivery—Arrangements have been made for the delivery by special messenger daily of letters and letters bearing a "Canadian Special Delivery" stamp or bearing Canadian postage stamps to the value of twenty cents in addition to the value of the letters. Nothing may be attached to a Post Card, except a small adhesive tag, giving the full name and address of the sender or addressee, or an engraving photograph or newspaper clipping adhering completely to the card.

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The above postage rates apply to all duly recognized newspapers and periodicals addressed to any place in Canada and to Canadian newspapers and periodicals addressed to Great Britain and the following British Possessions: Aden, Antigua, Ascension, Australia, Bahamas, Barbados, Bermuda, British Guiana, British Honduras, British North Borneo, British Somaliland, Brunei, Ceylon, Cocos, Cooker, Hong Kong, Iceland, Cyprus, Falkland Islands, Fanning Island, Federated Malay States, Dominica, Fiji Islands, Gambia, Gibraltar, Gilbert and Ellice Islands, Gold Coast Colony, Grenada, Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Hong Kong, India, Irish Free State, Jamaica, Johnston, Kenya and Uganda, Malta, Mauritius, Montserrat, Newfoundland, New Hebrides, New Zealand, Nauru, Nigeria, Nyassaland Protectorate, Palestine, Rhodesia, and Southern Rhodesia, St. Helena, Seychelles, Sierra Leone, Solomon Islands, South West Africa, St. Helena, St. Kitts and Nevis, St. Lucia, St. Vincent, B.W.I., Samoa, (British) Straits Settlements, Tanganyika Territory, Tristan da Cunha, Tonga, Tongareva, Trinidad and Tobago, Turks and Caicos Islands, Union of South Africa (including Basutoland), Bechuanaland, Swaziland, Virgin Islands (British), Zambezi Protectorate. Newspapers and periodicals are forwarded from Canada either by direct mail steamers or by way of Great Britain.

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Newspapers and periodicals addressed to other countries are subject to the rate of 2 cents for each two ounces or fraction thereof.

Printed and Miscellaneous Matter—The post on Books, Pamphlets, Circulars, occasional publications, etc. Manuscript books or newspapers, Printers' Proof Sheets, Maps, Prints, Drawings, Photographs, Sheet Music (whether printed or written), music books of instruction, etc., addressed to Canada, the United States and Mexico is 1 cent per ounce. If these articles can be sent to Great Britain and all other countries at the rate of 1 c per 2 oz.; but, in the case of manuscript books or newspapers and manuscript music, a minimum prepayment of 5 cents (covering a weight of 10 ounces) is required; 1 cent for each additional ounce or portion thereof. The general limit of size for Canada is 3½ ft. in length, width or depth, but in no case must the length and girth of a parcel exceed 4 feet. In other countries no packet must measure more than 18 inches in any direction, unless in the form of a roll when the length of 80 inches is allowed, provided diameter does not exceed 4 inches. The limit of weight for Canada is 5 lbs., for the United States and other Postal Countries 10 lbs. Limit of weight for a single book addressed to places in Canada, the United States or Mexico is 11 lbs.; to other countries 10 lbs.

Commercial Papers and Legal Documents may be sent to Great Britain, Newfoundland, United States and all other countries at 3 cents for 10 ounces and 1 cent for every additional 2 ounces. These papers, when posted for delivery in Canada, must be prepaid at Letter rate.

BAGGAGE.

For each trunk carried in any such vehicle, 25 cents. No charge shall be made for traveling bags, valises, boxes or parcels which passengers may carry by the hand.

a. Fractions of hours for any drive exceeding one hour shall be charged at pro rata hour rates as above established. The above tariff shall apply to every drive within the limits of the City of Montreal, even in the event of it being necessary to go through an adjoining municipality to reach any of the limits of the city.

b. For drives between midnight and four o'clock in the morning, fifty p.c. shall be added to the tariff rates above established. The above tariff shall apply to every drive extending beyond the city limits, provided the engagement be made within the limits.

c. Children under 5 years of age and sitting on their parents' or guardians' laps will be admitted free of charge and shall not be held as being included in the word "persons" in the said tariff.

d. The word "drive" wherever it occurs in the said tariff shall be held to admit stoppages within the time fixed for said drives.

Legal rates.—For one or two passengers, 25 cents for each first third of a mile or any fraction thereof.

10 cents for each additional third mile, 20 cents for each additional passenger, 10 cents for each 3 minutes waiting time.

Two children under 10 years of age free, but 20 cents will be charged for each additional child of the same age.

50 cents extra for each trunk if carried. No charge for hand baggage.

20 cents extra return drive, for each mile or fraction thereof, exceeding two miles on going when dismissed and returning, exclusive of the two miles above mentioned. This applies only to drives outside the city limits. Wednesday, Saturday, Monday and Sunday are included in the City limits for the purpose of this tariff.

TARIFF OF WATER RATES.

Dwelling-houses, stores, shops, offices, &c., on the assessed rental, 6 per cent.; churches 6 per cent. on rental based on 4 per cent. on the assessed value; restaurants, at uniform rate of 12 per cent. on assessed yearly rental, provided that when the rent is \$1000 and over and at least twenty furnished rooms exist, water shall be charged by meter and paid for at the same rate as distilleries, breweries, &c.; horses, \$2.50; cows, \$2 each; hives, beehives, stable keepers, horse dealers, tavern keepers, &c., shall pay \$1.50 for each stall whether occupied or unoccupied; public baths or other public buildings, which charge is made, \$6 each tub; steam engines \$6 per horse-power or \$1.15 per 1000 cubic feet by meter; building materials, 6 per cent. on the assessed value; cubic yard of masonry and \$3 per 1000 yards plastering; fountains, \$2 for every 1000 cubic feet, supplied by meter; hand hose, for sprinkling purposes, \$2.50; \$2.00 for each foot of hose; for fraction thereof; meter rates for distilleries, breweries, hotels, taverns, railways, laundries, ice-houses, academies, houses of industry, reformatories, boarding schools, nurseries, asylums, dye houses, photographic studios and all manufacturing establishments generally, \$1.15 per 1000 cubic feet; but the quarterly bill by meter must not be less than 1 1/2 p.c. of the assessed rental value of the premises; any rental value less than whatsoever in the opinion of the Board of Commissioners, water cannot be supplied by meter 6 per cent. on yearly rental; by meter, 1 1/2 inch, \$2.00; 3/4 inch, \$2.00; 1/2 inch, \$4.00; 1 1/2 inch, \$8.00; 2 inch, \$12 3/4 inch, \$25.00; 4 inch, \$40.00; 6 inch, \$75.00; 8 inch \$100.00.

Public hospitals having a minimum of 100 permanent beds, kept gratuitously for patients who pay nothing, for their water supply a uniform rate of twenty-five dollars (\$25).

Dates of payment.—The water rates are due and payable on the 1st day of September. In each year, up to which date there will be allowed a discount of 3 p.c. All charges for specific supplies, or for fractional part of the year shall be payable in advance before the water is turned on. Meter rates.—Water supplied by meter is payable quarterly.

Stopping supply.—The water supply will be cut off if not paid when due. Penalty interest at the rate of 6 per cent. per annum for the first 60 days, and 7 per cent. thereafter, is payable on all overdue taxes and water rates.

COURTS OF JUSTICE.

SUPREME COURT OF CANADA.

The Supreme Court, as a Court of Appeal, constituted by Dominion Statute (Revised Statutes of Canada, 1924) is composed of five chief justices and six puisne judges, and has appellate civil and criminal jurisdiction within and throughout the Dominion of Canada. The Judges reside at Ottawa, where the Supreme Court holds annually three sessions, the first beginning on the first Tuesday in February, the second on the first Tuesday in April, and the third on the first Tuesday in October.

EXCHEQUER COURT OF CANADA.

The Exchequer Court, constituted under a Dominion Statute, 50-52 Viet., chap. 16, is presided over by one judge, and has original exclusive jurisdiction in all claims, suits or actions against the Crown. It has concurrent jurisdiction in relation to revenue cases and the enforcement of penalties; in cases respecting patents of invention, trade-marks, copyrights and industrial designs and in respect to land patents; cases against Crown officers for anything done or omitted to be done in which the Crown is plaintiff or petitioner and in respect of Railway debts under 3 Ed. VII., ch. 21. Admiralty jurisdiction is vested in the Exchequer Court of Canada, under 33-35 Ed. VII. (Imperial) and 64-65 Vic. (Canadian), ch. 29. The Exchequer Court is also an Imperial Prize Court in time of war.

The Court sits at Ottawa every Monday at 11 a.m. except during vacation or the absence of the judge, for hearing motions, demurrers, etc., and for the trial of causes at such places and times as are fixed by the judge, by general or special orders.
