NEWS SUMMARY. DOMINION. Mr. Justice O'Brien has been elected President of the Toronto St. George's Society.

AN ORIGINAL PROPOSITION FOR LIQUOR LICENSES. A new and original liquor license scheme is now on foot in New York. The proposal is to limit the number of saloons to 2,000, or one to every 500 inhabitants.

DESTITUTE IMMIGRANTS.—It has been long complained, in stable cases of it, that the destitute immigrants who have been brought to light in this city, that it has been the practice not only of municipal authorities, but even of relatives, to send away to this country people who were dependent upon them, the unfortunate landing here penniless, and at once becoming a burden upon the community as well as a charitable one.
