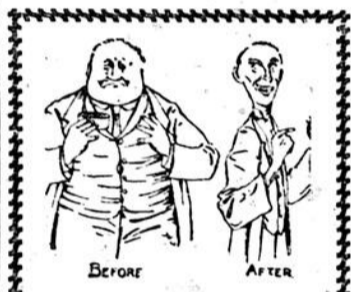

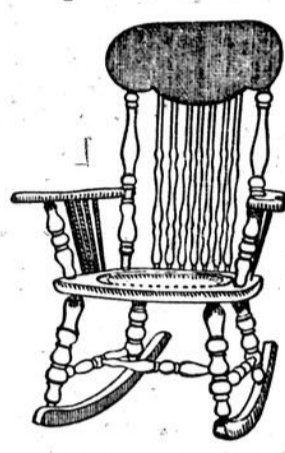

SUFFRAGE AND ITS USES. INTERESTING LECTURE AT THE Y. M. C. A.

Mr. H. B. Ames Tells What Constitutes a Voter and How to Vote—Final Lecture of the Series on Political History.

At the Y. M. C. A. Hall last evening, Mr. H. B. Ames delivered the final lecture of the Political History Course. Mr. Ames was listened to with rapt attention by a large audience.

We have now reached the final lecture of the course. Having considered the government of the Dominion of Canada, it is now our duty to consider how we can make our influence felt in regard to these matters.

As far as regards property or income and as regards occupation or residence under one of the following conditions: He must possess real property to the value of \$200 in a city, \$200 in a town, or \$150 elsewhere; and this ownership must have existed prior to the time of the revision.

He must be the tenant of real property under a lease and pay a monthly rental of at least \$2 a quarter or an annual rental of \$20, or an annual rental of \$20, and must be in possession as tenant for the year next previous to his being placed upon the list.

He must be the bona fide occupant of real property worth \$200 in a city, \$200 in a town or \$150 elsewhere; and this occupancy must have existed for one year next preceding his being placed upon the list.

One who derives an annual income of \$200, that is, earns steadily \$6 per week, and has resided in the Dominion of Canada previous to the date of the revision, may thus qualify in the polling place where he resides at the time of the revision.

As a farmer's son. Such are qualified, provided the farm upon which they live with their father is sufficient value to give each a vote, as under the ownership clause, a year's previous residence being here also required.

As a fisherman and owner of such an one as may qualify under the above conditions, fishing tackle, etc.

As an assiduous, that is one who annually receives \$100 per year, having resided within the district for a year prior to the revision.

Women, Chinaman and Indians west of Ontario cannot vote.

The law provides for an annual revision, but the great cost which this would entail is regarded as sufficient excuse for dispensing with this undertaking except when Dominion elections are reasonably near at hand.

When a revision is made, the Government appoints for each election district a person called the revising officer. In this province, he is usually an advocate or notary at least five years' standing.

THE PREMIER SWORN IN. SEVERAL OF HIS COLLEAGUES ALSO TAKE THE OATH.

The Governor-General Presides at an Interesting Ceremony This Morning—The Government's Plans—An Historic Parchment.

The Hon. Mackenzie Bowell, accompanied by several members of the new Cabinet arrived in the city last evening. The Canada Atlantic Express reaching Bonaventure Station at 7.30, brought the veteran statesman and the following members of the new government: viz. Hon. John Costigan, Minister of Marine and Fisheries, Sir Charles Hibbert Tupper, Minister of Justice, Hon. W. B. Ives, Minister of Trade and Commerce, Hon. A. R. Dickey, Secretary of State, and Hon. Dr. Montague. With the party were also Mr. John J. McGee, Clerk of the Privy Council, Mr. J. Lambert Payne, Private Secretary to the Premier, the Hon. Arthur Gordon, C. M. L., secretary to the Governor-General, and Dr. Powell, of Ottawa. The party proceeded on foot to the Windsor Hotel where dinner was partaken of, after which the Premier was driven to the residence of the Governor-General to whom he submitted the names of those forming the new Cabinet. After quite a lengthy conference Mr. Bowell returned to the Windsor, where all the members of the new government arrived with the exception of Dr. Montague, who was suffering from a sudden attack of heart weakness, and by the advice of Dr. Powell spent the night in the private car which brought the party to Montreal. This morning the ministers breakfasted at the Windsor Hotel, and the Premier and Dr. Montague, the whole party might have been seen about the residence of the Windsor by half past nine. Mr. Catellier, the Under Secretary of State, whose duties had been too pressing to allow him to catch the train which brought the remainder of the party had travelled, arrived later in the evening, and brought with him the great seal of the Dominion which he will formally hand over to the Secretary of State immediately after the latter is sworn in. It was a quarter to eleven before

DR. MONTAGUE ARRIVED AT THE HOTEL, where his colleagues gathered round him in groups, congratulating him upon his improved appearance, and asking after his health. In answer to enquiries the Doctor stated that he felt greatly improved, and was only sorry that he should be at all indisposed just when he desired to be in the best of health. Ten minutes later the Premier descended from his room and greeted his friends. He was in excellent spirits, and showed no signs of the cold from which he has recently been suffering. In a short interview with a STAB reporter, he said that the policy of the party would be unchanged, and that the Union which the country would support him in carrying it out. No time was lost in proceeding to business and three cars were immediately called to take the members of the Cabinet to the Vice-Royal residence. The first was filled by the Hon. Mackenzie Bowell, Dr. Montague and Dr. Powell, the second contained Messrs. Costigan, Catellier and McGee, and Mr. J. Lambert Payne occupied the third. Sir Hilbert Tupper preferred to walk, and he was accompanied by the Hon. W. B. Ives and the Hon. A. R. Dickey. The party reached the Governor-General's mansion at a quarter past eleven. The ceremony took place in the drawing room. The only official present was John J. McGee, clerk of the Privy Council, a brother of the late Hon. Thomas D'Arcy McGee. Mr. A. Catellier, under-secretary of state and keeper of the Great Seal. After formal congratulations Hon. Mackenzie Bowell took the oath of office as Premier of the Dominion, and Sir Charles Hibbert Tupper and Hon. W. B. Ives, who have

took the same oath, in the order named, as Minister of Marine and Fisheries, Minister of Justice and Minister of Trade and Commerce respectively. Then following the swearing in of Hon. A. R. Dickey as secretary of state, and Hon. Dr. Montague as a Member of the Privy Council. In the case of the former was administered three oaths, the oath of office, the Privy Council's oath, and the oath as a head of department. Hon. Dr. Montague was more fortunate. Not holding a portfolio he simply promised allegiance, and took the Privy Council's oath, which is as follows: "You do solemnly promise and swear that you will serve Her Majesty truly and faithfully in the place of Her Council in this Her Majesty's Dominion of Canada, and that you will keep close and secret all such matters as shall be treated, debated and resolved in the Privy Council without publishing or disclosing the same, or any part thereof, by word, writing, or any wise to any persons outside of Council, but to such only as be of the Council, and particularly if any matter so proposed, treated and debated in any such Privy Council shall touch any particular person sworn of the same Council upon any such matter, as shall in any wise concern his

LOYALTY AND FIDELITY. to the Queen's majesty, you will in nowise open the same to him, but keep secret as you would from any person until the Queen's majesty please to be known in that behalf. You will in all things to be moved, treated and debated in any such Privy Council faithfully, honestly and truly declare your mind and opinion to the honor and benefit of the Queen's majesty and the good of Her Majesty's subjects without partiality or exception of persons, in nowise forbearing so to do for any manner of respect, favor, or

LOVE, MEED, DISPLEASURE, or dread of any person or persons whatsoever in general; you will be vigilant, diligent and circumspect in all things touching the Queen's Majesty's affairs, all which matters, things, and things observable, will keep as a good councillor ought to do to the utmost of your power, will, and discretion. So help us God."

The oaths were taken in the presence of His Excellency and attested by Mr. McGee. Subsequently the latter also secured the signatures of Messrs. Dickey and Montague to the historic Privy Council roll. This parchment document bears, in the order of their appointment, the names of every Privy Councillor since Confederation. The first signature is that of the late Sir John A. Macdonald. Opposite each name is the signature of the Governor-General of the day. When Lord Aberdeen appended his autograph, the procedure was completed. The ministers subsequently returned to the Windsor Hotel. They leave for home this evening at 4 o'clock.

The Hon. Mackenzie Bowell is accompanied by his veteran attendant, Mr. John Carleton, who was with the Premier when he visited the city last year.

Hon. A. R. Dickey will shortly offer himself for re-election in Cumberland, N. S.

THE OPEN SEASON. Old river men state that the river has not been open as early in the season, and so thoroughly free of ice since 1878. The local steamers of the Richelieu Company are still running, and the Hochelaga is to take a sail down the river as far as the site of Tremblay on Christmas Day.
